TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs Bob Rosenberg's Cubs and Game 2 (1-0) of a 10-day, 9-game road trip heading into the All-Star break that includes upcoming series at Cle's Progressive Field (3g) and at StL's Busch Stadium (off day, 3g)...the Redlegs are coming off a 4-3 homestand vs the first-place Brewers (2-2) and the White Sox (2-1).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds' 5-game winning streak is their longest vs the Cubs since 6/25-7/9, 2014...haven't won 6 straight vs Chi since 4/24-5/25, 2013...the Reds and Cubs are playing the first of their 3 series and second of their 10 games at Wrigley Field...the Cubs won 11 of the previous 15 series...the Cubs won 14 of the last 20 games played at Wrigley Field, including 10 of the last 14 games here...Billy Hamilton has 33 stolen bases vs the Cubs, the most by a Reds player vs Chi in the live ball era (Barry Larkin, 32)...over the previous 3 seasons (2015-2017), the Cubs' .702 winning percentage vs the Reds (40-17) was the best by any team against any division opponent...Reds vs Cubs information is on media guide Page 320.

INDIANS UP NEXT: The Redlegs and Tribe split last season's 4-game series...Cin won or tied 12 of the first 20 Ohio Cup season series, including 9 of the last 12, but lost 2 of the last 3 season series (1-5, 0-4, 2-2)...beginning in 2011, the Indians have won 6 of the last 7g at Progressive Field and 15 of the last 17 games there...beginning in 2002 and with a minimum of 40 games played, Cin's .317 winning percentage at Progressive Field (13-28) is its lowest at any current road ballpark...Reds vs Indians info on Page 332.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: This season the Reds are 8-2 vs the American League (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 2-1 vs WSox), including a 6-game winning streak vs the AL from 4/29-7/2 that ranks as their longest interleague winning streak...their 2-1 series win at Min's Target Field in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a 3-0 series sweep at Hou's Minute Maid Park in September 2013...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 146-199 all-time vs the AL, at .423 the second-lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team (SD, 151-213, .415)...Cin hasn't produced a winning record vs the American League since 2013 (11-9)...in 5 seasons since then are 31-59 vs AL (.344)...Reds vs AL opponents information is on media guide Page 332.

APRIL 19: The Reds are 36-34 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins... bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' staff as interim pitching coach.

STREAKING: The Reds' active 5-series unbeaten streak (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cws) is their longest since a 6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016 (2-1 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Atl, 2-1 vs Ari, 2-1 at SF, 2-1 at SD, 2-1 vs StL)...in fifth place since the fourth day of the season, the Reds have pulled to within 1.5 games of the fourth-place Pirates... from 6/21-7/1 the Redlegs played 3 consecutive series vs first-place teams and went 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl and 2-2 vs Mil.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' infield collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits (401), batting average (.289) and on-base percentage (.368)...1B Joey Votto leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking third in walks...2B Scooter Gennett leads the league in hitting...3B Eugenio Suárez is tied for the NL lead in RBI and leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI...he also ranks second in the NL in slugging percentage and seventh in batting average...SS José Peraza is tied for the league lead in most plate apps per strikeout.

DOT...DOT...DOT: Reds prospects RHP Hunter Greene and OF Taylor Trammell are on the U.S. roster for the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game (Sun, 7/15, 4:00et, MLB Network)...the Reds trailed in 8 of their last 12 victories.

REHABBING: RHP Homer Bailey is 4 apps into a rehabilitation assignment at Louisville (4gs, 1-2, 6.35, 22.2ip, 29h, 16er, 2bb, 14k, 4hr, 1hbp)...he has been disabled since 6/2 with right knee inflammation...made his most recent start Tue vs Indianapolis and earned the 3-2 win (6.2ip, 7h, 1er, 0bb, 8k, 103 pitches, 69 strikes).

RUTHIAN: In his last 7 plate apps RHP Michael Lorenzen singled, homered (pinch hit), walked, homered, homered (pinch-hit grand slam), struck out and struck out...he became the first Major League pitcher to homer in 3 consecutive at bats since Col's Mike Hampton in 2001...in his career as a pinch hitter Lorenzen is 4-for-12 with 3 HR (4/6/17 off Pit's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery, grand slam on 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes), including 3-for-5 this season (2hr, 5rbi)...5 times Lorenzen has come off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games.

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with 9 grand slams, tying the 2002 franchise single-season record and including a streak of 6 slams over a 17-game span from 6/13-7/1...the 1996 Expos, 1997 Braves and 2006 Mets are the only other teams in Major League history to produce at least 6 grand slams over a 17-day span...the 9 grand slams tie the 2010 Yankees for most ever prior to the All-Star break...the National League record for grand slams in a season is 12 (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is 14 (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds' 9 grand slams were hit by Adam Duvall (2), Scooter Gennett, Eugenio Suárez, Joey Votto, Jesse Winker, pitcher Anthony DeSclafani, Michael Lorenzen (pinch-hit) and José Peraza...on 6/23 vs Chi (off Brian Duensing), DeSclafani became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a grand slam (Bob Purkey 1959, Al Hollingsworth 1936, Ice Box Chamberlain 1892)...Lorenzen on 6/30 off Mil's Jacob Barnes became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since Tommy Byrne of the WSox on 5/16/1953 at NYY.

RED HOTS

Matt Harvey this afternoon is making his 11th appearance and start for the Reds...will be his **sixth career** appearance and **start** vs the **Cubs**, his second of the season, and his **fourth career start** at **Wrigley Field**...in his **last 4 starts** this season is **3-1, 2.31** and in his **last 3 starts** is **3-0, 1.47**...is his longest winning streak since he won his **first 5 starts** in **2015**...in Sun's **8-2 win vs Mil** didn't return after a 54-minute rain delay with 2 outs in the top of the sixth inning...left leading, 3-0...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00** in **4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on **5/5**...on **5/8** was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...from **2012-2018** for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66** in **104 starts** and **5 relief apps**.

- The switch-hitter ranks third in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.373, 19-51, 4 2b, 1 3b, 0hr, 8rbi, .475obp, .490slg).
- In his last 3 apps is 0-for-10 (2bb) following a season-high 8-game hitting streak (9-31, .290, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...over 4 apps is hitless in his last 12 at bats, 1 shy of his season high (0-13, 5/14-5/19).

- In 18 apps beginning 6/17 is hitting .351 (20-57, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, 5sb, 14r), raising his season BA from .187.

- On 6/27 at Atl and 6/28 vs Mil homered in consecutive games for the first time in his career, and in Sun's 8-2 win vs Mil produced his first career grand slam (off Aaron Wilkerson)...was the ninth grand slam by a Reds batter this season, tying the 2002 club record.
- In the batting order hit first (20gs), second (33gs), seventh (21gs) and eighth (8gs).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of **Last 23 Reds Games: .247 (18-73), 3hr, 9rbi**

- In his last 29 apps beginning 5/30 is hitting .321, raising his season BA from .237 (36-112, 10 2b, 6hr, 15rbi).
- The lefthanded batter ranks sixth in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.338, 24-71, 3 2b, 2hr, 4rbi).
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi) and .330 in June (4hr, 11rbi, .560slg, .392obp).
- Has made 24 career starts batting leadoff, including 19 times this year (26-82, .317)...in his 24 career starts batting leadoff hit .317 (33-104), including .320 (32-100) in his 23 starts batting leadoff for the Reds...his career on-base percentage while batting first is .374.
- Has made a team-high 44 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf **Last 23 Reds Games: .329 (28-85), 5hr, 16rbi**

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb is tied for the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI (4.2) while among National League leaders ranks second in slugging percentage and seventh in batting average.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/17/17 is hitting .274 with 26 doubles, 2 triples, 33 HR and 109 RBI (.499slg, .378obp).
- Has a 9-game hitting streak (12-35, .343, 3 2b, 1hr, 5rbi)...his 13-game hitting streak from 6/8-6/23 was the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- In his last 40 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .333, raising his season BA from .274 (51-153, 6 2b, 1 3b, 10hr, 31rbi).
- The Reds are 35-36 when he plays and 4-13 when he does not play.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b **Last 23 Reds Games: .244 (19-78), 2hr, 16rbi**

- Leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking third in walks and second in hitting vs RHP (.330)...is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time.
- His 103 hits at Wrigley Field are the most by any active opposing player (Ryan Braun 2nd, 102).
- Reached base safely in 75 of his 87 apps, including an active streak of 3 games...his season-high 20-game on-base streak was snapped on 6/13 at KC (0-4).
- Through his third plate appearance on 6/6 was hitting .311 (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history...Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- In the Reds' 88 games has made 87 apps and 85 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.

33 JESSE WINKER, of **Last 22 Reds Games: .305 (18-59), 3hr, 17rbi**

- Among the National League leaders ranks sixth in on-base percentage and seventh in hitting with RISP (.333)...leads NL rookies in walks while ranking second in hits, on-base percentage and multi-hit games (17).
- Produced 2 hits in each of his last 2 apps (4-6, 2 2b, 2rbi).
- In his last 15 apps beginning 6/20 is hitting .421 (16-38, 2 2b, 3hr, 16rbi, 12bb, .711slg, .560obp, 1.2710ps).
- Hit .305 through April (Ohr, 9rbi, .414obp), .174 in May (1hr, 3rbi) and .308 in June (5hr, 20rbi, .432obp)...among National League leaders in June ranked third in on-base percentage, 79th in RBI and 20th in hitting.
- Has made 37 starts in RF, 24 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
