RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers evened their series against the Indians with a 2-1 win on Saturday night at Comerica Park. Blaine Hardy started for Detroit and earned his fourth win of the season, allowing one run on four hits with two walks and one strikeout in 5.0 innings. The Tigers bullpen combined to pitched 4.0 scoreless innings, capped by a shutout ninth inning from Shane Greene, who notched his 21st save. Offensively, JaCoby Jones hit a two-run home run, his eighth of the season. Jim Adduci, John Hicks, Jose Iglesias and Leonys Martin each added one hit in the victory. The Tigers and Indians conclude their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's series finale and an off day on Monday, the homestand continues on Tuesday with two games vs. Cincinnati (July 31-August 1).

V-MART STAYS HOT: Victor Martinez went 1x4 in last night's game to extend his hitting streak to six games. Over the six games, Martinez has posted a slash line of .455/.520/.773 with a double, two home runs and six RBI during the streak.

THE 'PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Tigers bullpen combined to throw 4.0 shutout innings in last night's win, allowing just one hit. Detroit relievers have combined for a 3.44 ERA (70.2IP/27ER) during the month of July, which is the second-lowest in the American League, trailing only New York (AL), which has a 3.18 bullpen ERA in July. The Tigers bullpen also ranks second in the AL with a 1.15 WHIP in July, while they are third with a .231 (61x264) opponents batting average.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 32nd one-run game of the season last night, improving to 16-16 in those contests with a 2-1 win. Detroit's 32 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 43 and Seattle, 41). In addition to the 32 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 22 games that have been decided by two runs.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their American League leading 52nd day game of the season (out of 107 games, 48.6%). Detroit has posted a 25-26 (.490) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 20-35 (.364) at night. The Tigers have lost 11 of their last 16 day games.

TIGERS AND INDIANS: Detroit is 4-11 against the Indians this season, and the two teams have split eight meetings at Comerica Park. Cleveland has won the season series over the Tigers in each of the last two seasons and has gone 38-14 against Detroit since the start of the 2016 season.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 21-22 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 8-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 4-11 vs. Cleveland, 3-3 vs. Minnesota and 6-7 vs. Kansas City. Detroit has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 1-1 on their current five-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (1-1) and two games vs. Cincinnati (July 31-August 1. Detroit is 27-26 at Comerica Park this season, but have lost nine of its last 13 home games. The Tigers are hitting .253 (454x1797) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has posted a 3.98 ERA (488.0IP/216ER).

MORRIS, TRAMMELL HALL OF FAME INDUCTION: Jack Morris and Alan Trammell will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame this afternoon. The induction ceremony begins at 1:30 p.m. ET and will be televised live on MLB Network. Both Morris and Trammell were elected by the Modern Baseball Era Committee last December. Morris and Trammell will become the 26th and 27th players who wore a Detroit Tigers uniform to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY ON DECK: The Tigers continue their 20-game Interleague schedule tomorrow as they begin a two-game series vs. Cincinnati. The Reds swept a two-game series from Detroit earlier this season at Great American Ball Park and lead the all-time series against the Tigers, 13-11. Detroit is 1-9 against National League opponents this season after going 0-2 vs. Chicago (NL), 0-2 vs. Cincinnati and 1-5 vs. Pittsburgh. The Tigers have an all-time record of 207-186 (.527) in Interleague play. Detroit is one of nine teams with 200-or-more wins in Interleague play, joining New York (AL), Boston, Los Angeles (AL), Oakland, Chicago (AL), Texas, Minnesota and Seattle.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 45-61 (.425) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,113-1,100 (.503) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT JORDAN: In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his 14th start of 2018 this afternoon in the series finale vs. Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann took the loss in his start on Tuesday at Kansas City, allowing four runs on seven hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND: Zimmermann has faced the Indians six times in his career, posting a 0-4 record with a 10.57 ERA (23.0IP/27ER) and 18 strikeouts. His only start against Cleveland this season came on April 11 at Progressive Field, when his outing was cut short after a scoreless two thirds of an inning when he suffered a right jaw contusion after being hit by a line drive.

AT COMERICA PARK: Zimmermann has appeared in 30 games, including 29 starts, at Comerica Park and has a 12-12 record with a 5.99 ERA (162.1IP/108ER) and 113 strikeouts. In five home starts this season, Zimmermann is 2-0 with a 2.59 ERA (31.1IP/9ER) and 34 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Zimmermann has posted a 13-10 record with a 5.41 ERA (168.0IP/101ER) and 135 strikeouts in 32 career appearances, including 31 starts, against teams from the American League Central. In five starts vs. AL Central teams this season, Zimmermann has a 1-1 record with a 5.85 ERA (20.0IP/13ER) and 16 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JULY: Zimmermann has made 38 career starts during the month of July, posting an 11-14 record with a 4.25 ERA (218.0IP/103ER) and 193 strikeouts. In three July starts this season, Zimmermann is 2-2 with a 3.38 ERA (26.2IP/10ER) and 26 strikeouts.

IMPRESSIVE STRETCH: Zimmermann has allowed three runs-or-fewer in seven of his last eight starts. Over that stretch, he has compiled a 3-2 record with a 2.40 ERA (48.2IP/13ER) and 43 strikeouts. He has limited opponents to a .214 (39x182) batting average, while posting a 0.95 WHIP.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .256 (699x2729) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .266 (737x2766) against him. In 13 starts this season, righties are hitting .269 (36x134), while lefthanded batters are hitting .235 (31x132).

KEEPIN' IT 1,000: Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 43 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

STREAK SNAPPED: Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13, 2017 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann leads all active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.91 walks per nine innings.

SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016: Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

TOSSING A NO-HITTER: Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd earned his fifth win of the season on Wednesday at Kansas City, allowing two runs on seven hits with seven strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. CINCINNATI/AT COMERICA PARK: Boyd's only career appearance against the Reds came earlier this season on June 19 at Great American Ball Park when he took the loss after giving up five runs on six hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 4.0 innings. Boyd has made 37 appearances, including 35 starts, in his career at Comerica Park, compiling a 10-11 record with a 4.14 ERA (198.0IP/91ER) and 151 strikeouts. In nine home starts this season, Boyd is 3-3 with a 3.40 ERA (50.1IP/19ER) and 41 strikeouts.
