METSCELLANEOUS: New York has lost three straight and is 4-6 in its last 10 games...The Mets are 19-23 vs. the NL East...New York is 19-41 in its last 60 games.

AT HOME: New York is 7-8 in its last 15 home games and 9-23 in their last 32 home games...Overall, the Mets are 21-34 at home this year, the second-worst winning percentage (.382) in the National League, behind San Diego (.357).

ATLANTA: The Mets are 3-10 vs. Atlanta with six games remaining...The last time the Mets lost 11 or more games in one year to the Braves was in 2012 (6-12).

LEADOFF HOMERS: The Mets have 32 leadoff homers since 2015, including one last night from Brandon Nimmo, the most in the majors during that span...Minnesota is second with 30.

BRANDON NIMMO: Hit his third leadoff home run of the year last night off Mike Foltynewicz (also, June 18 at Colorado and June 8 vs. the Yankees)...Nimmo is the fifth Met to have three or more leadoff homers since 2000...Curtis Granderson (four times), Jose Reyes (three times), Michael Conforto and Kazuo Matsui are the others.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo is 13th in the NL with a .375 on-base percentage and tied for fifth in the majors with six triples...Nimmo has a career-high 14 homers, but just two in his last 36 games.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is 13-for-41 (.317) with three homers, four doubles and nine RBI, a .396 OBP and a .634 slugging percentage in 12 games since the All-Star break...Over his last 16 games, Conforto is hitting .302 (16-53) with four home runs, four doubles, 12 RBI, 12 runs scored and a .406 OBP...Conforto has a 14.7 percent walk-rate, the 10th-best in the majors.

IN THE SECOND HALF: Michael Conforto is 10th with a .634 slugging percentage since the All-Star break, 13th with a .396 OBP, tied for 11th with four doubles, tied for eighth with seven extra-base hits and tied for 11th with three homers.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

1,000: Bautista has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored.

FROM THE ELIAS FILES: José Reyes became the first player in team history to homer from both sides of the plate in a game he didn't start when he did so on August 1 at Washington.

AMED ROSARIO: Is tied for third in the NL with three stolen bases in the second-half...Overall, is tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

AUSTIN JACKSON: Has gone 5-13 (.385) since joining the Mets with a .429 OBP and a .615 slugging percentage (five games).

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost four straight home games to the Braves for the first time since they lost six consecutive home games to Atlanta in 2016.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



STREAKS: Jacob deGrom has hurled 13 straight quality starts, the longest active streak in the majors and the longest single-season streak since Johan Santana had 14 consecutive quality starts from July 22-September 27, 2008...DeGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 18 straight starts, the second-longest single-season streak in franchise history...Dwight Gooden had a 24-game streak in 1985.

deGROMINATE: Jacob deGrom leads the majors with a 1.82 ERA, is third in the NL and seventh in the majors with 164 strikeouts, sixth in the majors in WHIP (0.98) and is third in the majors with a .296 slugging percentage.

JAKE VS. ATL: DeGrom has a 0.72 ERA (two earned runs/25.0 innings) in four starts vs. the Braves this year...His 1.80 career ERA (19 earned runs/95.0 innings) vs. Atlanta is the second-best among all major league pitchers vs. the Braves since 1913 (min. 75.0 innings), trailing only Whit Wyatt's 1.60 ERA against the Braves...DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in five-straight starts against Atlanta dating back to September 16, 2017...That is the longest streak by a Mets starter in franchise history.

deCITI: DeGrom has the lowest home ERA (1.66) in the majors and the second-lowest home ERA (2.21) since 2014 behind Clayton Kershaw (1.93) and the lowest home ERA in franchise history (min 400 IP).

BOBBY WAHL: Made his Mets debut last night, retiring the only two batters he faced...He had 73 strikeouts in 45.0 minor league innings and 292 strikeouts in 221.2 career minor league innings.

PRIDE NIGHT: The Mets, along with LGBT Network CEO David Kilmnick, will host Pride Night for the third year in a row tomorrow night...Thousands of fans will wear commemorative Pride Night shirts with a portion of each ticket sale going to support the LGBT Network's anti-bullying programs in Long Island and New York City schools...The Mets were the first New York team among the four major sports leagues to host a Pride Night when they did so in 2016.

SYNDERGAARD AS THOR BOBBLE: This Saturday, the first 25,000 fans attending the Braves-Mets 7:10 p.m. will receive a Noah Syndergaard as Thor bobblehead presented by Marvel.

LAST START: DeGrom tonight makes his 22nd start of the season...In his last start, July 28 at PNC Park, tossed 7.0 innings, allowing three runs, earned, on a season-high eight hits while striking out five and not issuing a walk...Lost his fourth-consecutive decision despite registering his 13th-straight quality start in the Mets' 5-0 loss to the Pirates...Was his 18th-straight start allowing three or fewer runs, the longest streak by a Mets pitcher within a single season since Dwight Gooden's 24-start streak in 1985...Fell to 1-6 in his last 12 starts (1.86 ERA in that span).

VS. ATLANTA: DeGrom tonight faces Atlanta for the fifth time this season and makes his 16th-career appearance against the club overall...Last pitched vs. the Braves on June 13 at SunTrust Park...Tossed 7.0 innings of one-run ball and struck out seven...Was the hard-luck loser in the Mets' 2-0 loss...The Mets are winless in his four starts vs. Atlanta this season despite his 0.72 ERA (two earned runs/25.0 innings) in those games...His 1.80 ERA (19 earned runs/95.0 innings) is the second-best vs. the Braves since 1913 (min. 75.0 innings), trailing only Whit Wyatt's 1.60 ERA against the Braves...Has allowed one or no runs in five-straight starts against Atlanta dating back to September 16, 2017...That is the longest streak by a Mets starter in franchise history...Only two pitchers since 1908 have had six-straight starts vs. the Braves allowing one or no runs, Clayton Kershaw (July 31, 2014-present) and Claude Osteen (October 4, 1972-July 2, 1974).

IN deCITI: Owns a 1.66 ERA (14 earned runs/76.0 innings) in nine starts at Citi Field this season...That is the lowest home ERA in the majors...His .188 opponent average at home (52-276) ranks second in the NL...Has a 2.21 ERA (102 earned runs/415.0 innings) in 64-career starts at home, the second-lowest home ERA since 2014 behind Clayton Kershaw (1.93) and the lowest home ERA in franchise history (min 400 IP).

BETTER THAN MOST: Leads the majors with a 1.82 ERA (28 earned runs/138.1 innings)...His 164 strikeouts this season are third-most in the NL...Ranks second in the league with a .555 opponent OPS and a 0.46 HR/9 rate...According to Baseball Reference, holds the second-highest WAR (6.5) among all major league pitchers.

deGROMETRICS: According to FanGraphs, deGrom's 28.8 percent hard-hit rate is the fifth-lowest in the NL this season...DeGrom also produces the second-most soft contact in the NL (25.0 percent), behind teammate Zack Wheeler (25.7 percent)...Leads the NL with a 2.26 FIP...Has stranded 83.0 percent of his baserunners allowed this season, second-most in the NL.

HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY: Has thrown 13 quality starts in a row, the longest streak by a Mets pitcher since R.A. Dickey strung together 14-straight quality outings from July 25, 2011-April 13, 2012...His 17 quality starts are tied for second-most in the NL this season while his current streak of 13 quality starts in a row is the longest-active streak in the majors (no other active streak of more than nine QS).

ESCAPE ARTIST: Has held opponents to a .149 (14-94) batting average with RISP this season, third-lowest in the majors and second-lowest in the NL...That includes a 6-49 (.122) mark with RISP and two outs...Opponents are 0-13 this season vs. deGrom with the bases loaded...DeGrom is the only pitcher in the majors this season to not allow a bases-loaded hit (min. 13 batters faced in bases-loaded scenarios).

AMAZIN': His 1.68 first-half ERA was, by a thin margin, the second-lowest ERA before the break in franchise history (Dwight Gooden holds the franchise record with a slightly-lower 1.68 first-half ERA in 1985)...His 149 pre-break strikeouts were the fourth-most in team history and his 30.7 strikeout percentage was the highest in franchise history before the break.

KEEPING IT IN THE YARD: Has allowed home runs at a rate of 0.46HR/9 this season (seven home runs/138.1 innings), the lowest rate in the league...Had a 0.45 HR/9 rate in his rookie season in 2014...Only three Mets pitchers have had multiple seasons with a HR/9 rate under 0.50 in at least 130.0 innings (Dwight Gooden, five times; Tom Seaver, three; David Cone, two).

FREE PASSES: deGrom has issued three or fewer walks in a career-high 39-straight starts dating to June 18 of last season...The streak is the eighth-longest in Mets history and is one start shy of tying Daniel Hudson for the longest active streak in the NL...

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK WHEELER (5-6, 4.11)

LAST START: Pitched 6.0-shutout innings and allowed five hits while walking one and striking out seven and drove in the Mets' lone run in a 1-0 victory, July 29 at PNC Park...Earned his third-straight victory for the first time in his career...Became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to earn a victory in a 1-0 game and drive in the team's only run.

WHEELING AND DEALING: In his last six starts, Wheeler is 3-0 with a 2.56 ERA (11 earned runs/38.2 innings) and a 1.11 WHIP...His ERA and WHIP each rank in the top 16 in the NL in that span (since June 27)...Has thrown a first-pitch strike to 68.1 percent of the batters he's faced in those six starts (is 10th in the NL with a 64.0 first-pitch strike percentage overall this season).
