TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 4, 1983: Dave Righetti tosses a no-hitter in a 4-0 Yankees win vs. Boston, striking out Wade Boggs for the final out. It is the Yankees' sixth all-time regular season no-hitter and first since Allie Reynolds had two in 1951.

July 4, 1939: Lou Gehrig Appreciation Day is held at the original Yankee Stadium. During the ceremony, which is held in between games of a doubleheader vs. Washington, Gehrig delivers his "Luckiest Man" speech.

July 4, 1930: Late Yankees principal owner George M. Steinbrenner is born in Rocky River, Ohio.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 5, 1951: RHP Rich "Goose" Gossage is born in Colorado Springs, Colo. Elected to the 2008 Hall of Fame class, Gossage had a 22-year career with nine teams, including two stints with the Yankees (1978-83, '89).

July 5, 1930: The New York Lincoln Giants and the Baltimore Black Sox split a double-header before 20,000 fans in the first Negro League game at Yankee Stadium.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees conclude their six-game homestand today...are 3-2 so far, splitting the first two games of this series vs. Atlanta after going 2-1 vs. Boston over the weekend...is their final home game before the All-Star break...following an off day tomorrow, begin an 11-game road trip to finish the "first half": 3G at Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), 4G at Baltimore (7/9-11, incl. DH on 7/9) and 4G at Cleveland (7/12-15).

- ▶ **At 55-28 (.663), have the Majors' second-best record behind Boston (58-29, .667)...have held sole possession of the Majors' best record for 14 of the last 19 days (since 6/16)...was the latest in a season they have had sole possession of MLB's best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (.606, 60-39).**
- ▶ **Are 27G over .500, 1G shy of their season high...are 5-6 since they were 28G over .500 at the end of play on 6/21 (50-22).**
- ▶ **Are 1.0G behind Boston for first place in the AL East...the AL East division lead has changed hands on five of the last six days, and 12 times since 5/7...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the two best records in the Majors on 61 of the last 62 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 41-27, the Yankees are 46-19).**
- ▶ **Are 18-3-2 over their last 23 series (since 4/19)...are 46-19 in their last 65G...are 39-5 (.886) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 35-5 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.**
- ▶ **Are 20-14 vs. the AL East and 35-14 vs. all other divisions.**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Braves, 8-5, on Tuesday...**Yankees batters** had 5BB in the third, their most in an inning since 8/2/14 at Boston (also 5BB)...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI, 2BB) hit his 15th homer of the season, tying his career high (15HR in 2017)...**C Kyle Higashioka** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) has two career hits, both homers...**RF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-5, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit a two-run HR in the eighth, his 20th HR this season...**DH Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1BB, 2SB) recorded his first career multi-steal game...**RHP Domingo Germán** (4.1IP, 6H, 3ER, 3BB, 6K, 2HR, 1BK) started and did not record a decision...tied his career high in HR (also 2HR on 5/22/18 at Texas and 6/9/18 at the Mets)...**RHP A.J. Cole** (1H, 4K) tossed 1.2 scoreless innings to earn his second win as a Yankee and third of the season...**RHP Adam Warren** (1.1IP, 4H, 2ER, 1K, 1HR) allowed a two-run HR to Markakis in the seventh, his first run allowed since coming off the D.L. on 6/4...also snapped a 13.1-inning scoreless streak (4/20-6/30)...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** tossed a perfect ninth inning to record his 24th save of the season (1.0IP, 2K).

FIRST HALF FRENZY: With OF Aaron Hicks hitting his 15th home run of the season on Tuesday, the Yankees now have five players with at least 15HR prior to the All-Star break for the first time in franchise history (also Judge-23HR, Stanton-20HR, Gregorius-15HR and Torres-15HR).

- ▶ The Yankees are the Majors' only club to have five players each with at least 15HR...join Boston as the only two teams to have six players each with at least 40RBI (Gregorius, Hicks, Judge, Sánchez, Stanton and Torres).

NATIONAL PASTIME: The Yankees are 8-6 in Interleague play in 2018, and 14-6 in Interleague games since 7/25/17.

- ▶ Are 10-3 in their last 13 games vs. Atlanta.

FAN FAVORITES: Through 45 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,920,961) and average attendance per home gate (42,688), trailing only the Dodgers in average home attendance (46,306 per gate).

- ▶ Have 14 sellouts in 45 games at Yankee Stadium in 2018, surpassing their sellout total from 2017 (13)...are their most since they had 16 in 2014...have drawn sellouts in five of their last seven home games and seven of their last 10.

FLAG ON THE PLAY: The Yankees are 32-30 on the Fourth of July in the Expansion Era (since 1961)...have won four of their last six Fourth of July games since 2012 and are 6-3 in their last nine since 2009...are playing at home on July 4th for the second straight year (lost, 4-1, on 7/4/17 vs. Toronto).

- ▶ Is just their second July 4th Interleague matchup, losing to the Mets at Shea Stadium in 2004 (6-5).
- ▶ To celebrate Independence Day, the Colors will be presented by the West Point United States Army Garrison Color Guard and the anthem will be sung by United States Military Academy Band Vocalist Master Sergeant Mary Kay Messenger...as part of the Yankees' Field of Dreams program, children from TAPS (Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors) who have lost a parent in combat will take the field with the Yankees for the anthem.

YANKEE DOODLE DANDY: Today is the birthday of late Yankees principal owner **George Steinbrenner** (born 7/4/30)...for more information on his legacy, please see p. 260-261 of the 2018 Official Yankees Media Guide & Record Book.

LUCKIEST DAY: Today marks the 79th anniversary of Lou Gehrig's "Luckiest Man" speech, which took place on 7/4/39 at the original Yankee Stadium in between games of a doubleheader vs. Washington...for more information, including the speech in its entirety, please see p. 259 of the 2018 Official Yankees Media Guide & Record Book.

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit his 20th HR of the season on Tuesday, becoming the 11th player ever to hit at least 20HR in at least each of his first nine Major League seasons...only Mark Teixeira (first 13 seasons, 2003-15) and Albert Pujols (first 12 seasons, 2001-12) have accomplished the feat since 2000.

- ▶ Is one of two players with at least 20HR in each of the last nine seasons (since 2010), joining Nelson Cruz.
- ▶ Is hitting .390 (16-for-41) with 6R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI and 4BB in his last 10 games (since 6/23).
- ▶ Is tied for second in the Majors with 10HR vs. LHP (in 86AB).

HIGGY, HIGGY, HIGGY: On Tuesday, **C Kyle Higashioka** became the third Yankee in franchise history to have his first two Major League hits go for HRs, joining Alfonso Soriano (first 3H were HRs from 9/24/99-4/9/00) and Joe Lefebvre (first 2H were HRs from 5/22-23/80)...is one of two Yankees since 2009 to homer for his first 2H with the club (also Ji-Man Choi in July 2017)...is the second player since the start of 2017 whose first two MLB hits were HRs (also Los Angeles-AL's Nolan Fontana).

- ▶ **Yankees catchers** lead the Majors with 19HR and 60RBI at the position this season, while ranking second in slugging pct. (.472) and third in runs scored (47).

JUST FOR HICKS: **CF Aaron Hicks** hit his 15th home run of the season on Tuesday vs. Atlanta, tying his single-season career high (15HR in 2017)...has 4HR in his last 3G, 5HR in his last 7G and 8HR in his last 14G...has 9HR in his last 17G (since 6/14) after hitting 6HR in his first 49G of the season (3/29-6/13).

- ▶ Has 6XBH in the last 3G (2 doubles, 4HR)...had 3HR on Sunday and 2 doubles on Monday, collecting multiple XBH in back-to-back games for the first time in his career.
- ▶ Has batted leadoff 18 times this season (Yankees: 14-4), hitting .288/.349/.712 with 9HR in those games...has homered in 6-of-9 starts in the leadoff spot since 6/14 (8HR).
- ▶ Of his 38HR since joining the Yankees in 2016, 27 have been hit at Yankee Stadium.

HOME COOKING: The Yankees **are a Major League-best 32-13 (.711) at home in 2018**, including 27-8 in 35G since 4/21.

- ▶ Are 17-1-2 in their last 20 home series (since 8/31/17), going 46-17 in 63G over that span.
- ▶ Since their only home series loss of the season (1-3 vs. Baltimore from 4/5-8 vs. Baltimore), are 10-0-2 in 12 home series, their longest streak without dropping a series at home since going 20-0-5 over 25 home series from 9/15/97-8/16/98...are 10-0-1 in 11 home series since 4/19.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 1-1 vs. the Braves...will play a 3G series in the Bronx this week concluding today...are 20-13 (.606) all-time vs. Atlanta...are 10-3 in the last 13G since 6/24/09... IN 2015: In their most recent series against Atlanta at Turner Field in 2015, the Yankees swept the Braves in 3G, while outscoring them, 38-11...won the first game, 15-4, and the finale, 20-6... AT YANKEE STADIUM: Are 1-1 at Yankee Stadium this year...the Braves make their second-ever visit to the current Yankee Stadium, as Atlanta took 2-of-3 from the Yankees in 2012...since that 2012 series, 13 of the other 14 NL clubs have played at Yankee Stadium (all but San Diego, which has never played at this venue)...the Yankees are 8-11 at home vs. Atlanta in the regular season all-time (went 6-8 at the original Yankee Stadium)... IN ATLANTA: The Yankees were 12-2 all-time at Atlanta's Turner Field...have not played a regular season game at SunTrust Park.

YANKEES IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY

WINNING FORMULA: Today the Yankees play their 15th Interleague game of 2018 (are 8-6 so far)...have the most wins and have the second-highest all-time winning percentage (234-162; .591) in Interleague history (Boston: 233-157, .597)...are 52-35 in their last 87 Interleague games since 5/14/14.

- ✦ All-time, are .500-or-better against all but one NL team during the regular season (6-7 vs. the Dodgers)...are 15-15 all time against the Phillies and 6-6 against Milwaukee.
- ✦ Went 15-5 vs. the National League in 2017, setting a club record for most Interleague wins in a single season (previous was 13: 13-7 in 2014, 13-5 in 2003, '11, '12, 13-3 in 1998)...went 8-12 in 2016.
- ✦ Have posted a winning Interleague record in 17-of-21 seasons (17-3-1 overall) since Interleague play was established in 1997...produced a winning record in 13 consecutive seasons from 2000-12, going 143-90 over that span.
- ✦ Have compiled a *non-losing* Interleague record in 18-of-21 seasons (5-10 in 1997; 9-11 in 2013; and 8-12 in 2016), including a stretch of 15 consecutive non-losing records from 1998-2012.

THE SCHEDULE: The Yankees are scheduled to play 20 Interleague games in 2018...are 8-6 in Interleague play so far...in addition to their annual Subway Series – went 2-1 at Citi Field in June and will play 3G three in the Bronx later this month (7/20-22) – the Yankees play the NL East this year...went 2-2 vs. Washington (1-1 at home and 1-1 on the road) and 2-1 vs. Philadelphia (3G at Citizens Bank Park last week)...are 1-1 vs. Miami, with two more games at Marlins Park from 8/21-22...are hosting the Braves for three games this week (1-1 so far).

LAST START: Earned his fifth win of the season in Friday's 8-1 win vs. Boston (7.0IP, 6H, 1ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HP)...improved to 3-1 with a 2.54 ERA (49.2IP, 14ER) in his first nine home starts of 2018...has allowed one-or-zero runs in five of those nine starts...since the start of 2017, is 12-0 with a 2.47 ERA (105.2IP, 29ER) in 18 regular season starts following a Yankees loss...earned his 242nd career win, surpassing Herb Pennock (241 wins) for sole possession of 54th place on Baseball's all-time wins list...also surpassed Pennock for sole possession of 13th place on the all-time wins list among left-handed pitchers...has allowed 3R-or-fewer for the fifth consecutive start and has completed at least 5.0IP in his sixth straight...has not allowed a home run in four straight starts...allowed his sole run of the game to score on back-to-back doubles by Betts and Benintendi in the fifth.
