WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won four of their last six games as they continue a six-game, seven-day homestand tonight with the finale against the New York Yankees.
- RHP Lucas Giolito, who is 2-1 with a 3.19 ERA (11 ER/31.0 IP) over his last five starts, is scheduled to start for the White Sox.
- The Sox have lost the first two games of this homestand by a combined 11-3 margin.
- Following today's game and a day off tomorrow, the Sox conclude the homestand this weekend with three games vs. Cleveland (8/10-12).
- The White Sox went 3-0 on their last trip to Tampa Bay from 8/3-5 and 2-4 on their last homestand vs. Toronto (1-2) and Kansas City (1-2) from 7/27-8/2.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are looking to avoid their first three-game sweep at home by the Yankees since 5/27-29/02.
- The Sox are hitting .122 (9-74) with three runs scored through two games of this series.
- White Sox starting pitchers own a 2.29 ERA (10 ER/39.1 IP) and .190 (26-137) opponents average over the last six games.
- The Sox bullpen owns a 6.75 ERA (95 ER/126.2 IP) over the last 42 games (since 6/19).
- José Abreu is hitting .367/.418/.800 (22-60) with five doubles, seven homers, 14 RBI and 16 runs scored over his last 15 games.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Miguel Andújar hit a go-ahead single off Luis Avilán with two outs in the 13th inning, and the Yankees went on to defeat the White Sox, 4-3.
- The Sox carried a 1-0 lead into the seventh before Andújar hit a solo home run off starter Reynaldo López.
- Giancarlo Stanton hit a two-run homer off Tyler Danish in the 10th to give the Yankees a 3-1 lead, but José Abreu connected on a two-run shot (No. 20) off Zach Britton in the bottom of the frame to extend the game.
- López posted a no decision despite allowing one run on four hits over 7.0 IP ... Juan Minaya retired all five batters he faced, and Xavier Cedeño threw 2.0 scoreless IP.
- The Sox went 1-11 with RISP, left nine runners on base and struck out 20 times, tied for the second-highest total in franchise history (21 on 3/31/96 at Seattle).

20/20/20/20 VISION

- José Abreu last night became the 18th player in major-league history to hit 20-plus home runs in each of his first five seasons and first player in White Sox history to accomplish the feat.
- Pete Incaviglia (1986-90), Eddie Murray (1977-81), Tony Conigliaro (1964-69), Ted Williams (1939-42, 1946) and Joe DiMaggio (1936-40) are the only players to accomplish the feat exclusively in the American League (source: Baseball Reference).

NEAR NO-NO'S

- Reynaldo López last night became the fifth White Sox starting pitcher this season to carry a no-hitter into the sixth inning or beyond ... López did not allow a hit last night until Aaron Hicks led off the sixth inning with a ground-rule double.
- Carlos Rodón (5.2 IP on 7/24 at the Angels), Dylan Covey (5.1 on 7/21 at Seattle), Lucas Giolito (5.1 on 6/28 vs. Minnesota) and James Shields (6.1 on 5/6 vs. Minnesota) also have taken no-hitters into the sixth inning or later this season (STATS).

HONORING A HALL-OF-FAMER

- The White Sox will honor five-time All-Star Jim Thome this Saturday on his induction into the National Baseball Hall of Fame ... White Sox great Mark Buehrle will be among the special guests who will attend the pregame ceremony.
- The first 20,000 fans to the park will receive a Jim Thome Hall of Fame Bobblehead, presented by Wintrust ... in celebration of Thome, White Sox Charities will guarantee a \$20,000 Sox Split jackpot ... fans can play at the ballpark or online at whitesox.com/soxsplit (sales will start on Saturday, 8/11 at 3 p.m. CT).

REVIVING BASEBALL

- The Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities (RBI) World Series continued on Tuesday in Minneapolis, with the White Sox Junior team defeating Jersey City, 10-1, before suffering an 11-1 loss to Tampa.
- Donavon Noble hit an inside-the-park home run to start the sixth inning against Jersey City ... it marked the team's second inside-the-park home run in as many days.
- The White Sox Senior team defeated Arizona, 8-3 ... Kendal Ewell recorded four RBI, including a two-run homer in the first and a two-run single in the second.

WHITE SOX VS. NEW YORK-AL

- The Yankees lead the season series, 2-0, and are 10-1-3 in the last 14 season matchups vs. the White Sox (2004-17).
- The Sox are batting .122/.205/.203 (9-74) with a 4.50 ERA (11 ER/22.0 IP) and have been outscored the Yankees, 11-3.
- The White Sox are 13-9 in their last 22 home games vs. the Yankees dating back to 2012.
- The Sox trail the all-time series, 820-1,065 ... they are 450-496 at home (55-60 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 370-569 on the road (8-22 at new Yankee Stadium).

LOOKING FOR AN EDGE VS. THE EAST

- The White Sox are 189-230 vs. the American League East since 2007, with their only winning record during that span coming in 2016 (19-14).
- The Sox are 10-11 vs. the AL East this season (4-8 at home) and have won nine of their last 16 games after a 1-4 start.

SOX IN THE DESERT

- Class A Winston-Salem hitting coach Charlie Poe and minor-league medical/rehab coordinator Scott Takao will serve on the Glendale Desert Dogs staff at the 2018 Arizona Fall League.
- The 2018 AFL season will begin on 10/9, the Fall Stars Game will take place on 11/3, and the championship game will be played on 11/17 at Scottsdale Stadium.

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have hit 41 home runs in 29 games since 7/3, tied for the fourth-highest total in the American League behind Texas (43), Toronto (43) and Oakland (42).
- The Sox have homered in 15 of their last 17 games (25 total), including a season-high tying eight in a row from 7/28-8/5.
- José Abreu has hit seven home runs in his last 15 games, Avisail García has hit 12 in his last 30, and Daniel Palka has 10 in his last 26.

PALKA POWER

- Daniel Palka ranks among the American League rookie leaders this season in home runs (2nd, 17), slugging percentage (3rd, .494), RBI (3rd, 44) and total bases (T4th, 129).
- Palka's three pinch-hit homers this season are tied with Oscar Gamble (1977), John Romano (1959) and Ron Northey (1956) for the White Sox franchise record, and his nine RBI are the most by a Sox pinch-hitter since Jerry Hairston in 1987 (10).

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- José Abreu has joined Magglio Ordóñez (1999-2003) as the only players in White Sox history to hit 30-plus doubles in five straight seasons ... he and Matt Carpenter are the only players to hit 30-plus doubles in each of the last five seasons (2014-18).
- Abreu also has joined Frank Thomas (nine), Paul Konerko (eight), Ordóñez (five), Ray Durham (five), Willie Kamm (five) and Bibb Falk (five) as the only players in Sox history with five-plus seasons of 30-plus doubles.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,365 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, four more than the second-place New York Mets (1,361) and 46 more than Oakland (1,319), the next-closest American League team.

PROSPECT PROWESS

- The White Sox farm system is ranked No. 3 in baseball according to MLB Pipeline's updated rankings, and includes seven of the Top 100 prospects.
- OF Eloy Jiménez (No. 3), RHP Michael Kopech (13), OF Luis Robert (25), INF Nick Madrigal (32), RHP Dylan Cease (44), RHP Dane Dunning (64) and OF Blake Rutherford (88) all are ranked in MLB Pipeline's Top 100.

ON THE AIR

- Matt Vasgerian will work approximately three innings with Hawk Harrelson in the Sox TV booth this Sunday vs. Cleveland.
- Tom Paciorek will fill in for Steve Stone alongside Jason Benetti for the White Sox series at Detroit from 8/13-15.

ON DECK: CLEVELAND INDIANS

- The White Sox conclude the homestand this weekend with three games vs. Cleveland ... LHP Carlos Rodón (3-3, 2.94) is scheduled to start Friday's opener.
- Rodón is 2-0 with a 1.56 ERA (6 ER/34.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts over his last five starts, allowing just 18 hits.
- The Sox are 2-8 against Cleveland in 2018, suffering a pair of sweeps at Progressive Field and splitting a four-game series at Guaranteed Rate Field from 6/11-14.

GIOLITO AT A GLANCE

- The 24-year-old makes his 23rd start of the season (12th at home) and first career against the Yankees.
- Is 2-1 with a 3.19 ERA (11 ER/31.0 IP) and .198 (21-106) average over his last five starts.
- Has gone 3-4 with a 7.76 ERA (46 ER/53.1 IP) over 11 starts at home this season and 4-4 with a 4.54 ERA (34 ER/67.1 IP) in 11 road starts.
- Ranks last among major-league pitchers (min. 20 starts) in ERA (5.97), SO/BB ratio (1.13) and walks per 9.0 IP (5.07) and second-to-last in opponents on-base percentage (.358).
- Owns an 8.18 ERA (20 ER/22.0 IP) and .459 opponents on-base percentage in the first inning this season.
- Has received zero runs of support seven times and one run on four occasions.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster.
- Lost 10 pounds in the offseason, dropping from 255 to 245.
- Was acquired from Washington on 12/7/16 with RHP Dane Dunning and RHP Reynaldo López in exchange for OF Adam Eaton.

LAST START

● Posted a no decision on 8/3 at Tampa Bay despite allowing one run on two hits over 7.0 IP ... walked three, struck out six and hit a batter ... carried a one-hit shutout into the eighth inning before allowing a leadoff double to Daniel Robertson in the eighth ... was replaced by Jace Fry, who gave up an RBI single to Joey Wendle ... threw 99 pitches (58 strikes) ... the Rays tied the game at 2-2 before the Sox won, 3-2, in 10 innings.

2018 STARTS OF INTEREST

- Threw 6.1 scoreless IP on 7/15 vs. Kansas City ... lost on 7/8 at Houston despite allowing two runs on three hits over a career-high 7.1 IP ... carried a no-hitter through 5.1 IP on 6/28 vs. Minnesota ... pitched into the eighth inning for the first time in his career on 6/22-2 vs. Oakland.
- Allowed a career-high nine hits on 5/29 at Cleveland but did not issue a walk for the first time this season ... lasted 1.1 IP on 5/24 vs. Baltimore, the shortest start of his career ... won 5/13 at the Cubs despite walking a career-high tying seven batters ... became the third Sox pitcher since 2005 to earn the victory while issuing seven-plus walks, joining Derek Holland on 8/8/17 vs. Houston (seven over 5.2 IP) and Gavin Floyd on 4/13/09 at Detroit (seven over 5.0 IP).
- Earned his first victory of the season and first career road win on 4/26 at Kansas City ... allowed career highs of nine runs and seven walks over 2.0 IP on 4/21 vs. Houston ... his three HBP on 4/7 vs. Detroit were the most by a Sox starter since Chris Sale on 9/21/16 at Philadelphia (also three).

DAY AND NIGHT

- Has gone 7-4 with a 3.72 ERA (35 ER/84.2 IP) and .195 (59-303) opponents average over 14 starts during the day since 2017, compared to 3-7 with a 6.31 ERA (57 ER/81.1 IP) and .268 (84-313) opponents average in 15 starts at night.
- His 0.99 ERA during the day in 2017 would have led the American League with the required IP.

IT'S ALL ME

- Is one of 35 members of the Taylor Hooton Foundation advisory board, which is recognized as the leader in advocacy against appearance and performance enhancing drug use by the youth of America.
 - The advisory board is comprised of at least one member from each of the 30 Major League clubs ... the players will participate in the THF 2018 public service campaign, including "It's All Me" themed PSAs which will appear in MLB's 2018 All-Star Game, League Championship Series and World Series programs.
- 2017 RECAP**
- Made 24 starts with Class AAA Charlotte and seven with the White Sox in his first season in the organization.
 - Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP), 30 strikeouts, a .177 (25-141) opponents average and 0.94 WHIP over his final six starts ... five of the outings were quality.
 - Was recalled on 8/23 and made his White Sox debut that night vs. Minnesota (4 ER/6.0 IP; 3 HR) ... earned his first win with the Sox on 8/27 vs. Detroit, allowing just three hits over 7.0 scoreless IP.
 - Allowed one run and struck out a career-high 10 over 7.0 IP on 9/3 vs. Tampa Bay ... became the first Sox pitcher to strike out 10-plus batters within his first three starts with the club since Chris Sale in 2012.
 - Received a ND on 9/13 at Kansas City, allowing one run on four hits in 6.1 IP ... became the 15th Sox pitcher to make four-plus straight starts of 5.0-plus IP and four hits or less allowed.
 - Began the season with Charlotte ... threw his first professional no-hitter on 5/25-1 vs. Syracuse (7.0 IP), marking the first no-hitter in BB&T Ballpark history ... was named IL Pitcher of the Week for 5/22-28.
 - Entered the season ranked by MLB.com as the No. 12 Prospect in baseball.

Rick has appeared in "As the World Turns," "Who's the Boss," "Hunter," "Jake and the Fatman," "Twin Peaks" and "Hit the Dutchman" ... Lindsay acted in "The Ring," "Collateral Damage," "Without a Trace," "The Unit," "Boston Legal," "Crossing Jordan," "Lost," "Frasier" and "CSI."
- His uncle, Mark Frost, is a co-creator and writer of the ABC and Showtime drama "Twin Peaks."
- Grandfather, Warren Frost, was a veteran actor who played George Costanza's father-in-law, Henry Ross, on the award-winning sitcom "Seinfeld."

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Was selected by Washington in the first round (16th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft ... was committed to play baseball at UCLA prior to signing with the Nationals.
- Is a 2012 graduate of Harvard-Westlake High School in Los Angeles, where he was teammates with current major-leaguers RHPs Jack Flaherty (St. Louis) and Max Fried (Atlanta).

VS. NEW YORK YANKEES

- Makes his first career start against the Yankees ... is 1-1 with a 6.41 ERA (14 ER/19.2 IP) and 19 strikeouts in four career starts against American League East opponents.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER

- LHP Carlos Rodón (3-3, 2.94) makes his 11th start of the season and seventh at home ... is limiting opponents to a .191 (44-230) average, which would rank fourth in the American League with the required IP ... is 2-0 with a 1.56 ERA (6 ER/34.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts over his last five starts, allowing just 18 hits.
- Posted a no decision in his last start on 8/4 at Tampa Bay despite allowing one unearned run on three hits over 6.0 IP ... carried a no-hitter through 5.2 IP and a one-hit shutout into the eighth inning on 7/24 at the Angels (2 ER/7.2 IP) ... his streak of 15.1 consecutive IP ended in the eighth.
- Began the season on the disabled list to continue his recovery from left shoulder surgery before being reinstated on 6/9.
- Is 0-1 with a 4.76 ERA (6 ER/11.1 IP) in two starts against Cleveland in 2018 and 4-2 with a 2.71 ERA (22 ER/73.0 IP) in 12 career games (11 starts).
