- TRIBE HEADLINES

 » The Tribe holds a 32-15 record against the A.L. Central this season, posting a 2.70 ERA (127ER/423.0IP) that ranks as the lowest intradivisional mark in MLB.
- » The Indians offense ranks 2nd in the American League this season in team batting average (.258), stolen bases (85) and home runs (153, T2nd)...the club also ranks 3rd in the A.L. in hits (982), 3rd in OPS (.772) and 4th in runs scored (560).
- » JOSÉ RAMÍREZ has regained a share of the MLB lead with his 33 home runs this season...his 12 1st-inning homers are the most in MLB, and his 26 stolen bases are tied with Seattle's Dee Gordon for the American League lead (T2nd in MLB).
- » TREVOR BAUER enters play tonight with the 3rd-lowest home ERA (2.02) in the A.L. and the 3rd-lowest ERA (2.12) vs. the A.L. Central...he sits five punchouts shy of becoming the 11th different pitcher in Indians history to reach 200 strikeouts in a single season.
- » FRANCISCO LINDOR continues to lead MLB with 95 runs scored, while he ranks T1st with 43 multi-hit games.

TWIN BILLING

- » The Indians are set to begin their fifth of six series against the Minnesota Twins, as well as their second here at Progressive Field. » The clubs previously met last week at Target Field (July 30 - August 1), with the Tribe taking two of the three contests...in their first matchup at Progressive Field from June 15-17, Minnesota won two of the three games
- » Overall, the Indians own a 5-7 record vs. the Twins this season, going 1-2 at Progressive Field, 1-1 in Puerto Rico and 3-4 at Target Field...the Tribe is at least five games over .500 against every other team in the A.L. Central division.

- CENTRAL COMMAND

 » Cleveland has gone 32-15 against the A.L. Central, with a record of 10-3-2 in series play...the Indians' .681 intradivisional winning percentage ranks 2nd in the A.L. and MLB (Boston - .725)...the Tribe has gone 18-4 in divisional home games and 14-11 on the road...Cleveland has won seven straight divisional home games and eight of its last 10 divisional road games (since June 14).
- » In 47 games vs. the A.L. Central, Tribe pitchers own a 2.70 ERA (127ER/423.0IP), marking the lowest intradivisional ERA in MLB... six of the Tribe's 11 shutouts (T1st in A.L.) have come against divisional opponents, and the Indians have allowed three-or-fewer runs in 33 intradivisional games (going 29-4 in those contests).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- » The Indians improved to 27-10 in series finales (16-3 at Progressive Field) as they won their rubber match vs. Los Angeles-AL, 4-3, yesterday afternoon.
- » The victory also returned the Indians to 12 games above .500, matching their high-water mark this season (also 49-37 on July 6).
- » JOSÉ RAMÍREZ (1-2) opened the scoring with a three-run homer in the bottom of the 1st inning, his 33rd longball of the season...JA-SON KIPNIS drove in the other Tribe run with an RBI-double in the bottom of the 6th...FRANCISCO LINDOR recorded his 43rd multi-
- hit game of 2018, going 2-for-4 with a double and a run scored. » **SHANE BIEBER** earned the win, allowing two runs on seven hits over 5.2 innings of work...walked one and fanned seven batters, becoming just the sixth Indians pitcher in the Baseball-Reference Play Index era (1908-) to win six of his 10 career appearances (first since **CC Sabathia** in 2001).
- » BRAD HAND collected his third save as a member of the Indians (27th overall in 2018), allowing one run on two hits in the 9th inning.

STRONG STARTERS

- » Cleveland starting pitchers have combined for a 3.43 ERA this season, the 2nd-lowest mark in the American League (Houston -
- 3.02) and 3rd-lowest in MLB (Los Angeles-NL 3.35).

 » COREY KLUBER's complete-game shutout Saturday marked the Tribe's MLB-leading fifth complete game of the season...the club also owns an MLB-best 45 starts of 7.0-or-more innings and 69 quality starts (2nd in MLB behind Houston - 77).

 » Tribe starters rank 2nd in MLB with 716 strikeouts this season
- and have issued just 169 walks (4th-fewest in MLB)...the rotation's 4.24 K/BB ratio leads MLB, just ahead of Los Angeles-NL (4.19).

- **BAUER OUTAGE**» Right-hander **TREVOR BAUER** is set to make his third start this season against Minnesota, entering play with a 1-1 record and a 3.75 ERA (5ER/12.0IP) in two prior starts vs. the Twins.
- » Faced the Twins in his most recent start on July 31 at Target Field, earning the win after holding Minnesota to two runs on four hits over 6.1 innings of work (4BB, 3K)...finished the month of July 3-0 with a 2.03 ERA (9ER/40.0IP), the 2nd-lowest ERA in the A.L.
- (min. 30.0IP) for the month (HOU's **Dallas Keuchel** 1.65).

 » Bauer enters play tonight with 195 strikeouts, 4th-most in the American League...with five punchouts tonight, Bauer would become just the 11th different pitcher in Indians history to record a 200-strikeout campaign...of the 28 total times a Tribe hurler has logged 200 strikeouts, only four instances have featured the pitcher reaching the milestone in 24-or-fewer appearances: Bob Feller (1946). Sam McDowell (1968 & 1970) and COREY
- gone 5-1 with a 2.02 ERA (17ER/75.2IP)...enters play tonight with the 3rd-lowest home ERA in the American League, behind Tampa
- Bay's **Blake Snell** (0.97) and **Kluber** (2.01).

 » Bauer has also compiled a 7-3 record with a 2.12 ERA (18ER/76.1IP) in 11 intradivisional starts, marking the 3rd-lowest ERA vs. the A.L. Central (min. 40.0IP) behind Boston's **Chris Sale** (1.13) and Kluber (1.62)

- JOSÉ CAN YOU SWING (AND STEAL)

 » JOSÉ RAMÍREZ belted his 33rd home run of the season with a three-run blast yesterday afternoon, moving him into a tie with Boston's **J.D. Martínez** for the Major League lead.
- » 12 of Ramírez's 33 home runs have come in the 1st inning, the most in MLB...also marks a new franchise record, surpassing Al Rosen (11 in 1953).
- » Ramírez remains the MLB leader with 65 extra-base hits...he also has stolen 26 bases this year, tied with Seattle's **Dee Gordon** for the American League lead...<u>the last player to finish a season</u> leading the A.L. in home runs and steals was Detroit's Ty Cobb in 1909 (nine homers, 76 steals).
- » He enters play tonight among A.L. leaders in several other categories, inlcuding total bases (256 2nd), walks (72 2nd), on-base percentage (.409 - 3rd), slugging percentage (.631 - 3rd), RBI (82 - 3rd), runs scored (78 - 5th), and home batting average (.317 - 8th).

FRANKIE KEEPS ROLLING

- » FRANCISCO LINDOR went 2-for-4 yesterday with a double and a run scored...his 36 doubles rank T2nd in the A.L. and MLB, while his 95 runs scored continue to lead the Majors...Lindor remains on pace to score 140 runs this season, which would match **Earl** Averill's franchise record of 140 in 1931.
- » His 43 multi-hit games this season are tied with Boston's J.D.
- Martinez and Atlanta's Nick Markakis for the MLB lead.

 » Lindor enters play tonight among the A.L. top 10 in extra-base hits (64 2nd), total bases (249 3rd), hits (130 5th), OPS (.932 6th), home runs (27 7th), OPS (.934 7th) and RBI (67 T9th).

- HOME IS WHERE THE HITTERS ARE

 » MICHAEL BRANTLEY is batting .333 (69-207) at Progressive
 Field this season, the 6th-highest home batting average in the American League...he also ranks T3rd in the A.L. in home hits (69) and 5th in home RBI (43).
- » EDWIN ENCARNACION ranks T3rd in the A.L. with 44 RBI at home, and he is batting .275 (19-69) at Progressive Field since June 19 with five homers, 22 RBI and 12 runs scored.
- » JASON KIPNIS is batting .308 (20-65) over his past 21 home games (since June 16) with five homers, three doubles, 12 RBI and 11 runs scored.

» The 27-year-old right-hander is due to make his 24th start of the year in tonight's series opener vs. Minnesota...will mark his 156th career appearance (147th start). » Will be pitching on extended five days' rest after facing the Twins in his last start on July 31 in Minnesota...earned his 10th win (6.1IP, 4H, 2R/ER, 1HR, 4BB, 3K).

» Bauer is due to start against the Twins for the third time this season, compiling a 1-1

record and 3.75 ERA (5ER/12.0IP) in his two previous starts.

» Owns a 7-3 record and 2.12 ERA (18ER/76.1IP) in 11 starts vs. the A.L. Central

- » Bauer is due to face the Twins for the third time this year and second consecutive start...also marks his first time facing Minnesota at home this season...has compiled a 1-1 record and 3.75 ERA (5ER/12.0IP) in his two starts.

 » Last faced Minnesota on July 31 at Target Field, earning the win after holding the Twins to two runs on four hits (one home run), with four walks and three strikeouts... marked his 18th quality start of the season, which ranks 3rd-most in the A.L.

 » Bauer will make his 12th start vs. the A.L. Central this season...has compiled a 7-3 record and 2.12 ERA (18ER/76.1IP) in his 11 starts so far against the division...his 2.12 ERA is the 3rd-lowest vs. the A.L. Central this season, behind Boston's Chris Sale (1.13) and teammate COREY KLUBER (1.62).

HOME SWEET HOME

- Bauer is due to make his 12th home start of the season this afternoon...has compiled a 5-1 record and 2.02 ERA (17ER/75.2IP) at Progressive Field this season...entering to-night's game ranks 3rd in the American League in home ERA.
- Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in each of his last five home starts, dating back to June 18 vs. Chicago-AL and compiling a 3-0 record and 0.76 ERA (3ER/35.1IP) in
- those starts...Tribe has won four of the five games.

 » Won his most recent home outing on July 25 vs. Pittsburgh, holding the Pirates to two hits across 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two walks and striking out 10 batters.

 » In his career, owns a 31-20 with a 4.03 ERA (215ER/479.2IP) in 80 appearances (76
- starts) at Progressive Field.

- THE ROAD TO 200

 » Bauer enters his start tonight with 195 strikeouts on the season, the most on the Tribe and 4th-most in the American League (5th-most in MLB).

 » He is one batter away from matching his career-best mark of 196 strikeouts, set
- in 32 appearances (31 starts) last season.
- "s Should he fan five batters tonight, he would become the 11th different pitcher (29th time) in Indians franchise history to record 200-or-more strikeouts in a single season...if Bauer reaches 200 strikeouts in his 24th start of the season, it would also mark the fifth time an Indians pitcher got to 200 strikeouts in 24-or-fewer starts, joining Bob Feller (1946), Sam McDowell (1968 and 1970) and COREY KLUBER (2017).
- » Cleveland had two pitchers reach the 200-strikeout mark in 2017, **KLUBER** (265, 32GS) and **CARLOS CARRASCO** (226, 32GS).

MONTH BY MONTH

- » Bauer finished the month of June with a 2.18 ERA (10ER/41.1IP), then his 3rd-lowest ERA in a single month (min. 4GS), behind March/April 2015 (1.80 ERA) and June 2016 (2.01 ERA)...he also led MLB with 62 strikeouts in June.

 » He topped his strong June with an even more dominant July, going 3-0 with a 2.02
- ERA (9ER/40.0IP) in the season's fourth month, marking a new 3rd-lowest ERA in a single month in his career (min 4GS)...his 47 July strikeouts led MLB and his 2.02 ERA marked the 2nd-lowest ERA in the A.L., behind Houston's Dallas Keuchel (1.65).

A HALF TO REMEMBER

- » Bauer has had a dominant start to the season, etching his name into the Indians record books in the first half...he posted a 2.24 ERA in the first half, which marks the 5th-lowest first-half ERA by an Indians pitcher since 1969.
- » Recorded 175 strikeouts in the first half, which is the 3rd-most by an Indians pitcher in the first half of the season, behind **Bob Feller** (190 in 1946) and **Sam McDowell** (183 in 1970)...also enters tonight 3rd in the A.L. (4th in MLB) in strikeouts.

 » Bauer also averaged 11.55 strikeouts-per-9.0 IP in the first half, which is the 2nd-
- highest rate by an Indians pitcher in the first half of the campaign (min. 80.0IP), behind COREY KLUBER (11.86 in 2017).

- SEASON HIGHLIGHTS | 2018 RECAP

 » Bauer has struck out 10-or-more batters in nine starts this season, which is the 3rd-most such starts in MLB, behind Washington's Max Scherzer (12) and
- Boston's Chris Sale (10).

 » From May 27 July 25, Bauer struck out seven-or-more batters in 12 consecutive starts, which tied Sam McDowell (12GS, September 14, 1965-May 17, 1966) for the 2nd-longest such run in franchise history, behind COREY KLUBER's 14-start streak (June 1-August 13, 2017).
- » Bauer has thrown 100-or-more pitches in each of his 23 starts so far this season which is the longest such streak of his career and the longest active run in MLB... which is the longest such streak of his career and the longest active run in MLB... streak is also the longest streak of consecutive starts with 100-plus pitches by an Indians pitcher since 1988, the most recent year that Baseball Reference has accurate pitch count data available...streak marks the longest such run in MLB since Tampa Bay's Chris Archer had a 24-game run from August 12, 2016 - June 16, 2017.

 » Bauer was named to his first career All-Star team this year, representing the Indians on the American League squad on Tuesday night in Washington, D.C... did not pitch in the A.L.'s 8-6 win over the National League.

 » From June 8 - July 10, Bauer recorded a streak of seven consecutive quality start swith eight for more strikeouts and not home runs allowed, which representations.

- » From June 8 July 10, Bauer recorded a streak of seven consecutive quality start swith eight-or-more strikeouts and not home runs allowed, which represented the 2nd-longest such streak in the live ball era (1920-), behind Pedro Martínez's run of eight starts from July 1 August 10, 2002 (STATS LLC).

 » Bauer also struck out eight-or-more batters in nine consecutive starts from May 27-July 10, a career-long run for Bauer and the longest such run by an Indians pitcher since COREY KLUBER's 14-start streak from June 1-Aug. 1, 2017.

 » Recorded a streak of 10-or-more strikeouts in four consecutive starts from May 27 to June 13...streak the longest such run in MLB this season...marked just the third pitcher in Indians franchise history to record a streak of four-or-more starts with 10-or-more strikeouts, joining teammate COREY KLUBER (two streaks of five starts in 2017) and Hall-of-Famer Bob Feller (one streak of four starts from 1938-39). starts in 2017) and Hall-of-Famer Bob Feller (one streak of four starts from 1938-39).
