The Brewers are looking for their first series sweep over the Rockies since sweeping a 3-game series at Miller Park from 8/22-8/24, 2016.....the team has won 7 of its last 8 games against Colorado, dating back to 8/19/17.

Go West, Young Man

Today is Game 11 (7-3) of a 14-game stretch against NL West opponents.....the team is 19-7 against the NL West this season, going 5-1 vs. Arizona, 5-1 vs. Colorado, 3-4 vs. Los Angeles, 3-0 vs. San Diego and 3-1 vs. San Francisco.

There's No Place Like Home

After a 2-6 start, the Brewers have gone 33-15 (.688) over their last 48 home games, which is the best home record in the National League and trails only the Yankees (34-13, .723) and Red Sox (33-14, .702) in the Major Leagues during this stretch (since 4/17).

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 30-28 on the road, going 9-6-3 in series play.....had a season-high 5-game road winning streak from 4/30-5/11 and a season-high 6-game road losing streak from 7/11-7/15.....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (285-290) and third full season.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke.....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 20 replay challenges, going 4-16.....their last challenge (lost) came on 8/3 vs. Colorado as an out call at first base involving Lorenzo Cain was confirmed.....went 17-27 in 44 replay challenges last season.

TODAY'S STARTER: #20 - LHP WADE MILEY (6gs, 2-1, 1.53)

MILEY AT A GLANCE: Wade Miley, 31, will be making his seventh start of the season and first against the Rockies....Miley last started on Tuesday at Los Angeles and earned a 1-0 victory (7ip, 2h, 2bb, 5k)....the team is 4-2 in his starts....he has 3 quality starts....opponents are batting .196 (20-for-102, 0hr)....Miley was placed on the 10-day disabled list on 5/9 with a right oblique strain and transferred to the 60-day DL on 5/12....he was reinstated on 7/12.... he was signed to a minor-league contract on 2/16 and invited to Major League camp.... he suffered a groin strain while fielding a bunt on 3/21 vs. Oakland and was reassigned to minor-league camp on 3/28....Miley began a rehab assignment on 4/17 at Double-A Biloxi and joined the Brewers on 5/2....he returned to Biloxi for a second rehab stint on 6/22....bio is available in the press box.

LAST SEASON: Miley went 8-15 with a 5.61 ERA in 32 starts with Baltimore....he made 30+ starts for the fifth consecutive season....the team went 15-17 in his starts....he made 8 quality starts....opponents batted .287 (179-for-624, 25hr).

CAREER: Is 68-75 with a 4.31 ERA in 206 games / 202 starts (1185ip, 567er)....he has pitched for Arizona (2011-14), Boston (2015), Seattle (2016), Baltimore (2016-17) and Milwaukee (2018)....Miley was a 2012 National League All-Star while pitching for the Diamondbacks.

CAREER AT MILLER PARK: Is 1-2 with an 8.15 ERA in 5 starts (17.2ip, 16er)....is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in 2 starts this season (6.1ip, 0er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 35-40 with a 4.16 ERA in 111 games / 110 starts (635.1ip, 294er)....is 2-1 with a 1.96 ERA in 4 starts this season (23ip, 5er).
