**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 1-5 through six games on their current nine-game roadtrip, going 1-2 against the White Sox and 0-3 against the Cubs...today they will play the first of a three game series at Milwaukee...after this series the Twins will return home for an 11-game homestand before the All-Star Break...the Twins are now 15-25 on the road and are 5-14 in their last 19 road games.

**SWEPT ON THE NORTH SIDE:** The Twins lost to the Cubs in the series finale yesterday by a score of 11-10 and suffered their fourth sweep of the year, the first since May 25-27 at Seattle...Lance Lynn was the starter and loser, allowing seven earned runs on five hits and three walks with one strikeouts...the Twins recorded 16 hits, a season high for the team...Mitch Garver highlighted the Twins offense by going 3-for-5 with a home run and three RBI...the Twins scored 25 runs over the three game series, the most in any series this season.

**ROSTER MOVE:** The Twins announced today that they have reinstated shortstop Jorge Polanco from the restricted list after serving his 80-game suspension for violating Major League Baseball's Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...Polanco was most recently at Triple-A Rochester where he appeared in four games going 6-for-13 with a triple and two walks...the Twins also recalled right-handed pitcher Zack Littell from Rochester, he is set to join the bullpen tonight in Milwaukee...to make room for Polanco and Littell on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned left-handed pitcher Adalberto Mejía to Rochester and placed infielder Ehire Adrianza on the 10-day disabled list with a left-hamstring strain...to make room for Polanco on the 40-man roster the Twins have designated Ryan LaMarre for release or assignment...additionally, the Twins have returned outfielder Byron Buxton from his rehab assignment, reinstated him from the 10-day disabled list and optioned him to Triple-A Rochester...Buxton played in 11 games for the Red Wings while rehabbing a hairline fracture in his left-great toe, an injury he originally suffered while on a rehab assignment (migraines) with the Ft. Myers Miracle on April 22...Buxton has missed a total of 51 games this season due to injuries.

**IL PLAY, FOR THE RECORD:** The Twins have gone 6-9 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-1 at Pittsburgh, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. St. Louis, 1-2 vs. Milwaukee and 0-3 at Chicago...the Twins play the NL Central this season, with five games remaining: three at Milwaukee this upcoming week and Pittsburgh for two games in mid-August...they have won 16 of their last 25 vs. the NL, dating back to August 2...the Twins are 209-188 all-time in Interleague Play, tied for sixth most wins in MLB since IL began in 1997.

- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .368 (35-for-95) with 10 doubles, seven home runs and 16 RBI in his last 23 games vs. NL opponents...he enters today with a 10-game hitting streak vs. NL opponents.
- ☞ Joe Mauer is hitting .321 (280-for-873) in 238 career games in IL Play, with 59 doubles, 22 home runs, 123 RBI and a .401 on-base percentage.

**THE BATTLE OF I-94:** The Twins are 229-219 all-time against the Brewers (games since 1970) and have a record against them of 63-50 in Interleague Play...they have won six of their last eight vs. Milwaukee...the Twins lost two of three earlier in the year against the Brewers, their first series loss to Milwaukee since June 26-28 2015 when they lost two of three at Miller Park...the Twins are 107-116 all-time on the road against Milwaukee and 24-23 at Miller Park all-time.

- ☞ Brian Dozier is hitting .331 (43-for-130) with six doubles, seven home runs, 18 RBI, 23 runs scored and a .390 on-base percentage in 31 career games vs. Milwaukee.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .333 (19-for-57) with six doubles, four home runs and 10 RBI in 16 career games against Milwaukee.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1987, Minnesota native, Jim Eisenreich, making a comeback into the major leagues, hits his first major league home run since 1982 to lead the Royals to a 10-3 win over his former club, the Twins...in 2012, the Twins beat the Tigers by a score of 6-4 at Comerica Park to give Ron Gardenhire his 900th career managerial victory...in 2015, Miguel Sanó made his major league debut at Kansas City, going 1-for-4, hitting an infield single off Greg Holland.

- ☞ It was announced today that Eddie Rosario ranks ninth among AL outfielders in American League All-Star voting with 666,108 votes...Rosario is the only Twin listed among the leading AL All-Star vote getters.

**LAST START:** Gibson suffered his sixth loss of the year at Chicago-AL on June 27 after giving up five runs on 11 hits and one walk with seven strikeouts over 7.0 innings...the 11 hits are a season high and the most since he allowed 11 to New York-AL on July 4, 2013...entered the game leading the AL in opponent batting average on the road and had only given up 21 hits on the road prior to this start...fourth time in six starts he's thrown 7.0 innings...fourth straight start throwing 100+ pitches, tying the longest streak of his career.

**AGAINST THE BREWERS:** Gibson is making his sixth career start and second of the year against Milwaukee, is 1-2, 5.76 ERA (25.0 IP, 16 ER) with five walks and 18 strikeouts...last start against the Brewers was May 18, suffered the loss after allowing five runs on eight hits and four walks with five strikeouts over 5.1 innings...only career win against the Brewers was June 27, 2015 at Miller Park when he allowed two runs on six hits and one walk with three strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

**PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF:** After a rough first half of 2017, Gibson finished the second half of the season 7-3, 3.76 ERA (76.2 IP, 32 ER) with 22 walks and 70 strikeouts...since July 16, 2017, Gibson is 9-9, 3.60 ERA (172.1 IP, 69 ER) with 62 walks and 163 strikeouts and is holding opponents to a .242 average...his ERA is 11th in the AL over that span while his 163 strikeouts ranks tied for 15th among pitchers with more than 170 IP over that stretch.

**SWING AND A MISS:** Thus far in 2018, Gibson has recorded 93 strikeouts through 16 starts and owns a strikeout rate of 23.3 percent and a swing-and-miss rate of 26.2 percent, 16th best in the AL...his career strikeout rate is 16.8 percent while his career swing-and-miss rate is 22.7 percent.

**KEEP THE K'S COMING:** Gibson has improved his strikeouts-per-9.0 innings rate nearly every year in his career, setting a career-high in 2017 with 6.89 K/9...through 15 starts in 2018, Gibson is striking out 8.75 batters-per-9.0 innings, 20th in the AL.

**LIMITING THE DAMAGE:** Gibson has only allowed 23 XBH this season, tied for fewest allowed in the AL and tied for 9th fewest in baseball among starters with at least 15 starts... opponents are slugging .353 against Gibson, ninth lowest in the AL...Gibson has given up 11 doubles, which is tied for fewest in the AL among starters with at least 15 starts, and 10 home runs, tied for eighth best in the AL...his .212 opponent batting average is 15th in the AL.

**ROAD RUNNER:** In 2018, Gibson is holding opposing hitters to a .177 average on the road, which is fourth lowest in baseball, and is eighth in the AL in road ERA with 2.60, holding opponents scoreless in three of his eight road starts this year...has only allowed two home runs and 11 extra base hits on the road this year, second fewest in the AL among starters with eight road starts...over his career, Gibson has had success on the road, posting a 26-24 record across 70 starts away from Target Field as compared to his 20-29 record at home...since 2016, Gibson has posted a 13-8 record on the road, in contrast to his 7-19 record at home...his road ERA in that span is 4.01 as compared to 5.28.

### 2017 RECAP:

- Was the Twins third starter to begin the season.
- Optioned to Triple-A after six starts, going 0-4 and allowing 24 earned runs over 26.1 innings on 39 hits.
- In return to Twins, recorded his first win on May 22 against Baltimore.
- Won his final six decisions, allowing 11 runs over 31.2 innings in the six wins, notching the longest win streak of his career.
- Made his 100th career start on April 12 at Detroit...the first pitcher to make 100 starts for the Twins since Francisco Liriano from 2005-11...was the 25th pitcher in Twins history to make 100-plus starts for the club.

**KILLING TWO BIRDS WITH ONE STONE:** Gibson induced 26 double plays in 2017, ranking third in the AL...his 1.48 GIDP/9 ranked fourth in baseball among pitchers who threw more than 150 innings in 2017...since 2014, Gibson has induced the most GIDP in the majors with 105 and is second in GIDP/9 with 1.23 (Martin Perez - 1.61)...has induced nine double plays in 2018, tied for most on the team and owns a 0.85 GIDP/9 rate, good for 10th in the AL.

**RISP-Y BUSINESS:** Gibson has held opponents to a .200 average (13-for-65) with runners in scoring position, tied for seventh best in the AL among pitchers who have faced 50 batters... of those 13 hits, only three have gone for extra bases (one home run, two doubles) and has struck out 20 batters...over his career, is opponents are hitting .266 (195-for-732) with RISP.

- Given 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.
- Earned the win in his MLB debut 6/29/13 vs. KC allowing three runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings.
- Named the Twins Minor League Player of the Week for May 12, 2013 after tossing a CG SHO.
- Named an Arizona Fall League Rising star in 2012 and the AFL Player of the Week, 10/23/12.
- Selected to the 2011 Futures Game where he tossed 1.1 inning, allowing two hits.
- Named to the 2010 Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star Team.
- Named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week, May 3, 2010.
- Selected in the first round (22nd overall) by the Twins in the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Missouri as a senior...major was communications.
- Originally selected by Philadelphia in the 36th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft out of Greenfield Central High School in Greenfield, IN.
- Named to the All-Big 12 honorable mention team in 2007 and 2008 and All-Big 12 First-Team in 2009 as the Tigers' Friday night starter.
