**LEADING OFF:** *Happy Cinco de Mayo!!...Happy Birthdays to pitching coach Charles Nagy & bullpen catcher Tom Gregorio...LAA plays the second contest of a five-game road trip (1-0) to Seattle (May 4-6; 1-0) and Colorado (May 8-9)... Halos are off on Monday...Angels are 11-3 vs. A.L. West foes, winning all four completed series vs. the division...LAA has won last four games to move into first place tie with Houston...Halos are 7-9 since a club-record 13-3 start...MLB-best 12-2 road record is tops in team history through 14 games (LAA won 11 consecutive on road, March 30-April 24) and leads A.L...Halos are 7-3-0 in 10 series played.*

**3,000!!!** With a fifth inning single to right field last night (off Mike Leake), **Albert Pujols**...

- Became 32<sup>nd</sup> player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**).
- 6th foreign-born player to reach 3K (2nd Dominican – **Beltre**).
- Is one of four players with 3,000 hits, 450 HRs and 600 doubles (**Aaron, Carl Yastrzemski, Beltre & Musial**) - *STATS LLC*.
- Joins **Rod Carew** (Aug. 4, 1985 vs. Minnesota) as only players to log 3,000<sup>th</sup> hit in an Angels' uniform.

**3x3x3:** **Pujols** has matched **Stan Musial** and **Alex Rodriguez** as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.

**SIMBA SIZZLIN':** **Andrelton Simmons** boasts a nine-game hit streak batting .452 (14/31) with seven runs, four doubles, a triple, two home runs and 12 RBI in the span...**Hit streak surpasses season-high 8-gamer (March 29-April 6)...**His .339 season average ranks sixth in the A.L.

**A.L. ROOKIE OF THE MONTH:** **Shohei Ohtani** was named American League Rookie of the Month for April...As a DH, he batted .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

**THAT'S A NO-NO:** Angels' prospects **Jason Alexander** (7 IP), **Zac Ryan** (1 IP), and **Sean Isaac** (1 IP) threw a combined no-hitter for the Inland Empire 66ers on Wednesday...**Marked second combined no-hitter in the Angels' system in five days (also Double-A Mobile on April 28).**

**DOUBLE VISION:** With a two-bagger Wednesday night, **Albert Pujols** surpassed **Hank Aaron** for 11<sup>th</sup> place on MLB all-time doubles list with 625 (**David Ortiz** is 10<sup>th</sup> with 632)...**Pujols currently sits at 626 career doubles.**

**TWO-WAY SHOHEI:** **Ohtani** is just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971...**Ohtani** tied the club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)...**Ohtani** has a hit in 12 of 14 starts at DH this season.

**FAST FACT:** Angels' pitching staff has recorded 10+ strikeouts 15 times this season – a new franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games through the team's first 32 games of the season (previous was 11 in 2017).

**SHO-KKKK OHTANI:** **Shohei Ohtani** set Angels' record with 26 K through first four career games as a pitcher. He has passed the mark of 24 Ks set by **Bo Belinsky** (1962) & **Tim Lincecum** (1992).

**THIS N' THAT:** **Halos' average home attendance of 39,525 leads A.L...** Club boasts six sellouts already...**LAA has committed 13 errors thru 32 games (second fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .990 fielding pct...** Halos hurlers have issued 123 free passes, second-most in A.L...**Angels' bullpen has tossed 135 IP to lead all of baseball (average 4.1 IP per game)...** Trout has his 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. (2008) A day after **Joe Saunders** moves to 6-0, **Ervin Santana** joins him at 6-0 with a 4-hit shutout over the Royals at Kauffman Stadium... Just 8<sup>th</sup> pair of teammates since 1920 to start 6-0 simultaneously.

**May 6**

(1983) In a 4-2 win at Detroit, **Rod Carew**, with a 3-for-4 effort, raises his average to .500 (48-for-96). The first baseman will finish 1983 at .339, second best in A.L. as **Wade Boggs** leads at a .361 clip; (1972) Angels played their fastest nine-inning game in club history (1:31) in a 2-0 win over Milwaukee.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP TYLER SKAGGS**

**3-2, 3.03 ERA**

Tossed 6.1 scoreless innings in last start at Safeco Field on Aug. 10, 2017

- Making seventh start of the season and fourth on the road...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Sunday vs. New York (A.L.) after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on three hits with two walks and eight strikeouts...Only runs allowed came on two-run HR by Gary Sanchez...Recorded 300<sup>th</sup> career strikeout against **Aaron Hicks** in 4<sup>th</sup> inning.
- **THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD:** Has pitched to a 3-0 record and 0.49 ERA (18.1 IP – 1 ER) on the road this season, compared with an 0-2 record and 6.28 ERA (14.1 IP – 10 ER) at home.
- **EARLY SUCCESS:** In 16 career regular season starts during March/April, is 6-3 with a 3.43 ERA (97 IP – 37 ER) and 83 strikeouts...The six wins are his most for any month...Tonight marks first start in month of May since 2014.
- **GETTING FAMILIAR:** Since start of 2017, has not allowed a home run the first time through the batting order in a game (198 PA), but has yielded 14 HR in 195 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- **VS. SEATTLE:** In seven career starts against the Mariners, is 1-2 with a 4.81 ERA (39.1 IP – 21 ER)...In two starts vs. M's last year, was 0-0 with a 2.45 ERA (11 IP – 3 ER)...Has recorded 41 strikeouts and 13 walks vs. M's.
- **AT SAFECO FIELD:** In four career games at Safeco Field, is 1-1 with a 3.28 ERA (24.2 IP – 12 ER)...Tossed 6.1 scoreless innings in last start at Safeco Field on Aug. 10, 2017.
- **NEW CAREER HIGH:** Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati).
- **SEASON DEBUT:** Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP – 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:** During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made 16 starts for Angels last year and pitched to a 2-6 record and 4.55 ERA (85 IP – 43 ER) with 76 strikeouts...Missed 85 games on disabled list with a right oblique muscle strain suffered on Apr. 28 at Texas...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of 11 contests following return from disabled list.

**CAREER NOTES:**

- Owns a 16-23 career record with a 4.44 ERA (348.1 IP – 172 ER) and 301 strikeouts in 63 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by **Dr. Neal Elattrache** after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.

**RHP SHOHEI OHTANI (2-1, 4.43 ERA)**

Making fifth start of the season and third on the road...First career start vs. Mariners...Was named the American League Rookie of the Month for April after going 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 innings pitched and also batting .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...Did not factor in decision in last start as a pitcher on April 24 at Houston after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing a season-high four earned runs on six hits with five walks and seven strikeouts...His 26 strikeouts on the season are the most in Angels history through a pitcher's first four career starts...He also joined Babe Ruth and Walter Johnson as the only players in the last 100 years (min. 40 PA) with multiple wins and a batting average of at least .359 in a calendar month.
