PITTSBURGH PIRATES (72-73) vs. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (84-63)

September 14, 2018 at Miller Park, Milwaukee, WI --- GAME #146/ROAD #72

RHP CHRIS ARCHER (4-7, 4.56 ERA) vs. LHP GIO GONZALEZ (8-11, 4.40 ERA)

THE PIRATES... had the day off yesterday in Milwaukee...Are 6-2 in their last eight games...Have gone 19-24 in their last 43 games after winning 11 in a row between 7/11-24...Have produced a 32-26 record since July 7 and have gone 36-32 in their last 68 games, dating back to 6/25...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 68-77 after 145 games in 2017 (68-78 after 146).

WHAT'S BREWING: Tonight the Pirates begin a stretch of playing the Brewers six times over the next nine games...Pittsburgh's 9-4 record against the Crew is the best by any team in MLB this year...The Bucs have posted a 2.96 ERA (121.2ip/40er), including two shutouts, this season against Milwaukee...The Pirates have also outscored the Brewers 68-42 on the season.

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Chris Archer gets the start tonight in the first game of this series against the Brew Crew...In his last start last Friday at PNC Park, Archer allowed three runs over 6.0 innings but came away with a no-decision in a 5-3 come-from-behind win against the Marlins.

THE MEN BEHIND THE MASK: Pittsburgh's catchers enter today leading MLB in slugging percentage (.432) and on-base percentage (.358) while ranking third overall in batting average (.269) and RBI (81)...Individually, Francisco Cervelli leads all MLB backstops in on-base percentage (.384), ranks sixth in slugging (.430), seventh in average (.258) and eighth in RBI (48).

MILLER TIME: Starling Marte has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games here at Miller Park, going 16-for-46 (.348) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs, eight RBI and a 1.023 OPS...Marte has 15 career home runs vs. Milwaukee, which are his most vs. any team; eight of those home runs have come in his 43 career games at Miller Park.

BEATING UP ON THE BREWERS: Adam Frazier has hit safely in 13 of his last 14 games against the Brewers dating back to July 20, 2017, going 20-for-52 (.385) with a double, two triples, four homers and 14 RBI...His .435 average (10-for-23) vs. the Crew this year is the second-highest by any player in the big leagues with at least 25 plate appearances, trailing only Atlanta's Freddie Freeman (.440).

LET'S GET IT STARTED: Pittsburgh's starting rotation has posted a Major League-best 2.75 ERA (59.0ip/18er) this month...Atlanta ranks second with a starting rotation ERA of 2.82 while the Brewers rank third (2.87)...Pittsburgh's rotation also ranks fifth in MLB this month in batting average against (.212) and second in opponents slugging percentage (.313).

THIS MONTH: The Pirates are batting .267 this month, which ranks third in all of MLB...The only two teams with a higher batting average this month are the Rockies (.308) and Rays (.285).

SIGHTS ON THE CENTRAL: The Pirates are 1-2 in a stretch that has them scheduled to play 16 of their final 20 games against teams from the National League Central after losing two-of-three in St. Louis...The only three games Pittsburgh is scheduled to play outside of its division will come next week in a three-game series against the Royals...The Pirates are also scheduled to close out the 2018 campaign with an October 1 makeup game against the Marlins at PNC Park.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Minor League Baseball announced yesterday that Pittsburgh's Jack Herman was named as an outfielder to the Gulf Coast League's All-Star team...Herman, who was selected by the Pirates in the 30th round of this year's draft, ranked third in the GCL this season in batting average (.340) and second in on-base percentage (.435).

SELECT COMPANY: With 19 home runs and 30 stolen bases, Starling Marte is one homer shy of becoming just the third player in team history to produce at least 20 home runs and 30 steals in the same season...Barry Bonds accomplished the feat four times (1987, 1990-92) and Andy Van Slyke did it twice (1987-88).

BELL OF LATE: Josh Bell has gone 8-for-17 with two doubles, two home runs and four RBI overall in his last five games...He is hitting .296 with a .999 OPS this month after recording a .231 average and .752 OPS last month.

SAVING THE DAY: All-Star closer Felipe Vázquez has converted each of his last 22 save opportunities, which is the longest active save streak in Major League Baseball...Vázquez is one of nine pitchers - and the only lefthander - to earn 32 or more saves in a single season with the Pirates...His 53 saves in a Pittsburgh uniform rank 10th all time (since saves became official in 1969); Bill Landrum is ninth on the list with 56.

CAPTAIN RED BEARD: Colin Moran enters today's action ranked tied for fifth among all rookies in the Majors with 107 hits...He also ranks fourth among all National League rookies with 51 RBI.

FRAZIER EN FUEGO: Adam Frazier is hitting .331 (44-for-133) with 16 doubles, five home runs and 22 RBI in 40 games since being recalled on July 25...Since July 25, his .331 average ranks seventh among all National League hitters.

ROOKIE ROLLING: Richard Rodríguez leads all National League rookie relief pitchers and ranks fourth among all rookie relievers in MLB, in strikeouts (76)...The only three rookie relievers in MLB with more punchouts are Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough (93), Los Angeles' (AL) Noe Ramirez (88) and Oakland's Lou Trivino (78).. Rodríguez has whiffed 19 batters in his last 11.1 innings of work and is averaging 11.2 Ks per 9.0ip this season...His 76 strikeouts are the most by a Pirates rookie reliever since Blas Minor fanned 84 batters in 1993.
