- The Colorado Rockies continue their first East Coast road trip of 2017 with the series finale against the Washington Nationals on Jackie Robinson Day today ... pitcher Armando Reynoso is the only player in Rockies franchise history to wear the number 42.
- After today's game the Rockies will travel to Pittsburgh where they will play three games Monday-Wednesday ... after an off day Thursday, Colorado returns home to Coors Field for a six-game homestand against the Chicago Cubs and San Diego Padres.
- The Rockies won the first two games of the series and will go for their second consecutive road series win today after losing the last two series at home against Atlanta and San Diego.
- Lost yesterday's game 6-2 to snap their season-long three-game winning streak ... scored both of their runs on a two-run home run by Charlie Blackmon in the first inning, his first at-bat after missing the previous four games with right quad tightness ... Jon Gray pitched 5.2 innings and allowed five runs, four of them in the sixth inning ... Nationals starter Max Scherzer retired 20 consecutive batters after the Blackmon home run.

TIME OUT

- Nolan Arenado dropped his appeal yesterday and began serving his five-game suspension ... he will miss the last four games of the road trip before returning on Friday ... Gerardo Parra is appealing his four-game suspension ... pitcher German Márquez, who was fined for his actions in the brawl, was issued a fine.

DIG THE LONG BALL

- DJ LeMahieu's four home runs on the season are halfway to his 2017 season total of eight ... in 2017, he did not hit his fourth home run until July 6 ... the quickest he has ever reached four home runs was in 2016, when he recorded his fourth on June 9.
- Carlos González has three home runs ... hit his third home run of 2017 on May 21.

PINCH ME, WAKE ME

- Pat Valaika's pinch-hit single in the third inning of last Wednesday's game snapped the Rockies' 0-for-22 hitless streak in the pinch ... the Rockies' are currently 1-for-26 (.038), the second-most pinch-hit at-bats in the Majors.

THWACK!

- The Rockies rank second in the NL in home runs with 21 (St. Louis ranks first with 23) ... in 2017, Colorado ranked 10th in the NL with 192 home runs.

- The Rockies .220 team batting average ranks last in the National League ... their .273 batting average in 2017 led the Major Leagues.
- Colorado is batting .215 (20-for-93) with runners in scoring position, 13th in the NL ... they are 8-for-59 (.136) with RISP over their last 10 games, including 0-for-16 this series against the Nationals.
- The Rockies .268 batting average on balls in play ranks last in the National League ... they led MLB with a .332 BABIP in 2017.

DES-TINATIONS BEYOND

- Ian Desmond is playing his first series in Washington D.C. since his last season as a member of the Nationals in 2015.
- Desmond's 927 games played with the Nationals are the second-most in franchise history ... he hit .264 with 185 doubles, 21 triples, 110 home runs and 432 RBI ... was named an All-Star in 2012 and won the Silver Slugger at shortstop in 2013 and 2014.

MAIN EVENT

- Colorado play the Nationals seven times this year, including the Rockies' first four-game set in Washington since 2013.
- All-time vs. Washington and Montreal, Colorado is 109-84 ... the Rockies are 53-38 vs. Washington since the move to D.C. in 2005.
- In Washington, the Rockies are 29-17, including 22-13 at Nationals Park ... the Rockies have won two of three in D.C. each of the last three seasons, going 7-3 over that span.
- DJ LeMahieu is a career .366 hitter (45-for-123) against the Nationals ... LeMahieu is a career .343 hitter in D.C., going 23-for-67 with four doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI ... he has hit safely in 12 of 17 games at Nationals Park ... at Nationals Park, his average ranks seventh among all active players with 60 or more plate appearances.
- In 31 career games against the Nationals, Nolan Arenado has batted .308 (36-for-117) with six home runs ... in 15 games at Nationals Park, Arenado has hit .345 (20-for-58) with three doubles, two triples and four home run.

OTTOMATIC

- Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in seven of his eight games, including striking out the side three times ... leads Major League relievers with 18 strikeouts ... has allowed one hit and one walk over his 8.2 innings of work across eight appearances.

WE THREE KINGS

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Charlie Blackmon (588), DJ LeMahieu (571) and Nolan Arenado (561) rank first, second and third, respectively, among National League players in hits.
- Since the start of the '15 season, LeMahieu's .319 batting average is the highest in NL.
- Nolan Arenado leads all Major Leaguers with 460 RBI since 2014.

MOVING UP

- With two hits April 2, Carlos González passed Vinny Castilla to move into fourth place all-time in Rockies history with 1,207 hits ... he is 66 hits from passing Dante Bichette (1,278) for third-most in franchise history.

BACK IN BLACK

- Manager Bud Black led the Rockies to a postseason appearance in his first season in 2017 with the club going 87-75 and advancing to the National League Wild Card game ... it was the Rockies' first winning season since 2010.
- Black and Nationals Manager Dave Martinez were teammates on the San Francisco Giants from 1993-94.

A NEW BEGINNING

- The 28-year-old left-hander will be making his fourth start of the season, his third on the road ... is a member of his second career Opening Day roster in his third Major League season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego.
- The University of Oregon product selected as the Rockies' first-round selection (20th overall) in Major League Baseball's 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... was also drafted in '08 by the Minnesota Twins, but did not sign.

TIDE PADS

- Made his second consecutive start against the Padres and his first start of the season at Coors field his last time out on April 10 ... did not factor into the decision in the 5-2 Rockies loss ... allowed two runs on seven hits with two walks and eight strikeouts in six innings pitched, his second consecutive quality start.

CHERRY BLOSSOM

- Will be making his second career start against the Washington Nationals, his first at Nationals Park.
- Faced the Nationals on April 24, 2017 at Coors Field, an 8-4 Rockies win ... allowed four runs in 5.2 innings with six hits, one walk and five strikeouts ... allowed all four runs in the sixth inning before being removed from the game ... surrendered a two-run home run to Ryan Zimmerman.

AWAY WE GO

- Is 3-7 with a 5.34 ERA (89.1 IP, 53 ER) in 18 career games, 17 starts, away from Coors Field.
- In two road starts this season, is 0-0 with a 7.56 ERA (8.1 IP, 7 ER), four walks and seven strikeouts ... all seven runs came on March 30 at Arizona, in a career-low tying 2.1 inning start.
- Went 3-3 with a 5.44 ERA (44.2 IP, 27 ER) in nine games, eight starts, on the road in 2017 ... allowed a home run in eight of his nine games outside of Denver ... homer-less relief stint on Sept. 11 at Arizona, his first road game with no homers since Sept. 25, 2016 at Los Angeles-NL.

DOMESTICA

- In 21 career appearances, 20 starts, at Coors Field, has posted a 3.38 ERA (125.1 IP, 47 ER), the lowest ERA at Coors Field in franchise history (min. 100 IP).
- In 2017, went 3-3 with a 4.14 ERA (41.1 IP, 19 ER) in eight games, seven starts at Coors Field ... did not allow a run over his final two starts at home in 2017, pitching 13 innings and allowing six hits with two walks and eight strikeouts.
- Was 5-2 with a 3.00 ERA (78.0 IP, 26 ER) in 12 starts at Coors Field in 2016 ... recorded nine quality starts and pitched at least six innings 11 times.
- His 3.00 ERA at home in 2016 was the second-lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 75 innings pitched) behind Jorge De La Rosa's 2.76 home ERA (81.2 IP, 25 ER) in 2013.

FUN IN THE SUN

- Made five starts in Spring Training, going 0-1 with a 6.32 ERA (15.2 IP, 11 ER), 23 hits, nine walks and seven strikeouts ... surrendered four home runs.
- Pitched four innings on the back fields on Sunday at Salt River Fields ... last official Cactus League appearance came on March 20.

THE NOT SO DISTANT PAST

- In 15 starts and two relief appearances in 2017, went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) ... the two relief appearances were the first of his professional career.
- Was 5-6 with a 5.11 ERA (81.0 IP, 46 ER) as a starter, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 0 ER) in his two relief appearances.
- Had two separate stints on the 10-day disabled list and one stint on the 60-day DL ... placed on the 10-day DL on June 4 with left knee inflammation ... reinstated on June 22 but made just two appearances (one start) before being placed on the disabled list again on June 26 ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on July 3 and was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 26.

FINISH STRONG

- After being reinstated from the disabled list on Sept. 10, went 3-1 with a 1.19 ERA (22.2 IP, 3 ER), three walks and 18 strikeouts in four appearances (three starts) to end the regular season.

JUST A TASTE

- Pitched one inning of relief in the National League Wild Card Game at Arizona ... entered the game in the third inning and allowed two runs on two hits with one strikeout ... allowed a two-run home run to Daniel Descalso.

SOMETHING TO BUILD ON

- Went 4-3 over his first 10 starts in 2016 with a 3.25 ERA (61.0 IP, 22 ER) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts ... allowed three or fewer earned runs over his first six career starts.
- His 3.54 ERA (114.1 IP, 45 ER) was the eighth-lowest in franchise history among pitchers with a minimum 100 innings pitched ... it was the second-lowest among rookies in franchise history (Jhoulys Chacin, 3.28 ERA, 2010).
- Had a 67.0 strike percentage in 2016, which ranked 11th among qualifying Major League starting pitchers.
