INSIDE THE NUMBERS

Dating back to June 29, 2014, Nelson Cruz has hit safely 23 of his last 27 games vs. Tampa Bay, including an active 11-game hitting streak (5/10/16-current)...during this 27-game stretch he is batting .385 (42x109) with 24 runs scored, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 26 RBI, 9 walks and 1 stolen base.

The Mariners have not committed an error in 14 consecutive games (5/23-c)...during this span, the Mariners have successfully converted 544 total chances (393 putouts, 151 assists)...the 14 consecutive games (previous: 12, 7/3-21/12) without an error and 544 total chances (previous: 518, 7/3-21/12) without an error are both club records.

VS. TAMPA BAY

The Mariners and Rays meet for the 4th (3-0) of 7 games this season...Seattle swept a 3-game series vs. the Rays at Safeco Field, June 1-3...the Mariners are 12-3 in their last 15 games vs. the Rays, dating back to the start of the 2016 season:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-day, 6-game road trip covering over 5,600 miles with the first game of a 4-game series with Tampa Bay...opened the road trip splitting a 2-game set with Houston (1-1)...the Mariners will return home to Seattle on June 11 to begin a 7-day, 7-game homestand that features 3 games vs. the Angels and 4 games vs. the Red Sox...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 5 of their last 6 games, 9 of their last 12, 14 of their last 18 and 16 of their last 22...Seattle is 24-12 in its last 36 games, 29-15 over its last 44 games and 34-19 in its last 53 games...Seattle is 12-10 during the day and 27-12 at night...Seattle is 20-12 at Safeco Field, 18-11 on the road.

- **Extra, Extra!** - the Mariners are 6-0 in extra-inning games this season...tied with Texas (6) for the ML-lead in extra-inning wins.
- **Walk it Off** - the Mariners (5) are tied with the Yankees for 3rd-most walk-off wins in the ML, trailing only the Cardinals (7) and Braves (6)...each of the Mariners 5 walk-off wins has come during extra-innings.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - Jean Segura leads the Major Leagues with 27 multi-hit games, ranking ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (26) and Nick Markakis-ATL (26)...Segura leads the Majors with 12 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (11).
- **Welcome to Seattle** - Since joining the Mariners on May 27, Alex Colomé has appeared in 4 of the Mariners 10 games, including recording the save in his Mariners debut on April 27 vs. MIN...overall he has retired 13 of 15 batters faced (1 H, 1 HBP) while striking out 4 over 4.0 scoreless innings.
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 26-8 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 12-15 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **That was Close** - the Mariners are 18-9 (.667) in one-run games this season, the most one-run wins and one-run decisions in the Majors...the Mariners are also 24-11 in games decided by 2-or-fewer runs.
- **Scoreless** - RH Chasen Bradford has an active 8.2 scoreless innings streak over his last 8 games (5/17-c)...his scoreless streak is currently the T11th-longest active streak in the American League.

HOT START...Seattle is 38-23 (.623) through its first 61 games of the season, its 3rd-best record in club history, trailing only 2001 (48-13/.787) and 2003 (42-19/.689)...the Mariners currently have a +1.0 lead over the Astros in the American League West...prior to this season, the last time the Mariners led the AL West outright after May was at the end of play on Aug. 24, 2003.

ROAD HOMERS...since 2015, Nelson Cruz (76) and Kyle Seager (61) have combined to hit 137 home runs on the road...Cruz's 76 road home runs since 2015 lead all Major League players, while Seager ranks T5th...during this stretch as a team, the Mariners have hit 355 home runs on the road, trailing only the Toronto Blue Jays (377), the Houston Astros (360), the Tampa Bay Rays (359) and the New York Mets (357) for most home runs on the road...Cruz (7) and Seager (7) have combined for 14 career home runs at Tropicana Field.

AS THE STARTING PITCHING GOES...since May 16, the Mariners starters are 9-1 (team is 14-6 overall) with a 2.24 ERA (32 ER, 128.2 IP) with 99 strikeouts and 30 walks in 20 games...Seattle starters lead the Major Leagues in ERA during that span, ranking ahead of Washington (2.81/35 ER, 112.0 IP) and St. Louis (2.84/37 ER, 117.1 IP)...the 128.2 innings pitched by Mariners starters are the most in the Majors since May 16...during this same stretch, Mariners relievers are 5-5 with 8 saves and a 2.43 ERA (16 ER, 59.1 IP).

DRAFT RECAP...the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft concluded yesterday...the Mariners selected 40 players, highlighted by their first pick, right-handed pitcher Logan Gilbert, who was the 14th overall selection in the draft...overall the Mariners selected 21 pitchers, 3 catchers, 11 infielders (6 2B, 4 SS, 1 3B) and 5 outfielders...Seattle selected 33 college players and 7 high school players.

NO FREE PASSES...James Pazos has not issued a walk since his first appearance of the season on April 4, a span of 23 appearances without a walk...Pazos' streak of 23 consecutive games without issuing a walk is the 2nd-longest streak of games without a walk among Major League relievers this season...Kansas City's Kelvin Herrera has an active streak of 24 straight games without issuing a walk, dating back to the beginning of the season...Pazos' streak is the 2nd-longest by a reliever in club history, trailing only Charlie Furbush, who did not walk a batter in 26 straight outings, May 20 - July 29, 2014.

FAMILIAR FACES...the Mariners and Rays franchises have been involved in 15 trades, including one 3-team trade, involving 44 players and 1 manager...since Nov. 5, 2015 the Mariners and Rays have pulled off 7 different trades with 11 players coming to Seattle in exchange for 16 players...several Mariners 40-man roster players have Rays connections, including Alex Colomé (2013-18), Erasmo Ramírez (2015-17), Mike Marjama and Denard Span (2018)...former Mariners on Rays current 40-man roster include Andrew Kittredge, Brad Miller (2013-15), Andrew Moore (2017), Vidal Nuño (2015-16), Chaz Roe, Mallex Smith, Jesus Sucre (2013-16) and Ryan Yarbrough.

ROLLING IN ST. PETE...the Mariners have won 9 of the last 12 games and 12 of the last 18 games in St. Petersburg (since July 21, 2012)...the 14-game stretch followed an 8-game losing streak at Tropicana Field (8/19/11-7/2012)...the Mariners swept a 3-game set in Seattle earlier this season (June 1-3) and overall are 19-6 in the last 25 games against the Rays (since June 7, 2014).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...Jean Segura is batting .366 (45x123) with 24 runs scored, 10 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 20 RBI, 5 walks and 8 stolen bases in 28 games on the road this season, including batting .444 (20x45) with 7 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 5 RBI and 3 stolen bases in his last 10 road games (5/9-c)...among all American League players, his .366 road average is the 3rd-highest this season...he also ranks 2nd in hits, T3rd in runs, T9th doubles, 11th in on-base percentage (.388), T11th in RBI.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Mike Leake has an active streak of 112 consecutive batters faced without issuing a walk over his last 5 starts (5/10-current)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Leake's 112 consecutive batters faced without allowing a walk is the longest active streak in the Majors and the 3rd-longest streak this season?...Leake trails only Corey Kluber-CLE (139 BF, 5/8-6/5/18) and Kelvin Herrera-KC (116 BF, 9/7/17-6/2/18) and ranks ahead of Robbie Erlin-SD (94 BF, 4/16-current) and James Pazos-SEA (78 BF, 4/4-current) for the longest batters faced walkless stretch this season.

ABOUT LEAKE...

- Michael Raymond Leake.
- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 13th start of the season, 18th Mariners start, 251st career appearance (246th career start) and 4th career start vs. Tampa Bay today.
- A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning *Baseball America* First-Team All-American Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
- Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft... did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 17-11 with a 3.55 ERA (117 ER, 296.1 IP) in 46 career games (all starts) in June.

LAST OUTING......did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 4-3 13-inning Mariners win on June 1 vs Tampa Bay...allowed 2 runs on 6 hits while striking out a season-high 8 batters across 7.0 innings pitched...both runs came on back-to-back solo home runs in the 5th inning...marked his 5th start of the season without issuing a walk.

NO FREE PASSES......has not allowed a walk in 4 consecutive starts, the second-longest active streak among starters in the Majors (Corey Kluber-CLE, 5)...has not allowed a walk in 5 starts this season, T3rd among Major League starters, trailing only Kluber (7) and Ivan Nova-PIT (6)...Leake's 1.98 walks per 9.0 innings are the 7th best among AL pitchers (13th in the Majors).

GETTING LOOSE......through Leake's first 25 pitches in a game, opponents are batting .360 (27x75) with a .385 on-base percentage and a .547 slugging percentage, but in pitches 26 through 100+, Leake has limited batters to a .244 average (51x209) with a .296 OBP and a .440 slugging mark.

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE......has exited 9 of his 12 starts with a lead (7 games) or a tie score (2 games)...in 2 of his other 3 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, and 0-3 in the 6th inning...the Mariners are 9-3 in his 12 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE......since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 8-4 with a 4.04 ERA (47 ER, 104.2 IP) in 17 starts (10 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in wins and innings pitched and is tied with James Paxton for most quality starts...in 13 of his 17 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 12-5 in Leake starts.

FOUR SCORE......is 10-1 with a 3.52 ERA (40 ER, 102.1 IP) in his last 16 starts in which he has received 4 or more runs of support, dating back to April 23, 2017...his clubs are a combined 13-3 in those 16 games (7-3 w/STL, 6-0 w/SEA)...for his career, Leake is 66-4 with a 3.45 ERA (243 ER, 633.1 IP) in 98 career starts when he has received 4+ runs of support; his clubs are 79-19 in those 98 starts.

TAKING HIS TURN......since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 245 starts, 14th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 15th in innings pitched (1519.0).

DAY AND NIGHT......is 4-0 with a 3.12 ERA (9 ER, 26.0 IP) in 4 day games this season, while going 1-3 with a 5.59 ERA (29 ER, 46.2 IP) in 8 night starts...opponents are batting just .194 (18x102) with a .255 on-base percentage against Leake when the sun is out, while batting .314 (60x191) with a .351 on-base percentage after dark.

2017 SEASON RECAP......went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE......made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE......recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in MLB made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber, 8, Chris Sale, 4, Carlos Martinez, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom, 4 and Carlos Carrasco, 4).

QUICK RISE......became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)...became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft...appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

CAREER......has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 88-80 with a 4.02 ERA (678 ER, 1519.0 IP) with 1,032 strikeouts and 358 walks in 250 career games (245 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.

26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 13th start of the 2018 season tomorrow vs. Tampa Bay...has allowed just 1 earned run in his last 4 starts combined (0.35 ERA, 26.0 IP, 16 H, 1 ER, 18 K, .180 batting average against)...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 7 of his last 8 starts, going 5-1 with a 1.98 ERA (11 ER, 50.0 IP) with 5 quality starts over that span...W#6 in his last start, a 3-1 Mariners win on 6/2 vs. TB (6.2,5,1,1,2,6)...**SPRING TRAINING:** went 1-1 with 2.08 ERA (6 ER, 26.0 IP) in 6 Spring Training starts...**CAREER:** Drafted by St. Louis with 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...made MLB debut with the Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado...is 11-6 with a 4.50 ERA (72 ER, 144.0 IP) with 123 strikeouts in 34 games (26 starts) in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...missed the 2016 season while recovering from ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow...**vs. TB:** Made sole start against Tampa Bay in last start on June 2 (6.2,5,1,1,2,6).
