## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs tied a Major League record with 14 consecutive games against teams that were in first place at the time of the matchups (also: 1993 Orioles and 1996 Tigers).
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** has 7 straight quality starts at home (3-1, 2.28 ERA)...next up, tied for eighth in franchise history, are 8 straight home quality starts by Zack Greinke (July 1-Sept. 11, 2017) and Curt Schilling (July 5-Sept. 10, 2002).
  - In his last 9 starts (8 quality), is 4-2 with a 2.70 ERA (17 ER in 56.2 IP), .224 opp. average and 71 strikeouts (11.28 K/9.0 IP).
  - In 3 starts vs. Rockies this season, is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base via hit/walk in 18 of his last 20 home games, hitting .311 (23-for-74)/1.029 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 11 RBI, 1 HBP and 13 walks.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** is hitting .280 (7-for-25)/.960 OPS with 5 extra-base hits (2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs) and 8 RBI.

## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost the opener, 6-2, vs. Rockies.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** had a quality start (3 ER in 7.1 IP) in the loss and reached 200.0+ innings in a season for the eighth time.
- ♦ **David Peralta** went 2-for-4 with a 2-run homer.
- ♦ **Jon Jay** was 2-for-4 with a double.

## DOWN THE STRETCH WE GO

- ♦ The D-backs' have 8 games remaining (5 home/3 away), all against the NL West: 2 vs. Rockies (@ home), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home), 3 vs. Padres (on road).
- ♦ From Sept. 6-19, the D-backs' 14 straight games against teams currently in first place (Braves, Rockies, Astros and Cubs) tied the Major League along with the 1993 Orioles and 1996 Tigers, per Elias Sports Bureau.

## EXTRA! EXTRA!

- ♦ Arizona has recorded an extra-base hit in 55 consecutive games, its longest streak within a single season since a 79-game stretch from April 20-July 14, 2013 [team record is 91 straight from April 14-July 26, 1998].
- ♦ The D-backs' 55-gamer is the seventh longest in the Majors this season...next up is the Rockies' 57-gamer from May 25-Aug. 1.

## VS. ROCKIES

- ♦ A series win would ensure Arizona's fourth consecutive winning season over Colorado, which would be a club record.
- ♦ This season vs. Rockies: **David Peralta** is hitting .407 (22-for-54) with 5 doubles, 4 homers and 13 RBI...**Nick Ahmed** has 7 doubles, 3 homers and 18 RBI...**Chris Owings** is batting .409 (9-for-22) in 12 games.

## ON THIS DAY IN D-BACKS HISTORY

- ♦ **2008: Brandon Webb** got his 22nd win of the season, tied for the third most in a season by a D-back with Curt Schilling (2001) behind Randy Johnson (24 in 2002) and Schilling (23 in 2002).
- ♦ **2010: Kevin Towers** agreed to terms to become the third Executive Vice President & General Manager in club history.
- ♦ **2017: Fernando Rodney** records his 300th career save (vs. Marlins), the 28th player in baseball history to reach the milestone.

## PERALTA'S POWER SURGE

- ♦ **David Peralta's** 29 homers are 1 shy of becoming the sixth D-backs outfielder to reach the 30-homer plateau [stats as OF only], joining Luis Gonzalez (2x; 2000-01), Steve Finley (2x; 1999-2000), Reggie Sanders (2001), Justin Upton (2011), Chris Young (2007).
- ♦ Should Peralta reach 30 homers, it would mark the first time Arizona boasted multiple 30-homer hitters in back-to-back seasons since 1999-2001...Paul Goldschmidt (36) and Jake Lamb (30) each reached the milestone last year.

## HIRANO AMONG JAPANESE & ARIZONA ROOKIE RELIEVERS

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 73 relief appearances are tied for the most by a Japanese rookie reliever with Akinori Otsuka/SD/2004 ahead of Takashi Saito/LAD/2006 (72), Hideki Okajima/BOS/2007 (66) and Kazuhiro Sasaki/SEA/2000 (63).
- ♦ Hirano's 2.09 ERA is the lowest by a D-backs rookie reliever in club history, ahead of José Valverde (2.15 in 2003) and Oscar Villarreal (2.46 in 2003), while his 73 appearances are second to Oscar Villarreal (85 in 2003).

- ◆ Sixth season with the D-backs.
◆ Named to the D-backs' 20th Anniversary Team.
◆ 2-time NL All-Star (2013, '18).
◆ NL Player of the Week for April 16-22 (2 GS, 2-0, 1.20 ERA, 2 BB, 19 K, 0.33 WHIP).
◆ Finalist for 2013 Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
◆ Acquired on July 25, 2010 from the Angels... Angels' second-round pick in 2009 draft.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ In his last 7 home starts (7 quality), is 3-1 with a 2.28 ERA (11 ER in 43.1 IP), .219 opponent average and 52 strikeouts.
◆ His 237 strikeouts are fifth in the Majors.

LAST START

- ◆ Took the loss on Sept. 17 vs. Cubs, allowing 3 runs on 5 hits with 7 strikeouts in 6.0 IP.

VS. ROCKIES

- ◆ In 20 career games (19 starts), is 8-3 with a 4.63 ERA (58 ER in 112.2 IP).
◆ Is 5-1 with a 2.81 ERA (18 ER in 57.2 IP) in 9 career starts vs. Rockies @ Chase Field.
◆ In his last 5 starts, is 3-0 with a 2.86 ERA (9 ER in 28.1 IP), .257 opp. average and 27 strikeouts.

MILESTONE WATCH

- ◆ His 888 strikeouts are third most by a D-backs pitcher all-time (Randy Johnson, 2,077; Brandon Webb, 1,065) and his 56 wins are fourth (next: Curt Schilling, 58 W).

WHEN QUANTITY MATCHES QUALITY

- ◆ Is looking to notch 200.0+ IP for the second time in his career (also: 2013)...it would be the 34th time (19 different pitchers) a D-backs pitcher has accomplished the feat.
◆ He would be the ninth pitcher in team history to reach 200.0 innings twice: Brandon Webb (5), Randy Johnson (5), Brian Anderson (2), Curt Schilling (2), Dan Haren (2), Ian Kennedy (2), Wade Miley (2) and Zack Greinke.
◆ He would be the fifth pitcher in club history (11th time) to reach 200.0+ IP and 200+ strikeouts in a single season, and the first since Zack Greinke last season (202.1 IP/215 SO)...the last lefty to do so was Randy Johnson in 2004.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ 2007 graduate of Cisero North Syracuse (N.Y.) High School...did not play baseball until his junior year...went to tryouts wearing jeans and told coaches he wanted to be a pitcher.
◆ Played basketball and baseball at Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, N.Y. before transferring to Chiopla Junior College (Fla.).
◆ Traveled to Australia in Nov. 2013 as part of a Major League Baseball goodwill tour.

PATTY 200

- ◆ Is the sixth D-backs pitcher (13 times) and third lefty (8 times) to reach the 200-strikeout milestone, joining Randy Johnson (5x), Curt Schilling (2x), Robbie Ray (2x), Dan Haren (2x) and Zack Greinke.

AT HOME

- ◆ In 16 home starts, is 7-4 with a 3.22 ERA (36 ER in 100.2 IP), .210 opp. average and 126 strikeouts.
◆ Among NL starters at home, is third with 126 strikeouts, 11th with a .210 opponent average and 14th with a 3.22 ERA.
