TRIPLE CROWN

Eugenio Suárez, hitting .291, is the only player in the National League with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...Bos' **J.D. Martinez** (.331, 40 HR, 121 RBI) is the only other player in the Major Leagues to match those numbers in the **Triple Crown** categories...Oak's **Khris Davis**, hitting .248, is the only other player in the majors with at least **31 HR** (41) and **100 RBI** (108).

HOTTEST CORNER

Eugenio Suárez (.291, 31 HR, 100 RBI) is the fourth player in franchise history to hit **30 HR** in a season while playing primarily third base (list below)...is the 18th Reds player to produce at least **30 HR** and **100 RBI** in a season...is trying to become the ninth Reds player to produce **30 HR** and **100 RBI** while hitting at least **.300**.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Dai Sugiura's Dodgers** and **Game 5** (2-2) of a 7-game homestand that included a **2-2 series split** vs the **Padres**...the Reds preceded this homestand with a **4-12 stretch** vs **National League Central** rivals that featured **13 games on the road** (1-2 at Mil, 0-4 at Chi, 1-2 vs Mil, 2-1 at StL, 0-3 at Pit)...following this series, the Redlegs head out for their final road trip (3g at Cubs, 3g at Mil, 4g at Mia) before finishing the 2018 championship season with a 5-game homestand vs the **Royals** (2g) and **Pirates** (3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Dodgers' **.615** winning percentage at **Great American Ball Park** (32-20) is the second-best by any National League team here (Mets, .627, 32-19)...the Reds swept the 4-game series in **May** at **Dodger Stadium**...in their **6 series** covering the **previous 3 seasons** (2015-2017), the Reds went **0-5-1 vs LAD** (1-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 2-2 at Cin, 0-3 at LA, 0-3 at Cin)...entering this season, Cin had lost **17 of 19 games vs LAD**...in May, the Reds produced their **first series win** vs LAD since **September 2013**, their first **series win** at **Dodger Stadium** since **June 2011** and their first **4-game sweep** of the Dodgers since **August 1976**...prior to that **May series win**, the Reds had gone **0-6-2** in the **previous 8 series vs LAD**...that winning **May series** snapped the Reds' **6-series losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium** (1-2 in 2012, 1-3 in 2013, 1-2 in 2014, 1-3 in 2015, 0-3 in 2016, 0-3 in 2017)...the Reds' **4-1 win** on **5/10** snapped their **8-game losing streak** to the Dodgers and their **9-game losing streak** at **Dodger Stadium**...**Reds vs Dodgers** information is on media guide **Page 322**.

POSTSEASON: Last night at Radiology Associates Field at Jackie Robinson Ballpark, Class A **Daytona** staged off elimination in the **Florida State League** playoffs with a 6-2 win vs **Fort Myers** in Game 3 of the best-of-5 championship series...Game 4 is tonight, also at **Daytona**.

JAPAN ALL-STAR SERIES: **3B Eugenio Suárez** has been named to Major League Baseball's roster for the upcoming **Japan All-Star Series** with **Nippon Professional Baseball**...the event includes 7 games across Japan from **November 8-15**...MLB's early roster also includes StL's **Yadier Molina**, Mil's **Christian Yelich**, Atl's **Ronald Acuña Jr.**, Phi's **Rhys Hoskins** & **Carlos Santana**, KC's **Whit Merrifield** and LAD's **Chris Taylor**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **58-68** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15** this year.

DOT, DOT, DOT... Celebrating birthdays this week are **Joey Votto** (35 today), **Matt Wisler** (26 Wednesday) and catching coordinator **Mike Stefanski** (49 Wednesday)...**Billy Hamilton** turned 28 yesterday...with Wed night's loss at Pit, coupled with the Cubs' win at Mil, the Reds were eliminated from **NL Central Division** contention...will be eliminated from **Wild Card** and playoff contention with their next loss or the Cardinals' next victory...last season the Redlegs were eliminated on **9/12** (Wild Card) and **9/14** (NL Central).

HURLING: The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4 position players** (**Cliff Pennington** on 4/12 vs StL; **Alex Blandino** on 7/11 at Cle; **Dilson Herrera** on 8/8 at NYM; **Brandon Dixon** on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and **7 rookies** (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Kevin Shackelford, RHP Keury Mella, RHP Jesús Reyes).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went **16-26-3** in their **45 completed series**, including **11-10-2** in the **last 23 completed series** beginning **6/19**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds have gone **5-1-2** in their last 8 series vs **teams in first place** when those series began (15-13, .536, **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Phi**, **2-1 vs Ari**, **0-3 vs Cle** and **0-4 at Chi**)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss** at **Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...the Reds had the best record in the NL Central in **June** (15-11, .577).

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits, batting average** (.285) and **on-base percentage** (.359)...All-Star **1B Joey Votto** leads the NL in on-base percentage...All-Star **2B Scooter Gennett** leads the National League in 3-hit games while ranking second in hitting and multi-hit games

and third in hits...All-Star **3B Eugenio Suárez** is the only player in the National League with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...**SS José Peraza** ranks among the NL leaders in several statistical categories...he is the leader in most plate apps per strikeout (9.5).

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **11 grand slams**, a new single-season franchise record (9 slams, 2002) and 1 shy of the **National League record** (12 slams, 1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals)...the Major League record for grand slams in a season is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds' **11 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Joey Votto** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, pitcher **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit), **José Peraza** and **Scott Schebler**.

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Silver Slugger Award** and the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least 4 HR in a season **without starting a game**...he has **4 HR**, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...according to our friends @EliasSports, the franchise record for **HR as a pitcher** is 4 by converted outfielder **Hal Jeffcoat**, who hit 4 HR in **1957**, all as a pitcher...**Tom Parrott** hit 4 HR in **1894**, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman.

Tonight's Pitcher - #25 Cody Reed, LHP

RED HOTS

Cody Reed on 4/15 turned **25 years old** but already is in his **third Major League season**...tonight is making his 14th appearance and fourth start of the season... will make his first career appearance vs the **Dodgers**...is **0-1, 7.11** in 3 starts (12.2ip, 10er)...between his first 2 starts of this season, in his debut and then again **8/30 vs Mil**, made all 10 of his apps in relief (0-1, 2.31, 11.2ip, 10h, 3er, 3bb, 10k, 1hr)...is in his third stint of the season with the Reds...was added to the roster after the **Opening Day rainout** forced the Reds to add a fifth starter...was scheduled to start the Reds' fifth game of the season, on **4/3 vs Cubs**, but it, too, was rained out...instead, he threw a simulated game the next day in **Louisville**, then made his regular season debut in a start on **4/9 at Phi**...made 1 start and 3 relief apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 4/20, when **OF Scott Schebler** came off the disabled list...was 2-6, 4.57 in 12 starts for the Bats when he was recalled on 7/4, the day after the Reds' 12-inning, 12-8 loss vs WSox...spent 7/4 on Cin's roster without pitching and was returned to Louisville the next day...was promoted again on **8/13**, when **RHP Keury Mella** (KAY-oo-ree MAY-uh) was optioned to Louisville...in **spring training** made 1 start and 5 relief apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 3/25, the day the Reds left Goodyear.

- Is 1 of only 6 players in the Major Leagues with three 10-game hitting streaks (13g, 13g, 10g), joining Atl's Nick Markakis (12g, 11g, 11g) and Freddie Freeman (16g, 10g, 14g), Hou's Yuli Gurriel (11g, 12g, 13g) and Alex Bregman (12g, 10g, 11g) and KC's Whit Merrifield (12g, 12g, 12g)...Suárez' career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10) are the longest by any Reds batter this season.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf Homestand: 1g as PH, 1g at 2B, 1g at 3B, 1-3, 1r

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- In the 5-1 loss on 9/3 at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, Gabriel Guerrero).
- On 9/1 was promoted from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS...for the Reds has played 2B, 3B and SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in the IL in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
- Never has been invited to Major League spring training camp, but for the Reds over the last 3 Cactus League seasons appeared in 13 games (429 in 2016), 8 games (.333 in 2017) and 5 games (0-for-6 in 2018).

- Today is celebrating his 35th birthday...5 times on his birthday produced at least 2 hits.
- In 68 career apps vs LAD has hit .336 (83-247, 14hr, 50rbi, .583slg, .421obp).
- Has homered in back-to-back apps for the first time since his 4-game homer streak from 4/24-4/27 fell 1 shy of the club record...Sat's grand slam vs SD was his first home run since 7/9 at Cle, snapping a 36-game homerless streak that did not include his HR in the All-Star Game...was the second-longest single-season homerless stretch of his career (40g, 6/25-10/3, 2012).
- Reached base safely in each of his last 10 apps (10-33, .303, 1 2b, 2hr, 9rbi, .455obp).
- In 11 apps since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on 8/30 is hitting .265 (10-38, 1 2b, 2hr, 9rbi, .408obp)...had been on the 10-day disabled list since 8/17 with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of Homestand: 2g as PH, 1gs as CF, 2-6, 1hr, 1rbi

- In his last 18 apps beginning 8/18 is hitting .342 (13-38, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 2rbi, .526slg, .390obp), raising his season BA from .267.
- In the seventh inning of Thu's 6-2 loss vs SD hit his first career pinch-hit HR (solo off Trey Wingenter).
