AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the first of 3G vs. Atlanta (Mon.-Wed.), their final home series before the All-Star break...went 2-1 vs. Boston over the weekend...on Friday, began an 11-game road trip to finish the "first half": 3G at Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), 4G at Baltimore (7/9-11, incl. DH on 7/9) and 4G at Cleveland (7/12-15).

- ▶ **At 54-27 (.667), have the Majors' best record**...have held sole possession of the Majors' best record for 14 of the last 17 days (since 6/16)...is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).
- ▶ **Over the last 60 seasons (since 1959), is their second-best record through the midway point** (61-20 in 1998).
- ▶ **Are 27G over .500**, 1G shy of their season high...are 4-5 since they were 28G over .500 at the end of play on 6/21 (50-22).
- ▶ **Are pct. points ahead of Boston (56-29, .659) for first place in the AL East**...since 5/7, the AL East division lead has changed hands 11 times...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (*at least a share of*) the two best records in the Majors on 59 of the last 60 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 39-27, the Yankees are 45-18).
- ▶ **Are 18-3-2 over their last 23 series (since 4/19)**...are 45-18 in their last 63G...are a Major League-best 38-4 (.905) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 35-5 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ **Are 20-14 vs. the AL East and 34-13 vs. all other divisions.**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Red Sox, 11-1, on Sunday Night Baseball at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Luis Severino** tossed 6.2 scoreless innings (2H, 3BB, 6K) to earn his Major League-leading 13th win...**Yankees batters** hit a season-high 6HR, including a career-high 3HR by **CF Aaron Hicks** (3-for-4, 4RBI, 1BB)...**2B/SS Gleyber Torres** (1-for-4, 1BB) hit a three-run HR in the first, one of 5HR off Boston starter David Price...**C Kyle Higashioka** (1-for-4) ended an 0-for-22 start to his career with a solo HR in the fourth...**RF Aaron Judge** (3-for-4, 3R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) hit his 22nd HR.

ST. LOUIS: **RHP Luis Severino** allowed just 2H over 6.2 scoreless innings on Sunday to earn his **Major League-leading 13th win** (no other pitcher has more than 11).

- ▶ Is tied with Atlanta's Sean Newcomb for the most qualifying scoreless starts (5.0IP+) in the Majors this season (six).
- ▶ **Lowered his AL-best ERA to 1.98**, second in the Majors to the Mets' Jacob deGrom (1.84).
- ▶ Is the first Yankee to win 13 games before the All-Star break since CC Sabathia (13-4) in 2011...is the fourth Yankees pitcher (fifth time) in 60 seasons since 1959 to win 13 games in the team's first 81 team games, joining Tommy John (13 in 1980), Ron Guidry (13 in 1978) and Whitey Ford (13 in 1963, 16 in 1961).
- ▶ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 15 straight starts (since 4/16), the longest streak by a Yankee since Ron Guidry did it in 15 starts from 4/8-6/22/78.
- ▶ Improved to 8-0 with a 1.64 ERA (65.2IP, 12ER) in 10 starts at Yankee Stadium this season, as the Yankees won his 14th consecutive home start (since 9/3/17).

THE GLEY-HEY KID: **2B Gleyber Torres** hit his 15th career HR in his 60th career game on Sunday.

- ▶ **Is the first Yankee, and just the sixth player ever, to hit at least 15HR in his first 60 career games at age-21-or-younger**, joining Cody Bellinger (24), Adam Dunn (17), Willie Mays (17), Albert Pujols (17) and Frank Robinson (17).
- ▶ Was his Major League-leading sixth three-run HR of the season, two more than any other player.

FAN FAVORITES: The Yankees drew their fifth consecutive sellout on Sun. vs. Boston, their seventh in their last eight home games...have 14 sellouts in 43 gates at Yankee Stadium in 2018, surpassing their sellout total from 2017 (13)...the series vs. Boston drew a total of 141,040 over 3G.

- ▶ Through 43 home games, **the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,831,721) and average attendance per home gate (42,598)**, trailing only the Dodgers in average home attendance (46,275 per gate).

MAIN EVENT OF THE EVENING: The Yankees begin a three-game series tonight against Atlanta, which owns the National League's best record at 48-34 (.585)...marks their second consecutive series against a team that entered with the best record in its league (Boston had an MLB-best 55-27 record entering Friday).

- ▶ With the Yankees owning the best record in Baseball, this marks the latest in the regular season that the owners of each league's best record have matched up in Interleague play since 7/23/15 (Kansas City at St. Louis)...is the latest in a season in the Interleague era (since 1997) that the Yankees have matched up in such a series.

JUST FOR HICKS: **CF Aaron Hicks** on Sunday recorded his first career 3HR game, **the first 3HR game by a Yankee since Alex Rodriguez on 7/25/15 at Minnesota**...homered off LHP David Price in the second and fourth and off RHP Hector Velázquez in the eighth...**homered from both sides of the plate in a game for the second time in his career** (also 4/13/17 vs. Tampa Bay)...was his fifth career multi-HR game, his second this season (also 4/13 at Detroit-2HR).

- ▶ Was the fourth player (second Yankee) to hit 3HR in a game at the current Yankee Stadium, also Yankees CF Curtis Granderson on 4/19/12 vs. Minnesota, Detroit RF J.D. Martinez on 6/21/15 and Kansas City CF Lorenzo Cain on 5/10/16.
- ▶ Was the first Yankees leadoff hitter to hit 3HR in a game, just the 27th such game in Major League history...has hit 9HR in 18G as a leadoff hitter this season (5HR in other 46G).
- ▶ Has hit 8HR in his last 15G (hit 6HR in his first 49G).

MIGGY HONORED: **3B Miguel Andújar** today **was named the AL "Rookie of the Month" for June**, his first career monthly award...in 25G, hit .264/.302/.560 (24-for-91) with 10R, 6 doubles, 7HR and 20RBI, leading all Major League rookies in HRs and XBHs (13) and tying for first in RBI (first in the AL).

- ▶ Is the sixth Yankee (ninth time) to win AL "Rookie of the Month" and the fourth current Yankee to do so, joining Gary Sánchez (Aug. 2016), Aaron Judge (four times in 2017) and Gleyber Torres (May 2018)...is the third Yankee to win a monthly award this season, along with Didi Gregorius (AL "Player of the Month" in April) and Torres (AL "Rookie of the Month" in May).

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** on Sunday hit a season-high 6HR, just their second 6HR game since the start of 2008 (also 9/24/10 vs. Boston-6HR).

- ▶ Lead the Majors with 137HR this season, setting a franchise record for the most HRs before the All-Star break (prev. 134HR in 2002, '12)...**is tied for the second-highest first-81G total in Major League history** (Seattle-139HR in 1999, St. Louis-137HR in 2000)...surpassed their previous first-81G high (127HR in 2002)...are on pace for 274HR (MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Have hit multiple HRs in 9-of-12G at home since 6/1 (28HR).
- ▶ Hicks' 3HR game was the Yankees' 16th individual multi-HR game this season, the most ever by one team through 81G in a season.
- ▶ Judge (22), Stanton (19), Gregorius (15) and Torres (15) are **only the second quartet in franchise history to hit at least 15HR before the All-Star break**, joining a group in 2002 (Jason Giambi-22, Alfonso Soriano-20, Robin Ventura-19, Jorge Posada-15)...Hicks and Sánchez both have 14HR, Andújar has 12HR.

DELLIN DONUTS: **RHP Dellin Betances** **has allowed just 1H with 25K in 14.2 scoreless innings (10BB, 2HP) over his last 15 appearances** (since 5/27).

- ▶ Per *Elias*, is the second pitcher in Yankees history to allow **1H-or-fewer over a span of at least 15 appearances** (LHP Tommy Layne: 1H in 8.0IP over 16G, 8/13-9/9/16).

HOME COOKING: The Yankees **are a Major League-best 31-12 (.721) at home in 2018**, including 26-7 in 33G since 4/21.

- ▶ Are 17-1-2 in their last 20 home series (since 8/31/17), going 45-16 in 61G over that span.
- ▶ Since their only home series loss of the season (1-3 vs. Baltimore from 4/5-8 vs. Baltimore), are 10-0-2 in 12 home series, **their longest streak without dropping a series at home since going 20-0-5 over 25 home series from 9/15/97-8/16/98**...are 10-0-1 in 11 home series since 4/19.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 2, 1941: Joe DiMaggio goes 1-for-5 with a two-run home run off Dick Newsome, extending his hitting streak to 45 games and surpassing Wee Willie Keeler's single-season Major League record 44-game streak set in 1897.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 3, 1957: Yogi Berra goes 3-for-5 with a career-high 8RBI and catches Bob Turley's 3-hit shutout as the Yankees rout Boston 10-0.

July 3, 1923: In the bottom of the 15th inning, Babe Ruth homers off Washington's George Mogridge to give the Yankees a 2-1 win, marking the first walk-off homer in Yankee Stadium history. Yankees starter "Bullet" Joe Bush and Mogridge each throw complete games.

July 3, 1922: In a 12-1 win vs. Philadelphia, Bob Meusel hits for the cycle for the second time in his career. He remains the only player to accomplish the feat three times as a Yankee (also on 5/7/21 vs. Washington and 7/26/28 at Detroit).

YANKEES IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY

WINNING FORMULA: Tonight the Yankees play their 13th Interleague game of 2018 (are 7-5 so far)...have the most wins and have the second-highest all-time winning percentage (233-161; .591) in Interleague history (Boston: 231-157, .595)...are 51-34 in their last 85 Interleague games since 5/14/14.

- ✦ All-time, are .500-or-better against all but one NL team during the regular season (6-7 vs. the Dodgers)...are 15-15 all time against the Phillies and 6-6 against Milwaukee.
- ✦ Went 15-5 vs. the National League in 2017, setting a club record for most Interleague wins in a single season (previous was 13: 13-7 in 2014, 13-5 in 2003, '11, '12, 13-3 in 1998)...went 8-12 in 2016.
- ✦ Have posted a winning Interleague record in 17-of-21 seasons (17-3-1 overall) since Interleague play was established in 1997...produced a winning record in 13 consecutive seasons from 2000-12, going 143-90 over that span.
- ✦ Have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record in 18-of-21 seasons (5-10 in 1997; 9-11 in 2013; and 8-12 in 2016), including a stretch of 15 consecutive non-losing records from 1998-2012.

THE SCHEDULE: The Yankees are scheduled to play 20 Interleague games in 2018...are 7-5 in Interleague play so far...in addition to their annual Subway Series – went 2-1 at Citi Field in June and will play 3G three in the Bronx later this month (7/20-22) – the Yankees play the NL East this year...went 2-2 vs. Washington (1-1 at home and 1-1 on the road) and 2-1 vs. Philadelphia (3G at Citizens Bank Park last week)...are 1-1 vs. Miami, with two more games at Marlins Park from 8/21-22...are hosting the Braves for three games beginning tonight.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: The Yankees are 2-2 at home vs. the NL in 2018...are 127-69 (.648) all-time in Interleague play at home, including 55-35 (.611) at the current Yankee Stadium...have won 26 of their last 40 Interleague home games (since 5/17/14)... went 72-34 (.679) against NL teams at the original Yankee Stadium.

UNFAMILIAR SURROUNDINGS: The Yankees are 5-3 in NL parks this season...went 7-3 in Interleague road games in 2017 (went 3-7 in 2016)...over the last 10 seasons (since 2008), have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record on the road eight times (4-6 in 2013, 3-7 in 2016)...are 106-92 (.535) in Interleague road games all time.

- ✦ Are 67-51 all-time in NL East ballparks (does not include a 2-1 mark against the Rays at Citi Field in September 2017), 21-19 in NL Central parks and 18-22 in NL West parks.

ON THE HILL: Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.57 ERA (105.0IP, 30ER) with 131K in their first 12 Interleague games in 2018, the Majors' second-lowest Interleague ERA (Houston-1.51) and second-most strikeouts (Washington-135) this season.

- ✦ In 2017, struck out a Major League-best 203 batters in Interleague play...**Yankees starters** posted 3.43 ERA (120.2IP, 46ER) with 113K in 20 starts...**RHP Luis Severino** set a single-season franchise Interleague record with 37K and also tallied a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP, 4ER) in four starts in 2017.

AT THE PLATE: In the history of Interleague play (since 1997), the Yankees rank first in walks (1,553) and stolen bases (292), second in OBP (.341), third in runs scored (1,932) and fifth in home runs (466).

PITCHERS AS HITTERS: Yankees pitchers are 3-for-their-last-90 in Interleague play since 5/20/14...the only three hits in that span: **Luis Severino** singled and later scored a run on 8/17/17 at New York-NL; **Michael Pineda** snapped a team 0-for-29 with a single on 5/5/17 at Chicago-NL; reliever **Branden Pinder** snapped a team 0-for-28 with an RBI double on 8/30/15 at Atlanta...Pinder's hit is the most recent extra-base hit and hit with an RBI by a Yankees pitcher...was the second Yankees relief pitcher in the DH era (since 1973) to record a hit (also Mike Stanton on 6/6/00 at Montreal)...have batted a combined .083 (37-for-446) with 9 doubles, 13RBI and 49 sacrifice hits in Interleague play.

- ✦ The last HR by a Yankees pitcher came in the pre-DH era (Lindy McDaniel solo HR on 9/28/72 at Detroit).

RHP Jonathan Loaisiga will make his fourth career start in tonight's series opener vs. Atlanta...the 23-year-old will start on extended six days' rest...earned the win in his last start on 6/25 at Philadelphia, taking a no-hitter into the sixth inning (5.1IP, 1H, 0R, 2BB, 8K)...**is the first Yankees pitcher since 1908 to toss at least 5.0 shutout innings with 3H-or-fewer twice within his first three career games**...was recalled from Double-A Trenton on 6/15 and earned the win in his Major League debut vs. Tampa Bay (5.0IP, 3H, 0R, 4BB, 6K)...was the 11th pitcher (eighth starter) in Yankees history to toss at least 5.0 scoreless innings in his Major League debut, just the second since 1943 (Sam Militello-7.0IP in a start on 8/9/92 vs. Boston)...was the seventh pitcher to start a game for the Yankees this season...last name is pronounced "loh-AYE-see-gah"...was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 2/9/16...was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster on 11/20/17...was originally signed by San Francisco as a non-drafted free agent on 9/13/12.

LAST START: On 6/25 at Philadelphia, took a no-hitter into the sixth inning and earned his second win (5.1IP, 1H, 0R, 2BB, 8K)...allowed his only hit on a leadoff single by Jorge Alfaro in the sixth...retired the first 12BF in order...along with his MLB debut on 6/15 vs. Tampa Bay (5.0IP, 3H, 0R, 4BB, 6K), is the first Yankees pitcher since 1908 to toss at least 5.0 shutout innings with 3H-or-fewer twice within his first three career games.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (14.0IP, 3ER) in three Major League starts...made his Major League debut on 6/15 vs. Tampa Bay, tossing 5.0 shutout innings (3H, 4BB, 6K) to earn his first win...was the 11th pitcher (eighth starter) in Yankees history to toss at least 5.0 scoreless innings in his Major League debut, just the second since 1943 (Sam Militello-7.0IP in a start on 8/9/92 vs. Boston).

- ✦ Was the first Yankees pitcher since 1908 to record at least 6K and not allow a run in his Major League debut.
- ✦ Was the first Yankees pitcher to record a win in his first career game since Masahiro Tanaka on 4/4/14 at Toronto.

NATIONAL PRIDE: Born in Managua, is the first Nicaragua-born player in Yankees history and the 15th Nicaraguan player (11th pitcher) in Baseball history...was the fourth player born in Nicaragua to appear in a Major League game this season, joining Kansas City's Cheslor Cuthbert, Seattle's Erasmo Ramirez and Los Angeles-AL's JC Ramirez.

FAST TRACK: Never appeared above Double-A in the minors...was the second Yankee this season to be recalled from Trenton (also LHP Ryan Bollinger)...excluding Masahiro Tanaka, was the first player to make his Major League debut with the Yankees without having ever appeared at the Triple-A level since INF Ramiro Peña on 4/6/09 at Baltimore...was the first pitcher to do so since LHP Chase Wright on 4/17/07 vs. Cleveland (credit: *Elias*).
