<u>LEADING OFF</u>: Halos open a six-game trip to Tampa Bay (7/31-8/2) & Cleveland (8/3-5)...LAA has won four of last five...Club is 5-5 since the break, 11-12 this month & 13-13 last 26 games...Halos need a victory tonight to avoid a third straight sub-.500 month...
Club is in fourth place, -12.5 in A.L. West (-9.5 for 2nd wild card)...
LAA is 10-21 when a lefty starts (44-32 vs. RHS)...Following the trip, Angels will host Detroit (8/6-8) & Oakland (8/10-12).

HALO TO YOU: Last night, Angels acquired RHP Ty Buttrey and LHP Williams Jerez from Boston in exchange for lan Kinsler...Buttrey, 25, was 1-1 with a save & 2.25 ERA (44 IP/11 ER; 14 BB/64 K) in 32 games for Triple-A Pawtucket...The Matthews, NC native was named by Baseball America as having best changeup in system & Boston's #19 prospect by MLB.com...Jerez, 26, went 2-1 with five saves & 3.68 ERA (51.1 IP/21 ER; 67 K) in 33 games with Paw Sox... The Dominican native ranked #23 in Red Sox system by MLB.com.

SKAGGS TONIGHT: Tyler Skaggs has allowed one earned run or less in seven of his last eight starts (1.44 ERA; 50 IP - 8 ER) & has not allowed a HR in the eight-game span... 1.44 ERA since June 3rd (min. 50 IP) ranks 2nd among MLB starters (Chris Sale; 0.75 ERA).

LOOKING AHEAD: 36 of 53 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 at home, 7 on road), 10 against Houston (3 at home, 7 on road), nine against Oakland (6 at home, 3 on road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...17 of 28 games in August on road... LAA plays seven interleague games next month (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI and 8/27-28 vs. COL).

THERE GO JO: Angels' top prospect OF Jo Adell was promoted to Double-A Mobile yesterday...In 82 combined single-A games, he batted .300 (100/333) with 69 runs, 26 doubles, four triples, 18 HR, 71 RBI & 13 SB...A first round pick in 2017 (10th overall), Adell is rated the 11th overall prospect as by Baseball America.

<u>POP AT THE TROP</u>: Angels' top offensive performers in careers at Tropicana Field are Andrelton Simmons (.438; 14/32, 5 R, 6 2B, 3B & 6 RBI in 9 G) & Mike Trout (.344; 21/61, 15 R, 5 2B, 5 HR & 11 RBI in 17 G)...Ironically, Simmons (.349; 59/169, 2nd in A.L.) & Trout (.330; 61/185, 5th in A.L.) are LAA's top road hitters this season.

<u>SAY HEY TO THE KID</u>: With his next HR, **Mike Trout** will join **Willie Mays** as only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign or younger (**Trout** would be first in A.L. history)...If **Trout** reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be his third campaign doing so (**Barry Bonds** in 1991 is only other in MLB to accomplish).

#27 TURNS 27: Mike Trout turns 27 on August 7th...He is one of four players with at least 1,100 hits & 600 walks before turning 27, joining Jimmie Foxx, Mel Ott, & Mickey Mantle...Also joins Mantle, Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 walks & 225 HR prior to 27th birthday...His 230 HRs rank ninth all-time by a player before turning 27, trailing only Alex Rodriguez (273), Foxx (266), Mathews (253), Albert Pujols (250), Mantle (249), Ott (242), Ken Griffey Jr. (238) & Frank Robinson (235).

WORTH THE WAIT: After toiling for 12 years in the minors, catcher Francisco Arcia made his MLB debut Thursday (2-4, R, HR, 4 RBI), first Angel with four RBI in big league debut (13th in A.L. history)... On Saturday, he posted two doubles, HR & six RBI... His 10 RBI thru first two career games are an MLB record, passing Joe Cunningham (9 in 1954 with St. Louis); previous fastest to 10 RBI was Trevor Story (11 RBI thru first 4 games)... Also tied MLB record (6th player) with four XBH thru first two games... Arcia is just 2nd MLB player w/ 4+ RBI in first two career games (also Cunningham).

BATS ARE HAPPENING: Since the All-Star break, Halos lead MLB with 27 doubles, rank second in MLB with 44 extra-base hits, third in runs (63) & RBI (62) and fourth with .506 slugging pct...Angels have scored 62 runs last eight games (7.8 per)...In the eight contests, LAA batting .308 (86/279) with 42 XBH (25 2B, 3B, 16 HR), including a .338 (26/77) clip with RISP...LAA has outscored opponents 52-24 in last five victories (11+ runs in four of five wins)...Club has 62 runs over last eight games (56 R previous 16 G).

<u>@ TAMPA BAY:</u> Rays lead 2018 season series 3-1...Halos are just 2-10 in last 12 home games vs. Tampa Bay but 10-5 in last 15 contests at Tropicana Field...Rays claimed 2017 season series 4-3... Angels haven't won a season series since 2014...LHP Jose Alvarez has nine career outings against Rays without allowing an earned run (7.2 IP, 5 H, 0 ER, 2 BB, 2 IBB, 12 K).

<u>THE NEW ME</u>: In 34 games since returning from D.L., **Kole Calhoun** is batting .283 (34/120) with 25 runs, nine doubles, 11 HR & 26 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .201...*In last 15 games, hitting* .328 (19/58) with 15 runs, six doubles, seven HR & 17 RBI.

SHELVED: 22 players were placed on the disabled list in the first half (most in MLB)...Angels have 11 players currently on DL...Average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 33 games...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...52 players used for LAA this season, most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers have played (12 starters), most in team history thru 107 games (LAA record 31 pitchers in '17).

<u>MVP x 3?</u> Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in *Top 5 in MLB* in several offensive categories, including HR (3^{rd} ; 29), runs (3^{rd} ; 80), runs created (1^{st} ; 117), total bases ($T4^{th}$; 226), times on base (1^{st} ; 218), walks (1^{st} ; 98), IBB (1^{st} ; 20), OBP (1^{st} ; .462), SLG (4^{th} ; .621), OPS (1^{st} ; 1.083), OPS+ (1^{st} ; 197.0) and offensive WAR (7.2; 1^{st}).

WALK TALK: Trout's 98 walks are most in club history through 107 games (club record for a season is 116 by Trout in 2016)...He is the first MLB player with at least 98 walks thru 107 games since Barry Bonds (145) in 2004...First Angel with three 4+ walk games in a season...Fourth player in A.L. history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB in a season, joining Ichiro Suzuki (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) and Reggie Jackson (1974)...Since 2012, he leads A.L. in multi-walk games (143) and has 25 such games in 2018.

GLOVE STORY: LAA's 54 errors are tied for fourth-fewest in A.L. while Club ranks tied for third in circuit with .986 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB having turned 116 double plays...Catchers own a 42.2% caught stealing pct. (19 of 45), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...A. Simmons leads A.L. shortstops with 145 putouts and is tied for second-fewest errors (7; min. 90 GS)...Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct.

PITCHING POINTS: Despite a 3.80 team ERA (653.2 IP – 276 ER) since May 6th (6th in A.L.), LAA has gone 34-40 in the span...3.89 team ERA on season ranks fourth in A.L..Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 20.1% to score (37 of 184)...LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 107 affairs (5th in A.L. with 947 K)...Bullpen has logged 399.2 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Halos have allowed 141 HRs, tied for second-most in A.L..Since 2017, Jose Alvarez & Blake Parker have each pitched in 118 games, tied for third-most in A.L. in span.

THIS N' THAT: A. Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 19.90 (398 PA/20 K)...He also leads MLB batting .306 (38/124) with two strikes... Angels' 146 HRs hit are third-most in MLB...Trout's 7.9 WAR leads MLB...Justin Upton is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013...Mike Scioscia (1,624 wins) is in sole possession of 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)... Shohei Ohtani is first Angel with first nine career HRs hit at home (all against RHP)...Just second rookie in A.L. history with each of first nine HR at home (Bill Akers, 1930 w/ Det.)...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: Justin Upton has hit in 11 of 14 games batting .373 (19/51; 9 R, 2 2B, 4 HR, 13 RBI)...Albert Pujols has eight extra-base hits (5 HR, 3 2B) & eight RBI his last 11 games...Andrew Heaney is 6-1 with a 1.60 ERA (62 IP – 11 ER) across last nine home starts...1.60 ERA at home since April 27 leads A.L...Has limited opponents to a 1.86 clip (41/220) during the stretch (14 BB/50 K)...David Fletcher has hit in eight of nine (five multi-hit games) batting .429 (15/35) with eight runs, four doubles & four RBI.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,063 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...*He is 10 hits shy of becoming 1 of 9 players all-time with 1,000 hit is each league.*..On Aug. 25th, he passed Ken Griffey Jr. (630 HR) for sole possession of sixth on all-time HR list (631)...He is one of four players all-time with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,972 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1,283 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mays is fifth with 1,323 XBH)... Only two players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 28 RBI shy).

INDIANS ON DECK: Angels have dropped last 10 games at Progressive Field and are 2-12 at the venue last 14 games there... Halos lead 2018 season series 2-1 (clubs met April 2-4 at Angel Stadium)...Angels' 13-2 win on April 3rd snapped a 12-game losing streak to Cleveland (matched longest in Club history vs. one team)... LAA has dropped 16 of last 19 overall to Indians.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

July 31

(1998) Garret Anderson's club record hit streak reaches 28 games but ends the following day; in that same game, Troy Glaus make his ML debut and doubles off Bret Saberhagen in his first AB; (1986) Brian Downing & Bob Boone each hit grand slam HRs at Oakland to tie the MLB record; (2005) The Molina brothers (Bengie & Jose) each hit HRs off Randy Johnson at NYY, first siblings to homer in same game for same team since Giambi bros (Jason & Jeremy), Aug. 11, 2001 vs. NYY.

August 1

(2012) Mike Trout named A.L. Player of the month & Rookie of the Month for July 2012, first A.L. player to win both awards in same month...Trout hit .392 (38/97) with 32 runs, 10 HR, six doubles, two triples, 23 RBI & nine SB in 25 games...32 runs scored tied the A.L. rookie record for July.

In last eight starts, is 5-2 with a 1.44 ERA (50 IP - 8 ER)

- Making 20th start of the season and 11th on the road...ls in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made
 Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- WELCOME BACK: Making fourth start for Angels since being reinstated from disabled list on July 12...Missed nine
 games with a right adductor strain (was scratched from scheduled start on June 21 with right hamstring tightness, but
 made two more starts before being placed on the DL).
- THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD: Has pitched to a 5-2 record and 2.11 ERA (59.2 IP 14 ER) on the road this season (third best road ERA in A.L. behind Justin Verlander and Chris Sale), compared with a 3-4 record and 3.22 ERA (50.1 IP 18 ER) at home.
- OFF THE BOARDS: Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in 15 of 19 starts this season...Had streak of six straight starts allowing one-or-fewer earned runs from June 3 July 12, which was tied for second longest in Angels history.
- INSIDE THE PARK: Has not allowed a home run across last 52 innings pitched, (including each of last eight starts) after yielding six HR in previous four starts (22 IP)...Last Angels lefty to go nine straight starts without allowing a HR was Geoff Zahn in 1984...Ranks third in the American League with a 0.65 HR/9 innings rate this season.
- 100K: Has reached the 100+ strikeout plateau in a single season for first time in career...Skaggs (105 SO) and Andrew Heaney (102) became first pair of Angels teammates with 100+ strikeouts before the All-Star Break since Garrett Richards (127) and C.J. Wilson (107) in 2014.
- LEFT OUT: Is holding lefties to a .206 (22/107) batting average this season, which ranks fifth in the A.L. among lefties.
- LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in last start on Wednesday vs. White Sox after tossing six innings and allowing two runs (one earned) on four hits with no walks and a season-high nine strikeouts.
- STRIKEOUT STREAK: Had streak of 12 straight games with 5+ strikeouts snapped on July 20 by Astros...It was the longest streak by an Angels lefty since Chuck Finley (16 consecutive games) in 1997.
- HOT JUNE: In five June starts, went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP 3 ER) and 36 strikeouts... Established the lowest June ERA in Angels history (min. 30 IP)... Three straight starts with a win (June 3-15) was the longest streak of his career... Is the only Angles pitcher to win at least three consecutive starts this season.
- GETTING FAMILIAR: Since start of 2017, has allowed two home runs the first time through the batting order in a game (315 PA), but has yielded 16 HR in 312 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- <u>VS. TAMPA BAY:</u> In two career starts vs. Rays, is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (12 IP 6 ER) and 12 strikeouts...Charged with loss in first start of year vs. Tampa Bay on May 17 at Angel Stadium after tossing six innings and allowing one earned run on six hits with three walks and seven strikeouts; only run allowed was solo HR by **C.J. Cron.**
- AT TROPICANA FIELD: Tonight marks first career appearance at Tropicana Field.
- 300 K's: Recorded 300th career strikeout against Aaron Hicks in 4th inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- NEW CAREER HIGH: Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati.
- SEASON DEBUT: Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- <u>COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT</u>: During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.

- Owns a 21-27 career record with a 4.08 ERA (425.2 IP 193 ER) and 384 strikeouts in 76 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by Dr. Neal Elattrache after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.
