

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP GARRETT RICHARDS

5-4, 3.42 ERA

Third consecutive start vs. Mariners

- **BACK WITH THE HALOS:** Making second start since being reinstated from disabled list prior to last start on July 4; missed 17 games with a left hamstring strain...Making 16th start of the season and seventh at home...Fourth start of 2018 vs. Seattle.
- **THREE IN A ROW:** Tonight marks third consecutive start vs. Mariners...Becomes sixth pitcher in Angels history to have three straight starts come against the same opponent and the first since **Matt Wise** against the Rangers in 2001 (prior to Wise, the last Angels pitcher to do so was **Nolan Ryan** vs. White Sox in 1978). (STATS LLC).
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Is pitching to a 2.54 ERA (46 IP – 13 ER) across last nine starts...His ERA ranks seventh in the American League (min. 40 IP) in that span (since May 4)...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 13 of last 14 games.
- **LOW AVERAGE:** Ranks third in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .219 (414/1891) batting average against since the start of 2014 behind **Chris Sale** and **Corey Kluber**.
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** In 16 road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 3-3 record and 2.88 ERA (75 IP – 24 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in 13 of the 16 starts.
- **LAST TIME OUT:**
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Charged with loss in rehab assignment with Adv.-A Inland Empire on June 29 at Rancho Cucamonga after tossing 3.1 innings and allowing five earned runs on seven hits with no walks and four strikeouts...Four of the five runs came in his fourth innings of work.
- **DIVISIONAL PLAY:** Since 2013, owns a 21-17 record and 3.19 ERA (330.1 IP – 117 ER) in 62 games (53 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 21 wins are eighth most in the Majors in that span.
- **GROUNDING:** This season, has a ground ball rate of 51.6%, which ranks fourth in the A.L. (min. 70 IP).
- **UNEARNED:** Leads the American League with 12 unearned runs this season...His 12 UER are the most by any Angels pitcher before the All-Star Break since **Kelvim Escobar** matched **Chuck Finley's** club record of 16 in 2006.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** According to *Fangraphs*, ranks third among A.L. players currently on active rosters with an average fastball velocity of 95.9 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP)...This season (min. 50 IP), ranks third in the A.L. with a 95.9 MPH average, behind **Luis Severino**, **NY Y** (97.8 MPH), and **Gerrit Cole**, **HOU** (96.4 MPH).
- **VS. SEATTLE:** In 21 career games (13 starts) against the Mariners, is 7-4 with a 3.06 ERA (94 IP – 32 ER) and 90 strikeouts...In three starts this season, is 2-0 with a 2.57 ERA (14 IP – 4 ER)...Earned the win in start vs. Seattle on May 4 at Safeco Field after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings...Exited start on June 13 after two innings pitched with a left hamstring strain...As a starter, is 7-3 with a 2.73 ERA (82.1 IP – 25 ER)...**Has allowed two runs-or-fewer in eight of 13 starts.**
- **SCORELESS START:** Tossed 6.2 shutout innings on May 4 at Seattle, marking 15th career scoreless start (first of 2018); 11th scoreless start of at least 6.2 IP.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Tonight marks first home start since June 2...Owns a 24-16 career record with a 3.38 ERA (370 IP – 139 ER) in 81 appearances (54 starts) at Angel Stadium...In six starts at home this season, is 2-2 with a 3.31 ERA (32.2 IP – 12 ER)...Since 2014, is 18-12 with a 3.02 ERA (253 IP – 85 ER)...Overall as a starter, is 24-14 with a 3.30 ERA (338.2 IP – 124 ER) at the Big A...Angels are 33-21 in his home starts.
- **CAREER-HIGH K'S:** Matched career-high (fourth time) with 11 strikeouts on April 21 vs. San Francisco...Became first Angels pitcher with 11+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings pitched since **Zack Greinke** on Sept. 25, 2012 vs. Seattle.
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- **STREAK SNAPPED:** Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- **CAREER TOTALS:** In 169 career games (114 starts), is 45-38 with a 3.52 ERA (742 IP – 290 ER) and 644 strikeouts across eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 34-25 with a 3.11 ERA (512 IP – 177 ER).
