Newcomb is tied with Luis Severino for the most multi-inning scoreless starts in the majors, one more than Houston's Justin Verlander, teammate Julio Teheran and Tampa Bay's Ryne Stanek.

The Atlanta franchise record is nine, done twice by Greg Maddux, first in 1998 and then again in 2002

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Yankees continue a three-game set tonight with the first series between the teams since 2015...These three games will be the clubs' only matchup this season.

A With last night's win, the Braves improved to 11-7 in the Bronx during the regular season, including 3-1 at new Yankee Stadium...They are 2-12 against the Yankees in Atlanta.

A LHP Sean Newcomb is set for his first career start against the Yankees...The left-hander and Massachusetts native is 1-1 with a 5.12 ERA (11 ER/19.1) in four career interleague starts, including 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (4 ER/16.0 IP) in such starts this season.

A RHP Domingo Germán has never faced the Braves...The right-hander has won his last two starts here, striking out 19 over 13.0 innings... Overall, in five home starts, Germán is 2-1 with a 3.94 ERA (13 ER/29.2 IP).

WINS: The Braves have won four straight games to move a season-high 15 games over .500...The Braves have not been 16 games over .500 since finishing the 2013 season 96-66 and as National League East champions.

A The Braves also improved to 26-17 (.605) away from SunTrust Park, the best road record in the National League and tied for the fourth-best mark in the majors.

A Atlanta is now 31-19 (.620) against teams with winning records this season, the best record in the National League and the third-best mark in the majors...Only the Yankees (.721) and Boston (.675) are better.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today reinstated RHP Arodys Vizcaíno from the 10-day disabled list and optioned OF Michael Reed to Triple-A Gwinnett.

A Vizcaíno returns after missing eight games with right shoulder inflammation...The right-hander went to the 10-day disabled list on June 24, retroactive to June 21

MARKAKIS: OF Nick Markakis went 2-for-5 last night with his National League high-tying 27th double...Markakis is tied with teammate Ozzie Albies, and the Braves lead the N.L. with 176 two-base hits.

A With his two hits last night, Markakis extended his N.L.-leading hit total to 106...He now has 2,158 career hits, but no All-Star game appearances... Since 1933, the year of the first All-Star game, 158 other players have collected at least 2,100 hits...All of them, except OF Juan Pierre, made at least one All-Star team...Markakis leads all N.L. outfielders in All-Star voting this season.

A Markakis and Albies are two shy of the franchise record for most doubles prior to the All-Star break...Marcus Giles set the mark with 29 in 2003.

ROOKIE HOME RUN: Ronald Acuña Jr. lifted a 1-2, 11th-inning pitch from David Robertson over the wall in right-center field last night to give the Braves a 5-3 win...Acuña Jr. has five game-winning RBI since his MLB debut on April 25 at Cincinnati, tied for the most on the team over that time frame.

A Acuña Jr. at 20 years, 196 days, became the youngest player to hit a game-winning, extra-inning home run for the Braves since Andruw Jones (20 years, 3 days) hit a two-run, game-ending homer in the 10th inning off San Diego's Trevor Hoffman on April 26, 1997...The last younger major leaguer with a game-winning homer in extra innings was Florida's Miguel Cabrera (20 years, 155 days) on September 20, 2003 at Atlanta.

A Acuña Jr. became the only player to ever hit a game-winning extra-inning home run at Yankee Stadium prior to his 21st birthday...Prior to Acuña Jr., the youngest player with a game-winning extra-inning home run at Yankee Stadium was Minnesota's Kent Hrbek (21 years, 95 days) on August 24, 1981.

NEVER QUIT WITH SNIT: The Braves collected their N.L. high-tying 11th last at-bat win of the season yesterday, and since Brian Snitker took over as interim manager on May 17, 2016, the club leads the N.L. with 48 such wins.

A The Braves finished with a N.L.-most 20 such victories in 2017 after leading the league with 19 the year before.

A The Braves have scored 153 runs after the sixth inning this year, the second most in the majors... Only Chicago (NL) have scored more with 156.

A The Braves have hit 32 of their 94 home runs (34%) in the seventh inning or later, the third biggest percentage in the majors...Only the Mets (39%) and Oakland (38%) hit a greater share of their homers in the later innings.

WITH THE DH: The Braves improved to 14-7 (.667) over their last 21 games in American League parks, including 5-3 this season...These next two games with the Yankees will be the Braves' last two in an A.L. stadium this season.

A The Braves designated hitters are hitting .273 (9-for-33) with no home runs and one RBI this season... The last Atlanta DH to homer was Jeff Francoeur on July 27, 2016 at Minnesota.

LONG RELIEF: LHP Jesse Biddle went 2.0 shutout innings with four strikeouts last night to earn his second win of the season...The outing marked Biddle's eight appearance of more than 1.0 inning this season, and in these eight games, spanning 17.1 innings, the lefty has not allowed a run while striking out 25.

A Braves relievers have made 58 appearances of more than 1.0 inning this season, compiling a 2.92 ERA (37 ER/114.0 IP) in these outings.

Tonight's Game

- A Makes his 17th start of the season and the 36th of his career.
- A Has made six starts this season in which he has not allowed a run, tied for most in the majors among starters with at least 30.0 innings pitched...Yankees starter Luis Severino also has six scoreless starts.
- A Ryne Stanek has eight scoreless starts for Tampa Bay, but has not completed more than 2.0 innings in any of his outings.
- A Newcomb is the first Braves pitcher with six or more scoreless starts in a season since Julio Teheran had eight in 2016...Teheran did so in 30 starts on the season.
- A Makes his 10th nighttime start of the season, and is 6-1 with a 1.79 ERA (11 ER/55.1 IP) in such turns...Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his last eight night starts.
- A Among pitchers to make at least nine starts at night, Newcomb's 1.79 ERA is lowest in the majors.
- A Only one qualified Atlanta starter has posted a lower ERA in night games since the franchise moved to Atlanta in 1966...Greg Maddux pitched to a 1.69 ERA in 21 nighttime starts in 1995.
- A Newcomb is 2-1 with a 4.06 ERA (17 ER/37.2 IP) in seven starts during the day...Has allowed three or more earned runs in four of his seven daytime starts.
- A Faces the Yankees for the first time in his career, and makes his fifth career Interleague start...Is 1-1 with a 5.12 ERA (11 ER/19.1 IP) in his first four starts against the American League.
- A Has made three starts in Interleague Play this season, and is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (4 ER/16.0 IP).

2018 Recap

- A Allowed seven hits and three runs in his last turn, 6/27 vs. CIN...Allowed three or more earned runs for just the fifth time in 16 starts on the season.
- A Threw a career-most 111 pitches.
- A Beat the Padres 1-0, 6/16 at SunTrust Park...Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings with two hits and seven strikeouts.
- A Is 3-0 with 18 scoreless innings in his three career starts against the Padres... Has thrown 6.0 scoreless frames in each of the three starts...His 18 scoreless innings to open his career are the most against San Diego by a Braves pitcher in franchise history.
- A Allowed a season high-tying five earned runs, 6/10 at LAD, to suffer his second defeat of the season.
- A Snapped his career-best seven-game winning streak, which dated to 4/8 at COL...Went 7-0 with a 1.96 ERA (14 ER/64.1 IP) in 11 total starts during the run.
- A Finished the month of May 5-0 with a 1.54 ERA (6 ER/35.0 IP) and no home runs allowed...Atlanta went 5-1 in his six starts.
- A His five wins in the month were most in the majors, while his 1.54 ERA ranked sixth best in the N.L...His batting average against of .158 was the lowest in the league among qualifying pitchers.
- A Newcomb allowed 19 total hits in 35.0 innings during the month, becoming the first Braves player in the last 110 seasons to make at least six starts in a month and allow 19 hits or less.
- A Faced Miami for the second consecutive turn, 5/19, and allowed four hits and one run over 6.0 innings to earn his fourth consecutive win.
- A A run-scoring groundout by Bryan Holaday scored Justin Bour in the second inning to snap Newcomb's career-long scoreless streak at 21 consecutive innings.
- A Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed a career-low one hit, 5/13 at MIA...The start was his third consecutive scoreless turn.
- A Became the first Braves pitcher over the last 110 seasons to allow two hits or fewer and no runs in three consecutive starts.
- A Allowed two hits and three walks over 6.0 scoreless innings, 5/8 at TB... Turned in consecutive scoreless starts for the first time in his career.
- A Tampa Bay logged just two hits, both of which were singles...Newcomb became the first Braves starter since Greg Maddux (6/27 and 7/2/99) to log consecutive scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings with two or fewer hits allowed.
- A Earned his first win of the season, 4/8 at COL, after allowing just five hits in 6.0+ scoreless innings...Did not walk a batter for the first time in his career.
- A Walked at least one batter in each of his first 20 career games...Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, only two other pitchers opened their careers with longer streaks of walking at least one batter - Pete Smith (29 games) and Tom Glavine (27 games).

- A Selected by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim in the first round (15th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.
- A Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with SS Erick Aybar, RHP Chris Ellis and cash considerations, from the Los Angeles of Anaheim in exchange for SS Andrelton Simmons and C Jose Briceno on 11/12/15.
