SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (19-17) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (20-15) Wednesday, May 9, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 36; Home 19 RHP Nick Pivetta (1-2, 4.76) vs RHP Chris Stratton (3-2, 3.99)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the San Francisco Giants, 4-2, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Aaron Nola (W, 5-1) turned in one of, if not the best, starts of his young career ... Nola went 7.0 innings and allowed 1 run on 5 hits with 12 strikeouts and 0 walks ... Nola found himself in a bit of trouble in the 2nd inning as the Giants had runners on 2nd and 3rd with no outs ... Nola worked his way out of trouble allowing only one run to score, and from there, he was off to the races ... At one point he recorded nine consecutive outs via strikeout ... Aaron Altherr, Jorge Alfaro and Carlos Santana all homered for the Phils.
- RAGING BULL:** Odubel Herrera has now reached base safely in a career-best 37 straight games (since 9/27/17), posting a .350/.403/.531 slash line over 159 plate appearances during the streak ... Herrera, who has reached base safely in each of his 33 games to start the season, has the longest on-base streak to begin a season by a major league player since Matt Holliday began the 2015 season reaching base in 45 straight (*Elias*) ... **Overall, Herrera's 37-game on-base streak is the longest active streak in baseball and the 10th-longest in Phillies franchise history.** ... If he reaches safely tonight, he'll tie Jimmy Rollins (2005-06) and Scott Rolen (1998-1999) for the eighth-longest streak in club history.

- NON-DIVISION DOMINANCE:** The Phillies have gone 7-13 against the National League East this season, but are a combined 13-2 against all other teams (7-0 vs NL Central, 3-2 vs NL West, 3-0 vs AL East) ... Philadelphia's .867 winning percentage outside of their own division is the 2nd-best mark in the majors, trailing only the Yankees, who have gone 15-2 (.882 win %) outside of the American League East (8-0 vs AL Central, 6-1 vs AL West, 1-1 vs NL East).
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 24-10 in their last 34 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12-current) and their .706 win percentage over that stretch ranks 3rd in the majors behind the Yankees (.765) and Cubs (.720) ... This season, the Phillies own the best home record in the National League at 13-5 (.722 win %) trailing only the Yankees (15-5, .750) and Red Sox (11-4, .733) for the major league lead ... Philadelphia has a +38 run differential at home, 2nd among all big league clubs behind only the Yankees (+52) ... Offensively, among all NL clubs, the Phils lead the league in runs at home (97) and SLG (.434) and are T-1st in home runs (25) ... Individually, Odubel Herrera leads all NL hitters with a .406 batting average at home and Maikel Franco ranks 6th with a .327 mark.
- STAFF NOTES:** The Phillies rotation has allowed 1 ER or none in six of their last seven starts (since 5/1), posting a combined 2.31 ERA (10 ER, 39.0 IP) in that span.
- SAPS MY STRENGTH:** Through 35 games, the Phillies have held opposing hitters to a .232/.309/.358 slash line, having allowed a total of 82 extra-base hits, the second-fewest of any ML team (least: STL, 76) and 29 home runs, tied for the second-fewest ... Furthermore, the Phillies bullpen has allowed 10 home runs this season, three of which came on Opening Day in Atlanta on March 29 ... Since March 30, they have combined to allow just 25 extra-base hits, the second-lowest total of any major league bullpen behind only the Cubs (22 XBH).
- THEY MIGHT BE GIANTS:** The Phillies and Giants square off for the first time this year, with Philadelphia going 2-0-1 in the last three series matchups ... Philadelphia has won seven of their last nine games at home against San Francisco (since 6/7/15) after going just 3-11 against them at Citizens Bank Park from July 27, 2011-June 6, 2015 ... The Phillies have won each of their last four games against the Giants (8/19/17-current), which marks their longest win streak against San Francisco since a five-game streak, August 23, 2005-May 7, 2006.
- ENTER STRANDMAN:** The Phillies bullpen has successfully stranded 33 of their last 37 inherited runners (4/9-current) and their 89.2% strand rate is easily tops in the majors over that stretch (next: SF, 33-39, 84.6 %) ... Overall this season, the Phils pen has stranded 40 of the 52 runners they have inherited and their 76.9% strand rate ranks 4th among all major league bullpens (best: LAA, 80.9 %) ... Individually, **Luis Garcia** has stranded all 12 runners he has inherited.
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** After getting off to a 1-4 start, the Phillies have gone 19-11 in their last 30 games (4/5-current) and their .633 winning percentage over that span is fourth-best among any major league team (best: NYY, .724).
- TRUST THE PROCESS:** The Phillies have seen a total of 5,505 pitches over 1,341 plate appearances this season and their 4.11 pitches per plate appearance lead the majors (next: LAD, 4.06) ... The Phils have four who rank inside the top 18 in pitches per plate appearance among qualified players in the National League: **Rhys Hoskins** (3rd, 4.47), **Cesar Hernandez** (4th, 4.44), **Carlos Santana** (13th, 4.18), **Scott Kingery** (18th, 4.13) ... Additionally, the Phillies have drawn 146 walks over those 1,341 plate appearances and their 10.9 % walk rate ranks 3rd in the majors, trailing the Nationals (11.5 %) and Yankees (11.0 %) ... The Phils completed the month of April with 110 walks which was tied for the third-most free passes in franchise history for the month of April (also 2003), trailing only the 2007 club (114 BB) and the 1996 team (129 BB).

LAST START: 5/4 at WSH: L, 1.0 IP, 5 H, 6 R, 6 ER, 3 BB, SO, 2 HR ... Pivetta vs Gonzalez ... Trailing 7-0, the Phils battled back and made it a game as Carlos Santana and Maikel Franco went back-to-back with 400-plus foot home runs in the 6th inning ... The Phillies bullpen kept them in it all night with Drew Hutchison (5.0 IP, 1 ER) and Zac Curtis (2.0 IP) making appearances in relief of Pivetta.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Last 10: Is 4-2, 3.53 ERA (20 ER, 51.0 IP) with 54 SO in his last 10 starts since 9/18/17** ... 3 of those starts have been scoreless and he has allowed 5 or fewer hits in all but one of them
- Strike First: Has thrown a first pitch strike to 70.3 % of the batters he has faced this season, the best percentage among all NL starters with at least 30.0 IP, and 2nd-best in MLB (Masahiro Tanaka, 70.5%)** ... In 2017 threw a first pitch strike to 51.9 % of batters, 79th of 105 pitchers to throw at least 130.0 IP
- Left Loose:** Lefties (.339) are batting 130 points higher against Pivetta than righties (.209) ... He has allowed 3 HR and 7 BB to RHH and 1 HR and 3 BB to LHH ... Among the 95 ML pitchers to face at least 50 LHH this season, Pivetta's .339 OPP AVG is 8th-highest
- Walk Talk:** Walked 3 batters in the 1.0 inning he pitched in his last start after walking only 7 in his other 33.0 IP in 2018
- Learning Curve:** Has thrown his curveball 25.34 % of the time in 2018, after throwing it 12.83 % of the time in 2017
- Darts:** Is averaging 94.4 mph on his fastball, 23rd-fastest among 198 pitchers to make a start in 2018
- vs NL West:** 1-4, 7.62 ERA (24 ER, 28.1 IP) in 6 starts

- 2018:** 1-1, 3.00 ERA (8 ER, 24.0) in 4 starts
- Career:** 5-4, 4.70 ERA (46 ER, 88.0 IP) in 16 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillie to do so since Mark Leiter Jr. accomplished the feat in relief, 8/5/17 vs COL and the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

2017 SEASON:

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts
- Had the most starts (26) in a single season by a Phillies rookie since 1990, when Pat Combs started 31
- Among all NL pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 4th in lowest % of pitches put in play (15.7), trailing ARI's Robbie Ray (13.7), WSH's Max Scherzer (14.3) and LAD's Rich Hill (14.7)
- Struck out a career-high 11 batters 8/16 at SD, which was the most by a Phillies rookie since Cole Hamels struck out 11 on 9/16/06 at HOU and the most by any Phillie since Vince Velasquez's 16-SO game on 4/14/16 vs SD ... Since at least 1913, Pivetta is the only Phillie to finish a start with at least 11 SO in 5.0 or fewer IP
- Allowed 1 hit in 7.0 IP on 7/2 at NYM, becoming the first Phillies rookie with just 1 hit allowed in 7.0+ IP since 8/23/01 (Brandon Duckworth)
- Recalled for the first time on 4/30 and made his ML debut that day at LAD as the starting pitcher (first of 4 stints with the Phillies)

CAREER:

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
