HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 6-1 vs. Rockies this season...Arizona has won 13 of its last 16 regular season games vs. Colorado.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 9 consecutive games @ Coors Field, the longest win streak by the D-backs in an opponent's stadium in club history.
- ♦ Arizona is 8-1 in its last 9 road games and 12-2 in its last 14...the D-backs' .581 (25-18) winning pct. on the road is best in the NL.
- ♦ The D-backs are 25-15 (.625) since May 28, tied for the second-best record in the NL with the Cubs, behind only the Dodgers (.641; 25-14).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit .378 (54-for-143)/.473 OBP/.734 SLG with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 32 RBI, 24 walks and 29 runs scored since June 1.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won @ Rockies, 5-3
- ♦ **David Peralta** went 1-for-5 with the game-winning, 3-run home run (16) in the seventh inning...**Nick Ahmed** was 2-for-5 with a double, home run (12) and RBI, and **A.J. Pollock** went 1-for-5 with a home run (12).
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** allowed 2 runs in 4.1 innings...**Randall Delgado** (2-0) earned the win, throwing 1.2 perfect frames...**Brad Boxberger** (1.0 IP) notched his 23rd save of the season.

- ♦ The D-backs @ Cubs game on Monday, July 23rd, will be on ESPN's Monday Night Baseball, co-existing with the FOX Sports Arizona broadcast.

MR. GOLDSCHMIDT AND MR. CORBIN GO TO WASHINGTON

- ♦ Major League Baseball announced on Sunday that 1B **Paul Goldschmidt** and LHP **Patrick Corbin** were named to the NL All-Star Team in the 89th Midsummer Classic on July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, DC.
- ♦ Goldschmidt is making his D-backs-record sixth All-Star appearance (2013-18), surpassing the 5 by Luis Gonzalez and Randy Johnson...he is the only NL player to make each of the last 6 All-Star teams, and 1 of 3 players in the Majors to do so (also: Mike Trout and Salvador Perez).
- ♦ Corbin is making his second All-Star appearance (also: 2013) and is 1 of 4 D-backs left-handed pitchers to earn an All-Star selection, along with Randy Johnson (1999-2002, '04), Wade Miley (2012) and Robbie Ray (2017).
- ♦ This is the D-backs' second straight year with multiple All-Stars (4 in 2017) and 12th time in club history.

NO MINOR FEAT

- ♦ Tonight, OF **Sócrates Brito** and INF **Ildemaro Vargas** will represent the Pacific Coast League at the 31st Annual Triple-A All-Star Game at Huntington Park in Columbus, Ohio...Brito, who was named PCL Player of the Month for June, will make the start in right field, batting third.

ON THIS DAY: PROFITABLE HOME RUN

- ♦ Jay Bell's grand slam in the sixth inning vs. A's in 1999 wins \$1 million for fan Gylene Hoyle of Chandler, who predicted the player and the inning before the game as part of Shamrock Farms Grand Slam Sundae.

- ♦ The D-backs have won 9 consecutive games @ Coors Field, the longest win streak by the D-backs in an opponent's stadium in club history:

- ♦ The streak is the longest by any team all-time at Coors Field, surpassing 8 game streaks by the Pirates (July 27, 2014-April 27, 2016) and Angels (July 6, 2001-July 8, 2015).

- ♦ Arizona's 9-game streak at Coors Field is the longest active win streak at an opponent's stadium:

- ☐ **LONGEST ACTIVE WIN STREAKS AT AN OPPONENT'S STADIUM: 9 – D-backs at Coors Field,** Astros at Globe Life Park, Dodgers at Citi Field, Red Sox at Camden Yards and Nationals at Great American Ball Park [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

MILLER-COORS DYNAMIC

- ♦ **Shelby Miller**, in his first career start vs. Rockies on May 10, 2013 @ Busch Stadium, retired 27 consecutive batters after yielding a leadoff single to Ernie Young...he earned a game score of 98, the highest in Cardinals history in a 9.0-inning game.

- ♦ The D-backs have won 16 series (min. 3 games) before the All-Star Break, tied for the third most in the Majors this season and tied for the second most all-time in club history [source: STATS LLC]:

TAKING THE SHOW ON THE ROAD

- ♦ Arizona is 25-18 (.581) on the road, the best winning pct. in the NL this season ahead of Milwaukee (.568; 25-19), Colorado (.560; 28-22) and Atlanta (.551; 27-22).

THE GOLD STANDARD

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit .378 (54-for-143)/.473 OBP/.734 SLG with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 32 RBI, 24 walks and 29 runs scored since June 1, ranking among the NL leaders in average (1st), OBP (1st), SLG (1st), OPS (1st, 1.208), extra-base hits (1st, 24), runs (2nd), home runs (3rd) and walks (6th).
- ♦ He is a lifetime .324 (73-for-225)/.418 OBP/.609 SLG hitter with 18 doubles, 2 triples, 14 home runs and 62 RBI in 56 games @ Coors Field.
- ♦ He recorded his 20th home run of the season Saturday vs. Padres, his sixth career 20-homer season, matching Luis Gonzalez's team record.
- ♦ Goldschmidt has 4 career seasons of 20+ home runs and 50+ RBI before the All-Star break (2013, '15, '17-18), making him 1 of 4 players to have 4 such seasons since 2013, joining Giancarlo Stanton (5), Nelson Cruz (5) and Edwin Encarnacion (4).

THESE GUYS IN THE PEN HAVE BEEN MIGHTY

- ♦ Arizona's bullpen leads the Majors with a 2.46 ERA, ahead of the Yankees (2.74), Astros (2.78) and Cubs (3.09)...the D-backs bullpen also ranks third in opponent average (.218), on-base pct. (.290) and slugging pct. (.339).
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has not yielded an earned run in 19 of his last 21 outings with a 0.93 ERA (2 ER in 19.1 IP)...leads the Majors with 24 holds.
- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** has allowed just 1 run in his last 29 games (0.36 ERA), posting a .198 opponent average in that time...is tied for third in the Majors with 20 holds.
- ♦ **Andrew Chafin** has held opponents scoreless in 13 of his last 14 outings (0.71 ERA; 1 ER in 12.2 IP).
- ♦ **T.J. McFarland**, who leads all NL relievers with 59.1 innings, has posted a 0.47 ERA (1 ER in 19.0 IP) over his last 11 games...his 59.1 innings are the most in team history by a reliever before the All-Star Break (previous: Byung-Hyun Kim, 58.1 in 2001).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP ROBBIE RAY (3-1, 5.23)

- ♦ Has won 9 of his last 10 decisions since Aug. 24, 2017, posting a 3.75 ERA (36 ER in 86.1 IP) with a .213 opponent average and 132 strikeouts in that time.
- ♦ Is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA (7 ER in 22.2 IP), 34 strikeouts and a .188 opponent average in 5 starts on the road this season...since the start of 2017, is 10-1 with a 2.05 ERA (25 ER in 109.2 IP), 153 strikeouts and .179 opponent average in 20 road starts.
- ♦ Is 3-3 with a 5.74 ERA (34 ER in 53.1 IP) in 10 career starts vs. Rockies.
