LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels open a five-game road trip to **Seattle** (May 4-6) and **Colorado** (May 8-9)...Halos are off on Monday...LAA went 3-3 on six-game home stand vs. **New York Yankees** (0-3) & **Baltimore Orioles** (3-0)...**LAA outscored Orioles 25-12 to complete third sweep of season and move into first place tie with Houston atop A.L. West**...Halos are 6-9 since a 13-3 start to season (LAA's best ever start after 16 G)...**11-2 road record is best in team history through 13 games** (Club won 11 consecutive on road, March 30-April 24)...Halos are 7-3-0 in 10 series played...**Upcoming birthdays:** May 5 (Charles Nagy & Tom Gregorio); May 6 (Jose Alvarez).

DID YOU KNOW? Garrett Richards is facing Seattle for the first time in three years – last time coming Sept. 25, 2015 in Anaheim (W; 7 IP, 5 H, 3 ER, 4 BB, 8 SO).

3,000/600: Albert Pujols is one hit shy of becoming one of 32 players all-time to reach 3,000...**Will be just fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**...Also joins a group of four players with 3,000 hits, 450 homers and 600 doubles (Hank Aaron, Carl Yastrzemski, Adrian Beltre & Stan Musial).

SHOHEI OHTANI ON ICHIRO: "I have nothing but the utmost respect for him. What he has done for this game, our country and the fans. Sure I wish we could have played against him but it wasn't meant to be. Wish nothing but the best for him moving forward."

A.L. ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Shohei Ohtani was named American League Rookie of the Month for April...As a DH, he batted .359 (14/39) with four HR and 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

MEAT OF THE ORDER: During the Baltimore series, Angels' 2-4 hitters (Trout, Upton & Pujols) were a combined 11-for-33 (.333) with 11 RBI, three doubles and three HR.

THAT'S A NO-NO: Angels' prospects Jason Alexander (7 IP), Zac Ryan (1 IP), and Sean Isaac (1 IP) threw a combined no-hitter for the Inland Empire 66ers on Wednesday...**Marks the second combined no-hitter in the Angels' system in five days** (also Double-A Mobile on April 28).

DOUBLE VISION: With a two-bagger Wednesday night, Albert Pujols surpassed Hank Aaron for 11th place on MLB all-time doubles list with 625 (David Ortiz is 10th with 632)...**Pujols currently sits at 626 career doubles.**

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani is just the fourth player in the modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month:

- Wes Ferrell (July 1935)
- Don Drysdale (August 1958)
- Fergie Jenkins (Sept. 1971)

Ohtani tied the club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (Jackie Warner in 1966)...Ohtani has a hit in 11 of 13 starts at DH this season.

FAST FACT: Angels' pitching staff has recorded 10+ strikeouts 14 times this season – a new franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games through the team's first 31 games of the season (previous was 11 in 2017).

SHO-KKKK OHTANI: Shohei Ohtani set Angels' record with 26 K through first four career games as a pitcher. He has passed the mark of 24 Ks set by Bo Belinsky (1962) & Tim Lincecum (1992).

Trout has a long ball in eight of 10 series this season and has nine HRs his last 21 games (11 HRs rank 2nd in MLB - tied)...**His nine HRs in April equaled club record set by Albert Pujols (2014) & Brian Downing (1987).**

FISH FACT: Mike Trout scored his 700th career run on April 8th... Only eight players have hit 200 HRs and scored 700 runs prior to their age-27 season: Albert Pujols, Alex Rodriguez, Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx.

THIS N' THAT: Andreton Simmons currently boasts an eight-game hit streak batting .423 (11/26) with seven runs, three doubles, a triple, two home runs and 11 RBI in the span...**Halos' average home attendance of 39,525 leads the A.L.**...Club boasts six sellouts already...**LAA has committed 11 errors thru 31 games (second fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .991 fielding pct.**...Halos hurlers have issued 122 free passes, second-most in A.L....**Angels' bullpen has tossed 132.2 IP to lead all of baseball (average 4.1 IP per game)**...Trout has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? Rogers Hornsby (4) and Ty Cobb (4)...**Kole Calhoun is tied for A.L. lead with four outfield assists**...Since 2015, his 34 assists are second most in the AL, behind White Sox Avisail Garcia (36).

(1966) Dean Chance became the first Angels hurler to pitch a complete game in Anaheim Stadium in a 13-2 win over the Kansas City Athletics; (2006) Mike Napoli becomes the third player in Angels' history to hit a home run in his first Major League at-bat at Detroit; (2007) With the 5-1 win over Chicago at Angel Stadium, Mike Scioscia becomes the Angels' winningest manager with victory #626 breaking Bill Rigney's previous club record of 625 victories as Halos skipper.

May 5

(2008) A day after Joe Saunders moves to 6-0, Ervin Santana joins him at 6-0 with a 4-hit shutout over the Royals at Kauffman Stadium... Just 8th pair of teammates since 1920 to start 6-0 simultaneously; (1962) Bo Belinsky pitched the first no-hitter in Angels' history in a 2-0 win vs. Baltimore at Chavez Ravine.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP GARRETT RICHARDS

3-1, 4.88 ERA

First start vs. Mariners since Sept. 25, 2015 at Angel Stadium

- Making seventh start of the season and fourth on the road.
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Allowed two-or-fewer runs in four straight starts from April 3-21 and pitched to a 2.57 ERA (21 IP – 6 ER) in that span....Longest such streak of career is five straight starts (three times; last April 24 – May 17, 2015).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Saturday vs. New York (A.L.) after allowing season-high nine runs (five earned) on five hits with three walk and two strikeouts in 1.2 innings pitched...Career high is 10 runs (June 30, 2012 at Toronto).
- **CAREER-HIGH K's:** Matched career-high (fourth time) with 11 strikeouts on April 21 vs. San Francisco...Became first Angels pitcher with 11+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings pitched since **Zack Greinke** on Sept. 25, 2012 vs. Seattle.
- **LOW AVERAGE:** Ranks third in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .219 (377/1722) batting average against since the start of 2014 behind only **Corey Kluber** (.217) and **Chris Sale** (.218).
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** In 10 road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 1-1 record and 2.61 ERA (48.1 IP – 14 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in eight of the 10 starts.
- **DIVISIONAL PLAY:** Since 2013, owns a 19-16 record and 3.36 ERA (302.1 IP – 113 ER) in 57 games (48 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 19 wins are eighth most in the Majors in that span.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** According to *Fangraphs*, leads all A.L. players currently on active rosters with an average fastball velocity of 95.8 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP)...This season (min. 25 IP), ranks fourth in the A.L. with a 95.7 MPH average, behind **Luis Severino**, NYY (97.7 MPH), **Charlie Morton**, HOU (96.1 MPH) and **Gerrit Cole**, HOU (96.0 MPH).
- **VS. SEATTLE:** In 18 career games (10 starts) against the Mariners, is 5-4 with a 3.15 ERA (80 IP – 28 ER) and 72 strikeouts...Tonight marks first game vs. Seattle since Sept. 25, 2015 at Angel Stadium...As a starter, is 5-3 with a 2.77 ERA (68.1 IP – 21 ER)...Has allowed two runs-or-fewer in six of 10 starts.
- **AT SAFECO FIELD:** Tonight marks first appearance at Safeco Field since Sept. 14, 2015...In eight career games (five starts) in Seattle, is 2-3 with a 3.68 ERA (36.2 IP – 15 ER)...As a starter, is 2-3 with a 3.69 ERA (31.2 IP – 13 ER).
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- **STREAK SNAPPED:** Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- **2017 SEASON:** Exited first start of year (Apr. 5, 2017 at OAK) after five scoreless innings with right biceps strain...Missed 135 games on disabled list...Returned to Angels on Sept. 5, 2017 at OAK...Made five September starts and pitched to a 2.74 ERA (23 IP – 7 ER) for the month...Allowed one-or-fewer runs in four of six starts on the season.
- **CAREER TOTALS:** In 160 career games (105 starts), is 43-35 with a 3.58 ERA (696 IP – 277 ER) and 595 strikeouts across eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 32-22 with a 3.17 ERA (466.1 IP – 164 ER).
