WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost six of the last nine games and 13 of the last 19 as they conclude their 2018 home schedule tonight with the series finale vs. Cleveland.
- LHP Jace Fry, whose first 68 career appearances came in relief (2017-18), will make the start for the White Sox.
- The Sox are currently in fourth place in the American League Central, 2.0 games behind third-place Detroit (64-93).
- The White Sox opened this homestand by splitting the first two games vs. the Indians after losing two of three to the Cubs.
- Following tonight's game and tomorrow's off day, the Sox will finish 2018 with four games at Minnesota (DH on Friday).
- The White Sox went 4-5 on their last trip at the Indians (1-2), Baltimore (2-1) and Kansas City (1-2), and 3-7 on their last homestand vs. Boston (2-2), Detroit (1-2) and the Angels (0-3).

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox need to win one of their final five games to avoid the fourth 100-loss season in franchise history.
- The Sox have lost eight of their last 10 games at Guaranteed Rate Field, and have been outscored, 62-29.
- Chicago is looking to win consecutive games vs. Cleveland for just the third time since 2017 ... it has lost nine of the last 12 games and 22 of the last 29 vs. the Indians.
- The White Sox will finish with a sub-.500 record at home for the fifth time in the last six seasons (45-36 in 2016).
- The Sox are hitting .223/.281/.352 with 20 homers and 62 runs scored (3.3 R/G) in the last 19 games ... have left 130 runners on base and own a .236 RISP mark (30-127) during that span.
- LHP Jace Fry tonight will make his first career start ... the White Sox are planning to utilize a "bullpen day" for tonight's game.

TONIGHT'S "OPENER"

- LHP Jace Fry tonight will make his first major-league start as part of a "bullpen day" for the White Sox.
- Fry has made 57 relief appearances with the Sox this season, the most among current team members and second-most in 2018 behind LHP Luis Avilán (58), who was traded to Philadelphia.
- Fry is limiting opponents to a .189 mark (35-185), including a .148 average (12-81) vs. left-handers.
- He went 1-8 with a 3.63 ERA (21 ER/52.0 IP) in 10 starts with Class A Winston-Salem in 2015 ... was 11-2 with a 1.80 ERA (24 ER/120.1 IP) and 98 SO in 16 starts with Oregon State in 2014.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Daniel Palka hit a game-ending, two-run single in the bottom of the ninth inning to cap a three-run rally in Chicago's 5-4 win.
- Yoán Moncada (walk), Adam Engel (single) and Yolmer Sánchez (RBI single) each reached base to start the ninth ... Leury García's sacrifice bunt set up Palka's walkoff hit.
- Avisail García hit a two-run HR (career-high No. 19) in the first before the Indians scored three in the fourth and one in the fifth.
- James Shields received a ND after allowing four runs on six hits with four walks and six strikeouts over 6.0 IP ... he reached the 200.0-IP mark for the 10th time in his career.
- Ian Hamilton (0.1 scoreless IP) earned his first MLB victory.
- Yolmer Sánchez went 2-5 with a RBI and two runs scored.

LATE-INNING WALK-MANIA!

- Daniel Palka last night recorded his second game-ending hit of the season ... he previously snapped a scoreless game with a walkoff, solo homer in the ninth on 8/10 vs. the Indians.
- Palka is hitting .208 (10-48) with two doubles, six home runs and 12 RBI in the ninth inning this season ... he ranks among the MLB ninth-inning leaders in homers (T1st) and RBI (T4th).
- His six homers in the ninth are tied with Paul Konerko (2005) for the most by a White Sox since 1990.

200 CLUB

- James Shields last night reached the 200.0-IP mark for the 10th time in his career ... he previously reached the mark in nine consecutive seasons from 2007-15.
- His 10 seasons of 200.0-plus IP since 2007 are the second-most in MLB during that span behind Justin Verlander (11).
- Since 2000, only former White Sox Mark Buehrle (14) and Verlander have more seasons of 200.0-plus IP.

RICKY SAYS THANK YOU

- Manager Rick Renteria has donated 200 tickets to children who were treated at Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis for Sunday's game at the Twins.
- The ticket donation is a thank you from Renteria to the staff who were involved in his care while he was a patient last month ... he also sent a shipment of Nuts on Clark "Chicago mix" popcorn.
- He missed four games from 8/20-23 due to lightheadedness.

WHITE SOX VS. CLEVELAND

- Cleveland leads the season series, 13-5 ... Chicago is 4-5 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 1-8 at Progressive Field, and has been outscored, 94-48, in 2018.
- The White Sox are batting .195/.254/.328 with 17 home runs, and own a 4.78 ERA (83 ER/156.1 IP) with seven quality starts.
- The Sox have lost nine of the last 12 games overall, and nine of the last 13 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... they are 7-22 overall in their last 29 games vs. the Indians dating back to 6/11/17.
- Chicago has lost five of the last six season series dating back to 2013 (10-9 in 2015), going 40-73 during that span.
- The White Sox lead the all-time series, 1,085-1,073 ... they are 573-504 at home (116-116 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 512-569 on the road (97-111 at Progressive Field).

FAN APPRECIATION NIGHT

- The Sox will celebrate Fan Appreciation Day tonight ... all fans in attendance will receive a ticket voucher for an April/May 2019 home game (excludes Opening Day and Boston series).
- In addition, fans will receive discounted parking (\$10) and chances to win prizes, including a 20-person patio party in 2019 (excluding OD and Cubs series), SoxFest 2019 passes (Sunday only), two round-trip tickets from United Airlines, autographed Sox memorabilia and Beggars Pizza for a year.
- Tonight will conclude with a postgame fireworks show.

(DIS)COMFORT OF HOME

- The White Sox have lost eight of their last 10 games at Guaranteed Rate Field and are 30-50 (.375) at home this season, the third-worst mark in MLB (Baltimore, 27-50; San Diego, 29-49).
- This season marks the Sox fourth-worst home record in club history, ahead of 1948 (27-48), 1932 (28-49) and 1970 (31-53).
- Chicago will finish with a sub-.500 record at home for the fifth time in the last six seasons (45-36 in 2016).

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have hit 96 home runs since 7/2, the fourth-highest total in the American League and seventh-most in MLB.
- The Sox feature six players with 17-plus home runs this season, tied for the third-most in MLB behind the Dodgers (eight).
- Chicago has hit 98 HRs on the road, compared to 82 at home.

PALKA POWER

- Daniel Palka is tied with Zeke Bonura (1934) for third place in White Sox single-season history among rookies with 27 home runs in 2018 ... he is eight shy of Ron Kittle (35 in 1983) for second ... the 27 homers are the most by a Sox left-handed rookie.
- He ranks among MLB rookie leaders in homers (1st, 27), RBI (T3rd, 66), extra-base hits (7th, 44) and total bases (7th, 197).
- Palka is trying to become the first White Sox rookie to lead all MLB rookies in home runs since José Abreu (36) in 2014.
- His four pinch-hit HRs are the most in a season in Sox history.

YOUNG AND PRODUCTIVE

- Yoán Moncada needs two doubles to become the fifth player in White Sox history, age 23 or younger, to record 30-plus doubles, 15-plus home runs and 60-plus RBI in a single season.
- He would join Chet Lemon (1977), Frank Thomas (1991), Paul Konerko (1999) and Carlos Lee (1999) ... also would be the first Sox, 23 or younger, with a 30+ 2B/15+ HR/60+ RBI/10+ SB season.

GRAB SOME BENCH

- Chicago has struck out 1,538 times in 2018, the most in MLB and the most in a single season in franchise history.
- Yoán Moncada leads MLB with 212 strikeouts ... he is 10 shy of tying Adam Dunn (222 in 2012) for the club record.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made 1,388 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, tied with the New York Mets (1,388) for the most in MLB during that span, and 57 more than Oakland (1,331), the next-closest American League team.
- The Sox rank third in the AL with 73 quality starts in 2018 ... RHP James Shields is tied for sixth in the AL with 19 QS, and RHP Reynaldo López is tied for 10th with 18.

ON DECK: AT MINNESOTA TWINS

- The White Sox conclude the 2018 regular season with four games at Minnesota, including a split doubleheader on Friday.
- The Sox are 7-8 vs. the Twins this season, going 4-5 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 3-3 at Target Field.
- Chicago is batting .247/.304/.403 with 17 home runs and owns a 3.64 ERA (55 ER/136.0 IP) with eight quality starts ... both clubs have scored 64 runs.
- The White Sox have won six of the last nine games.
