The Mariners and Angels meet for the 8th (5-2) of 19 games this season... these two clubs will play their final 3 head-to-head series in Anaheim: July 10-12, July 27-29 and Sept. 13-16:

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-day, 9-game homestand with the second (1-0) of 3 games vs. Los Angeles-AL...began the homestand with a 3-game sweep of Kansas City...will also face Colorado (3 G) on this homestand...went 5-5 on a recently-concluded 11-day, 10-game, 3-city road trip to New York-AL (0-3), Boston (1-2) and Baltimore (4-0)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network...it will also be broadcast to a national audience on **ESPN Radio**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won a season-high 8 straight games and are 9-6 over their last 15 contests...they have won 15 of their last 22 games, 22 of their last 31, 26 of their last 37, 31 of their last 43 and 33 of their last 47...Seattle is 41-20 in its last 61 games, 46-23 over its last 69 games and 51-27 in its last 78 games...Seattle is 16-14 during the day and 39-17 at night...Seattle is 29-14 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Spee-Dee - Dee Gordon** recorded his 300th career stolen base in the 7th inning last night...Gordon joins Jose Reyes (516 SB) and Rajai Davis (410 SB) as the only players current on a 25-man roster with at least 300 career steals...Gordon leads the American League with 22 stolen bases this season.
- **Corner of Edgar & Dave** - the Mariners are 29-14 (.674) at Safeco Field this season, the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...they trail New York-AL (.711/32-13), Boston (.700/28-12) and Cleveland (.675/27-13), while ranking ahead of San Francisco (.650/26-14)...the Mariners have won 13 of their last 15 home games (5/31-c) and are 20-4 at home since May 18.
- **Get Used to It** - eight of the Mariners next 19 games will be against the Los Angeles Angels...the Mariners are 1-0 so far in this 3-game series vs. the Halos at Safeco Field, which marks the final meeting between these clubs in Seattle this season...the Mariners will travel to Anaheim for a 3-game series July 10-12 and again July 27-29...Seattle will also travel to Anaheim during the final road trip of the regular season...the Mariners (54-31) currently lead the Angels (43-42) by 12.0 games for the 2nd AL Wild Card.
- **Multi-Hit Madness - Jean Segura** has 35 multi-hit games this season, tied for 2nd-most in the Majors and tied for the top spot in the American League (also: Francisco Lindor-CLE), trailing Nick Markakis-ATL (36)... Segura leads the Majors with 15 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (12) and Francisco Lindor-CLE (12).
- **First Things First - Dee Gordon** is batting .324 (23x71) when leading off a game this season.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 40-10 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 15-21 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 23 of their first 28 series, posting a series record of 17-5-6.

MARINERS ON THE FOURTH OF JULY...Seattle is 16-23 all-time playing on the Fourth of July...the Mariners have lost 6 straight Independence Day games following a 5-game winning streak...the Mariners and Angels have squared off 3 times on the Fourth of July with the Mariners going 1-2: July 4, 1997 in Anaheim (7-3 win), July 4, 2000 in Anaheim (7-6 loss) and July 4, 2006 at Safeco Field (14-6 loss)...this will be the first meeting between the two clubs on the 4th since 2006...**LEAKE ON THE FOURTH OF JULY**...

Mike Leake has made 2 career starts on the Fourth of July, both with Cincinnati: July 4, 2010 at Chicago-NL and July 4, 2012 at Los Angeles-AL...he is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER, 13.0 IP) with 10 strikeouts and 1 walk in those 2 outings.

HIGH-WATER MARK...at 55-31, the Mariners are a season-high 24 games over .500...this marks the first time Seattle has been 24 games over .500 since being 93-69 (.574) at the end of the 2003 season...with a win today, the Mariners would improve to 25 games above .500 for the first time since being 76-51 (.598) following game #127 of the 2003 season on Aug. 21.

PITCH LIKE MIKE...since May 22, **Mike Leake** is 4-1 with a 2.22 ERA (14 ER, 56.2 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 8 walks in 8 starts...the Mariners are 7-1 in those 8 starts...Leake has worked at least 6.0 innings in each of his last 8 starts, including 5 outings of at least 7.0 innings and 2 or fewer runs allowed...7 of his last 8 starts have been quality starts...among Major League leaders since May 22, Leake ranks 3rd in innings pitched, 3rd in BB/9.0 IP (8 BB, 56.2 IP), 4th in WHIP (0.92/8 BB, 44 H, 56.2 IP) and 5th in ERA.

EIGHT IS GREAT...the Mariners have won a season-high 8 consecutive games, marking the club's first 8-game winning streak since Sept. 7-14, 2016...the last time the Mariners won 9 straight games was May 27 - June 5, 2003...Seattle's current 8-game winning streak is the longest active streak in the Majors.

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 33 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 72 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 83)...**Díaz is the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break**, joining Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (31 SV, 76 K)...Díaz's 33 saves are 2nd-most all-time in a club's first 86 games of a season, trailing only Francisco Rodriguez-LAA (34, 2008)...his 33 saves rank T3rd-most all-time prior to the All-Star Break (also: Danny Graves-CIN, 2004, and Jim Johnson-BAL, 2013), behind Rodriguez in 2008 with the Angels (38) and John Smoltz in 2003 with the Braves (34)...of Díaz's 33 saves, 20 have come in one-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 11)...his 20 one-run saves are only 3 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 41-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 22-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 20-for-22 in 1-run save opportunities (90.9%) with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts and 5 walks.

AMONG THE BEST...since May 8, the Mariners have a .679 (36-17) winning percentage, 2nd-best in the Majors over that span...they trail Houston (.680/34-16), while ranking ahead of New York-AL (.633/31-18) and Boston (.623/33-20)...the Mariners 36 wins are the most in the Majors since May 8, ranking ahead of the Astros (34-16).

AS YOU KNOW...**Nelson Cruz** ranks 8th all-time in club history with 148 career home runs with the Mariners...**AND AS YOU MAY KNOW**...Cruz belted 157 home runs over 8 seasons with the Texas Rangers...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Cruz is 2 home runs shy of becoming the 19th player in Major League history to hit at least 150 home runs with 2-or-more clubs?...17 players have belted 150+ home runs with 2 clubs: Barry Bonds, Joe Carter, Andrew Dawson, Carlton Fisk, Jimmie Foxx, Jason Giambi, Ken Griffey Jr. (417 w/SEA, 210 w/CIN), Vladimir Guerrero, Mark McGwire, Johnny Mize, Rafael Palmeiro, Mike Piazza, Albert Pujols, Manny Ramirez, Frank Robinson, Mark Teixeira and Dave Winfield...one player has hit 150+ homers with 3 clubs: Alex Rodriguez (351 w/NYY, 189 w/SEA, 156 w/TEX)...**STATS LLC**.

ABOUT LEAKE...

- Michael Raymond Leake.
- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 18th start of the season, 23rd Mariners start, 256th career appearance (251st career start) and 5th career start vs. Los Angeles-AL today.
- A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning *Baseball America* First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
- Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft... did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 18-15 with a 3.92 ERA (106 ER, 243.2 IP) in 40 career games (all starts) in July.

LAST OUTING......did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 4-2 extra-innings Mariners win in Baltimore on June 28...allowed just 2 runs on 5 hits and 1 walk while striking out 6 across 7.0 innings pitched...allowed a pair of solo home runs to Manny Machado and Chris Davis in the 4th inning; marked the only inning in which Leake allowed more than one baserunner.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY......7 of his last 8 starts (5/22-c) have been quality starts, including 3 outings of 8.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs...his 42.0 innings pitched in June were tied with Jacob deGrom-NYM for most in the Majors...only James Paxton (43.0 IP in May) has tossed more innings in a single calendar month this season.

GOING FOR DISTANCE......his 3 starts this season of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 2-or-fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN, 6/7 at TB and 6/23 at BOS) are T1st in the Majors (8 others)...his 7 games with 7.0-or-more innings pitched are T5th-most among Major League starters.

GETTING LOOSE......through Leake's first 25 pitches in a game, opponents are batting .355 (38x107) with a .389 on-base percentage and a .486 slugging percentage, but in pitches 26 through 100+, Leake has limited batters to a .217 average (68x314) with a .265 OBP and a .404 slugging mark.

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE......has exited 13 of his 17 starts with a lead (10 games) or a tie score (3 games)...in 2 of his other 4 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, and 0-3 in the 6th inning...the Mariners are 13-4 in his 17 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE......since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 11-5 with a 3.67 ERA (57 ER, 139.2 IP) in 22 starts (14 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in wins, innings pitched and quality starts...in 11 of his 22 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 16-6 in Leake starts.

FOUR SCORE......is 13-1 with a 3.11 ERA (43 ER, 124.1 IP) in his last 19 starts in which he has received 4 or more runs of support, dating back to April 23, 2017...his clubs are a combined 16-3 in those 19 games (7-3 w/STL, 9-0 w/SEA)...for his career, Leake is 69-4 with a 3.38 ERA (246 ER, 655.1 IP) in 101 career starts when he has received 4+ runs of support; his clubs are 82-19 in those 101 starts.

TAKING HIS TURN......since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 250 starts, 13th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 14th in innings pitched (1554.0).

2017 SEASON RECAP......went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE......made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE......recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in MLB made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber, 8, Chris Sale, 4, Carlos Martinez, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom, 4 and Carlos Carrasco, 4).

QUICK RISE......became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)...became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft...appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

CAREER......has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 91-81 with a 3.98 ERA (688 ER, 1554.0 IP) with 1,051 strikeouts and 366 walks in 255 career games (245 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP MARCO GONZALES (8-5, 3.77 ERA)

26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 18th start of the 2018 season tomorrow vs. Los Angeles-AL...W#8 the 1st complete game of his career, a 4-1 Mariners win on 6/29 vs. KC (9.0,6,1,1,0,7)...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 11 of his last 13 starts (4/24-c), going 7-3 with a 3.01 ERA (28 ER, 83.2 IP) with 7 quality starts over that span...**CAREER:** Drafted by St. Louis with 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...made MLB debut with the Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado...is 13-8 with a 4.51 ERA (89 ER, 177.2 IP) with 151 strikeouts in 39 games (31 starts) in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...missed the 2016 season while recovering from ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow...vs. LAA: Is 0-0 with a 4.66 ERA (10 ER, 19.1 IP) in 4 career starts vs. the Angels...has faced the Angels twice this season, collecting a 5.73 ERA (7 ER, 11.0 IP) while striking out 14 batters.
