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**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners begin a first-half-concluding 2-team, 6-game road trip with the first of three at Los Angeles-AL...will also face NL West rival Colorado in a 3-game series prior to the All-Star break...recently concluded a 3-team, 10-day, 9-game homestand going 6-3 against Kansas City (3-0), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Colorado (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners have won 10 of their last 13 games, including a season-high 8-game winning streak (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have also won 17 of their last 27 games, 24 of their last 36, 28 of their last 42, 33 of their last 48 and 35 of their last 52...Seattle is 43-23 in its last 66 games, 48-26 over its last 74 games and 53-30 in its last 83 games...Seattle is 17-16 during the day and 40-18 at night...Seattle is 31-17 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Homer Happy** - dating back to May 26, **Nelson Cruz** is batting .309 (43x139) with 27 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 15 home runs, 34 RBI and 21 walks in 39 games...during this stretch he is T2nd in the Majors in home runs (Jesús Aguilar-MIL, 16), while ranking 3rd in slugging (.676) and T7th in RBI.
- **Milestone** - **Kyle Seager** recorded his 1,078th career hit on Sunday vs. the Rockies, passing Raúl Ibañez (1,077) for 6th-most hits in Mariners franchise history (next: 5, Alvin Davis, 1,163).
- **First Things First** - **Dee Gordon** is batting .333 (25x75) when leading off a game this season.
- **Herrmann's Hits** - **Chris Herrmann** has reached base safely via hit or walk in 5 of his 7 starts this season... he has reached base twice via hit or walk in 3 of those 7 starts...the Mariners are 5-2 in Herrmann's 7 starts.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 42-11 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 15-23 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 24 of their first 30 series, posting a series record of 18-6-6.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR**...DH **Nelson Cruz** (.267/74x277, 39 R, 10 2B, 3B, 53 RBI, 10 HBP, 31 BB, SB), RHP **Edwin Díaz** (47 G, 0-2, 35 SV, 2.30 ERA/12 ER, 47.0 IP, 13 BB, 78 K) and OF **Mitch Haniger** (.271/88x325, 45 R, 16 2B, 2 3B, 17 HR, 62 RBI, 4 HBP, 42 BB, 4 SB) have been selected to play for the American League in the 89th annual Major League Baseball All-Star Game on Tuesday, July 17, at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C. ...this marks **Cruz's** 6th career All-Star selection and his 5th in the last 6 seasons (also: 2009, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017), while **Díaz** and **Haniger** each received their first All-Star selection.

**A SKY FULL OF STARS**...SS **Jean Segura** (.330/115x349, 61 R, 24 2B, 2 3B, 7 HR, 47 RBI, HBP, 17 BB, 14 SB) was selected as one of five American League Final Vote candidates for the 32nd and final roster spot on the American League All-Star team...voting is available now online and via mobile devices at **Mariners.com/vote** and **MLB.com/vote**...voting will conclude at 1:00 p.m. (PT) on Wednesday, July 11, 2018...now in its 18th season, fans again will be able to make their Final Vote selections on **MLB.com**, Club sites and in the **MLB At Bat** and **Ballpark** mobile apps...for more information, go to **MLB.com**.

**JEAN, JEAN THE HIT COLLECTOR**...**Jean Segura** has 37 multi-hit games this season, T2nd-most in the Majors (J.D. Martinez-BOS, 38)...Segura leads the Majors with 15 games of at least 3 hits...Segura has more multi-hit games (37) than games without a hit this season (22)...among Major League leaders, Segura ranks 2nd in hits with 115, trailing only Houston's Jose Altuve (122)...he also ranks 4th in the Majors with a .330 (115x349) batting average, behind Mookie Betts-BOS (.344/96x279), Altuve (.337/123x365) and Martinez (.331/110x332).

**NOT SO AVERAGE**...Seattle boasts 2 of the top-5 players in the American League in batting average on the road this season: 1. Jose Altuve-HOU (.365/69x189), 2. Andrelton Simmons-LAA (.348/54x155), 3. **Jean Segura** (.348/57x164), 4. Mike Trout-LAA (.337/59x175) and 5. **Nelson Cruz** (.331/43x130)...also among American League leaders on the road, **Kyle Seager** ranks 3rd with 38 RBI and T4th with 12 home runs.

**AMONG THE BEST**...since May 8, the Mariners have a .655 (38-20) winning percentage, T2nd-best in the Majors over that span (also: Boston, .655/38-20)...they trail Houston (.696/39-17), while ranking ahead of New York-AL (.636/35-20), Chicago-NL (.607/34-22), Los Angeles-NL (.607/34-22) and Milwaukee (.607/34-22).

**SEAGER BELIEVER**...dating back to June 26, **Kyle Seager** has hit safely in 8 of his last 12 games, including 6 multi-hit contests...during this 12-game stretch, he is batting .366 (15x41) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and 4 walks...Seager is also batting .375 (9x24) with 3 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 5 RBI and 2 walks in 7 games in July...he has a career .302 (191x632) average with 88 runs scored, 42 doubles, 1 triple, 24 home runs, 80 RBI and 61 walks in 166 games in July...his .302 average is his highest monthly average in his career (.276/205x744 in 194 games in May).

**ELECTRIC EDDIE**...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 35 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 78 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 85)...**Díaz is the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break**, joining Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (31 SV, 76 K)...Díaz's 34 saves rank 2nd-most all-time prior to the All-Star Break, behind Francisco Rodriguez in 2008 with the Angels (38)...of Díaz's 35 saves, 20 have come in 1-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 11)...his 20 1-run saves are only 3 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 43-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 22-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 20-for-22 in 1-run save opportunities (90.9%) with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts and 5 walks.

**HALF DOZEN**...**Ryon Healy** has hit safely in 7 of 9 games vs. the Angels this season, batting .371 (13x35) with 8 runs scored, 1 double, 6 home runs, 10 RBI and 1 walk...his 6 home runs vs. a single opponent are T3rd-most in the Majors this season (also: Eddie Rosario, 6 HR vs. CLE), trailing only Matt Davidson's 7 home runs vs. the Royals and A.J. Pollock's 7 home runs vs. the Dodgers...his 6 home runs vs. the Angels in a single season are also T3rd-most by a Mariners player in club history (also: Bret Boone, 6 HR in 2003), trailing only **Nelson Cruz's** 10 home runs in 2016 and Alex Rodriguez's 7 home runs in 2000.

**AS YOU KNOW**...the Mariners are 26-17 (.605) on the road this season...**AND AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...Seattle's .605 road winning percentage is T3rd-best in the Majors (also: New York-AL), trailing only Houston (.696/32-14) and Boston (.667/34-17)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...the Mariners will play 30 of their last 38 road games vs. opponents with a .500+ record (based on current records)?...the Mariners strength of schedule on the road is the 3rd-toughest in the Majors for the remainder of the season, trailing only the Texas Rangers (.545 SOS) and Colorado Rockies (.534 SOS), while ranking ahead of San Diego (.529 SOS) and New York-NL (.528 SOS).

ABOUT LEAKE...

- Michael Raymond Leake.
30-year-old right-hander is making his 19th start of the season, 24th Mariners start, 257th career appearance (252nd career start) and 6th career start vs. Los Angeles-AL tonight.
A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University... went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning Baseball America First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft... did not sign.
Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
Is 18-16 with a 4.01 ERA (109 ER, 244.2 IP) in 41 career games (all starts) in July.

LAST OUTING...L#5 in his last start, a 4-7 Mariners loss vs. Los Angeles-AL on July 4 that snapped an 8-game winning streak for the Mariners...allowed 4 runs (3 earned) on 9 hits and 1 walk while striking out 4 across 4.0 innings pitched...marked 1st loss since June 17 vs. BOS; is now 5-2 over his last 7 decisions.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...7 of his last 9 starts (5/22-c) have been quality starts, including 3 outings of 8.0 innings while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs...his 42.0 innings pitched in June were tied with Jacob deGrom-NYM for most in the Majors...among ML starters, only James Paxton (43.0 IP in May) has tossed more innings in a single calendar month this season.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...his 3 starts this season of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 2-or-fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN, 6/7 at TB and 6/23 at BOS) are T1st in the Majors (8 others)...his 7 games with 7.0-or-more innings pitched are T6th-most among Major League starters.

GETTING LOOSE...through Leake's first 30 pitches in a game, opponents are batting .339 (38x112) with a .373 on-base percentage and a .464 slugging percentage, but in pitches 26 through 100+, Leake has limited batters to a .239 average (77x322) with a .287 OBP and a .435 slugging mark.

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE...has exited 13 of his 18 starts with a lead (10 games) or a tie score (3 games)...in 2 of his other 5 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, and 0-3 in the 6th inning...the Mariners are 13-5 in his 18 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE...since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 11-6 with a 3.76 ERA (60 ER, 143.2 IP) in 23 starts (14 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in wins, innings pitched and quality starts...in 11 of his 23 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 16-7 in Leake starts since his Mariners debut.

STAYING GROUNDED...is ranked 4th in the American League with a ground ball rate of 48.8%, trailing only Lance McCullers Jr. (55.8%), Dallas Keuchel (55.35), and Charlie Morton (49.8%).

TAKING HIS TURN...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 251 starts, T13th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 14th in innings pitched (1558.0).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in MLB made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber, 8, Chris Sale, 4, Carlos Martinez, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom, 4 and Carlos Carrasco, 4).

QUICK RISE...became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)...became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft...appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 91-82 with a 3.99 ERA (691 ER, 1558.0 IP) with 1,055 strikeouts and 367 walks in 256 career games (251 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP MARCO GONZALES (9-5, 3.64 ERA)

26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 19th start of the 2018 season tomorrow vs. Los Angeles-AL...W#8 was the 1st complete game of his career, a 4-1 Mariners win on 6/29 vs. KC (9.0,6,1,1,0,7)...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 12 of his last 14 starts (4/24-c), going 8-3 with a 2.91 ERA (29 ER, 89.2 IP) with 8 quality starts over that span... CAREER: Drafted by St. Louis with 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...made MLB debut with the Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado...is 14-8 with a 4.41 ERA (90 ER, 183.2 IP) with 158 strikeouts in 40 games (32 starts) in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...missed the 2016 season while recovering from ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow...vs. LAA: Is 1-0 with a 3.91 ERA (11 ER, 25.1 IP) in 5 career starts vs. the Angels...has faced the Angels 3 times this season, collecting a 4.24 ERA (8 ER, 17.0 IP) while striking out 21 batters.
