RAY MATTER—While the Rays are 4-6 in their last 10 games, they are 18-9 (.667) in September, tied for 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL to the Astros (19-5)...they enter today's season finale having already clinched the best September in club history, ahead of 2011 (17-10)...they are 40-25 (.615) since the All-Star break, 5th in the majors and 4th in the AL.

- + Last night the Rays overcame 1-0 and 2-1 deficits to set up today's rubber match with the Blue Jays...they are attempting to avoid losing consecutive series for the first time since July 12-22 at MIN, vs. MIA, a combined 2-5 stretch surrounding the All-Star break...they are 8-1-2 in their last 11 series and 11-2-2 in their last 15 series.
- + The Rays have won their regular season finale in each of the last three years and seven of the last eight seasons since 2010.
- + Monday's loss officially eliminated the Rays from postseason contention—they were the last AL team to be eliminated.
- + Including today's game, since becoming the Rays in 2008 the club will have played only 54 games in which they were mathematically eliminated from postseason contention.

K'S FOR DAYS—Last night Rays pitchers recorded 18 SO, tying a club record for a 9-inning game...it was the fourth time they accomplished that, following last year's season finale on Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL, May 10, 2013 vs. SD and Aug 28, 2011 at TOR...their previous season high, regardless of game length, was 16 SO on Aug 21 vs. KC and June 3 at SEA.

ON THE LINE—A win today would be the club's sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays...they would join the Red Sox (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6) as the only teams with six 90-win seasons since 2008...the Rays are 944-838 (.530) since 2008, 6th in the majors behind the Yankees (.567), Dodgers (.556), Cardinals (.553), Red Sox (.549) and Angels (.531).

- + This is the club's seventh winning season, and the Rays are one of only eight teams in the majors with at least seven winning seasons since 2008, along with the Yankees (11), Dodgers (10), Red Sox (8), Cardinals (8), Giants (7), Rangers (7) and Nationals (7).
- + A win today would also mark only the third time since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 that a team won 90 games and missed the postseason, following the 2013 Rangers (91) and 2012 Rays (90)...it would also be the largest postseason deficit for a 90-game winner in the Wild Card era (1994).

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays are 50-30 (.625) at home this season, tied with the Brewers and Cubs for 3rd-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (56-24) and Yankees (53-28)...this is only the fourth time in franchise history that the Rays have reached 50 home wins, after going 51-30 in 2013, 52-29 in 2009 and 57-24 in 2008...while they are 5-6 in their last 11 games here following a club-record 12-game home winning streak, they are 38-14 in their last 52 games here following a 12-16 start this season.

- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, tied for 5th in the majors and tied for 2nd in the AL behind the Athletics (10)...this is their most since a club-record-tying 13 walk-off wins in 2013...their five walk-off home runs are tied for most in the AL and are 2nd-most for a single season in franchise history behind 2011 (7).

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—The Rays are 12-6 against the Blue Jays this season (6-2 at home, 6-4 on the road) and 197-173 (.532) all-time against them, their most wins against any opponent...their 12 wins this season are their most against them since 2012 (14)...this is the ninth time in the last 11 years the Rays have won the season series...the Rays are 3-4 in their last 7 games against the Blue Jays following a 9-2 start...they are 4-0-1 in series play this season, most recently a split last weekend in Toronto.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays have played consecutive 1-run games for the first time since a club-record-tying six straight from Aug 3-9...36.6 pct. of their games this season have been decided by 1 run, and they are 28-31 (.475) in these games...the 59 1-run games are the most for a team since the 2016 Mariners (60) and are a single-season club record...the 31 1-run losses are the most in the majors and are also a club record, passing 2015 (30)...the Rays are 18-12 (.600) in 1-run games since June 19.

PITCHING PLANS—Today's game will be started by **Ryne Stanek**, the 55th time the Rays will use an opener and 29th time using Stanek in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the

Rays have used other starters in 91 of 161 games (56.5 pct.).

- + Since the debut of the opener, the Rays rank 3rd in the majors with a 3.50 ERA, behind the Dodgers (3.23) and the Astros (3.39)—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays have pitched to a AL-best 3.63 ERA in the 1st inning.
- + The Rays are 46-38 with traditional starters and 43-34 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 70 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 60 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

REDEFINING RELIEF—The Rays bullpen has surpassed 800 IP, and their 817.1 IP are a major league record by 160.1 IP, ahead of the 2012 Rockies (657 IP)...prior to this season, only four teams—the 2017 Marlins (612 IP), 2017 Reds (610 IP), 2012 Rockies and 2003 Rangers (601.1 IP)—saw their bullpen surpass 600 IP, and all four of these teams finished with losing records...56.8 pct. of the club's innings this season have been covered by the bullpen...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 61 apps of at least 50 pitches and 29 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 90 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 148 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1985 Braves (158);
- + 72 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- + 46 apps of at least 4 IP, most since BB-Ref data is available;
- + 31 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1917 Athletics (34)

30 ON 3-0—Last night **C.J. Cron** hit a solo homer in the 2nd inning and became the ninth player in club history with 30 HR in a season, joining **Evan Longoria** (4), **Carlos Peña** (3), **Steven Souza Jr.**, **Logan Morrison**, **Brad Miller**, **Aubrey Huff**, **Fred McGriff** and **José Canseco**...the homer was the first of his career on a 3-0 pitch and the 18th in franchise history on a 3-0 pitch, first since **Ben Zobrist** on Sep 27, 2013 at TOR (**R.A. Dickey**) and first at home since **Melvin Upton Jr.** on Sep 9, 2012 vs. TEX (**Martín Pérez**).

- + Cron is one of only four Rays with double-digit homers, tied with the Tigers for fewest in the majors and tied with 2001 for their fewest in a single season in club history...they are the only team in the majors with only one player with 15 HR, and it will be the second time they finish a season with only one (2014, **Evan Longoria**).

POWER BALL—Last night **Austin Meadows** hit his first homer as a Ray, a go-ahead solo shot in the 7th inning...he became the 24th player this season to hit a homer for the Rays, breaking a tie with the Angels, Brewers and Phillies for most in the majors, and a club record ahead of 2015 (23)...despite this, the Rays have totaled only 150 HR, 4th-fewest in the majors and 78 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season.

- + From the other side, the Rays have yielded 12 HR in their last 5 games and 21 HR in their last 10 games...they have allowed at least 1 HR in six consecutive games, and multiple homers in three straight games for the first time since Aug 5-8 vs. CWS/BAL.

PHAM-LY MATTERS—**Tommy Pham's** 31-game on-base streak is the longest active in the majors and tied for the 5th-longest in franchise history...it is the longest by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (34) spanning 2012-13 and the longest single-season on-base streak by a Ray since **Johnny Damon's** club-record 39-game stretch in 2011...he is batting .376/.468/.692 (44-for-117) with 7 HR and 20 RBI over this 31-game stretch.

- + Since returning from the 10-day DL on Aug 16 at NYY, Pham ranks among AL leaders in avg. (.343, 2nd), on-base pct. (.441, 3rd), slugging pct. (.627, 5th) and on-base plus slugging (1.068, 3rd).

ZILLA'S CASE—Last night **Blake Snell** made his final start of the season, and he finishes the year with a club-record 21 wins, while his 1.89 ERA leads the AL...the last two AL pitchers to record 21 wins and a sub-2.00 ERA were BOS **Roger Clemens** (21, 1.93) in 1990—two years before Snell was born—and NYY **Ron Guidry** (25, 1.74) in 1978...his ERA is the 3rd-lowest in the AL since the designated hitter was adopted in 1973 behind BOS **Pedro Martínez** (1.74) in 2000 and Guidry (1.74) in 1978.

- + Snell is the fourth pitcher in the live ball era (since 1920) to finish a season with 21 wins and a 1.89 ERA (or lower) at age 25 or younger...joins NYM **Dwight Gooden** (24, 1.53) in 1985, OAK **Vida Blue** (24, 1.82) in 1971 and DET **Hal Newhouser** (25, 1.81) in 1945.
- + Snell's 27 starts of 2 runs or fewer are the most by an AL pitcher since CWS **Wilbur Wood** (27) in 1972—also before the introduction of the DH...his 21 starts of 1 run or fewer are the most in the AL, excluding openers, since LAA **Dean Chance** (22) in 1964 (pre-DH).

LAST OUTING—On Wed vs. NYY, started and threw 30 pitches in the 1st, including a 3-run homer to **Neil Walker**, the second of his career allowed to a lefty, both in his last 4 apps (2 starts)...the 3 runs allowed tied a career high (3rd time, last July 28 at BAL), and it matched his total runs allowed from his first 29 home apps (15 starts) this season...it was the second time in his career he allowed a homer with 2 runner(s) or more on base, following a **Manny Machado** grand slam on May 11 at BAL.

RECENT STRUGGLES—His last outing pushed his ERA over 3.00 for the first time since the end of play on June 10 (3.14)...has allowed 5 R/ER in his last 4 apps (2 starts) spanning 3 IP following a streak of eight consecutive scoreless outings and a 1.50 ERA (12-IP, 2-ER) from Aug 20–Sep 18...has allowed multiple runs in consecutive starts—a 2-run homer to **Rowdy Tellez** on Sep 20 at TOR and the Walker 3-run homer.

- + Had a sub-2.00 ERA as late as the end of play on July 25 vs. NYY (1.86)...since then, has a 4.91 ERA (25.2-IP, 14-ER) in his last 26 apps (14 starts).

A NEW LOOK—Has made 28 starts, 2nd-most on the team behind **Blake Snell** (31)...all 28 starts have come since May 26, five more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...is the first pitcher with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a season since **PHI Hugh Mulcahy** (26 starts, 30 relief apps) in 1937 and the first AL pitcher since **PHA Eddie Rommel** (31 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1923...is the first rookie in major league history with 25 starts and 25 relief apps in a single season.

- + This will be the 55th time the Rays use an opener, all of them coming since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 3.55 ERA (38-IP, 15-ER) in his 28 starts.

MAKING THE LEAP—Has made 58 apps, tied for 4th among AL rookies and the most by a Rays rookie since **Steve Geltz** (70) in 2015...his 28 starts are tied with **SF Andrew Suarez** for most among major league rookies and are the most by a Rays rookie since **Jake Odorizzi** (31) in 2014...min. 50 IP, is 2nd among AL rookies with a .193 opp avg. behind teammate **Diego Castillo** (.178) and ranks 4th with 10.91 SO/9 IP.

- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 98.0 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL.

THE LONG BALL—Has yielded 8 HR, including five with runner(s) on base...has allowed 2 HR in his last 4 apps (2 starts) spanning 3 IP and 4 HR in his 22 apps (11 starts) spanning 20.2 IP...has allowed 14 HR in 84.1 IP in his career.

QUIRKS OF THE OPENER—Has made 8 starts without allowing a hit, the most for any pitcher in a season since BB-Ref data is available (1908).

- + From June 7–July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled only 13.2 IP over this span—passing **LAD Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), **LAD Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and **LAD Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP).
- + According to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record.

FROM THE OTHER SIDE—Is winless in all 28 starts, tied with **ATL/TOR Jo-Jo Reyes** from June 18, 2008–May 25, 2011 and **OAK Matt Keough** from Sep 6, 1978–Aug 8, 1979 for the longest in the majors since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)...has gone 2 IP or fewer in all of these starts and has never qualified for a win...his 28 starts of 2 IP or fewer are the most for a pitcher within a single season—before this year, no other pitcher ever made more than 8 starts of this type in a season...his 14 starts of 1 IP or fewer are the most in a single season, passing **PIT Max Butcher** (7) in 1940.

ELITE COMPANY—Named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third “Ryne” in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg’s nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + On Sep 11 vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
