Martinez** (.331, 40 HR, 121 RBI) is the only other player in the Major Leagues to match those numbers in the **Triple Crown** categories...Oak's **Khris Davis**, hitting .248, is the only other player in the majors with at least **32 HR** (41) and **101 RBI** (108).

Eugenio Suárez (.291, 32 HR, 101 RBI) is the fourth player in franchise history to hit **30 HR** in a season while playing primarily third base (list below)...is the 18th Reds player to produce at least **30 HR** and **100 RBI** in a season...is trying to become the ninth Reds player to produce **30 HR** and **100 RBI** while hitting at least .300.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Dai Sugiura's Dodgers** and **Game 6** (3-2) of a 7-game homestand that included a **2-2 series split** vs the **Padres**...following this series, the Redlegs head out for their final road trip (3g at Cubs, 3g at Mil, 4g at Mia) before finishing the 2018 championship season with a 5-game homestand vs the **Royals** (2g) and **Pirates** (3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds have won the first 5 games of this season series, their **longest single-season winning streak** vs the Dodgers since a **7-game** winning streak from **5/30-8/8, 1976**...the Reds swept the 4-game series in May at **Dodger Stadium**...in their **6 series** covering the **previous 3 seasons** (2015-2017), the Reds went **0-5-1 vs LAD** (1-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 2-2 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin)...entering this season, Cin had lost **17 of 19 games vs LAD**...in May, the Reds produced their **first series win** vs LAD since **September 2013**, their **first series win at Dodger Stadium** since **June 2011** and their **first 4-game sweep** of the Dodgers since **August 1976**...prior to that **May series win**, the Reds had gone **0-6-2** in the **previous 8 series vs LAD**...that winning **May series** snapped the Reds' **6-series losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium** (1-2 in 2012, 1-3 in 2013, 1-2 in 2014, 1-3 in 2015, 0-3 in 2016, 0-3 in 2017)...the Reds' **4-1 win** on **5/10** snapped their **8-game losing streak** to the Dodgers and their **9-game losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium**...the Dodgers' **.604 winning percentage** at **Great American Ball Park** (32-21) is the second-best by any National League team here (Mets, .627, 32-19)...**Reds vs Dodgers** information is on media guide **Page 322**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **59-68** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15** this year.

DOT, DOT, DOT... Celebrating birthdays this week are **Matt Wisler** (26 tomorrow) and catching coordinator **Mike Stefanski** (49 tomorrow)...**Billy Hamilton** turned 28 Sunday and **Joey Votto** 35 yesterday...with Wed night's loss at Pit, coupled with the Cubs' win at Mil, the Reds were eliminated from **NL Central Division** contention...with the Cardinals' 8-7 victory last night vs Pit, the Reds were eliminated from **Wild Card** and playoff contention...last season the Redlegs were eliminated on **9/12** (Wild Card) and **9/14** (NL Central).

HURLING: The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4 position players** (**Cliff Pennington** on 4/12 vs StL; **Alex Blandino** on 7/11 at Cle; **Dilson Herrera** on 8/8 at NYM; **Brandon Dixon** on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and **7 rookies** (**RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Tanner Rainey**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **RHP Kevin Shackelford**, **RHP Keury Mella**, **RHP Jesús Reyes**).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went **16-26-3** in their **45 completed series**, including **11-10-2** in the **last 23 completed series** beginning **6/19**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds have gone **5-1-2** in their last 8 series vs **teams in first place** when those series began (15-13, .536, **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Phi**, **3-1 vs Ari**, **2-1 vs Phi**, **0-3 vs Cle** and **0-4 at Chi**)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss** at **Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June** (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits, batting average** (.286) and **on-base percentage** (.361)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the NL in on-base percentage...**All-Star 2B Scouter Gennett** leads the National League in hitting and 3-hit games while ranking second in multi-hit games and third in hits...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** is the only player in the National League with at least **32 HR** and **101 RBI**...**SS José Peraza** ranks among the National League leaders in several statistical categories...he is the leader in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6).

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **11 grand slams**, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and 1 shy of the **National League record** (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals)...the Major League record for grand slams in a season is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds produced a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the Reds produced **9 grand slams** in the first half, tying the **2010 Yankees** for the most ever prior to the **All-Star** break...the Reds' **11 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Joey Votto** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, pitcher **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit), **José Peraza** and **Scott Schebler**.

SILVER SLUGGER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Silver Slugger Award** and the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least 4 HR in a season **without starting a game**...he has **4 HR**, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...according to our friends @EliasSports, the franchise record for **HR as a pitcher** is **4** by converted outfielder **Hal Jeffcoat**, who hit 4 HR in **1957**, all as a pitcher...**Tom Parrott** hit 4 HR in **1894**, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...**as a pinch hitter**, **Lorenzen** is **3-for-12** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-19** (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with **home runs** on **4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam)...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games.

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tonight is making his 29th start of the season and his **44th Major League** appearance and start...will be the second appearance of the season and of his career vs **Dodgers**...has **8 quality starts**, tied with **Sal Romano** for the staff lead...in Thu's 6-2 loss vs SD allowed a career-high 3 homers...in his 4-0 win on 9/1 at StL recorded a **career-high 11 strikeouts**, the second-highest total by a Reds pitcher in a game this season (**Tyler Mahle**, 12k, 6/30 vs Mil)...in the 4-0 win on 7/29 vs Phi made the **longest scoreless start** of his career (7ip)...his **3-game winning streak** from 5/8-5/24 (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the **first winning streak** of his career.

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tomorrow will make his 18th start of the season...will be his fifth career appearance and start vs the **Dodgers**, his first since **2016**...threw at least 6.0 innings in all 5 starts in **August** (3-1, 2.62)...began the **2018 season** on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a **left oblique strain** suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his **6/5 start vs Col**, from **5/14-5/30** made **4 rehabilitation starts** for Class AA Pensacola and Class AAA Louisville (0-3, 4.66).

- In 13 career apps vs LAD is hitting .415 (22-53, 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 7rbi).
- Leads National League shortstops in hits and ranks third in hitting...is 1 of only 6 players in the Major Leagues with at least 29 doubles and 22 stolen bases (Story, Ramirez, Merrifield, Lindor, Betts).
- Has a 6-game hitting streak, tied with Scott Schebler's for the longest active streak on the team and including 5 multi-hit games (12-25, .480, 2 2b, 1hr, 7rbi).
- Leads the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6)...this season has produced 3 streaks of at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout (45pa from 7/11-7/25, 43pa from 4/15-4/25, 40pa from 5/22-6/2).
- In his last 89 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .319 (115-360, 20 2b, 4 3b, 8hr, 40rbi, 14sb, .464slg, .360obp), raising his season BA from .243.
- His 165 hits this season are the most by a Reds shortstop since Felipe Lopez in 2005 (169).
- Leads the team in starts at 2 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (48gs) and second (58gs), and ranks second batting seventh (22gs, Barnhart 28gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs)...from 7/15-8/15 made a season-high 26 consecutive starts batting first and since then has made his last 22 starts batting second.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of Homestand: 4-16, 2hr, 6rbi

- Has a 6-game hitting streak (8-24, .333, 2hr, 6rbi, .583slg, .360obp) and at least 1 RBI in 3 of his last 4 apps (2hr, 6rbi)...in his last 11 apps is hitting .333 with 3 multi-hit games (13-39, 3 2b, 3hr, 8rbi, .641slg, .435obp).
- In 15 apps since he came off the disabled list on 8/25 is hitting .250 (14-56, 3 2b, 3hr, 9rbi)...had been on the DL since 7/18 with a sprained AC joint in his right shoulder suffered on 7/14 at StL when he hit the outfield walk while making a catch.
- Made his last 3 starts batting first...has made 34 career starts batting leadoff (43-145, .297), including 29 times this year (36-123, .293).
- Fri's grand slam off Rowan Wickler was the second of his career and the 10th by a Reds batter this season, setting a new club record (9 grand slams, 2002).
- Has made a team-high 64 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Homestand: 4-14, 1hr, 1rbi, 3bb, 3r

- First name is pronounced Ay-yoo-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- His 32 HR, 101 RBI and .925 OPS are career highs...is 1 of 11 players born in Venezuela to produce at least 30 HR in a season.
- He leads the National League in RBI despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.
- Is on Major League Baseball's roster for the November 8-15 Japan All-Star Series with Nippon Professional Baseball.

51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf Homestand: 1g as PH, 1g at 2B, 1g at 3B, 1-3, 1r

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- In the 5-1 loss on 9/3 at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, Gabriel Guerrero).
- On 9/1 was promoted from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS...for the Reds has played 2B, 3B and SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in the IL in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
- Never has been invited to Major League spring training camp, but for the Reds over the last 3 Cactus League seasons appeared in 13 games (429 in 2016), 8 games (.333 in 2017) and 5 games (0-for-6 in 2018).

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Homestand: 4-16, 1 2b, 2hr, 9rbi, 6bb

- In 69 career apps vs LAD is hitting .336 (84-251, 18 2b, 14hr, 52rbi, .582slg, .421obp).
- Reached base safely in each of his last 11 apps (11-37, .297, 2 2b, 2hr, 11rbi, .449obp).
- In 12 apps since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on 8/30 is hitting .262 (11-42, 2 2b, 2hr, 11rbi, .407obp)...had been on the 10-day disabled list since 8/17 with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016.
- Prior to his disabling had missed only 8 starts and 3 of the Reds' 121 games.
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks second in walks.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of Homestand: 4g, 1gs as CF, 3-7, 1hr, 1rbi

- In his last 19 apps beginning 8/18 is hitting .359 (14-39, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 2rbi, .538slg, .405obp), raising his season BA from .267.
- Has made 16 starts in RF (last, 8/24 at Cubs), 4 starts in CF (last, 9/7 vs SD) and 2 starts in LF (9/2 at StL, Wed at Pit).
- During Scott Schebler's most recent stint on the disabled list started 18 of the Reds' 26 games (17gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 13 of those 18 starts (19-68, .279, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi, 6r).
- In the seventh inning of Thu's 6-2 loss vs SD hit his first career pinch-hit HR (solo off Trey Wingenter).
- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
- On 7/26 vs Phi pinch hit in his Reds debut and first Major League appearance since 6/25/17 for NYY vs Tex...prior to this season, made all 25 career apps for NYY.
- In 87 apps for the Bats hit .280 (18 2b, 4 3b, 6hr, 30rbi, 5sb)...made all 83 of his starts in CF...after the Class AAA All-Star break hit safely in 12 of his 13 apps prior to his promotion (.362, 4 2b, 2 3b, 3rbi, .474obp, .532slg, 1.006ops).
