Angels vs. Royals

Tonight is the first of four through Sunday against the Halos, then the Royals will pay them a visit in Anaheim on June 4-6... KC was 6-1 vs. the Angels last year, sweeping a 3-game set here and going 3-1 in the Big A...the Royals trail the all-time series by a slim 286-290 margin, including a 135-149 deficit in Kansas City, 121-130 here in Kauffman Stadium...

ONE SWING SPOILS RUBBER GAME

--The Royals lost their second rubber game in as many tries on Wednesday when Kyle Seager snapped a 2-2 tie with an eighth inning home run to give the M's a 4-2 decision...the ball hit off of reliever Justin Grimm barely cleared the fence into KC's bullpen, but dropped the Royals to a 3-7 start on the year...Danny Duffy once again had first inning woes, allowing a pair of runs on just one hit with three walks...he then settled in and retired 13 out of 14 hitters, seven via the strikeout before running into a jam in the sixth...Brad Keller kept the Mariners off the board by entering and after loading the bases with an infield hit, he coaxed a double play ball to end the frame...the Royals tied the contest at 2-2 when Paulo Orlando doubled home a pair in the fourth inning...it was Kansas City's only hit on the day with runners in scoring position, going just 1-for-11 overall...Duffy finished working 5.1 innings allowing four hits and two runs (one earned) with the three first inning walks and seven K's.

GORDO SHELVED WITH HIP

--Prior to Tuesday night's game, Kansas City placed outfielder Alex Gordon on the 10-day disabled list (left hip labral tear), retroactive to April 9...to take his place on the Major League roster, the Royals recalled outfielder #45 Abraham Almonte from Omaha (AAA)...the 28-year old was a waiver claim from Cleveland on April 2.

MOOSE SWINGING WELL

--A mid-camp signing, Mike Moustakas has appeared to find his stroke in the last four games, going 9-for-17 (.529) with a pair of home runs and six RBI, upping his early season average from .174 entering Sunday in Cleveland to a lofty .325 heading into tonight...he homered on both Monday and Tuesday vs. Seattle, the 13th time he had gone deep in consecutive contests in his career while marking the first time he'd driven in at least three runs in back-to-back contests.

SOME WARMTH FOR TIME BEING

--Yesterday's first pitch temperature of 71 degrees was 32 degrees higher than the average temp the Royals had played in over their first eight games of the season encompassing contests here (3), in Detroit (2) and Cleveland (3)...Tuesday night's first pitch temperature of 60 degrees was 15 degrees warmer than any previous game...don't get too comfortable tonight and tomorrow, because the weatherman, who unfortunately has been pretty accurate of late, is calling for temps in the 40's as this series concludes on Saturday and Sunday.

DUPE STAYS PERFECT

--One of the top replay reviewers in the game, Bill Duplissea has converted his first three opportunities this year, including in two of the last four games...his most recent successful contribution was on Monday when Duper noticed that Mike Moustakas had beaten the throw to first on a second inning infield hit and just 36 seconds into the review the much warmer studio crew in New York agreed...in his four-plus years as the replay coordinator, Duplissea has made good on over 66% of his challenges, which ranks among the best, including a season mark of 69% (24-for-35) last year, which was second to the New York Yankees 74% (28-of-38)...Duper closed 2016 as the best in baseball with a 69.2% success rate, converting 27 of 39 challenges.

IAN KENNEDY makes his third start of the season, the 270th career start, 272nd overall appearance...he's facing the Angels for the eighth time, with this his seventh start...the 33-year-old right-hander is in his third season with Kansas City, after signing a five-year deal on Jan. 29, 2016...he was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Southern California.

WIN OVER THE TRIBE

--Ian enters tonight riding a streak of 11.0 consecutive shutout innings after earning his first victory of the season last Saturday afternoon in Cleveland, with 6.0 innings in a 1-0 triumph...he allowed four hits with no walks and eight strikeouts, firing 101 pitches...he never faced more than four hitters in any inning, while Cleveland did not put a runner in scoring position until Francisco Lindor led off the sixth with a double...his eight strikeouts were the most he's recorded since fanning 10 against these Angels on April 16 of last season...Kennedy also collected consecutive quality starts for the first time since last July 8-16, when he took no-decisions at Dodger Stadium (5-4 KC loss) and vs. Texas (4-3 Royals win), respectively.

APRIL DOMINANCE

--While the wins have not been plentiful, Kennedy has been very good in the month of April over the last three seasons...he enters tonight at 3-4 with a 2.27 ERA (16 ER in 63.1 IP) and a .186 opponents' average (41-for-220) over his last 10 April outings...among Major League hurlers that have at least 10 April starts since 2016, his opponents' average is tied with Chris Sale for the second lowest, while his April ERA is fourth best among all hurlers behind only Sale (1.46), Gio Gonzalez (1.54) and Carlos Carrasco (2.12)...last season, Ian posted a 2.30 ERA (8 ER in 31.1 IP) in the first month of the season, but dropped both of his decisions.

STARTING SOMETHING

--Despite a brief stint on the disabled list last season, Ian made at least 30 starts for the eighth consecutive season...it's the third-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only Jon Lester (10 straight) and Max Scherzer (nine straight)...since his first full season in the Majors (2010), his 258 starts (including tonight) are third to Scherzer (262) and Lester (260)...from 2010-15, he led the NL in starts (192) and ranked third in innings pitched (1175.0).

STRIKEOUT STREAK

--Kennedy has recorded at least one strikeout in each of his 271 career appearances...it's the second-longest active streak in the Majors to begin a career, trailing only David Price (272)...among non-active pitchers, only Dwight Gooden (349) and Josh Beckett (335) had longer streaks.

VS. HALOS

--Ian earned his first career win over the Angels last season, a 3-1 triumph on June 16 at Angel Stadium...he also tossed 8.0 scoreless frames here on April 16, but did not qualify for the win as KC won 1-0 on Alcides Escobar's walk-off RBI single...he is 1-4 with a 4.25 ERA (17 ER in 36.0 IP) in seven previous outings vs. LA (six starts).

AT HOME

--He did not factor into the decision in his first home start of the year, despite allowing one run over 6.0 innings to the White Sox on March 31 - a 4-3 Royals loss...Kennedy was 1-8 with a 6.46 ERA (51 ER in 71.0 IP) in 15 outings here last season, snapping an 18-start winless streak with a 2-1 triumph over Arizona on September 29...in 129 career home starts, he's 48-38 with a 3.96 ERA, holding the opposition to a .245 batting average.

FS 1 ON THE WEEKEND--This Saturday's telecast will be provided nationally by the folks at FS 1 with Justin Kutcher and Royals' Hall of Famer Mark Gubicza describing the action...tonight, tomorrow and Sunday can be found locally on the home of the Royals, FOX Sports Kansas City...FS 1 has also added Sunday's game to its weekend lineup with Shohei Ohtani scheduled to pitch, but the national feed will be that of the Angels FOX Sports telecast...Sunday's tilt will also be available in Japan in NHK.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY BURCH--One of Kansas City's two Rule 5 acquisitions is celebrating a birthday as right-handed hurler Burch Smith turns 28 today...the Texas-native shares his date of birth with such luminaries as Jesse James Decker, country singer and wife of wide receiver Eric Decker, is 30; actors Andy Garcia (62) and Ed O'Neill (72) and former talk show host David Letterman (71).

FACEBOOK ONLY NEXT WEDNESDAY--A reminder that next Wednesday's 3:07 (KC time) game from Toronto will be for exclusive viewing on Facebook with the MLB Network providing the feed and the announcers...Scott Braun will call the play-by-play, while former Royal, Jeremy Guthrie, will be joined by Cliff Floyd for the analysis...next week's game will be the third in the once-a-week games on Facebook with today's contest slated to be Milwaukee at St. Louis...the Royals could possibly be on two more times as the season progresses.

THREE SHUTOUTS, THREE W'S--Monday night was Kansas City's third win of the year and each have come while keeping the opposition off the board...the first two, in Detroit and Cleveland, respectively, were hold-your-breath 1-0 triumphs, while Monday's was a big exhale with a 10-0 final...the last Major League team to start the year with their first three triumphs occurring as shutouts were the 2016 Los Angeles Dodgers, when they opened the campaign with three straight blankings in San Diego...Jakob Junis has been the hottest during KC's early stretch of shutouts, working 7.0 innings on April 13 in Detroit in the 1-0 triumph, then flirting with history on Monday by tossing no-hit ball for 6.1 innings and leaving after 7.0 without allowing a run.

ESKY THE IRON MAN--Kansas City shortstop Alcides Escobar, who re-signed with the Royals over the winter, continues to possess the longest active streak of starts in the Majors with yesterday his 343rd consecutive assignment...Escobar, 31, was joined by Cincinnati's Joey Votto as the only big league players to start all 162 games last year, and Esky has a sizeable lead over the second longest skein among starters which belongs to Votto with 201 consecutive starts.

APRIL WILL CLOSE AS A BUSY MONTH--The sporadic action in the early going this year will be made up later this month as the Royals already have a pair of split doubleheaders on the docket before we get to May...the freeze-out in Detroit on April 4 will be made up on Friday, April 20 when the two clubs play at 12:10 and 6:10 (KC time) in Comerica Park to open what is now going to be a four-game series...the snowout of April Fool's Day vs. the White Sox will now be played as part of a split-DH here on Saturday, April 28 with a 1:15 first pitch for the make-up game and then 7:15 start for the nightcap, an hour later than the originally scheduled 6:15 affair, making that a five-game series...**both added games will be available on FSKC.**

ROYALS JOIN THE TV TWITTER-VERSE--Major League Baseball has announced its first nine games that will not only will be carried by club rightsholders, but also live on Twitter...the Royals will join the fray on Wednesday, May 2 from Boston when Twitter will show the 12:05 (CDT) contest from Fenway Park...the game will also air on its normal home in Kansas City of FOX Sports Kansas City...there will be more Twitter games announced as the season progresses.

STADIUM HISTORY THE FIRST 50TH CELEBRATION--The Royals have called just two ballparks "home" in their 50 seasons and this weekend vs. the Angels, each ballpark will gain recognition...in the 6:15 game Saturday, the Royals will salute the history of Municipal Stadium with special presentations, videos and trivia during the pregame show and in-game events...the first 10,000 fans will receive a Municipal Stadium replica, courtesy of Price Chopper and Pepsi...alumni to appear will include Tom Burgmeier, Steve Busby, Al Fitzmorris, Denny Matthews, John Mayberry, Fred Patek, former head groundskeeper George Toma and Dave Wickersham...Sunday, the Royals will review the history of Kauffman Stadium with special presentations, videos and trivia during the pregame show and in-game events...fans will be able to get pre-game autographs from two alumni as a part of Signature Sundays and among the scheduled to appear will be Lynn and Jennifer Splittorff (widow and daughter of Royals Hall of Famer Paul Splittorff who threw first Royals pitch in stadium history), Whitey Herzog, Mayberry, Busby and Patek.

NOT JUST THE TEAM'S 50TH SEASON--One common denominator with the Royals and this 50th season of baseball is Hall of Fame announcer Denny Matthews, who was in the booth with Buddy Blattner on April 8, 1969 and is once again calling the play-by-play as this milestone season gets underway...the Ford Frick Award winner in Cooperstown, NY in 2007, Matthews has been the one constant since the franchise came to be in '69...with this his 50th season, he trails only Los Angeles Dodger broadcasting icons Vin Scully (67 years prior to retiring) and Jaime Jarrin (59th season).

AT THE HELM--The winningest manager in franchise history, Ned Yost is in his eighth full season with the club, taking the reins on May 13, 2010...he has a 632-639 regular season record at the helm for the Royals, surpassing Whitey Herzog's previous team mark of 410 wins (1975-79)...Yost is the 16th full-time manager in franchise history and is sixth among active managers in games (2,230) and wins (1,089)...his postseason winning pct. of .710 (22-9) is tops among all managers in history who have worked at least 20 playoff games...this is his second stint as a big league manager after nearly six full campaigns at the helm for the Milwaukee Brewers (2003-2008)...he compiled a 457-502 record with the Brew Crew including a 166-146 mark in his last two seasons...Yost, a catcher during his playing days, began his coaching career in the Atlanta organization, including 12 straight seasons on Bobby Cox's big league staff (1991-2002).

RULE 5 ADDITIONS--The Royals are carrying a pair of Rule 5 acquisitions on the roster with right-handed hurlers Brad Keller and Burch Smith...Keller, 22, was selected in last December's Rule 5 draft from Arizona by Cincinnati and then dealt to KC, while the 28-year old Smith was acquired from the New York Mets after being selected in the draft...Keller spent the year in AA Jackson last year, while Smith has big league time with San Diego in 2013.

INTERLEAGUE FOES--The 2018 campaign features Kansas City playing the National League Central in Interleague action, including home & home 2-game sets with Milwaukee and Cincinnati, a home & home 3-game series with St. Louis...also on the slate is a 3-game series in Kauffman Stadium against the Chicago Cubs (August 6-8) and 3-game road trip to Pittsburgh (September 17-19).
