the Florida State League best-of-5 finals...Class AA Pensacola continued its Southern League title defense at Biloxi with a 4-1 win to even that best-of-5 series...Game 3 is tonight in the series' only game at Pensacola...last night, rookie Billings defeated Great Falls, 3-2, in Game 1 of the Pioneer League's best-of-3 series...Game 2 is tonight.

APRIL 19: The Reds are 56-67 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...

bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387** (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

<u>HURLING</u>: The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4** <u>position players</u> (Cliff Pennington on 4/12 vs StL; Alex Blandino on 7/11 at Cle; Dilson Herrera on 8/8 at NYM; Brandon Dixon on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and <u>7 rookies</u> (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Kevin Shackelford, RHP Keury Mella, RHP Jesús Reyes).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went 16-26-2 in their 44 completed series, including 11-10-1 in the last 22 completed series beginning 6/19...beginning 6/21, the Reds have gone 5-1-2 in their last 8 series vs first-place teams (15-13, .536, 4-0 vs Cubs, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cle, 3-1 vs Phi, 2-1 vs Ari, 0-3 vs Cle and 0-4 at Chi)...the Reds' 2-1 series loss at Cubs completed on 7/8 snapped their 5-series unbeaten streak, their longest since a 6-series winning streak from 7/15-8/4, 2016...the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in June (15-11, .577).

<u>ALL-STAR INFIELD</u>: The Reds' infield includes 3 National League All-Stars and collectively leads the Major Leagues in hits, batting average (.284) and on-base percentage (.359)...All-Star 1B Joey Votto leads the NL in on-base percentage...

All-Star 2B Scooter Gennett leads the National League in hitting and 3-hit games while ranking second in hits and multi-hit games...
All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez is the only player in the National League with at least 31 HR and 100 RBI...SS José Peraza ranks among the NL leaders in several statistical categories, including the leader in most plate apps per strikeout (9.6).

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP Michael Lorenzen is trying to become the first relief pitcher ever to win a Louisville Silver Slugger Award and the first player in the live ball era to produce at least 4 HR in a season without starting a game...he has 4 HR, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off Jacob Barnes)...according to our friends @EliasSports, the franchise record for HR as a pitcher is 4 by converted outfielder Hal Jeffcoat, who hit 4 HR in 1957, all as a pitcher...Tom Parrott hit 4 HR in 1894, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...as a pinch hitter, Lorenzen is 3-for-11 (2hr, 5rbi) this season and 4-for-18 (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with home runs on 4/6/17 off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)...6 times in his career, including 5 times this season, entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in the game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games.

RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tonight is making his 17th start of the season...will be his third career appearance and start vs the Padres, his first since 2016...in Sun's 10-inning, 6-4 win at StL threw 3.2 innings to snap a streak in which he had thrown at least 6.0 innings in 5 consecutive starts (3-1, 2.62), 1 start shy of his career high for consecutive 6.0-inning starts (6gs, 6/21-7/20, 2016)...has allowed 11 earned runs in his last 36.0 innings (2.75era), including a season-high 14.0 scoreless innings snapped in the third inning on 8/17 vs SF...from 8/4-8/17 became the first Reds pitcher to throw at least 7.0 innings in 3 straight starts since he did it from 8/21-9/2, 2016, tying his career-best streak...in the 11-2 win on 6/23 vs Cubs hit a grand slam (off Brian Duensing), the first home run of his career and only the fourth grand slam by a Reds pitcher (Bob Purkey on 8/1/59 vs Cubs, Al Hollingsworth on 5/28/1936 at Cubs, Ice Box Chamberlain on 4/30/1892 vs Wsh)...in the 9-6 loss on 6/5 vs Col made his first appearance for the Reds since a 2-1 win on 9/28/16 at StL... between his September 2016 and June 2018 apps, 17 pitchers made starts for the Reds...began the 2018 season on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his 6/5 start vs Col, from 5/14-5/30 made 4 rehab starts for Pensacola and Louisville (0-3, 4.66)...spent the entire 2017 season on the disabled list with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.
