IT'S SEPTEMBER

- The Colorado Rockies continue their 10-game homestand, their longest of the season, with the first of a four-game series against Arizona.
- Colorado has a half-game edge over the Los Angeles Dodgers and lead the D-backs by 2.5 games in the National League West Division.
- This is the latest the Rockies have been alone in first place in the division since the 1995 Rockies held first place as late as Sept. 26.
- Following the homestand, the Rockies will travel for three games at San Francisco, three at Los Angeles-NL and three at Arizona before finishing the regular season with four home games against Philadelphia and three vs. Washington.

LEAVE THE SNAKES ON THE PLANE

- Colorado is 5-7 vs. Arizona this year, 2-4 in Denver and 3-3 at Chase Field ... the Rockies are 4-1 the past five games vs. the Snakes after going 1-6 the first seven.
- The Rockies have won two consecutive games at home vs Arizona after losing nine straight in Denver from June 21, 2017 to July 10, 2018.
- The Rockies have not won a season series vs. Arizona since going 10-9 in 2014.
- Charlie Blackmon is a .337 hitter vs. Arizona, going 133-for-395 ... that ranks tied for sixth among active players ... Carlos González has 29 homers, third among active players ... Nolan Arenado and Charlie Blackmon each have 19 homers vs. the D-backs, ranking tied for fifth among active players ... González's 89 career RBI vs. Arizona rank third among active players.

MARQ ZONE

- According to *STATS*, German Márquez set the Rockies record for most strikeouts in a three-start span (Aug. 25-Sept. 4) with 33, surpassing Pedro Astacio's 2000 mark of 32 (May 13, 2000-May 24, 2000) ... Jon Gray fanned 32 over three games this year, June 12-22 ... the most strikeouts in a four-start span in Rockies history is 42, set by Astacio in 2000.

WHO'S THE TORTOISE?

- The Rockies' .549 winning percentage through 142 games (78-64) is tied with the 2010 team for the second-highest mark in franchise history, behind the 2009 club (.577, 82-60) ... this is the only time through 142 games that the Rockies have been in first place.
- The Rockies were as many as eight games back after play on June 28 ... since and including that date, have gone 40-22 (.645), the highest winning percentage in the National League and the third-best clip in the Majors.

BETTER HOMES AND ROOFTOPS

- Since an eight-game home losing streak ended June 19, the Rockies are 27-12 at Coors Field (.692), the second-best home winning percentage in the NL over that span.
- Their 3.41 home ERA (298.0 IP, 113 ER) since July 1 ranks third in the league ... Rockies starters have posted a 3.36 home ERA (193.0 IP, 72 ER) over that span.

TO BE THE BEST...

- Each of the Rockies next 13 games are against National League West opponents: three against San Francisco, three against Los Angeles-NL and seven against Arizona.
- Are 31-27 against teams below .500 and 47-37 against clubs with winning records, tied for the third-most victories against .500 or better clubs in MLB.

BABY COME BACK

- The Rockies' 41 come-from-behind wins are second in the NL and third in the Majors ... 41 is tied for the fourth most in franchise history (2004, 2009, 2011).

MID-SUMMER MAGIC

- Since June 28, the Rockies have gone a combined 30-6 when Kyle Freeland (12-1), Jon Gray (9-2) and German Márquez (9-3) start on the mound.
- Freeland (2.42) and Márquez (2.55) rank fifth and seventh, respectively, in ERA in the NL over that span ... Márquez's 100 strikeouts since June 28 are third in the National League.

LOCAL BOY DONE GOOD

- Saturday, Kyle Freeland allowed one run over six innings of work for his 20th quality start of the season ... he is the fourth pitcher (fifth time) in Rockies history with 20 or more quality starts in a single season (also: Jason Jennings, 20 in 2006; Jason Marquis, 21 in 2009; Ubaldo Jimenez, 24 in 2009 and 25 in 2010).
- Freeland's 2.91 ERA (176.1 IP, 57 ER) ranks fifth in the NL ... his 2.21 (81.1 IP, 20 ER) ERA at Coors Field is the fourth-lowest home ERA in the NL, seventh-lowest in MLB.

GO LONG

- The 814.1 innings by Colorado's starters rank third in the NL and fifth in the Majors ... the Rockies' 453.2 innings out of the bullpen are last in the NL and 28th in MLB.

ABOVE AVERAGE

- Per the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the Rockies are the first team in MLB history to use four different players at any point in the season who had previously won a batting title for that franchise ... Charlie Blackmon (2017), DJ LeMahieu (2016), Carlos González (2010) and Matt Holliday (2007) have each won batting titles with the Rockies.

NO CLICHÉ

- Trevor Story ranks first in the NL in total bases (301), tied for first in extra-base hits (75), tied for second in doubles (39), fourth in RBI (96), tied for sixth in home runs (31), sixth in hits (159), and tied for fifth in stolen bases (25).
- The 301 total bases are the most for a shortstop in a single season in franchise history (previous: Troy Tulowitzki, 300 in 2009).
- Story is the seventh player in franchise history to hit at least 25 home runs and steal at least 25 stolen bases, the first since Carlos González in 2010 ... he is the first infielder in franchise history to accomplish the feat.

MINOR FEATS

- The Rockies had three Minor League players named Most Valuable Player of their league ... Josh Fuentes, a first cousin of Nolan Arenado, was named MVP of the Triple-A Pacific Coast League, Casey Golden was named MVP of the Low-A South Atlantic League and Coco Montes was named MVP of the Rookie Level Pioneer League.
- Taking two of three from Ogden to win the South Division title, Grand Junction advanced to the Pioneer League Championship against Great Falls.
- The Lancaster JetHawks had their season end Saturday as they lost the best of five South Division Finals 3-1 to Rancho Cucamonga.

GERMAN ANDRES MÁRQUEZ

- 23-year-old right-hander a member of his second career Opening Day roster in 2018 ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
Made his Major League debut on Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
Named to the Topps All-Star Rookie Team last year, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
Pronounced HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z.

SIT EM DOWN

- Ranks fifth in the NL with 184 strikeouts, the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history ... is one strikeout from passing Jon Gray (185 strikeouts, 2016), for sixth-most in franchise history.
His 10.08 strikeouts-per-nine-innings ranks sixth in the NL, one of six pitchers with a SO/9 over 10 ... 3.54 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks 10th in NL.
Struck out 11 batters in his last start after striking out a career-high 13 hitters in the previous start ... first player in franchise history to strikeout out 11-plus hitters in consecutive starts, the fourth to record double-digit strikeouts in back-to-back games (last: Jon Gray, Sept. 17-23, 2016).
His 33 strikeouts over his last three games are the most over a three-game span in franchise history ... per STATS, the franchise record for strikeouts over a four-start span is 42, set by Pedro Astacio in 2000.

BE LIKE MÁRQ

- Last pitched on Sept. 4 vs. San Francisco and did not factor into the 6-2 win after pitching 6.2 innings and allowing two runs on seven hits with one home run, two walks and 11 strikeouts.
Has three straight no-decisions despite allowing just four runs over 21.2 innings (1.66 ERA) and striking out 33 batters ... the Rockies have won two of his last three games pitched.

QUALITY MÁRQ

- Has pitched eight consecutive quality starts since July 29, the longest streak by a Rockies pitcher since Ubaldo Jimenez had a franchise record 14-start quality start streak to begin the 2010 season ... besides Jimenez, who also had a 12 start quality start streak in 2009, the only other Rockies pitcher to have an eight-start quality start streak was Jeff Francis, who accomplished the feat across three seasons from Aug. 13, 2008-May 22, 2010.
Has gone 3-1 with a 2.24 ERA (56.1 IP, 14 ER), 12 walks and 72 strikeouts over that span, pitching at least seven innings in six of the eight starts ... has limited opponents to a .189 batting average (38-for-201) with four home runs allowed ... snapped his five straight homerless streak (the longest of his career) in his last outing, after allowing a home run in the seventh inning to Gorkys Hernández.
Leads the National League in strikeouts since beginning the streak on July 29 ... ranks 10th in the league in ERA (2.24) and eighth in opponent batting average (.189).

CATCH THE FEVER

- The Rockies have gone 9-3 over his last 12 starts since June 30 ... he has gone 6-1 with a 2.55 ERA (81.1 IP, 23 ER) over that span ... over that time frame, ranks among NL leaders in strikeouts (100-3rd), opponent batting average (.197-6th), ERA (2.55-7th) and wins (6-T8th).
His 13 strikeouts on Aug. 20 against the Padres are tied for the third-most in franchise history, the most for a Rockies pitcher since Jon Gray's 16-strikeout performance vs. San Diego on Sept. 17, 2016 ... fifth pitcher in franchise history to strikeout out at least 13 batters (Gray, Ubaldo Jimenez, Shawn Chacon, Darryl Kile).

FIFTH TIMES A CHARM

- Will be facing the Diamondbacks for the fifth time this season, the third time at home ... is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (20.0 IP, 12 ER) against Arizona this year, including 1-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 IP, 7 ER) at home ... the Rockies have gone 3-1 vs. the D-backs with Márquez on the mound, 2-0 at home.
Is 1-4 in his career against Arizona with a 4.62 ERA (55.1 IP, 29 ER), including 1-3 with a 5.46 ERA (28.0 IP, 17 ER) at home.
Allowed four home runs in 20.0 IP this season, three of which came from the his only loss against Arizona this year on June 8 at Coors Field.

COORS HEAVY

- Is 4-6 (Rockies 7-7) with a 5.50 ERA (75.1 IP, 46 ER), 29 walks and 88 strikeouts in 14 starts at home this season ... six quality starts at home with six games of eight-plus strikeouts ... 88 strikeouts at home are tied for eighth in the NL.
Each of his past five starts at home have been quality, going 2-1 with a 2.43 ERA (33.1 IP, 9 ER), eight walks and 46 strikeouts over that span.
In 30 career appearances, 29 starts, at Coors Field, is 11-9 with a 4.83 ERA (167.2 IP, 90 ER) ... Rockies are 17-12 when he starts at home.

ALL AROUND

- Has gone 7-3 with a 2.83 ERA (89.0 IP, 28 ER), 23 walks and 96 strikeouts in 14 road starts this season.
His road ERA (89.0 IP, 28 ER) this year ranks sixth in the NL ... is tied for sixth in the NL with seven road wins ... his .189 (61-for-322) opponents' batting average against on the road is fourth in the league.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

- Allowed 29 of his 79 runs in the first inning (second-most are 11 in the third and fifth innings) ... has given up a run in the first inning in 17 of his 28 starts, including 10 of his 14 home starts ... opponents are batting .344 (43-for-125) with six of his 21 home runs allowed in the first.

SILVER ANNIVERSARY SLUGGER

- His .294 (15-for-51) batting average leads all Major League pitchers (minimum 40 AB, excluding Shohei Ohtani) ... also leads the Majors with a .353 slugging percentage and ranks second in hits with 15 ... tied for fourth with five RBI.

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

- Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29 (9 SO, 9 SO, 10 SO).
