TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** lost the second game of the three game series and dropped their 10th series of the year...after winning four out of five games against Cleveland and Boston, have lost three straight games, losing those three by a combined score of 7-26...fall to seven games below .500, tying the most games under .500 this year...are 8-7 in their last 15 at Target Field and are 2-3 on the six game homestand...fall to 19-20 at home this year...fall to 6-12 against the AL West...Eddie Rosario hit the team's 13th first-inning home run this year, tied for third most in the AL with Los Angeles...allowed two hits to Adrian Beltre in the second inning, the third time an opponent has done that this season (last was Joey Votto and Scooter Gennet in the fifth inning on April 27).
- **JAKE ODORIZZI** lasted only 1.2 innings, allowing six runs on six hits and one walk with two strikeouts and suffered his fifth loss of the year...has now lost three straight decisions, tying a career-long streak...second shortest start of his career, the shortest coming April 15, 2017 vs. Boston when he last 1.0 inning...walked in a run with the bases loaded, the first time he's done that since July 7, 2017 vs. Boston...allowed six runs in the second inning, had previously only allowed four runs total in the second inning through 15 starts...six earned runs allowed is the second most of the season.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (2-for-5) hit a two-run home run in the first inning and a two-run double in the ninth inning...since May 1, is now hitting .354 (70-for-196) with 14 home runs, 17 doubles and 38 RBI...leads the AL in hits and is tied for second in RBI over that stretch.
- **MITCH GARVER** (3-for-4) singled three times today, his seventh multi-hit game this year and his second career three hit game (last coming August 30, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL), tying a career high.

RANGERS NOTES:

- **THE RANGERS** won the second of three against the Twins and take the series win, their fifth series win of the year and their third straight...improve to 34-44 on the season and 19-20 on the road...are 5-0 on their current six-game road trip after sweeping Kansas City...on the road trip, the bullpen has a 1.93 ERA (14.0 IP, 3 ER)...extend their season-long win streak to seven, longest active win streak in MLB...have won five of their last seven games against the Twins...are 11-8 vs. the American League Central this season, and are 7-5 on the road...scored six runs in the second inning, tying the most in a single inning this year (last May 4th vs. Boston in the 4th inning).

- **YOVANI GALLARDO** allowed four runs on six hits and two walks with three strikeouts over 5.1 innings and earned his first win of the year...second start of the year with Texas after making 10 minor league starts with Triple-A Round Rock...his 5.1 innings are his most in a big league start since August 26, 2017 vs. New York-AL as a member of the Mariners...starters have allowed now only 10 earned runs in 41.1 innings through the first five games of the road trip...won a road decision for the first time in seven games (four starts), his last coming in relief on July 17, 2017 at Houston.
- **NOMAR MAZARA** (1-for-5) singled and drove in a run in the second inning, extending his hitting streak to six games, hitting .444 (12-for-27) during the streak.
- **SHIN-SOO CHOO** (1-for-4) doubled and drove in a run in the second inning to extend his hitting streak to seven games, hitting .357 (10-for-28)...has now reached safely in 36 straight...hitting .326 (44-for-135) with 35 walks during the streak...marks the second longest on-base-streak in MLB behind Herrera of the Phillies with 40 games...is longest single season streak in Choo's career.
- **ADRIAN BELTRE** (3-for-5) recorded two singles in the second inning, the first time a Ranger has had two hits in an inning since Shin-Soo Choo on April 26, 2017 vs. Minnesota when he had a home run and a triple in the eighth inning...with 3,101 career hits, is nine hits away from tying Dave Winfield on the all-time hits list for 20th...hit his 466th career home run in the fourth inning, moving into sole possession of 34th place on the all-time home run list, passing Dave Winfield and Miguel Cabrera...now has 1,667 career RBI, moving into a tie for 26th on the all-time RBI list with Sammy Sosa.
- **JOEY GALLO** (1-for-2) doubled in the third inning to snap an 0-for-16 streak...left today's game with left hamstring tightness.
- **JURICKSON PROFAR** (0-for-1) was hit by a pitch three times today, tying a Rangers record for most times being hit by a pitch in a game...this is also the second time this year he's been hit three times in a game (last June 9 vs. Houston).
- **DELINO DESHIELDS** (2-for-4) singled and doubled today and has now reached safely in 14 of his last 15 games, hitting .326 (15-for-46) over that stretch.
