## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 10-8 vs. Dodgers this season and 6-3 at home, their 11th season with a winning/tied record (2017: 6-3, 2016: 5-5, 2012: 6-3, 2008: 5-4, 2006: 6-3, 2005: 5-4, 2003: 5-5, 2001: 5-5, 2000: 5-1, 1999: 5-2).
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is 7 strikeouts shy of his sixth career season of 200.0+ IP/200+ SO, as well as his fourth in the last 5 seasons (2014-15, '17-18)...his 6 seasons would be tied with Max Scherzer and Felix Hernández for second most in the Majors since 2004, trailing only Justin Verlander (8).

- ♦ The D-backs defeated the Dodgers, 4-3, on **Eduardo Escobar's** first career walk-off home run...it was his fourth career walk-off hit and his first since Aug. 11, 2015 vs. Rangers as a member of the Twins (double).
- ♦ **David Peralta** went 1-for-3 with a double and 2 RBI...**A.J. Pollock** was 2-for-4.
- ♦ **Matt Koch** (ND) allowed 1 run in 4.1 innings.

## GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Is a 5-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17-18), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995.

## WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Ninth 30-plus start season and eighth career 200.0+ inning campaign.
- ◆ His 193 strikeouts are 7 shy of 200...has 6 career 200-strikeout seasons (2009 with KC; 2011 with MIL; 2012 with MIL/LAD; 2014-15 with LAD; 2017 with ARI).
- ◆ In his last 7 home games (6 quality), is 2-1 with a 2.63 ERA (14 ER in 48.0 IP), .195 opp. average, 0.85 WHIP and 59 strikeouts (11.06 K/9.0 IP).
- ◆ In 5 home starts (5 quality) vs. Dodgers since 2016, is 3-2 with a 2.56 ERA (9 ER in 31.2 IP), .200 opp. average and 34 strikeouts.

## LAST START

- ◆ Had a quality start (3 ER in 7.1 IP) in a 6-2 loss vs. Rockies on Sept. 21.

## VS. DODGERS

- ◆ Owns a 6-5 record with a 3.83 ERA (37 ER in 87.0 IP) in 14 career starts (10 quality).
- ◆ Has allowed 2 or fewer earned runs in 8 of his 14 starts vs. Dodgers, and 3 or fewer in 11.

## ZACK ATTACKS THE NL WEST

- ◆ Is 48-19 (.716) all-time vs. NL West, the highest winning pct. all-time within the division (min. 50 GS) ahead of Clayton Kershaw (.709, 78-32), Tommy John (.706, 48-20), Kevin Millwood (.694, 34-15) and Kevin Brown (.684, 39-18).

## 30 GS/200 K/200.0 IP

- ◆ Is looking to become the first D-back pitcher (fourth overall) since Dan Haren (2008-09) with at least 30 starts, 200 strikeouts and 200.0 innings in back-to-back seasons.

## PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year at Apopka (Fla.) High School...played shortstop...transitioned to pitcher as a senior.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University.

## ON THE LEADERBOARD

- ◆ Ranks among NL leaders in walks per 9.0 IP (2nd, 1.83), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5th, 4.71), innings (4th, 201.2), WHIP (T-4th, 1.06), wins (T-6th, 14), strikeouts (T-6th, 193) and ERA (9th, 3.21).
- ◆ His 4.1 Pitching WAR is tied for eighth in the Majors with Zack Wheeler/NYM (Patrick Corbin is sixth at 4.4; leader is Aaron Nola/PHI at 9.8) [source: Baseball-Reference.com].
- ◆ His .206 opponent average with runners on base is sixth in the NL.

## SLOW ROLLER

- ◆ Leads MLB with 37 stikeouts on pitches 70 mph or slower, ahead of James Shield/CWS (21).

## CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ His 2,429 career strikeouts rank 44th all-time, 12 shy of Jamie Moyer (43rd; 2,441).
- ◆ His 2,429 career strikeouts are sixth among active pitchers behind CC Sabathia (2,981), Justin Verlander (2,696), Bartolo Colón (2,535), Felix Hernandez (2,463) and Max Scherzer (2,449).

## THE CHASE IS ON

- ◆ Ranks fifth among NL starters with a 34.9 chase pct. (swings at pitches outside the zone) behind Jacob deGrom/NYM (37.9), Patrick Corbin/ARI (37.7), Miles Mikolas/STL (36.6) and Max Scherzer/WSH (35.8).

## DEFENSE RULES

- ◆ Has 83 straight games errorless games (146 TC) since May 12, 2016, 1 of 13 active error-free pitchers during that span (min. 40 GS, 30 TC).
