Mike Leake was selected 8th overall by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2008 MLB Draft...he compiled a record of 62-47 with a 3.87 ERA (442 ER, 1028.1 IP) over parts of 6 seasons with the Reds (2010-15).

Ichiro Suzuki has appeared in 12 seasons with Seattle (2001-12), tied with Dan Wilson for 5th-most in club history...trails Edgar Martinez (18), Jay Buhner (14), Ken Griffey Jr. (13) and Félix Hernández (13).

Ichiro Suzuki is the most senior player in camp with 17 years of ML service.

When he appears in a regular season game, Ichiro Suzuki will become the 42nd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Erasmó Ramírez (2012-14, 2017-c) is the only active Mariner who has spent two stints with the club.

THE ROSTER

The spring roster is currently at 52 players (36 roster, 16 non-roster)...the camp breakdown by position is the following: 24 pitchers (6 non-roster), 4 catchers (1 non-roster), 11 infielders (3 non-roster) and 13 outfielders (6 non-roster).

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 42nd spring training with a Cactus League match-up today against the Cincinnati Reds at Peoria Stadium...today's game is the 17th of a 32-game Cactus League schedule for the Mariners that concludes March 27 vs. the Colorado Rockies at Salt River Fields...the Mariners will open the 2018 season March 29 vs. Cleveland at Safeco Field.

NEW FACES...Ichiro Suzuki is slated to make his 2018 Cactus League debut today vs. the Reds in Peoria, batting leadoff and playing left field...Suzuki was signed by the Mariners on Wednesday...he will become the 4th Mariners player on the 40-man roster to make their Cactus League debut in the last 9 days, joining Guillermo Heredia (3/2 at MIL), David Phelps (3/3 vs. LAA) and Mitch Haniger (3/10 at CIN).

THROWING GAS...Dan Altavilla tossed 1.0 scoreless inning last night, retiring the Reds in order...overall, this spring he has struck out 8 without walking a batter while allowing only 1 hit in 5.0 scoreless innings...he has retired 15 of 16 batters faced this spring.

BRINGING VOGELBACH...Daniel Vogelbach has reached base safely in 7 of his last 9 plate appearances, dating back to the 4th inning on March 7 vs. Oakland...he is 5-for-7 with 4 doubles, 1 home run and 2 walks during that span...Vogelbach went 3-for-4 with 1 run, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 1 RBI on Friday at San Francisco and is now batting .500 (10x20) with 4 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 4 RBI and 6 walks in 9 games this spring...among Spring Training leaders, his 5 doubles are T2nd-most (also: 7 others), trailing only Boston's Blake Swihart (7).

FIRST THINGS FIRST...Ichiro Suzuki has made 1,822 career starts batting leadoff, 5th-most in Major League history, behind Rickey Henderson (2,875), Pete Rose (2,300), Lou Brock (1,893) and Brett Butler (1,845)...since 2012, Ichiro has made 102 starts batting leadoff over the last 6 seasons.

PIÑEIRO JOINS CAMP...former Mariners right-hander Joel Piñeiro has arrived in camp to serve as a guest instructor for the next week...Piñeiro earned the win in his Major League debut with the Mariners on Aug. 8, 2000 at Chicago-AL, tossing 6.0 innings while allowing 2 runs and striking out 4...he is one of 13 pitchers in Mariners history to start in his MLB debut and earn the win...Piñeiro appeared in parts of 12 Major League seasons with the Mariners (2000-06), Red Sox (2007), Cardinals (2007-09) and Angels (2010-11).

VS. THE REDS...the Mariners and Reds meet today in the finale of two Cactus League match-ups this spring...Seattle won the first meeting last night, 5-2, in Goodyear...the Mariners went 2-0 against the Reds during Cactus League play last season...Seattle is 13-2 in the all-time regular season series between the two clubs...the Mariners and Reds will not meet during the 2018 regular season.

WELCOME BACK, ICHIRO...the Mariners agreed to terms with free agent outfielder Ichiro Suzuki on Wednesday...Ichiro is the active Major League hits leader, ranking 22nd all-time in MLB history with 3,080 career hits...after amassing 1,278 hits during a 9-year career (1992-2000) with the Orix Blue Wave, Ichiro has totaled 4,358 between MLB and Japan...Ichiro has appeared in 17 Major League seasons with Seattle (2001-12), New York-AL (2012-14) and Miami (2015-17).

THE SECOND HALF...today's game marks the beginning of the second half of the Mariners 32-game Cactus League schedule...including today's game, Seattle will play 16 games in 17 days before opening the 2018 regular season on Thursday, March 29 vs. the Cleveland Indians at Safeco Field...of the Mariners remaining 16 Cactus League games, 9 will be played in Peoria (8 home games, 1 "road" game vs. San Diego), 9 will be played during the day, and 9 will be played against American League opponents, including 6 vs. AL West foes.

ON THE AIR...today's telecast on ROOT SPORTS NW will feature in-game interviews with 1st base coach Chris Prieto, outfielder Mitch Haniger, infielder Taylor Motter and infielder Daniel Vogelbach...Aaron Goldsmith and Mike Blowers will call the action on TV today.

GAME TIME CHANGE...the Mariners Cactus League finale, March 27 at Colorado, will now start at 12:10 p.m....it was originally slated for a 1:10 p.m. first pitch.

PLAY-BY-PLAY...all radio broadcasts, including today's game vs. the Reds, can be heard live on Mariners.com...today's broadcast will also be aired live on 710 ESPN Seattle at 1:00 p.m. PT.

HEY AARON, AS YOU MAY KNOW...Mike Marjama hit a three-run, inside-the-park home run last night vs. the Reds in Goodyear...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that there have been 25 inside-the-park home runs during the regular season in Mariners club history (last: Willie Bloomquist, 6/15/07 at HOU)?...Ruppert Jones is the Mariners all-time leader with 3 inside-the-park home runs, while Julio Cruz, Ken Griffey Jr., Dave Henderson, Alex Rodriguez and Dan Wilson each have 2.

2018 Spring Training - 0-1, 3.00 ERA in 3 GS...allowed 1 H in 2.0 ShO IP in Cactus League debut on 3/24 vs. CWS...allowed only 4 hits and struck out 4 over 3.0 scoreless innings on 3/1 vs. KC...L#1 on 3/6 vs. COL (4.0,5,3,3,0,2,HR).

- **Last Season** - Went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts in 31 starts with St. Louis (26 GS) and Seattle (5 GS).
- **Seattle Finish** - In 5 starts with the Mariners, posted a record of 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts.
- **The Trade** - Acquired with cash and international slot money from St. Louis in exchange for Rayder Ascanio (inf) on Aug. 30, 2017.
- **An Even 30** - Recorded his 6th consecutive season with 30+ starts...he's one of four pitchers who have recorded 30+ starts in the last 6 seasons, joining Max Scherzer, Jon Lester and Ian Kennedy.
- **Grounded** - Ranked 4th in MLB with a ground ball rate of 54.3%, trailing only Toronto's Marcus Stroman (62.9%) and San Diego's Luis Perdomo (62.0) and Clayton Richard (60.2%).
- **Workhorse** - Tossed 186.0 innings, his 4th season of 185.0+ innings (also: 2014 - 214.1 IP, 2013 - 192.1 and 2015 - 192.0).
- **Taking His Turn** - Since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 233 starts, 16th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 16th in innings pitched (1446.1).
- **Career** - Has appeared in parts of 8 Major League seasons with the Reds (2010-15), Giants (2015), Cardinals (2016-17) and Mariners (2017-c)...selected and signed by the Reds in the 1st round (8th overall) of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Arizona State University.
