THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY - SEPT. 25

1986 - The Astros clinch the NL West title in grand fashion as **Mike Scott** no-hits the Giants in the Dome, 2-0...Scott tallies 13 K's in the win, becoming the 1st pitcher in MLB history to clinch a postseason berth with a no-hitter.

1979 - In an 8-0 win over the Braves, **J.R. Richard** fans 13 to reach 300 strikeouts for the 2nd straight season...Richard would end that season with a club-record 313 K's.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The defending World Series Champs play the 2nd game of this 3-game set in TOR this evening...rookie **RHP Josh James** (1-0) will make his 3rd ML start as he takes on Jays **RHP Sam Gaviglio** (3-8)...**Road Finale:** Tonight is the 2nd game of this 7-game road trip, which will wrap up the regular season for HOU...the 'Stros will visit BAL for a 4-game series following tomorrow afternoon's game here in TOR.

YOUNG JAMES: **RHP Josh James** hurled 5.1 scoreless inn. in his last start on 9/18 vs. SEA to earn his 1st ML victory (7-0 final)...**Bringin It!:** James, who has hit 100 mph on the radar gun on multiple occasions, has tallied 24 K's in his 16.0 IP while allowing just 10 hits for a .172 opp. avg...HOU is 4-0 in his appearances.

THE MAGIC NUMBER: Entering today, the Astros hold a 4.5-game lead in the AL West with a **Magic Number of 2 to clinch the division**...the Astros clinched a spot in the postseason with a win on Friday vs. LAA, ensuring their 3rd postseason appearance in the last 4 seasons.

STRONG DOWN THE STRETCH: The Astros 17-4 (.810) record in September is tops in the Majors for the month... additionally, HOU has posted a 24-7 mark dating back to Aug. 21, also tops in the Majors...the Stros had a similar finish in 2017, entering the postseason after winning 15 of their final 19 reg. season games.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros are 53-22 (.707) on the road in 2018, which is tops in the Majors and puts them on pace for one of the finest road records in Major League history...since the schedule expanded to 162 games in 1961, the best road record by any club was posted by the 2001 Seattle Mariners, who were 59-22 (.728)... HOU has won 11 of their last 12 on the road and 18 of 23 road games since 7/31...the Astros best road record ever for a season was in 2017 (53-28, .654).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros defeated the Blue Jays last night, 5-3...**LHP Dallas Keuchel** (12-11) picked up the win (5 IP, 3 ER)...**RHP Roberto Osuna** hurled a scoreless 9th to earn his 19th save...back-to-back solo HRs by **Brian McCann** (#6) and **Josh Reddick** (#16) in the 2nd inning gave HOU an early 3-0 lead... **Jose Altuve** (2 H, RBI) and **Yuli Gurriel** (2 H, RBI) also contributed.

HISTORIC PACE: At 99-57, the 2018 Astros have the best record after 156 games in franchise history, besting the 98-58 mark of the 1998 Astros...that 1998 team finished with a franchise best 102-60 final record...this year's club is three games better than the the 2017 World Series Champs, who were 96-60 thru 156, and finished with 101 victories...below are the highest win totals in franchise history:

THE BREGMAN BOX

Alex Bregman has been one of the top players in the Majors in 2018:

AT WAR: Per STATS, **Alex Bregman** ranks 4th in the Majors in WAR (8.0)...Bregman's 8.0 WAR ranks fourth in Astros history for a season and is the best since **Richard Hidalgo** posted an 8.9 WAR in 2000.

EXTRA! EXTRA! **Alex Bregman** is 2nd in the AL in extra-base hits with 82 (51 2B, 30 HR, 1 3B)...his 82 extra-base hits are the sixth-highest total in a single season in franchise history and are the most by an Astro since 2001, when **Richard Hidalgo** had 86 and **Lance Berkman** posted a franchise record 94.

B-MEN: **Alex Bregman** is just the second player in franchise history to reach 50 doubles, 100 RBI and 100 runs scored in the same season, joining **Lance Berkman** (55 doubles, 126 RBI, 110 runs) in 2001.

THAT'S A FIRST AT THIRD: **Alex Bregman** is the first player in Major League history to collect 50 doubles and 30 homers in the same season while playing the majority of his games at third base...additionally, Bregman is also the fifth player in MLB history with a 50-double, 30-homer season prior to turning 25 years old...he's joined by **Albert Pujols** (2003-04), **Alex Rodriguez** (1996) and **Lou Gehrig** (1927).

EXCLUSIVE CLUB: A win tonight would make the 2018 Astros just the 5th defending WS champion to win 100 games in a season since 1970...see below:

PITCHING IN: **Astros pitchers have set a MLB record with 1,637 strikeouts this season**, besting the previous record, set by the 2017 Indians (1,614)...in addition to leading the Majors in strikeouts, the Astros pitching staff also leads the Majors in virtually every significant category, including ERA (3.15), opp. avg. (.218), WHIP (1.10), starter's ERA (3.19) and bullpen ERA (3.07).

ON THE DEFENSIVE: As a club, the Astros have posted a .9888 fielding pct., which is tops in the AL and currently the best in franchise history for a single season...the 2008 club finished at .9887.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY: **RHP Justin Verlander** and **RHP Gerrit Cole** both rank in the top 10 in strikeouts in franchise history for a single season.

LAST START - 9/18 VS. SEA:

started last Tuesday in Houston and pitched the Astros to victory after tossing 5.1 scoreless inning, posting 7 strikeouts....

picked up his 1st Major League win in the Astros 7-0 victory.

ABOUT JAMES:

25-year-old was selected to the Major League roster on September 1st and made his Major League debut that night.

- as made 2 starts and 2 relief appearances this month, going 1-0 with 2 holds...has posted a 2.61 ERA (3ER/10.1IP) in his 2 starts.

ONE TO REMEMBER:

made his Major League debut in a start on 9/1 vs. LAA... went 5.0 innings, allowing 3 runs on 3 hits...struck out 9 batters to tie the 2nd-most strikeouts by an Astros pitcher in a Major League debut...also

Scott Elarton (June 20, 1998 vs. CIN) and **Dan Larson** (July 18, 1976 at MON)...the franchise record is 15 strikeouts, set by **J.R. Richard** on Sept. 5, 1971 at SF.

HIS MINOR LEAGUE SEASON:

put together one of the most dominant seasons in the minors this year...struck out 171 batters in 114.1 innings pitched.

- led the minor leagues in strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio (13.46) and strikeout rate (36.3%)...ranked 4th in the minors in strikeouts.
- his 171 strikeouts are the most by an Astros minor league pitcher in a single season over the last decade...since 2005, the only other minor league pitcher to post this many strikeouts in one season was **Fernando Nieve**, who struck out 171 batters in 2005.

DRAFTED AND DEVELOPED:

was selected by the Astros in the 34th round of the 2014 MLB Draft out of Western Oklahoma State College.

- became the first pitcher in franchise history to make a start for the Astros after getting selected in the 34th round-or-later of the MLB Draft...prior to James' start on Sept. 1, the lowest-drafted pitcher in franchise history to make a start for Houston was **RHP Darryl Kile**, who was taken in the 30th round of the 1987 MLB Draft and went 71-65 with a 3.79 ERA in 209 career games (182 starts) for Houston.
- was signed by longtime Astros scout **Jim Stevenson**, who currently works for the Astros as a domestic scout based out of Tulsa, OK...Stevenson has been the Astros signing scout for a number of late-round picks who have found success, including **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (7th round, 2009), **RHP Dean Deetz** (11th round, 2014), **IF Abraham Toro-Hernandez** (5th round, 2016), **RHP Tyler Ivey** (3rd round, 2017) and current Oakland Athletics **OF Ramón Laureano** (16th round, 2014).

JAMES IN 2018:

began the season at Double A Corpus Christi after spending all of Spring Training in minor league camp...in 6 games with the Hooks (4 starts), posted a 2.49 ERA (6ER/21.2IP) and 38 strikeouts.

- was named the Astros Minor League Pitcher of the Month for April after posting a 1.80 ERA (4ER/20IP), 34 strikeouts and a .208 opponent batting average in 5 April apps. with Corpus Christi...was tied for the Texas League-lead in strikeouts during the month, while ranking 2nd in ERA.
- promoted to Triple A Fresno on May 6 and continued to dominate, posting a 6-4 record and a 3.40 ERA (35ER/92.2IP) with 133 strikeouts in 17 starts...posted a .187 opponent average in his 17 starts with the Grizzlies.

JAMES' CAREER:

has posted a 27-24 record and a 3.61 ERA (183ER/456.2IP) in 104 career minor league games, including 75 starts...has recorded 498 strikeouts in his 456.2 innings pitched.

- was a 2017 Double A Texas League Midseason All-Star.

- has 8 walks in his last 10 games...has reached in 15 of his last 16 games, batting .311 (19x61) with 3 HR, 10 RBI and a .924 OPS (.432 OBP/.492 SLG).
- ranks 3rd in the AL in batting average and ranks 9th in hits (165)...was leading the Majors in hits prior to his DL stint.

- is the first player in MLB history to have 30 homers and 50 doubles in a season while playing the majority of his games at 3rd base...at 24 years old, is the youngest player in club history with a 30-HR season...is also the 5th player in MLB history with a 50-double, 30-homer season prior to turning 25 years old...also **Albert Pujols** (2003-04), **Alex Rodriguez** (1996), **Lou Gehrig** (1927).
- his 51 doubles tie the 3rd-most in a season in franchise history with **Craig Biggio** (1998)...trails only **Biggio** (56 in 1999) and **Lance Berkman** (55 in 2001)...is the first Astro with a 100-RBI season since **Carlos Lee** in 2009 (102 RBI)...his 82 extra-base hits rank 6th in club history for a single season and are the most by an Astro since the 2001 season (**Berkman**: 94, **Bagwell**: 86).
- 2018 All-Star Game MVP** is making a strong bid for the AL MVP...leads MLB in doubles (51)...in the AL, ranks 2nd in XBH (82), 2nd in walk/strikeout ratio (1.16), 4th in WAR (8.0, STATS), 3rd in walks (93), T-4th in RBI (101), 4th in OBP (.395), 5th in runs (103), 5th in OPS (.930), 6th in SLG (.534) and 8th in hits (167).
