TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs Ray Garcia's White Sox and Game 6 (3-2) of a 7-game homestand that included a 2-2 series split with the first-place Brewers...is the Reds' last home series prior to the All-Star break...following this series and Thu's off day, the Redlegs will finish the first half of the season with a 10-day, 9-game road trip to Chi's Wrigley Field (3g), Cle's Progressive Field (3g) and StL's Busch Stadium (off day, 3g)...will open up the championship season's second half with a 10-game homestand vs the Pirates (3g), Cardinals (3g) and Phillies (4g).

SERIES NOTES: The Redlegs and White Sox are meeting during the regular season for the first time since 2015 at U.S. Cellular Field and for the first time at Great American Ball Park since 2009, a span of 3,297 days between visits...the White Sox won 6 of the 7 previous season series (1-1 split in 1998) and 16 of the 21 games, including 10 of the 13 games here in Cincinnati...the Reds never won more than 1 game in any of the previous 7 season series, and the Sox swept 3 of the 7 series...Reds vs White Sox information is on media guide Page 333...1919 World Series information is on media guide Pages 438-439...the Reds won that World Series, 5 games to 3.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: This season the Reds are 7-1 vs the American League (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 1-0 vs WSox), including 6 consecutive wins...have won 6 straight interleague games for the first time...their 2-1 series win at Min's Target Field in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a 3-0 series sweep at Hou's Minute Maid Park in September 2013...between those series wins the Reds went 0-9 in interleague road series of at least 3 games and 4-23 in games in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the White Sox (3g, 7/2-7/4), Indians (3g, 8/13-8/15) and Royals (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at Cle's Jacobs Field (3g, 7/9-7/11) and at Det's Comerica Park (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 145-198 all-time vs the AL, at .423 the second-lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team (SD, 151-211, .417)...Cin hasn't produced a winning record vs the American League since 2013 (11-9)...in 5 seasons since then are 30-58 vs AL (.340)...Reds vs AL opponents information is on media guide Page 332.

APRIL 19: The Reds are 34-33 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

STREAKING: On Sunday the Redlegs completed 3 consecutive series vs first-place teams and went 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl and 2-2 vs Mil...is their first 4-series unbeaten streak (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil) since they ended the first half of last season by going 3-0-1 vs Mil (2-1), vs Cubs (2-1), at Col (2-2) and at Ari (2-1)...haven't produced a 5-series unbeaten streak since a 6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016 (2-1 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Atl, 2-1 vs Ari, 2-1 at SF, 2-1 at SD, 2-1 vs StL)...in fifth place since the fourth day of the season, the Reds have pulled to within 3.5 games of the fourth-place Pirates.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' infield collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (387), batting average (.289) and on-base percentage (.367)...1B Joey Votto leads the National League in on-base percentage and hitting vs RHP while ranking second in walks...2B Scooter Gennett leads the league in overall hitting and hitting on the road...3B Eugenio Suárez is tied for the NL lead in RBI and leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI...he also ranks fourth in the NL in slugging percentage and eighth in batting average...SS José Peraza ranks second in the league in most plate apps per strikeout.

DOT...DOT...DOT: The Reds tonight are hosting 2018 draft picks IF Jonathan India (1st pick, 5th overall), CF Michael Siani (4th round) and RHP Michael Byrne (14th round)...in Sat's 12-3 win vs Mil Reds pitchers recorded 18 strikeouts, a new franchise record for a 9-inning game...the Reds trailed in 7 of their last 10 victories...haven't lost a game when leading after 8 innings since 4/21/17 vs Chi, an active streak of 87 consecutive wins when leading after the eighth (33-0 this season)...in the last 10 days, Reds pitchers produced 4 HR (Michael Lorenzen 3, Anthony DeSclafani 1), 2 grand slams (Lorenzen, DeSclafani), 2 pinch-hit HR (Lorenzen 2) and a pinch-hit grand slam (Lorenzen).

RUTHIAN: In his last 5 plate apps RHP Michael Lorenzen has singled, homered (pinch hit), walked, homered and homered (pinch-hit grand slam)...is the first Major League pitcher to homer in 3 consecutive at bats since Col's Mike Hampton in 2001...his 3 HR are the most by a Reds batter whose primary position is pitcher since Michah Owings had 3 homers in 2009...in his career as a pinch hitter Lorenzen is 4-for-11 with 3 HR (4/6/17 off Pit's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery, grand slam on 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes), including 3-for-4 this season (2hr, 5rbi)...5 times Lorenzen has come off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games...on 6/7 vs Col Lorenzen pinch hit and produced a 116.5-mile-per-hour single off Tyler Anderson, the hardest-hit ball in the Statcast era by any Reds batter or by any Major League pitcher...information courtesy Elias Sports Bureau and Stats.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 9 grand slams, tying the 2002 franchise single-season record and including a streak of 6 slams over a 17-game span from 6/13-7/1...the 1996 Expos, 1997 Braves and 2006 Mets are the only teams in Major League history to produce at least 6 grand slams over a 17-day span...the National League record for grand slams in a season is 12 (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is 14 (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds hit 5 in June, a new club record for grand slams in a calendar month...the Reds' 9 grand slams were hit by Adam Duval (2), Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Joey Votto, Jesse Winker, pitcher Anthony DeSclafani, Michael Lorenzen (pinch-hit) and José Peraza...on 6/23 vs Chi (off Brian Duensing), DeSclafani became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a grand slam (Bob Purkey 1959, Al Hollingsworth 1936, Ice Box Chamberlain 1892)...Lorenzen on 6/30 off Mil's Jacob Barnes became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since Tommy Byrne of the WSox on 5/16/1953 at NYY.

REHABBING: RHP Homer Bailey is 3 apps into a rehabilitation assignment (3gs, 0-2, 8.44, 16ip, 22h, 15er, 2bb, 6k, 4hr, 1hbp)...he has been disabled since 6/2 with right knee inflammation...on Thu for Louisville at Toledo started and suffered the 3-2 loss (7ip, 6h, 3er, 0bb, 3k, 3hr, 100pch)...is pitching tonight vs Indianapolis.

Tonight's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tonight is making his sixth start of the season...will be his first career appearance vs the **White Sox** and his first appearance of the season vs an **American League** team...in **6 career starts vs the AL** is **1-2, 4.67** (34.2ip, 18er)...in his **last 3 starts** this season is **3-0, 3.86** (23.1ip, 10er)...his **3-game winning streak** ties **Matt Harvey's, Luis Castillo's** and **Tyler Mahle's** for the longest by a Reds pitcher this season...in Thu's 6-4 loss vs Mil, left with a 4-2 lead but became the victim of a blown save when **Eric Thames** hit a 3-run HR off **Amir Garrett**...in the 11-2 win on **6/23 vs Cubs** hit a grand slam (off **Brian Duensing**), the first home run of his career and only the fourth grand slam by a Reds pitcher (**Bob Purkey** on 8/1/59 vs Cubs, **Al Hollingsworth** on 5/28/1936 at Cubs, **Ice Box Chamberlain** on 4/30/1892 vs Wsh)...in the **9-6 loss on 6/5 vs Col** made his first appearance for the Reds since a **2-1 win on 9/28/16 at StL**...between his **September 2016** and **June 2018 apps**, **17 pitchers** made starts for the Reds...began the **2018 season** on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a **left oblique strain** suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his **6/5 start vs Col**, from **5/14-5/30** made **4 rehabilitation starts** for Class AA **Pensacola** and Class AAA **Louisville** (**0-3, 4.66**)...spent the entire **2017 season** on the disabled list with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his **right elbow**.

RED HOTS

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...on Wed will make his 18th start of the season and his **34th Major League** appearance and start...will be his first career appearance vs the **White Sox**, his fourth start of the season vs an **American League** team (**1-1, 1.37**, 19.2ip, 3er) and his **fifth career start vs the AL** (**1-2, 3.04**, 23.2ip, 8er)...from **6/12-6/24** produced a career-high **14.2-inning scoreless streak**...in the 10-inning, 5-1 win on **6/12 at KC** threw **8.0 innings**, tying his career high and the most by a Reds pitcher this season...followed that with **7.0 shutout innings** in his next start, a 9-5 win on **6/19 vs Det**.

- The Reds' infield collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (387), batting average (.289) and on-base percentage (.368).
- The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 9 grand slams, tying the 2002 single-season club record (Adam Duvall 2, Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Joey Votto, Jesse Winker, pitcher Anthony DeSclafani, pitcher Michael Lorenzen, José Peraza)...DeSclafani's was the first grand slam by a Reds pitcher since Bob Purkey did it in 1959...Lorenzen hit his grand slam not as a pitcher but as a pinch hitter.

16 TUCKER BARNHART, c **Last 20 Reds Games: 16g, .302 (19-63), 2hr 9rbi**

- The switch-hitter ranks second in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.396, 19-48, 4 2b, 1 3b, 0hr, 8rbi, .500obp, .521slg).
- Last night went 0-for-3 (2bb), snapping his season-high 8-game hitting streak (9-31, .290, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...hit safely in 14 of his last 16 apps (19-63, .302, 2 2b, 2hr, 9rbi).
- In his last 42 apps beginning 5/6 is hitting .287, raising his season BA from .224 (48-167, 7 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 19rbi, .351obp).
- Beginning 5/22 made each of his last 28 starts batting second, his first career starts at that position in the order (32-120, .267, 3 2b, 2hr, 11rbi)...his 28 starts batting second are the most by a Reds catcher in that spot in the order since Smoky Burgess made 56 starts there in 1955.
- In 2017 became only the third catcher in Reds history to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award for defensive excellence, joining Johnny Edwards (1963, 1964) and 10-time winner Johnny Bench (1968-1977).

2 ALEX BLANDINO, inf **Last 20 Reds Games: 14g, .182 (4-22), 3rbi**

- As a pinch hitter in the eighth inning of Mon's 5-3 win vs WSox, his 2-out, 2-run double off Chris Volstad snapped the 3-3 tie...was his first career multi-RBI game.
- Has 2 hits in his last 3 plate apps following an 0-for-11 skid.
- Has made 25 starts (10gs at 3B, 10gs at 2B, 5gs at SS)...last started Sun vs Mil, played 2B in the 8-2 win.
- On 4/10 at Phi made his Major League debut with a start at 3B (0-3).
- Began the season at Class AAA Louisville, where he made 3 starts at 3B before he was promoted (0-8, 3r, 2bb, 2hbp, 1sb)...along with RHP Zack Weiss was recalled from Louisville on 4/9, when OF Scott Schebler and 3B Eugenio Suárez went on the 10-day disabled list.
- In March 2016 played for Team Nicaragua in the World Baseball Classic qualifier in Mexicali, Mexico...his father was born in Nicaragua.

38 CURT CASALI, c **Last 20 Reds Games: 6g .333 (6-18), 1 2b**

- His media guide bio is available on the home page at www.redspressbox.com.
- Has hit safely in 8 of his 12 apps for the Reds.
- Has made 7 starts, most recently in Sat's 12-3 win vs Mil.
- On 5/31 was acquired from the Rays for cash considerations...the next day was promoted to the 25-man roster, replacing C Tony Cruz (optioned to Louisville).
- On 6/2 at SD started in his first Major League appearance of the season...in the second inning homered off Eric Lauer to become the first player to homer in his first Reds plate appearance since Adam Duvall on 8/31/15 at Cubs (off Justin Grimm).
- Prior to this season had made 161 Major League apps, all for the Rays (30g in 2014, 38g in 2015, 84g in 2016, 9g in 2017).
- On 1/18 was signed by the Rangers to a minor league contract...on 3/21 was released...on 3/22 was signed by the Rays to a minor league contract...prior to his trade to the Reds spent the season at Class AAA Durham (28g, .274, 5 2b, 4hr, 20rbi).

4 BRANDON DIXON, inf/of **Last 20 Reds Games: 14g, .273 (3-11), 1hr, 2rbi**

- Made his 3 starts at 3 different positions (1B on 5/24 vs Pit, RF on 5/26 at Col, 2B on 6/7 vs Col).
- In the ninth inning on 6/16 at Pit, on his father's birthday, produced his only Major League home run (solo off Michael Feliz).
- On 5/22 was promoted from Louisville to fill the roster spot vacated by IF/OF Rosell Herrera, who was optioned to Louisville...that night vs Pit pinch hit in his Major League debut (P9 off Jameson Taillon).
- Was the fifth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera).
- Began the season at Louisville (37g, .326, 12 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 14tbi, 8st)...played 1B (11g), 2B (6g), 3B (4g), LF (10g) and RF (2g).
- When promoted on 5/22, among the International League leaders ranked fifth in both hitting and slugging percentage (.527) and T5th in stolen bases.

23 ADAM DUVAL, lf **Last 20 Reds Games: 19g, .271 (16-59), 2hr, 17rbi**

- In his last 14 apps beginning 6/19 is hitting .310, raising his season BA from .186 (13-42, 3 2b, 1hr, 12rbi, .396obp).
- In his last 25 apps beginning 6/5 is hitting .282, raising his season BA from .177 (20-71, 4 2b, 2hr, 18rbi, .363obp).
- Beginning with the 2016 season is 1 of only 5 Major Leaguers to produce at least 81 doubles, 76 HR and 252 RBI (Nolan Arenado, Mookie Betts, Paul Goldschmidt, Ryan Rizzo).
- Is on pace for 47 extra-base hits...is trying to join Hall of Famer Frank Robinson as the only players in Reds history to produce at least 70 XBH in 3 straight seasons.
- Has made 8 apps this season and 41 apps in his career at 1B...has made 26 career starts at 1B, including 4 this year (4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF, 6/12 at KC, 6/13 at KC).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b **Last 20 Reds Games: 18g, .314 (22-70), 1hr, 9rbi**

- Leads the National League in hitting (.336) and hitting on the road (.354)...no Reds batter has led the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the National League in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Is trying to become the first second baseman to lead the Reds in hits, runs and home runs since Cooperstown Hall of Famer Bid McPhee did it in 1886.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/25/17 is hitting .316 with 31 doubles, 1 3b, 30 HR and 113 RBI (.520slg, .362obp, .882ops).
- Has followed an 0-for-10 skid by reaching base safely in 7 of his last 8 plate apps (4 singles, 1 double, 2 walks)...in his last 2 apps is 5-for-7 (1 2b, 1rbi, 4r).
- Hit .298 in April (2hr, 14rbi), .398 in May (8hr, 24rbi) and .309 in June (3hr, 16rbi)...hit safely in 21 of his 25 apps in June, including a pair of 10-game hitting streaks.
- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.
- Since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds second baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month...has done it twice (8hr, 24rbi in May 2018 & 9hr, 24rbi in June 1017).
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf **Last 20 Reds Games: 20g, .281 (18-64), 5sb, 16r**

- Beginning 6/17 has hit safely in 11 of his last 15 apps (16-49, .327, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, 4sb, 12r, .370obp), raising his season BA from .187.
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and 61 starts batting ninth...his 61 starts batting ninth are the most by any player in the Major Leagues at that spot in the order...has made 50 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl...overall beginning 4/27 is hitting .231 (42-182, .302obp).
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 258, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- On 5/26 at Coors Field was timed at 10.39 seconds from home plate to third base, the quickest triple since Statcast started tracking in 2015.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss **Last 20 Reds Games: 19g, .284 (21-74), 3hr, 10rbi, 5sb**

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Ranks second in the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.5, Nick Markakis 10.0)...twice this season made at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout, from 4/15-4/25 (43pa) and from 5/22-6/2 (40pa)...current streak is at 4 plate apps.
- In his last 30 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .322 (38-118, 5 2b, 2 3b, 15rbi, .375obp), raising BA from .243 and including a 12-game hitting streak (5/26-6/9) that fell 1 shy of his career high.
- Last night went 0-for-3 (1bb), snapping a 6-game hitting streak that included four 2-hit games (10-26, .385, 1 2b, 2 3b, 3hr, 6rbi, 1sb).
- Wed and Thu homered in consecutive games for the first time in his career, and in Sun's 8-2 win vs Mil produced his first career grand slam (off Aaron Wilkerson)...was the ninth grand slam by a Reds batter this season, tying the 2002 club record.
- In the batting order hit first (18gs), second (33gs), seventh (21gs) and eighth (7gs).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of **Last 20 Reds Games: 17g, .270 (17-63), 3hr, 9rbi**

- Beginning 5/30 has hit safely in 23 of his last 26 apps (35-102, .343, 10 2b, 6hr, 16rbi, .618slg, .409obp), raising his season BA from .237.
- Beginning 5/28 has reached base safely in 26 of his last 28 apps (35-107, .327, 10 2b, 6hr, 15rbi, .589slg, .407obp), including a career-high 17-game on-base streak snapped on 6/19 vs Det when he pinch hit and finished 0-for-2.
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi) and .330 in June (4hr, 11rbi, .560slg, .392obp).
- The lefthanded batter is hitting .364 vs LHP (24-66, 3 2b, 2hr, 4rbi, .417obp).
- Has made 23 career starts batting leadoff, including 18 times this year (26-78, .333)...in his 23 career starts batting leadoff hit .330 (33-100), including .333 (32-96) in his 22 starts batting leadoff for the Reds...his career on-base percentage while batting first is .381.
- Has made a team-high 42 starts in RF, 13 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf **Last 20 Reds Games: 20g, .324 (24-74), 4 hr, 14rbi**

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb is tied for the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI (4.2) while among National League leaders ranks fourth in slugging percentage and eighth in batting average.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/13/17 is hitting .272 with 27 doubles, 2 triples, 32 HR and 107 RBI (.495slg, .376obp, .871ops).
- In his last 37 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .331, raising his season BA from .274 (47-142, 6 2b, 1 3b, 9hr, 29rbi, .577slg, .418obp, .995ops).
- Has a 6-game hitting streak (8-24, .333, 3 2b, 3rbi)...his 13-game hitting streak from 6/8-6/23 was the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- The Reds are 33-35 when he plays and 4-13 when he does not play.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b **Last 20 Reds Games: .242 (16-66, .432obp), 2hr, 16rbi**

- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and hitting vs RHP (.332) while ranking second in walks...is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time.
- Reached base safely in 72 of his 84 apps...his season-high 20-game on-base streak was snapped on 6/13 at KC (0-4).
- Through his third plate appearance on 6/6 was hitting .311 (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history...Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- In the Reds' 85 games has made 84 apps and 82 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%).

33 JESSE WINKER, of **Last 20 Reds Games: 19g, .264 (14-53), 3hr, 15rbi**

- Among the National League leaders ranks ninth in both on-base percentage and hitting with RISP (.333) and T4th in pinch hits (7)...leads NL rookies in walks while ranking second in hits, on-base percentage and multi-hit games (17).
- In his last 13 apps beginning 6/20 is hitting .375 (12-32, 3hr, 14rbi, 10bb, .656slg, .535obp, 1.191ops).
- Hit .305 through April (0hr, 9rbi, .414obp), .174 in May (1hr, 3rbi) and .308 in June (5hr, 20rbi, .432obp)...among National League leaders in June ranked third in on-base percentage, T9th in RBI and 20th in hitting.
- Has made 35 starts in RF, 24 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
