PITTSBURGH PIRATES (71-72) vs. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (80-64)

September 11, 2018 at Busch Stadium, St. Louis, MO --- GAME #144/ROAD #70

RHP JOE MUSGROVE (6-8, 3.75 ERA) vs. RHP MILES MIKOLAS (14-4, 3.06 ERA)

THE PIRATES...began their seven-day, six-game road trip with an 8-7 last at bat loss Monday night...Had their five-game winning streak come to an end with Monday's loss...Have gone 18-23 in their last 41 games after winning 11 in a row between 7/11-24...Have produced a 31-25 record since July 7 and have gone 35-31 in their last 66 games, dating back to 6/25...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 67-76 after 143 games in 2017 (67-77 after 144).

WE SHALL NEVER FORGET: Major League Baseball and all 30 clubs will conduct 9/11 commemorations throughout the league today as part of baseball's ongoing effort to honor and remember those whose lives were affected or lost on that tragic day... A "We Shall Not Forget" silhouetted batter ribbon will be displayed throughout ballparks and on special lineup cards and base jewels...On-field personnel including players, coaches and umpires will wear caps with a side patch of the ribbon during games...MLB will donate all of its royalties from the sales of the caps to the National September 11 Memorial & Museum, the Pentagon Memorial Fund and the Flight 93 National Memorial.

A RARE LOSS: Last night the Pirates lost when leading after seven innings for just the third time this season...Pittsburgh's 60-3 record when leading after seven frames is the third-best in the National League and sixth-best in all of MLB, trailing only the A's (63-0), Brewers (69-3), Yankees (68-3), Cubs (67-3) and Red Sox (81-4)...Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Joe Musgrove gets the start tonight in the second game of this series against the RedBirds... This is the second time in three starts Musgrove has faced St. Louis (he lost a 5-0 decision to John Gant in Pittsburgh's last trip here on August 30)...Tonight will be Joe's 18th start of the season; his previous high was 15 as a member of the Astros in 2017...In his last outing on September 4 vs. the Reds, he struck out eight batters and allowed two runs over 6.1 innings while winning a 7-3 decision against Cody Reed.

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: Last night the Pirates hit at least three home runs in a game for the 15th time this season (first since August 9 at San Francisco), including the 12th time on the road...It marked the first time this season the Bucs went deep at least three times in a game and lost.

SELECT COMPANY: With 19 home runs and 30 stolen bases, Starling Marte is one homer shy of becoming just the third player in team history to produce at least 20 home runs and 30 steals in the same season...Barry Bonds accomplished the feat four times (1987, 1990-92) and Andy Van Slyke did it twice (1987-88).

BULLPEN NOTES: Monday night Edgar Santana surrendered just the 45th home run allowed by the Pirates bullpen this season; that's the second-fewest in all of Major League Baseball (Houston's relievers have served up a Major League-low 41 homers)...The last season Pittsburgh's bullpen gave up the fewest home runs in all of MLB was 2015 when the team allowed 38; tied with Cleveland and Miami for fewest in all of MLB.

BELL OF LATE: Josh Bell has gone 5-for-10 with a double, two home runs and four RBI overall in his last three games, including a 3-for-5 showing Monday...Last night was Bell's seventh game this season with at least three hits and his first since August 10 at San Francisco.

THIS MONTH: The Pirates are batting .262 this month, which ranks fourth among all National League teams behind the Rockies (.291), Nationals (.266) and Reds (.265)...Overall this season, Pittsburgh ranks fifth among all National League teams with a .254 batting average.

SAVING THE DAY: All-Star closer Felipe Vázquez has converted each of his last 21 save opportunities, which is tied with Kenley Jansen for the longest streak in the National League this season...Vázquez is one of eight pitchers - and the only lefthander - to earn 31 or more saves in a single season with the Pirates...His 52 saves in a Pittsburgh uniform rank 10th all time (since saves became official in 1969); Bill Landrum is ninth on the list with 56.

CAPTAIN RED BEARD: Colin Moran enters today's action ranked fourth among all rookies in the Majors with 106 hits... Monday night Moran's solo home run off Adam Wainwright was his eighth RBI of the season against St. Louis, which is tied with Cincinnati for his most vs. any team.

FRAZIER EN FUEGO: Adam Frazier is hitting .350 (43-for-123) with 15 doubles, five home runs and 21 RBI in 38 games since being recalled on July 25...Since July 25, his .350 average ranks sixth in all of MLB, trailing only Justin Turner (.377), Ben Zobrist (.363), Mallex Smith (.358), J.D. Martinez (.351) and Paul Goldschmidt (.350).

STRIKING NUMBERS: Pittsburgh's bullpen has recorded 518 strikeouts, surpassing its total from the 2017 campaign (495)... The 518 strikeouts by the bullpen rank fourth among all National League teams, trailing only San Diego (625), Milwaukee (601) and Los Angeles (551)...The club record for most strikeouts in a season by the bullpen is 536, which was established in 2016.

ROOKIE ROLLING: Richard Rodríguez leads all National League rookie relief pitchers in strikeouts (76)...He has whiffed 19 batters in his last 11.1 innings of work and is averaging 11.2 Ks per 9.0ip this season...Rodríguez' 76 strikeouts are the most by a Pirates rookie reliever since Blas Minor fanned 84 batters in 1993.

September 11, 2013: Justin Morneau went 4-for-5 with two runs scored in a 7-5 Pirates win over the Texas Rangers in Arlington. Pittsburgh trailed 5-4 entering the sixth inning when the Pirates struck twice to take the lead. Each starting position player reached base safely in the victory and Clint Barmes hit his fifth homer of the year in the eighth to pad the Bucs' lead. A.J. Burnett earned his eighth win of the year and Kyle Farnsworth picked up his first save with the Pirates.

JAMESON TAILLON: The 26-year-old righthander will be making his career-high 29th start of the season tomorrow...Allowed one run in 5.0 innings while winning a 3-2 decision in his last start Wednesday vs. the Reds...Has made 18 straight starts allowing three earned runs or less and in 25 of his 28 starts overall...Had a complete-game victory in Colorado on 8/7...Has pitched into the sixth inning 16 times in his last 20 outings...Has posted a 2.55 ERA (70.2ip/20er) in his last 11 starts overall...Is 6-2 with a 2.48 ERA (58.0ip/16er) in nine starts since the All-Star break...Has gone 3-1 in his last four road starts...Has posted a 12-1 record this season when he receives three runs of support or more in a game.
