TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Giants continue a three-game set tonight with the fifth meeting between the teams this season...The Giants swept a three-game set at SunTrust Park earlier this season, May 4-6 before the Braves took last night's series opener.

A The Braves have not won a series in San Francisco since sweeping a three-game set, April 22-24, 2011...They are 0-4-2 in series play at AT&T Park over this stretch.

A Entering this series, the Braves were 8-13 in San Francisco since that sweep, and were outscored 104-70.

A RHP Mike Foltynewicz allowed six runs, earned, and nine hits over 5.0 innings in losing to San Francisco, 9-4, earlier this season on May 4 at SunTrust Park...Over his last two starts against the Giants, the righty is 0-2 with a 11.00 ERA (11 ER/9.0 IP)...Overall, Foltynewicz is 2-3 with a 5.35 ERA (21 ER/35.1 IP) in six games, all starts, against the Giants.

A LHP Andrew Suarez beat the Braves earlier this season in his first career appearance against Atlanta...The native of Miami, Fla., tossed 5.1 innings and allowed seven hits and one unearned run in the 4-3 win...He enters tonight's start with a 17.0-inning scoreless streak at home, dating to the third inning on August 9 vs. Pittsburgh.

WINS: The Braves collected their 80th victory of the season last night and with one more win will ensure they do not finish with a losing record for the first time since going 96-66 and winning the N.L. East in 2013.

A The Braves also went ahead in the seventh inning, the first time they did not need their last turn at-bat to win a game since shutting out Miami, 4-0, at Marlins Park on August 26...Prior to last night, each of the Braves' last six wins came in their last at-bat...That marked the team's longest such stretch since another six-game run from July 20-July 28, 1995 and tied for the longest such stretch by a team in baseball this season.

A Yesterday's win dropped Atlanta's magic number to clinch the National League East to 15...They are a season-high 5.0 games up in the East with 18 games yet to play.

200 STRIKEOUTS: RHP Mike Foltynewicz enters tonight's start with 179 strikeouts, 21 away from becoming the first Braves pitcher with 200 in a season since RHP Javier Vazquez fanned 238 in 2009...Foltynewicz is averaging 6.63 strikeouts per start this season.

A Since the club moved to Atlanta in 1966, only five different pitchers have reached 200 strikeouts in a season: John Smoltz (five times), Phil Niekro (three times), Vazquez (once), Kevin Millwood (once), Greg Maddux (once).

VS. THE N.L. WEST: Last night's victory clinched a winning road trip for the Braves after they took three-of-four in Arizona...The last time the Braves had a winning road trip that included multiple National League West teams was 2012, when the club went 5-2 on a seven-game swing to Arizona and Los Angeles, April 19-25... They won three of four against the Diamondbacks, before taking two games at Dodgers Stadium.

A Prior to the start of this trip, the Braves went 29-64 (.312) on the road against the National League West, dating to the start of 2013...They are now 8-6 this season and can finish with a winning record in West division parks for the first time since going 11-6 in 2012.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves are 43-30 (.589) away from SunTrust Park this season, which is the best road record in the National League and the fourth best in baseball.

A The 43 road wins are the most since the 2012 club went 46-35 away from Turner Field.

DOUBLES: 1B Freddie Freeman collected his 38th double of the season in the first inning, while 2B Ozzie Albies added his 36th two-base hit of the year in the seventh inning...OF Nick Markakis is tied for the league lead with 40 doubles.

A In franchise history, the Braves have only had one pair of teammates both reach 40 doubles in a season...Jeff Francoeur (40) and Chipper Jones (42) accomplished the feat in 2007.

A The last time a team had three or more players reach 40 doubles in a season was 2011, when Kansas City had four players (Billy Butler, Melky Cabrera, Jeff Francoeur, and Alex Gordon) and Boston had three players (Jacoby Ellsbury, Adrián González, and David Ortiz) reach the mark...The last time a National League team accomplished the feat was 2006, when Garret Atkins, Todd Helton and Matt Holliday all reached 40 doubles for the Colorado Rockies.

A The Braves lead the National League with 284 two-base hits this season...The next closest N.L. team is the Chicago Cubs with 257.

A The franchise team record for doubles in a season is 328, held by the 2007 club...The Braves are on pace for 320 this season.

LATE-INNING RUNS: The Braves scored three times following the sixth inning yesterday and now have a National League-high 242 runs in these late innings.

A They led the National League with 275 such runs last season.

RETIRED: The Braves retired the final 20 Giants in order yesterday...Starter Sean Newcomb set down 11 straight following a third-inning single from Austin Slater, before RHP Shane Carles, LHP Jonny Venters and LHP A.J. Minter all tossed a perfect inning in relief.

Tonight's Game

- A Set to make his 28th start of the season and the 93rd of his career...Is his 113th career appearance.
- A Tonight's start will be his 28th of the season, tying his career high set last season... Has already set career highs in innings (157.0), complete games (1), walks (60), and strikeouts (179) in 2018, his fifth major league campaign.
- A His 10 wins are tied for his career high, also set last year.
- A Atlanta has lost each of his last four starts, despite Foltyniewicz pitching to a 2.16 ERA (6 ER/25.0 IP) in that span...Allowed two hits and one run over 6.0 innings in his last start, 9/5 vs. Boston, before Atlanta lost 9-8.
- A Foltyniewicz has 10 starts this season in which he allowed two earned runs or fewer in a game Atlanta lost...Only Jacob deGrom and Ryne Stanek, both with 12 such starts, have more in the majors.
- A Atlanta is 12-15 as a team in Foltyniewicz's 27 starts this season...He ranks fourth in the N.L. and eighth in the majors with a 2.75 ERA.
- A Makes his seventh career start against San Francisco, and his second this season... Has pitched to a 5.35 ERA (21 ER/35.1 IP) over his first six turns.
- A Faced them on 5/4 at SunTrust Park, and allowed a season-most six runs and a season high-tying nine hits over 5.0 innings.
- A Is 5-10 with a 5.08 ERA in 25 career games, including 23 starts, against the N.L. West...It is his highest ERA against any one division in the majors.

2018 Recap

- A Made six starts in August, and went 3-2 with a 2.09 ERA (9 ER/38.2 IP) and 41 strikeouts.
- A His run last month followed five starts in July during which he went 2-3 with a 5.72 ERA (18 ER/28.1 IP).
- A Faced the Cubs, 8/30, and allowed five runs (four earned) over 6.0 frames to take the loss...Was his second start against Chicao at SunTrust Park this season.
- A Became the first Atlanta pitcher to make two starts against the Cubs at his home park in a single season since Greg Maddux did so in 1998.
- A Made his eighth career appearance against Colorado, 8/18, and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings...Did not earn the win after the Rockies won, 5-3, in 10 innings.
- A All eight of his appearances against Colorado have come with Atlanta, and the Braves are 0-8 in those games...Atlanta has been outscored 49-17.
- A Stopped a two-game losing streak with a win, 8/2 at NYM...Allowed five hits and two runs over 6.0 innings...Struck out five.
- A The two-game skid was his first time losing consecutive starts since dropping each of his final seven starts of 2017.
- A Was selected to his first major league All-Star Game after going 7-5 with a 2.66 ERA (30 ER/101.2 IP) over 18 games to open the season...Fanned 120 batters over 101.2 innings of work.
- A Tossed a scoreless fourth inning in his All-Star Game debut, retiring José Ramírez, Manny Machado and José Abreu, while walking Aaron Judge.
- A His 120 strikeouts before the All-Star break are tied for sixth most in Atlanta franchise history...John Smoltz fanned 149 batters in 134.0 innings before the break in 1996 to set the Atlanta franchise mark.
- A Held the Cardinals scoreless over 5.0 innings, 7/1 at STL...Allowed just one hit and fanned nine.
- A The start was his 11th of the season allowing one run or fewer, and those 11 starts came in his first 17 turns on the season...The Atlanta franchise record for starts allowing no more than one run is 19, set by Greg Maddux over 34 starts in 2002.
- A Reinstated from the 10-day disabled list, 6/25, and started vs. Cincinnati...Allowed one hit and one run over 5.0 innings...Missed seven games with right triceps tightness.
- A Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings, 6/12 vs. NYM, allowing just two hits while fanning six.
- A Threw a season-low 73 pitches before exiting the game with right triceps tightness...Was placed on the 10-day disabled list, 6/16.
- A Threw the first shutout of his major league career, 6/1 vs. Washington...Allowed just two hits and struck out 11.

- Recalled, 9/8, from Triple-A Gwinnett and earned his first professional win that night in Arizona...Retired the only batter he faced and stranded two inherited runners in the bottom of the ninth.
- Has fanned 13 batters over 9.0 innings in eight appearances with Atlanta...Had his contract selected, 8/10, from Triple-A Gwinnett and made his major league debut that night vs. MIL.
- Fanned 77 batters in 57.2 minor league innings...His 12.0 SO/9.0 IP is highest among all Braves farmhands with at least 50.0 innings pitched.

- Has allowed three runs over 19 games (15.1 IP) since Atlanta acquired him on 7/26...Has a 1.76 ERA with the Braves.
- In 40 relief appearances this season, is 4-0 with two saves and a 1.24 ERA (4 ER/29.0 IP)...Allowed five runs in 0.1 inning in his only start, 6/6 at WSH.
- Earned the win in back-to-back appearances, 9/1 and 9/2 vs. PIT...Won consecutive games just once previously in his career, 5/1 vs. STL and 5/5 vs. MIL in 2011, also with Atlanta.
- Earned his first save with Atlanta with a scoreless ninth inning on 8/21 at PIT...The save came exactly seven years to the day since he recorded his last save as a Brave in 2011.
- Atlanta acquired him from the Tampa Bay Rays, 7/26, in exchange for an international signing slot...Rejoined the Braves after spending three seasons in Atlanta, 2010-2012.

- Allowed three runs over 1.0 inming in his first relief appearance, 9/3 vs. BOS...In three relief outings between Atlanta and Gwinnett, has an 18.00 ERA (6 ER/3.0 IP)...Has a 3.15 ERA (45 ER/128.2 IP) in 24 starts.
- Recalled, 9/1, from Triple-A Gwinnett for his second stint on the active roster.
- Is the youngest pitcher in the majors, and was the eighth-youngest Braves pitcher to start his debut since 1908.
- Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in his major league debut, 8/20 at PIT, to beat the Pirates 1-0...Became the youngest pitcher in major league history to win his debut 1-0.

Dan Winkler • RHP • 6-3 • 210 • 28 yrs • #58

Saves/Opp: 2/5 **Holds:** 22 **1st Batter/Retired:** 64/44 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 30/9

- Allowed runs in back-to-back appearances after snapping a 14-appearance scoreless streak and allowing a career high-tying four runs, 9/5 vs. BOS, while not retiring a batter...Prior to the outing, had allowed one total run in his last 18 outings (16.1 innings) for a 0.55 ERA with 18 strikeouts.
- His 22 holds are a team high...Is 22-for-25 in hold chances...Is the second rookie in Atlanta-franchise history to reach 20 holds in a season, joining teammate Jonny Venters who did so in 2011 (24 holds).
- Earned his second career save 8/20 at PIT... Is 2-for-4 in save opportunities this season.
