OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-28) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (20-36)

FRIDAY, JUNE 1, 2018 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 7:15 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped a three-game losing streak last night...the skid matched their longest losing streak of the season (fourth time, last: May 7-9)...the win avoided a four-game sweep, which would have been the second time they were swept this season (three-game sweep by Houston May 7-9)...are now 29-28 for the season...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 4-6 (.400) in 10 games since then...the A's are 10-19 (.345) against American League West competition, 19-9 (.679) against all other teams...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 37th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...that is one short of the season high of 7½ (last on May 25)...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 52 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

MUSTACHE MAGIC: Before giving up three runs in the ninth inning yesterday, RHP Daniel Mengden tossed 25.0 consecutive scoreless innings...finished the month of May going 4-1 with a 1.51 ERA, 24 strikeouts and four walks in 41.2 innings of work spanning six starts...in May, was tied for the American League lead in wins (4), was second in ERA (1.51), and fifth in batting average against (.181)...tossed a complete game shutout in his previous outing at home against the Diamondbacks on May 26...was three outs away from becoming the first Athletics pitcher to throw back-to-back shutouts since Mark Mulder in 2001...has a team-high four-game winning streak...has walked just eight batters this season compared to 48 strikeouts in 74.1 innings pitched...leads all of baseball with a 0.97 walks per nine innings...the next four on the list are Bartolo Colon (0.99), Corey Kluber (1.06), Justin Verlander (1.66) and teammate Sean Manaea (1.68).

THE HOT CORNER: Athletics third baseman Matt Chapman leads all Major League third basemen in nearly every major defensive statistic...he ranks first in total chances (203)...Kyle Seager, SEA is in second place with 166 total chances...Chapman also ranks first in putouts (45), assists (150), assists per nine innings (2.66), range factor per nine innings (3.46), range factor per game (3.42), and zone rating (.867)...Chapman has 46 more chances and more assists than Nolan Arenado (157 chances, 115 assists)...Chapman leads all players across all positions in defensive runs saved (13)...he has a consecutive games played streak of 137 dating back to last season...offensively, Chapman has nine home runs and 23 RBI in 57 games, including eight doubles and three triples.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 4-6 on their 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-3) and are batting .161 (52-for-323) with 22 runs scored (2.20 per game)...have not lost more than six games on a homestand since June 30-July 9, 2006 (3-7)...went 7-3 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (4-0), which was the A's first seven-win trip since April 7-16, 2014 (7-2)...now embark on a five-game road trip to Kansas City (three games) and Texas (two games)...these are the A's only five road games over a 25-game stretch from May 22-June 17...have won four straight and six of the last seven on the road...are 15-15 at home (.500) compared to 14-13 (.519) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's scored seven runs yesterday after scoring five runs over their previous four games...were held to one hit on Wednesday night for the first time since July 31, 2015 against Cleveland (Danny Salazar, Cody Allen)...have been held to seven hits or fewer in each of the last 10 games, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .237 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the second lowest on-base percentage (.308) and sixth lowest slugging percentage (.405)...were shut out Wednesday for the third time in the last nine games and the fifth time this year, which is tied for third most in the AL.

SCORING POSITION: The A's are 3-for-37 (.081) with runners in scoring position over the last seven games...hit .194 (37-for-191) with RISP in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...are hitting .236 with RISP for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying four errors Wednesday night (April 29 at Houston) and now have 38 for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...are tied for the third fewest double plays (44) and tied for the fourth most unearned runs (23)...lead the majors with 604 assists...A's outfielders have five assists, which is the fewest in the AL.

A'S IN MAY: The A's went 15-14 in May...had not had a winning record in May since 2014 (16-12)...batted .211 (207-for-981) in May, which is second lowest in the majors (Arizona, .193)...the lowest single-month batting averages in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games are .210 in April 1969, .210 in May 2012, .211 in April 2012, .216 in June 1982 and .220 in Aug. 2008...had a .277 on-base percentage, which is also second lowest in the majors (Arizona, .264)...the lowest single-month on-base percentages in Oakland history (min. 20 games) are .267 in July 2015, .274 in Aug. 1972, .281 in June 1978, .282 in April 1979, .283 in Sept. 1978)...have 260 strikeouts, which is the third highest single-month total in Oakland history (285 in June 2017, 276 in Sept. 2012)...are 5-for-15 (33.3%) in stolen base attempts...the last time an A's team had a stolen base percentage under 40% in a month with 10 or more steals was Aug. 1958 (2-for-10, 20.0%)...the Oakland low is 42.1% in July 1974 (16-for-38)...are tied with Baltimore for the fewest stolen bases in the American League this month.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.66 ERA (36 er in 122.0 ip) and .202 (89-for-440) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...overall, have the third fewest walks per nine innings in the American League (2.75) and the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.48)...lead the majors with 39 wild pitches...A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 3.18 ERA (26 er in 73.2 ip) over the last 13 games

HOME RUNS: The A's have hit 22 home runs in 30 games at home compared to 47 home runs in 27 games on the road...lead the majors in home runs on the road and are tied for the sixth fewest at home...27 of the A's 69 home runs have given Oakland the lead and the A's are tied for with the Yankees for the most go-ahead home runs in the American League...have homered in each of their last 14 games on the road...the pitching staff has allowed 40 home runs on the road, which is tied for second most in the majors...have 28 at home, which is eighth fewest.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Six of the 10 games on the homestand have been decided by one run and the A's are 2-4 in those games...are 10-6 (.625) in one-run games for the season...are 3-3 in extra inning games and the six extra inning games are tied for third most in the AL...are 6-3 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins.

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have compiled a 3.23 ERA (63 er in 175.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is second lowest in the American League (Houston, 3.16) and sixth lowest in the majors...have a 4.34 ERA (165 er in 342.0 ip) over innings one through six...are 22-0 when leading after seven innings and are one of two teams in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven (Milwaukee, 30-0).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 11-for-23 (47.8%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the third fewest attempts...opponents have stolen 41 bases, which is second most in the American League (Toronto, 43), but they have been caught stealing 15 times, which is tied for second most.

A'S ON RADIO: Due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: Sunday at Kansas City, next Wednesday at Texas and June 8 against Kansas City...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is tied for fifth in the American League in multiple hit games (21), tied for sixth in RBI (39) and tied for eighth in hits (66)...Blake Treinen converted each of his 10 save opportunities in May and had a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) in 14 games in May...he tied the A's record for saves in the month of May, which was 10 by Dennis Eckersley (1992).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1971 Reggie Jackson homers in the third inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York to give the A's a home run in 13 consecutive games, what was then a club record...the A's hit 25 round trippers during the streak, including six by Jackson...in 2006 Barry Zito strikes out Lew Ford in the sixth inning to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history and the eighth in Athletics history with 1000 career strikeouts.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (1-0, 1.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Sunday and made his 2018 debut that day with a start against Arizona...it was his first start as an Athletic but the third start of his career...his previous Major League experience includes 23 relief appearances with the A's last year and seven games, including two starts, with the White Sox in 2015.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Arizona last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a career-high six innings and a career-high 82 pitches and matched his career best with seven strikeouts...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced and no-hit the Diamondbacks over the first five innings...had a 1-0 lead when Mathis singled to lead off the sixth...allowed his only run later in the inning on a Lamb sacrifice fly and the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in losses at the time of his May 27 promotion Oakland...had a .269 opponents batting average, including .200 (9-for-45) against left-handed hitters compared to .297 (33-for-111) against right-handers...surrendered five home runs, four to righties...four were solo shots...yielded a .300 batting average with runners in scoring position...walked just two batters to lead off an inning...went 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start...was 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA in five starts at home, 0-4 with a 6.16 ERA in four starts on the road

RHP Trevor Cahill (1-2, 2.25 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 16 and is 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .183 opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .202 opponents average in four starts before he was placed on the DL May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right elbow impingement...had a no decision in his last start, a 1-0 A's loss to Tampa Bay in 13 innings last Monday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 4 h, 6 so)...is 3-2 with a 4.74 ERA (38.0 ip, 32 h, 20 r, 20 er, 22 bb, 18 so, 6 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts, against Kansas City...last started against the Royals on June 14, 2011 with the A's (L, 4.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 7 bb, 0 so)...was signed by the A's as a free agent March 19 and made two spring training appearances before he was optioned to Nashville March 28...went 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA and .121 opponents batting average in two starts with the Sounds.
