### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 12, 1996:** Trailing 8-0 after two innings, the Yankees respond with nine unanswered runs to pull out a Mother's Day win at Chicago's Comiskey Park. Joe Girardi hits a bases-clearing double in the sixth to give the Yankees the lead.

**May 12, 1953:** Whitey Ford throws a one-hit complete game shutout against the Indians at Yankee Stadium, allowing his only hit to Cleveland pitcher Early Wynn (6th inning single) as the Yankees win 7-0.

**May 12, 1925:** Yogi Berra is born in St. Louis, Mo. A three-time American League MVP and 10-time World Series champion, Berra was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1972.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 13, 1985:** Down 8-6 with two on and two out in the bottom of the 9th, Don Mattingly takes former Yankee and then Twin Ron Davis deep for the walk-off three-run homer giving the Bombers the 9-8 win. The Yankees had been down 8-1 going into the sixth.

**May 13, 1955:** Mickey Mantle goes 4-for-4 with 3HR (2LH, 1RH) and all 5 RBI in a 5-2 victory vs. Detroit at Yankee Stadium. It marks his only career three-homer game and his first of 10 career games with home runs from both sides of the plate.

**May 13, 1929:** The Yankees lose, 4-3 at Cleveland, marking the first Major League game between two clubs wearing numbered uniforms.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees are 5-2 on their nine-game homestand...lost the opener of a 3G series on Friday vs. Oakland...won 2-of-3 vs. Boston after sweeping a 3G series vs. Cleveland...following a Monday off day, begin an 8G road trip on Tuesday: 2G at Washington (Tue.-Wed.), 3G at Kansas City (5/18-20) and 3G at Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ At 26-12 (.684), **are tied with Boston for the Majors' best record...is the latest in a season they have had at least a share of the Majors' best record since the end of play on 7/28/12** (tied with Cincinnati and Washington at 60-40)...last had sole possession of the best record in MLB this late in a season at the end of play on 7/27/12 (60-39).
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 9-10, the Yankees are 17-3).
- ▶ Are 14G over .500, 2G shy of their season high (16G over at the close of play Wednesday).
- ▶ **At 26-12, have matched the 2003 and 1994 seasons as their second-best 38G start over the last 60 seasons** since 1959 (went 29-9 to start 1998).
- ▶ Their +60 run diff. is third in MLB (Houston, +81; Boston, +62).
- ▶ Are 11-9 vs. the AL East and 15-3 vs. all other divisions.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees lost for the second straight night, dropping the opener of their three-game home series vs. Oakland, 10-5...marked their first time dropping consecutive games since 4/8 at Baltimore and 4/10 at Boston...**RHP Sonny Gray** (5.0IP, 9H, 5ER, 3BB, 2K, 2HR) started and took the loss, falling to 2-3 this year...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4) hit a three-run HR in the fifth and had a bases-loaded walk in the seventh, collecting a season-high 4RBI...**2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-3, 1SH) extended his hitting streak to nine games with his third career HR, a solo shot in the third...**LF Brett Gardner** (1-for-2, 1R) drew a season-high 3BB.

- ▶ The Yankees fell to 9-4 in series openers (6-2 at home).

**PLAYING ADVANTAGE:** Friday marked the first day this season on which both the Yankees and Red Sox suffered losses...in fact, prior to Friday, the Yankees had won each of the first 11 days this season on which the Red Sox lost, and the Red Sox had won on 10 of the first 11 days on which the Yankees lost (credit: Yankees official scorer Jordan Sprechman).

**SANTO DOMINGO:** RHP Domingo Germán made his first career Major League start on Sun. vs. Cleveland, tossing 6.0 hitless, scoreless innings with 9K and 2BB in a no-decision...retired his first 11BF.

- ▶ Per Elias, **was the first Major League pitcher since the mound was moved to 60'6" in 1893 to throw at least 6.0 hitless innings with at least 9K in his first career start.**
- ▶ **Was the first Yankee ever to record a hitless start of at least 6.0IP in his first career start.**
- ▶ Was the fourth Yankee ever to record at least 9K in his first career start, joining Hideki Irabu (9K on 7/10/1997 vs. Detroit), Dan Tripple (10K on 9/25/1915-G2 vs. Cleveland) and Russ Ford (9K on 4/21/1910 at Philadelphia-AL).

**ALL RISE:** RF Aaron Judge hit his 10th HR of the season and recorded a season-high 4RBI in Friday's loss vs. Oakland.

- ▶ With his 66th HR in his 220th career game, is the second-fastest to the number in Major League history (Rudy York-66HR in first 216G).
- ▶ Has 11RBI during his five-game RBI streak, tied for his longest RBI streak this season (4/3-7) and tied for the second-longest of his career (7G, 9/24-30/17)...with a team-high 32RBI, is tied fourth in the Majors (also Kris Davis and A.J. Pollock), behind Manny Machado (35RBI), Javier Baez (34RBI) and Jed Lowrie (33RBI).
- ▶ Is hitting .360/.500/.800 (9-for-25) with 5R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 13RBI and 7BB in 7G on the homestand.
- ▶ Has 5BB in his last 3G...ranks second in the Majors with an AL-high 32BB (Bryce Harper-40)...is the sixth Yankee since 1963 to draw at least 32BB through the team's first 38G: Kevin Maas (40BB in 1991), Jason Giambi (39BB in 2006), Nick Johnson (33BB in 2003), Willie Randolph (32BB in 1986) and Bobby Murcer (32BB in 1970).

**KID CAN PLAY:** **2B Gleyber Torres** (age 21y-150d today) has a nine-game hitting streak (since 5/2), batting .400 (12-for-30) with 3HR and 10RBI over the stretch...is the youngest Yankee since Mickey Mantle (10G, 6/24-7/3(G1)/52, ending at age 20y-257d) to tally a hitting streak of at least 9G.

- ▶ **Is the youngest Yankee in franchise history to hit 3HR in his first 19 career games...**is the second-youngest Yankee to tally at least 22H in his first 19 career games, behind Mickey Mantle, who also tallied 23H in his first 19G in 1951.
- ▶ Is batting .344/.386/.531 (22-for-64) w/ 10R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 12RBI, 5BB and 1SB in 2018...has reached safely in 17-of-19 games.
- ▶ The Yankees are a **Major League-best 16-3 since he was recalled on 4/22**, with Torres starting all 19 games.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT:** With Tyler Austin (16RBI), Miguel Andújar (13RBI) and Gleyber Torres (12RBI), Yankees occupy three of the top-four spots on the AL rookie RBI leaderboard (Los Angeles-AL's Shohei Ohtani-16RBI).

- ▶ Marks just the fourth time since 1971 that three Yankees rookies have at least 12RBI in the same season (also four players in 2016, three in 1996 and four in 1990).

**HOME COOKING:** The Yankees have dropped two straight home games after reeling off a current Yankee Stadium-record 11 consecutive wins from 4/21-5/9...was their longest single-season home win streak since taking 12-straight at the original Stadium from 4/25-6/1/85...matched Cleveland (8/24-9/14/17) and Los Angeles-NL (6/7-25/17) for the Majors' longest single-season home winning streak over the last two seasons (2017-18).

- ▶ Are 16-7 (.696) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, **the most home wins in the Majors...**own the third-best home record in the Majors (Philadelphia, 15-6, .714; Boston, 11-4, .733).
- ▶ Since 9/2/17, **are 29-10 in their last 39 regular season home games** (plus 6-0 in postseason home games)...are 11-1-1 in their last 13 home series (since 8/31/17).
- ▶ Have outscored opponents, 147-98, at home in 2018.
- ▶ Lead Major League clubs at home in runs (147), HRs (37), HR per game (1.61) and XBHs (83)...are second in runs per game (6.39), OBP (.360) and OPS (.827)...are third in SLG (.466)...have homered in 15 of their last 17G at home.
- ▶ Have played 23 home games in 2018, tied with Texas for the second-most in the Majors (San Diego-25)...**following this series, will play just six of the next 25 games at Yankee Stadium** (5/15-6/10).

**RISP MANAGEMENT:** Yankees pitchers have limited opponents to a .143 BA (20-for-140) with RISP over the last 20 games (since 4/21)...A's batters were just 3-for-16 with RISP on Friday...their .214 opp. BA with RISP leads all AL staffs and is second to Washington (.202).

**HOT, HOT HEAT:** LHP Aroldis Chapman has struck out 34-of-68 batters (50.0%) this season, the second-best strikeout rate among Major League relievers to Milwaukee's Josh Hader (60.8%, 48K/79BF)...has 3K in four of his five appearances this month (13K/21BF, 61.9%).

**HOLD IT RIGHT THERE:** RHP Jonathan Holder has not allowed an earned run in seven appearances since being recalled from Triple-A Scranton/WB on 4/21, retiring 25-of-28 batters (8.2IP, 2H, 1R/0ER, 1BB/1IBB, 7K).

**ON THE MEND:** Several Yankees continued their injury rehab assignments Friday night:

- ▶ In Triple-A Scranton/WB's doubleheader vs. Rochester, **INF Brandon Drury** (blurred vision) went 1-for-5 with 2BB and hit a second-inning grand slam off Minnesota prospect Stephen Gonsalves in Game Two...played all 15 innings of the twinbill at third base.
- ▶ **1B Greg Bird** (right ankle surgery) went 1-for-2 with 1R, 1RBI and 2BB in his second rehab game with Single-A Tampa vs. Florida, playing seven innings at first base.
- ▶ **OF Billy McKinney** (left shoulder sprain) went 1-for-3 with 1R, 3RBI and 2BB as the DH for Tampa.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP DOMINGO GERMÁN (0-1, 2.66 ERA)

**RHP Domingo Germán** will make his second start of the season (and seventh appearance) today vs. Oakland...will pitch on extended five days' rest following Monday's team off day...did not allow a hit or run in his first career start on Sun. vs. Cleveland (6.0IP, 2BB, 9K)...has not allowed a run in his last 12.0IP (last allowed a run in the sixth inning on 4/26 vs. Minnesota)...is the sixth pitcher to start a game for the Yankees this season...since being recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 4/7, has gone 0-1 with a 2.66 ERA (20.1IP, 6ER)...made his Major League debut with the Yankees in 2017, going 0-1 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP, 5ER) in seven relief appearances...was re-signed by the Yankees as minor league free agent on 12/11/15...was acquired by the Yankees, along with RHP Nathan Eovaldi and INF Garrett Jones, from the Miami Marlins in exchange for RHP David Phelps, INF/OF Martín Prado and cash considerations on 12/19/14...was originally signed by the Marlins as a non-drafted free agent on 8/8/09.

**LAST START:** Made his first career Major League (13th career appearance), tossing 6.0 hitless, scoreless innings in a no-decision (2BB, 9K)...retired the first 11 batters before walking José Ramírez with two outs in the fourth...overall, retired 18-of-20 batters...threw a career-high 84 pitches.

**FIRST FOR EVERYTHING:** In his first career start on Sun., was the first pitcher since the mound was moved to 60'6" in 1893 to throw at least 6.0 hitless innings with at least 9K in his first career start...was the first Yankee ever to record a hitless start of at least 6.0IP in his first career start...was the first hitless start of at least 6.0IP by a Yankee since Phil Hughes on 5/1/07 at Texas (6.1IP).

- ✦ Was the fourth Yankee ever to record at least 9K in his first career start, joining Hideki Irabu (9K in 6.2IP on 7/10/1997 vs. Detroit), Dan Tripple (10K in 9.0IP on 9/25/1915-G2 vs. Cleveland) and Russ Ford (9K in 9.0IP on 4/21/1910 at Philadelphia-AL).
- ✦ Was the first Yankee to throw at least 6.0 scoreless innings in his first career start since Luis Cessa (6.0IP) on 8/20/16 at Los Angeles-AL...is the first foreign-born Yankees starter since 1908 to toss at least 6.0 hitless innings.

**2018:** Has appeared in six games (one start) this season, going 0-1 with a 2.66 ERA (20.1IP, 6ER)...opponents are hitting .189 (14-for-74) off him, the lowest opponents' BA among all AL rookies (min. 20.0IP)...is tied for third in the AL among rookies with 27K...has not allowed a run in his last 12.0IP (last allowed a run in the sixth inning on 4/26 vs. Minnesota).

- ✦ Opponents are hitting .097 (3-for-31) with no extra-base hits and 17K in at-bats that end with a curveball (Brooks Baseball).

**FIRE-MÁN:** Is the first pitcher in Yankees history to record at least 3K in seven consecutive *relief appearances* (9/20/17-present)...is tied for the second-longest such streak in Major League history, behind Randy Johnson (9G from 8/16/93-7/18/01)...has 25K in 18.0IP (14H, 7ER, 9BB) in those relief appearances.

**DOMINGO'S DOZEN:** Is 0-2 with a 3.45 ERA (28.2IP, 11ER) in 12 career relief appearances...owns an 11.30 K/9.0IP ratio (36K/28.2IP) as a reliever.

- ✦ Has tossed at least 2.0IP in nine of his 12 relief appearances.

**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Is 0-2 with a 3.32 ERA (21.2IP, 8ER) in eight career games (one start) at Yankee Stadium...has held opponents to a .160 BA (12-for-75) while striking out 31-of-89 batters (34.8%).

**VS. OAKLAND:** Made one relief appearance vs. the Athletics last season and did not allow a run in 4.0IP (4H, 3BB, 6K).

**2017:** Saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2017, going 0-1 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP, 5ER) in seven relief appearances...spent the majority of the season at the minor league level, combining with Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/WB to go 8-6 with a 2.88 ERA (109.1IP, 35ER) and 119K in 20G/19GS.

**IT'S ALL IN A NAME:** His first name, Domingo, translates to 'Sunday'...is one of three Domingos to play for the Yankees in franchise history, joining RHP Domingo Jean (10G/6GS in 1993) and INF Domingo Ramos (1G in 1978).
