THE CAPTAIN: David Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87)...Wright hit .171 (7-41) with one double, two RBI, two walks and four runs scored in 12 rehabilitation games between St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League and Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League.

SPECIAL DUO: José Reyes and David Wright will start in the same line-up tonight for the first time since September 28, 2011 vs. Cincinnati...The duo has started 878 games together (including tonight), the most by any two players in franchise history...Research courtesy of Elias.

THIRD BASE: David Wright last started at third base on May 27, 2016 vs. the Dodgers...Tonight will be his 1,572nd game at third base and his 1,571st start, both the most in team history.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 6-4 in their last 10 games... The Mets are 31-22 in their last 53 games and 43-37 since July 1...New York is 38-36 vs. the NL East...The Mets are 35-44 overall at home...The Mets are 16-10 this month.

CONFORTO CONNECTS: Michael Conforto has 17 homers (tied for the seventh-most in the majors) and 52 RBI (third in the majors) since the All-Star break...He is third in the majors with 43 RBI since August 1 and tied for sixth in homers (14) during that span...Conforto has 82 RBI, extending his career-high (had 68 RBI last season)...He also has a career-high 28 homers (one more than last year).

SIZZLING SEPTEMBER: Conforto is second in the majors with 29 RBI and is tied for the major league leads with nine homers and 18 extra-base hits this month...Only two other Mets players have had 29 or more RBI in September: Gary Carter (34 in 1985) and Darryl Strawberry (30 in 1984)...The last Met with 30 or more RBI in a month was Carlos Beltran (32 RBI in July, 2006).

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 26-20 vs. the Marlins at Citi Field since 2014.

SEPTEMBER STARTERS: Mets starting pitchers are 10-4 with a 2.59 ERA (44 earned runs/152.2 innings), the lowest ERA in the majors this month.

STARTERS STRIKEOUTS: Mets starters have 918 strikeouts in 899.1 innings this season...The franchise record for strikeouts by starting pitchers is 934 by the 1990 Mets rotation...This year's starting staff has a collective 9.2 K/9 ratio, on pace to smash the franchise record (8.13 K/9, set last year).

MLB RECORDS: Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 29 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...DeGrom has hurled 24 straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...He has set a major league record with 19 starts in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings and allowed three or fewer runs but did not win...Research courtesy of Elias.

LEADERBOARD: DeGrom leads the majors in ERA (1.70), FanGraphs WAR (8.8), RA-9 WAR (9.3), FIP (1.98), HR/9 (0.41), Opponent's Slugging (.277), Opponent's OPS (.521), ERA+ (217), DRA (2.06) and Road ERA (1.87)...He is tied for the major league lead in WHIP (0.91)...DeGrom leads the NL in Home ERA (1.54), Opponent's OBP (.244) and leads the NL in Baseball-Reference WAR (10.1).

BRANDON NIMMO: Is second in the NL and fourth in the majors with a .404 on-base percentage, which would be the highest by a Met since David Wright had a .416 OBP in 2007...Nimmo ranks third in the NL with eight triples, leads the majors with 22 HBP (a single-season franchise record)...He has a career-high 17 homers...Nimmo has reached base safely in 33 of his last 34

WALKING MAN: Brandon Nimmo has 29 walks this month, the most by any Met in a calendar month...Keith Hernandez had 28 walks in July, 1984...He has drawn at least one walk in 14 of his last 15 games...Ranks ninth in the NL with 80 walks.

HIT MACHINE: Jeff McNeil has a .327 (71-217) batting average since his debut on July 24, which is the ninth-highest in the majors (min. 200 PA)...He is tied for ninth in the majors in hits since his debut...Is fourth in the majors with 33 hits this month... Has the 12th-highest batting average (.337) in the majors this month (min. 70 AB)...McNeil's .327 average in his first 61 career major league games with the Mets is the highest average in franchise history (min. 190 PA).

AMED ROSARIO: Has 71 hits since the All-Star break, tied for the 11th-most in the NL...Rosario is tied for fifth in the NL with 31 hits in September...Overall, ranks 10th in the NL with 22 stolen bases...He is tied for third in the NL with eight triples.

LAST START: Matz today makes his 30th and final start of the season...In his last start. September 23 at Washington. Matz took his fifth consecutive no-decision. pitching 3.0 innings, giving up three runs, all earned, on five hits with three walks and striking out four.

MATZ BATZ: Has homered in each of his last two games with an at-bat...Hit a solo home run to left-center field to give the Mets a 1-0 lead on September 18 at Philadelphia...Was his second-consecutive start with a home run, making him one of three Mets pitchers to go deep in two-straight starts (also, Ron Darling, 1989 and Tom Seaver, 1972)...Matz is the first pitcher to homer in consecutive starts since Travis Wood, August 30 and September 5 of last season with the San Diego Padres...Matz is the eighth Mets pitcher to homer at least twice in a season and the first since Noah Syndergaard hit three home runs in 2016.

VS. MIAMI: Matz tonight makes his third start against the Marlins this season and his eighth start against Miami in his career...Matz took a no-decision in his last start against the Marlins on September 13 at Citi Field in the first game of a doubleheader...The southpaw pitched 6.1 innings, giving up three runs, earned. on three hits with two walks and four strikeouts...Is 0-2 with a 7.20 ERA (12 earned runs/15.0 innings) in three starts against Miami at Citi Field in his career...Is 3-0 with a 0.76 ERA (two earned runs/23.2 innings) in four career starts at Marlins Park.

CITI BALL: Will make his 15th home start of the season tonight against Miami... Has thrown seven quality starts in his last nine outings at Citi Field, posting a 3.21 ERA (20 earned runs/56.0 innings) in that span, yet is 0-4 in those starts (the Mets are 3-6)...In 14 home starts this season, is 1-6 with a 3.86 ERA (34 earned runs/79.1 innings)...Has given up three earned runs or fewer in 13 of his 14 home starts this season and in 27 of his 33 career home starts...Opponents are batting .213 (61-286) against Matz at Citi Field this season.

SETTLING IN: Has thrown a scoreless first inning in each of his last six starts...Matz has a 7.53 ERA in the opening frame this season (24 earned runs/28.2 innings)...In all subsequent innings, his ERA is 3.32 (44 earned runs/119.1 innings)...Additionally, in Matz' starts, opponents are hitting .251 (110-438) against his first 75 offerings of a game with 21 homers...After Matz reaches pitch 76 of a given outing, his opponent's average dips to .175 (21-120) for the remainder of the start.

FINISHING STRONG: Matz tonight makes his 10th career start in the month of September and sixth this season...In his five September starts this season, the lefty owns a 3.08 ERA (nine earned runs/26.1 innings)...In his nine career starts in September, Matz is 2-0 with a 2.98 ERA (16 earned runs/48.1 innings).

BALLS IN PLAY: Only 15.6 percent of balls put in play against Matz this season have been line drives, the lowest rate in the majors (min. 140.0 innings)...48.0 percent of the balls in play against Matz have been grounders, the 10th-highest percentage in the National League (min. 140.0 innings).

A TALE OF TWO HALVES: Has seen his ERA climb from his 3.38 first-half mark to his current 4.14 ERA (68 earned runs/148.0 innings) in 11 second-half starts...In those outings, Matz is 1-4 with a 5.54 ERA (32 earned runs/52.0 innings)...In his career, has a 5.52 ERA (85 earned runs/138.2 innings) in 28 career starts after the All-Star break compared to his 3.21 lifetime first-half ERA (87 earned runs/244.0 innings)...His 3.21 first-half ERA is the 11th-best mark in the NL since 2015 among all pitchers with at least 220.0 first-half innings in the last four seasons.
