TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 30, 2004: Bernie Williams launches a two-run, "walk-off" homer against Minnesota (W, 6-4), as the Yankees clinch their seventh consecutive AL East crown, 10th straight postseason appearance and third consecutive 100-win season.

Sept. 30, 1984: Don Mattingly goes 4-for-5 in a 9-2 win vs. the Tigers, as he finishes the season with a .343 batting average and wins the American League batting title.

Sept. 30, 1973: The Yankees play their final game in Yankee Stadium before it gets remodeled, losing 8-5 vs. Detroit. Tigers pitcher John Hiller gets Yankees first baseman Mike Hegan to fly out to centerfield for the game's final out.

Sept. 30, 1927: Babe Ruth hits his 60th HR in a 4-2 win over Washington at the original Yankee Stadium.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Oct. 1, 2015: The Yankees become the first American League franchise to win 10,000 games with a 4-1 victory over the Red Sox at Yankee Stadium. Occurring in the franchise's 17,570th game, the win also clinches the Yankees' first postseason berth since 2012.

Oct. 1, 1961: Roger Maris hits his 61st home run in the season's final game off Boston's Tracy Stallard at Yankee Stadium, establishing a then-Major League record and still-standing AL record. It was the only run in a 1-0 Yankees victory.

Oct. 1, 1953: The Yankees take a 2-games-to-none lead over the Dodgers, coming from behind to win World Series Game 2, 4-2. After Billy Martin ties the game with a solo homer in the seventh inning, Mickey Mantle hits a two-run shot in the eighth.

Oct. 1, 1932: In Game 3 of the World Series at Wrigley Field, Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig each hit two home runs in the Yankees' 7-5 win over the Cubs. Ruth's second homer, which came in the fifth inning, is his fabled "called shot."

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees play the final game of the regular season today at Boston...are 5-1 on their final road trip of the season after winning their first two games at Boston and going 3-1 at Tampa Bay.

- ▶ **With their win on Friday at Boston, have clinched home field in Wednesday's AL Wild Card Game vs. Oakland.**
- ▶ **With their win on Saturday at Boston, have recorded the 20th 100-win season in franchise history...**marks their highest win total since going 103-59 in 2009.
- ▶ Are 9-3 in their last 12G after going 1-4 in their previous 5G...are 25-15 in their last 40G and 32-19 in 51G since 8/6.
- ▶ At 100-61 (.621), have MLB's third-best record and third-most wins (Boston, 107-54, .665; Houston, 103-58, .640).
- ▶ Are a season-high 39G over .500...prior to 2018, had not been 39G over .500 since finishing the 2009 season with a 103-59 record (44G over .500).
- ▶ Have clinched the 54th postseason berth in franchise history (116 seasons, 46.6%)...have qualified in 20-of-24 seasons since 1995 (missed in 2008, '13-14, '16)...are going to consecutive postseasons for the first time since 2009-12.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their 100th game of the season with Saturday's 8-5 victory at Boston...**Yankees batters** hit two home runs (Torres/Stanton) giving them **266 on the season to surpass the 1997 Mariners (264HR) for the most by a team in a single season in Major League history...****RHP Domingo Germán** started and allowed 1ER in 1.1IP (3H, 1BB, 3K, 1HP)...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (3-for-4) had an RBI double in the first and a solo HR in the seventh, giving him a team-leading 100RBI this season...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-2, 1BB) hit a two-run HR in the fourth, marking the Yankees' single-season record-setting 265th homer of the year...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-5) had a two-run double in the fifth, his 45th double of the season to surpass Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936) for the most by a rookie in Yankees history (also hit his 46th double in the ninth)...**RHP Lance Lynn** entered in relief to start the third and allowed 1ER in 3.0IP (2H, 1BB, 4K), earning the victory and improving to 10-10 this season, including his time with the Twins...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** recorded his 32nd save of the year (0.2IP, 1BB, 2K).

MANAGING WELL: With the Yankees' 100th win of the season on Saturday at Boston, **Manager Aaron Boone** became one of **six managers in Baseball history to lead his team to at least 100 wins in his rookie season**, joining Ralph Houk (1961 Yankees, 109-53), Alex Cora (2018 Red Sox, 107-54), Dusty Baker (1993 Giants, 103-59), Sparky Anderson (1970 Reds, 102-60) and Mickey Cochrane (1934 Tigers, 101-53).

- ▶ In MLB history, only four skippers have won the World Series in their rookie seasons without having any prior Major League managerial experience (Bucky Harris-1924 Senators; Eddie Dyer-1945 Cardinals; Ralph Houk-1961 Yankees; Bob Brenly-2001 Diamondbacks).

SLOT MACHINE: With Gleyber Torres' HR on Saturday as the No. 9 hitter in the batting order, **Yankees batters now have hit at least 20HR out of each of the nine slots in the batting order**, becoming the first such team in Major League history to accomplish the feat.

RECORD RIVALRY RECORD: This year marks the first season in MLB history that the Yankees and Red Sox each totaled at least 100 wins...prior to this season, the highest totals the teams reached in the same season was in 1978, when the Yankees went 100-63 and Boston went 99-64.

WILD THINGS: The Yankees have clinched their seventh AL Wild Card berth (1995, '97, 2007, '10, '15, '17-18)...will be their third Wild Card Game (lost 2015 vs. Houston, won 2017 vs. Minnesota), matching Pittsburgh (1-2 in NLWCG from 2013-15) for the most in the history of the Wild Card.

- ▶ Will join the Pirates as the only teams to play in consecutive Wild Card Games (Colorado can also join this group).
- ▶ The Yankees (2x) and Pirates (3x: 2013-15) are the only teams to host multiple Wild Card Games...home teams are 5-7 all-time in the Wild Card Game (AL 3-3, NL 2-4).
- ▶ Have won all three of their prior all time postseason series against Oakland, going 9-4 overall in postseason games against them (3-2 in the 2001 ALDS, 3-2 in the 2000 ALDS, and 3-0 in the 1981 ALCS).

BRONX BOMBERS, INDEED: Yankees batters hit 2HR on Saturday at Boston, giving them 266 on the season to surpass the 1997 Mariners (264HR) for the most by a team in a single season in Major League history...

2B Gleyber Torres hit the record-breaking 265th HR in the fourth inning...the Yankees' averages of 1HR/20.62AB and 1.65HR/G this season are the best in MLB history.

- ▶ Prior to Saturday, had hit four HRs in each of their previous two games (on Friday at Boston and Thursday at Tampa Bay)...have 32HR in their last 15G (since 9/14)...have homered in 31-of-35G since 8/24 (64HR total).
- ▶ Have scored 47R in the last 5G, their highest-scoring five-game span of the season.
- ▶ If **2B Gleyber Torres** hits his 25th HR of the season today (currently has 24), would become the sixth Yankee with at least 25HR (also Stanton-38HR and Andújar/Gregorius/Hicks/Judge-27HR each) and the Yankees would match the 2003 Red Sox (Garciaparra, Millar, Nixon, Ortiz, Ramirez, Varitek) for the most 25HR players on a team in MLB history.

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton has 38HR, 100RBI and 102R this season, and is the 12th player in franchise history to reach each of those totals in a single season...is just the fourth to reach those totals in his first season with the club, joining Mark Teixeira in 2009 (39HR, 122RBI, 103R), Jason Giambi in 2002 (41HR, 122RBI, 120R) and Babe Ruth in 1920 (54HR, 136RBI, 158R).

- ▶ His 38HR are fifth-most by a player in his first season with the club, trailing Babe Ruth (54HR in 1920), Jason Giambi (41HR in 2002), Mark Teixeira (39HR in 2009) and Roger Maris (39HR in 1960).

MULTI-TASKING: With Giancarlo Stanton's 2HR game on Thursday at Tampa Bay, the Yankees **tied a Major League record with their 24th player multi-HR game of 2018**...are the third team to do it, joining the 1961 Yankees and 1966 Braves.

- ▶ Stanton is one of 10 different Yankees to record a multi-HR game...Aaron Judge, who led the AL with seven multi-HR G in 2017, does not have any.

ROOKIE MOVES: 3B Miguel Andújar hit his 45th and 46th doubles of the season in Saturday's win at Boston, surpassing **Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936) for the most by a rookie in a single season in franchise history...**also ties for the fifth-highest total by any rookie in MLB history, marking the most since **Ryan Zimmerman (47) and Hanley Ramirez (46) in 2006**.

- ▶ With 92RBI this season, is just the eighth Yankees rookie to reach the total and only the third since 1963 (Judge-114 in 2017, Matsui-106 in 2003).

TO BE THE BEST, YOU'VE GOT TO BEAT THE BEST:

Among the five AL playoff teams, the Yankees have the best record against the other AL postseason qualifiers, having gone 22-16 this season (5-2 vs. Cleveland, 5-2 vs. Houston, 3-3 vs. Oakland, 9-9 vs. Boston)...see chart at right.

HOT HAND LUKE: In his last 10G (since 9/19), **1B Luke Voit** has hit safely nine times and driven at least one run eight times...is batting .410/.465/.949/1.414 (16-for-39) with 11R, 3 doubles, 6HR, 14RBI and 4BB over that stretch.

- ▶ Since making his Yankees debut on 8/2, is hitting .328/.403/.672/1.075 (42-for-128) with 27R, 5 doubles, 13HR, 31RBI and 15BB in 38G...since 8/24, his 13HR and 1.169 OPS (in 31G) are second in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee's Christian Yelich (15HR, 1.325 OPS).
