FISH BITES

Right-hander **José Ureña** will be making his first career start against the visiting Boston Red Sox in the finale of this two-game set. He will face off against LHP Chris Sale, who is making his second career start and appearance against the Marlins; he took the loss on August 14, 2016 at Marlins Park, surrendering five runs on eight hits over 6.2 innings. Miami is looking to split its season-opening homestand with a win tonight; the Marlins split a four-game set against the Chicago Cubs, with two of the four going into extra innings. Miami came into the 2018 season with 12 players making their first Opening Day roster. This past offseason also concluded a franchise makeover that saw 27 new players join the system via trade acquisition, a process that started with the Marlins trading for OF and 2017 Southern League batting champion Braxton Lee from Tampa Bay last June.

LAST NIGHT VS. RED SOX

After jumping out to an early lead, the Marlins couldn't maintain and eventually fell to the visiting Boston Red Sox, 7-3, in game one of this two-game set. **Brian Anderson** put Miami on the board with his first career home run, a solo shot to right field in the second inning. However, that was the only run the Marlins would push across the board until the eighth, when they were down 7-1. **Trevor Richards**, making his Major League debut for Miami, breezed through Boston's lineup the first time through the order, but was stung for three runs in the fourth and two more in the fifth before being lifted after 4.1 innings. **Starlin Castro** led Miami offensively, going 3x5 while recording his 500th career RBI in the ninth inning, and **Lewis Brinson** and **Cameron Maybin** chipped in two hits apiece.

VS. RED SOX

These two clubs split their last season series, 2-2, in 2015, with both teams sweeping two-game sets at their home ballparks. The last series between these two was on August 11-12, 2015 at Marlins Park, when Miami came away with 5-4 and 14-6 victories. The Marlins are 6-9 all-time at home against the Red Sox (3-3 at Marlins Park), and trail the overall series, 12-23.

UP NEXT

The Marlins will enjoy an off-day tomorrow before opening a three-game, four-day weekend set against the Philadelphia Phillies at Citizens Bank Park on Thursday at 3:05 p.m. Miami was swept in a three-game series the last time they visited CBP, September 12-14, 2017, and went 3-6 in Philadelphia last season. The Marlins are 80-128 all-time in the City of Brotherly Love (54-77 at CBP), and trail the overall series, 187-229.

YEAR OF THE FAN

The Marlins, in partnership with AutoNation, America's largest automotive retailer, will be awarding a prize of a 24-month car lease to a select fan tonight, the second of 25 dates this season where a fan (or fans) will drive off with a new car. The "Marlins Year of the Fan Sweepstakes, Driven by AutoNation" is open to any eligible fan in attendance at each select home date. Fans will be eligible for that date's drawing by scanning their valid, digital game ticket, stored on a mobile device, upon entry to Marlins Park prior to the end of the third inning. The 24-month car lease awarded to the winner of each game date's random drawing among all eligible entries will drive away with either a 2018 Ford Focus or 2018 Chevy Cruze. The next Sweepstakes game will be April 10 vs. the Mets.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES

The Marlins went 9-11 in Interleague Play last season, their best record against the American League since going 13-7 in 2014. Miami has an overall record of 184-187 (.496) against the AL all-time, the fourth-best record among all National League teams. The Mets are on top with a 185-177 record (.511), and are followed by the Cardinals (170-165; .507), and Cubs (167-168; .499). Miami's 184 wins are third to only the Washington (186) and the Mets in the NL. Miami's opponent tonight, the Boston Red Sox, leads all Major League teams since the start of Interleague Play in wins (228) and winning percentage (.594). Miami leads all National League teams in hits (3,368), doubles (674), runs scored (1,714) and RBI (1,626) since Interleague Play began.

LONG ROAD HOME

Starlin Castro has recorded at least one hit in each of his first five games this season, extending his hitting streak at Marlins Park to 13 games. It is currently tied for the sixth-longest hitting streak at Marlins Park, tied with Jason Heyward (4/29/14-6/23/16) and Christian Yelich (4/3/14-5/2/15). He trails a 16-game streak by Yelich in 2014, 15-game runs by Marcell Ozuna (2016), Dee Gordon ('15) and Jose Reyes ('12), and a 14-game stretch by David Wright from June 2, 2013 to September 2, 2014. - *Stats LLC*

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER

Through the first five games of the season, Miami's bullpen has worked a Major League high 29.1 innings, ahead of the Cubs (26.0), Dodgers (21.2) and Diamondbacks (20.2). Marlins relievers also lead the Majors in strikeouts, while their .189 average against ranks fourth, behind Seattle (.147), Toronto (.183) and the Cubs (.185).

TOUGH TEST

Based on 2017 records, Miami will have the sixth-toughest schedule in the Majors over the course of March/April, as their opponents had a combined .519 winning percentage last season. In the coming month, the Marlins will face Boston, Philadelphia, the Mets, Pittsburgh, the Yankees, Milwaukee, the Dodgers, and Colorado. However, from May through September, the Marlins have the third-easiest schedule, with opponents combining on a .485 record. - *Stats LLC*

STARLIN IS DARLIN'

Starlin Castro, who turns 28 on May 7, has amassed 1,288 career hits. Among players whose careers started in 1990 or later, his hit total is the sixth-most hits of any player prior to his 28th birthday. Alex Rodriguez led all with 1,467, and he was followed by Miguel Cabrera (1,417), Albert Pujols (1,344), Ivan Rodriguez (1,333), and Derek Jeter (1,294). Since 2010, Castro ranks 10th among active players in total hits, behind leader Robinson Cano (1,507). - *Stats LLC*

➤ José Ureña is making second start of season following OD assignment against Cubs. Finished 2018 Grapefruit League season with 2-1 record and 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip/7 er) in five starts.

➤ Was seventh different OD starter in last seven openers for Miami. Took OD loss against Cubs, allowing five runs on six hits over 4.0 innings. Hit three batters in first inning, becoming only second Marlins pitcher to ever tally three HBP in a single inning (Sergio Mitre on Aug. 31, 2007 vs. PHI).

➤ Is facing Boston for first time in career. Has 13 previous Interleague appearances (six starts), with a lifetime record of 4-2 and 4.04 ERA (42.1/19). Posted 4-1 record with 4.28 ERA in eight appearances (five starts) against AL opponents last season.

➤ Posted team-high 14 wins last season, to go with 3.82 ERA (169.2/72) and 113 strikeouts in 34 appearances (28 starts). Established career highs in wins, appearances, innings pitched, strikeouts, and ERA.

➤ Finished season 14-7, 3.97 (154.1/68) as starter. Did not factor in a decision and had a 2.35 ERA (15.1/4) in six relief appearances.

➤ Went 6-1 with 2.40 ERA (63.2/17) in 11 day-game starts. Owned fourth lowest ERA among NL starters (min. 50.0 IP), behind Max Scherzer (1.90), Stephen Strasburg (2.06) and Jimmy Nelson (2.32). - *Stats LLC*

➤ From May 7 through end of season, led National League with 28 starts, and 14 wins in that time tied Zack Greinke and Alex Wood for second, behind only Zach Davies (15). Among NL pitchers who made at least 25 starts in that time, average against (.232) ranked sixth and ERA ranked 10th.

➤ Set career high with five-game winning streak over seven starts from May 23 to June 23. Did so despite posting a 4.58 ERA (37.1/19) in that time, as he received 7.47 runs of support during stretch.

➤ Tossed season-high 8.0 innings in loss on July 31 vs. Washington, and again in win on Sept. 20 vs. the Mets. Allowed just one run to Nationals, and two to New York. Became first Marlins' pitcher since Henderson Alvarez (4), José Fernández (2), and Nathan Eovaldi (2) in 2014 to have multiple starts with 8.0-plus innings and two-or-fewer runs allowed in a single season.

➤ Made 21 starts following a team loss, with a 12-5 record and 3.54 ERA. Only Marcus Stroman (25) had more such starts in the Majors, while Ureña's win total tied Jacob deGrom for the MLB lead.

➤ Suffered loss on July 31, when he tossed 8.0 innings and allowed just one run on three hits and a walk, with six strikeouts. It was just fourth time in Club history that a pitcher took a loss in a game in which he tossed at least 8.0 innings and allowed just three hits and two-or-fewer runs.

➤ Over career, has gone 18-21 with a 4.63 ERA (268.0/138) in 50 Major League starts. Has 33 career relief appearances with a 1-1 record, one save, and a 5.65 ERA (51.0/32).
