The 19 hits are tied for the most the club has had in Atlanta since 2007, when that team finished with 22 twice: June 27 and August 2.

The Atlanta franchise overall record for hits in a game is 25, done on May 1, 1985 at Cincinnati.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Braves and Marlins finish a three-game series tonight with the 12th meeting between the clubs this season...The teams split a two-game series in Miami last week, July 23-24...Miami will return to Atlanta for one final time this season, August 13-15.

**A** The Braves took the first two games of this series and have won 11 of their last 14 games against the Marlins in Atlanta, including rallying from a five-run, ninth-inning deficit for a 10-9 Braves win on May 20 in the teams' last series here.

**A** The Braves are looking for their first sweep of Miami in Atlanta since 2012, when they took three games, September 25-27...They last swept Miami, August 30-September 1 of 2016 at Marlins Park.

**A** RHP Aníbal Sánchez is set for his first start against his former team since 2016...The right-hander, who appeared in 133 games for the Marlins from 2006-2012, is 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) in two starts against Miami.

**A** RHP Pablo López is set for his first career appearance against the Braves...The 6-foot-3, 200-pound right-hander won his last road start, beating Tampa Bay with 6.0 innings of one-run ball.

**ROSTER MOVE:** The Braves today recalled RHP Wes Parsons from Triple-A Gwinnett after optioning LHP Kolby Allard to the Stripers postgame last night.

**A** Parsons joins the team for the second time this season...The Braves selected his contract from Gwinnett on June 27 and optioned him back the same day after he did not appear in the game.

**A** His first appearance will be his major league debut.

**DEBUT:** LHP Kolby Allard earned the win last night in his major league debut...Allard, who was the youngest pitcher in the majors at 20 years, 352 days, became the youngest left-hander to win his debut for the Braves since Charlie Vaughan did so on September 3, 1966 at the age of 18 years, 332 days.

**A** Allard also singled in his first plate appearance, hitting the third pitch he saw to right field...He also later added a pair of sacrifice hits...He became the first Braves pitcher to get a hit in his first career at-bat (during his debut) since Joel De La Cruz also singled on June 29, 2016.

**TWO-OUT RUNS:** The Braves scored six times with two outs last night, and now have 202 such runs this season, the second most in the National League...Only Milwaukee has scored more with 206.

**A** The Braves also have a two-out slash line of .271/.440/.355, which leads the majors in all three categories.

**A** 1B Freddie Freeman (54 hits) and OF Nick Markakis (50) are first and second in the N.L. in two-out hits.

**VS. THE N.L. EAST:** The Braves improved to 31-16 (.660) against the National League East this season with last night's 11-6 win...The club has a +85 run differential against the division this season and have gone 11-2-3 in intradivision series play this season.

**A** Only Boston (.702) and Cleveland (.674) have better intradivision records.

**A** The Braves went 33-43 (.434) against their own division last season, including 11-8 against the Marlins.

**A** The Braves have not had a winning intradivision record since 2014, when they went 40-36...Over the three previous seasons, the club went 103-124 (.454) against the N.L. East.

**WINNING STREAK:** The Braves have won three straight games for the first time since a four-game run, June 29-July 2...Their season-best streak is a five-game run, April 28-May 3.

**ACUÑA JR. LEADING OFF:** OF Ronald Acuña Jr. finished 3-for-5 last night with his 11th home run of the season, and since moving to the leadoff spot on July 20 in Washington for the first game out of the All-Star break, the rookie is hitting .333 (13-for-39) with three doubles, four home runs, a .422 on-base percentage and a .718 slugging percentage (1.140 OPS).

**A** Acuña Jr.'s drive came in the first inning, and marked the fourth lead-off home run of the season for Atlanta...2B Ozzie Albies has three.

**A** The last Braves club with more than four lead-off homers in a season was the 2014 team, which had five...The Atlanta franchise record is seven, first set by the 1984 team...The 1996 and 2013 teams matched that mark.

**MULTIPLE HOMERS:** The Braves hit three home runs last night, tying their season-high total for SunTrust Park...They also hit three home runs on Opening Day, March 29 vs. Philadelphia.

**A** The Braves hit two home runs in the first game of this series, and have multiple homers in consecutive home games for just the second time this season...They hit two on June 3 vs. Washington and then again on June 12 vs. New York.

**FREEMAN VS. MIAMI:** 1B Freddie Freeman finished 3-for-5 last night and the first baseman is now hitting .467 (21-for-45) with six home runs, four walks, a .510 on-base percentage and a .889 slugging percentage (1.399 OPS) in 11 games against the Marlins this season.

**A** The last Braves player to hit more home runs against a single opponent in a season was Jeff Francoeur, who had seven home runs in 2006 against Miami.

**A** The Atlanta franchise history record is 11 by Dale Murphy against San Francisco in 1983.

#### Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his 14th start of the season (15th appearance) and the 276th (299th appearance) of his career.
- A* Makes his third career start (fourth appearance) against Miami, and is 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) against his former team.
- A* Acquired by the Marlins from the Boston Red Sox on 11/28/05, and played his first seven major league seasons with the organization...Went 44-45 with a 3.75 ERA across 132 starts, including a no-hitter vs. ARI on 9/6/06.
- A* Has not faced them since 2016, when he went 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 ER/6.0 IP) across a pair of games, one start.
- A* Has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last five starts, four of which have been quality outings...The five-start run of at least 6.0 innings is tied for the seventh-longest active streak in the majors and the longest by an Atlanta starter.
- A* Sánchez's current streak is the second longest by a Braves starter this season, trailing just a six-start stretch by Sean Newcomb from 4/20-5/19.
- A* Went 4-2 with a 2.60 ERA (19 ER/65.2 IP) in 11 starts (12 appearances) for Atlanta prior to the All-Star break...Is 1-1 with a 5.11 ERA (7 ER/12.1 IP) in two starts after the break.
- A* For his career, has pitched to a 4.17 ERA in 166 appearances before the All-Star break and a 3.89 mark in 132 games after.
- A* His 2.60 ERA at the All-Star break this season was the lowest of his career... His previous best was a 2.93 ERA in 2013, when he went on the pace the American League with a 2.57 full-season mark.

#### 2018 Recap

- A* Allowed a season-most five runs (four earned) over 6.1 innings in his last start, 7/26 vs. LAD...Two of the five runs scored following his departure in the seventh inning.
- A* Defeated Washington, 8-5, on 7/20 at Nationals Park...Allowed six hits and three runs over 6.0 innings.
- A* His 2.11 career ERA (36 ER/153.2 IP) against the Nationals/Expos is the lowest all-time mark by a qualifying pitcher against the franchise.
- A* His .909 (10-1) winning percentage is also the best mark all-time against the Nationals/Expos (minimum 10 decisions).
- A* Tossed just 4.2 innings, 6/26 vs. CIN, and allowed five hits and two runs to take his second consecutive loss.
- A* Was removed after throwing just 73 pitches due to cramping in his right calf.
- A* Took his first loss of the season, 6/20 at TOR...Allowed five hits and a season high-tying four runs over 5.0 innings...Set season highs in walks (4) and strikeouts (7).
- A* The loss snapped a streak of three straight wins to open the season...Opened a season 3-0 for the second time in his career...Won the first four decisions of his major league career to open his rookie campaign 4-0 in 2006.
- A* Won two consecutive starts, 6/9 at LAD (5.1 IP, 2 R) and 6/14 vs. SD (7.0 IP, 0 R)...The wins were the first of his career against each team.
- A* Entered the stretch winless against just three major league teams, all three of which played in California...Was winless against the Dodgers, Padres and Angels (0-4) before defeating Los Angeles-NL and San Diego in his last two turns.
- A* Allowed a pair of unearned runs over a season most-tying 7.0 innings, 6/3 vs. WSH...Allowed just four total baserunners.
- A* Returned from the disabled list, 5/29, and started that night vs. NYM...Allowed five hits and four runs over 4.0 innings in a no-decision.
- A* Missed 37 games after suffering a right hamstring strain on 4/18.
- A* Began a rehabilitation assignment with Triple-A Gwinnett on 5/21 and made two rehab starts with the Stripers...Combined to go 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA (8 ER/6.2 IP).
- A* Suffered a right hamstring strain during pregame warmups on 4/18 and was placed on the 10-day disabled list that night.
- A* Snapped a career-long six-game losing streak, 4/13 at CHI...Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in the Braves' 4-0 shutout of the Cubs.
- A* Went 0-6 with a 6.51 ERA (34 ER/47.0 IP) during the losing streak, which dated to 8/6/17 at BAL and spanned 11 games (10 starts)...Received just 13 runs of support during the stretch, an average of 1.18 runs per turn.
- A* Made his first start of the season and went 5.0 innings and allowed seven hits and two runs, 4/7 at COL...Atlanta lost 3-2 in the 10th inning.
- A* Is undefeated in six career starts against the Rockies...Sánchez is one of nine pitchers in history to make at least five starts against the Rockies and log an ERA under 2.00...Only five of those pitchers -- Sánchez, Jacob deGrom, Tom Koehler, Mark Prior and Bill Swift -- have done so without taking a loss

#### Career Recap

- A* 2018 marks his 13th major league campaign...Played the first six-and-a-half seasons (2006-12) of his career with the Marlins, before spending the last five-and-a-half seasons (2012-17) with Detroit.
- A* Led the American League with a 2.57 ERA in 2013.

### Ronald Acuña Jr. • OF • 6-0 • 205 • 20 yrs • #13

**Season Long Streak:** 4 games, 6/30-7/3 (7-18, .389, 2 HR)

- Hit leadoff for the first time in his career on 7/20 at WSH, and has hit there since... Is batting .333 (13-for-39) with a .422 on-base percentage with nine runs scored and four homers in 10 games in that role...Has also batted second, fifth, sixth, and seventh and hit a combined .244 (41-for-168).
- Has made starts at all three outfield positions (4 games, 1 start in center field; 47 games, 47 starts in left field; 3 games, 3 starts in right field).
- Became just the seventh Braves player over the last 110 seasons to reach double-digit home runs prior to turning 21...The others were Andruw Jones (26 total), Eddie Mathews (25), Hank Aaron (13), Jason Heyward (11) and Bob Horner (10).
- At 20 years, 214 days, he became the youngest player in baseball's modern era (since 1900) to homer and steal two bases in the same game, 7/20 at WSH.
- Reinstated from the 10-day disabled on 6/28...Went to the DL on 5/28 and missed 28 games with a left knee mild ACL sprain, left knee contusion and lower back contusion.
- Atlanta selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett, 4/25,
- Named Minor League Player of the Year by Baseball America and USA Today in 2017.

- Tied for the N.L. lead with 21 first-inning runs scored.
- Has 20 home runs and 10 steals, one of three players in the N.L. to reach those mark (Colorado's Trevor Story and Chicago's Javy Baez).
- Has 53 extra-base hits on the season...The club record is 92 by Hank Aaron in 1959... The Atlanta-era record is 87 by Chipper Jones in 1999.
- Has 12 games with multiple extra-base hits this season, five away from the Atlanta franchise record held by Chipper Jones (1999) and Javy Lopez (2003).
- Homered from both sides of the plate, 7/11 vs. TOR, for his first career multi-homer game...Is the first Braves batter to homer from both side since Nick Swisher (8/22/15).
