LEADING OFF: PLEASE NOTE TOMORROW'S GAME IS A 6:40 PM START... Angels play the sixth contest (3-2) of an 11-game home stand vs. **Minnesota** (2-2), **Houston** (May 14-16; 1-0) and **Tampa Bay** (May 17-20)...**Halos are on Day #8 of 29 games in span 30 days (lone off day is May 21)...** LAA is 9-4 this month to move into a first place tie with Houston in A.L. West (after 41 games in 2017, LAA trailed Houston by eight games)... Halos are 12-13 since a club-record 13-3 start... Angels are 8-3-2 in 13 series completed... LAA holds an MLB-best 14-4 road record, best 18-game away start in Club history... Next road trip is an 11-day, 10-game swing to **Toronto** (May 22-24), **New York Yankees** (May 25-27) and **Detroit** (May 28-31).

OH NO! Last night, Angels' Double-A affiliate Mobile BayBears threw their second combined no-hitter this season; **Griffin Canning** (4.1 IP), **Greg Mahle** (1.2 IP), **Adrian Almeida** (1.2 IP), **Ryan Clark** (1.1 IP) combined to no-hit the Birmingham Barons.

KNOW THIS: Last night **Justin Anderson** recorded his first career save and is fifth different Angel pitcher with a save this year (tied with **Milwaukee** for most in the Majors).

HOW BOUT' HEANEY? In his last four starts, **Andrew Heaney** has a 1.80 ERA (25 IP – 5 ER)... In three career starts vs. **Houston**, fashions a 0.95 ERA (19 IP – 2 ER) with 19 strikeouts and four walks.

SHO-K: With 11 strikeouts Sunday, **Shohei Ohtani** (43 Ks on season) passed **Bo Belinsky** (38 Ks in 1962) for most strikeouts by an Angel thru first six career games... Just fourth Angel with multiple 10+ SO games as a rookie, joining **Frank Tanana** (1974), **Belinsky** (1962) & **Ken McBride** (1961)... **First A.L. player ever to have 11+ K in two of first six career games.**

MUY BIEN! **Martin Maldonado** is hitting .538 (14/26) this month after a .156 clip in March/April (0-for-34 skid ended May 1)... Has three 3-hit games his last eight affairs & already has five 3-hit contests in 2018 - **first Angels' catcher with five such efforts in a season since Mike Napoli's seven in 2009.**

MOVIN' ON UP-TON: **Justin Upton** homered in a career-best four straight games (May 8-11) and has HRs in five of last nine games (six HRs last 11 contests)... Has hits in 12 of last 14 games (.328; 19/58) with 19 RBI... **Leads MLB with 19 RBI this month.**

HERE'S WHAT'S LEFT: **Upton** is the first Angel **left fielder** with 10+ HRs since **Josh Hamilton** (21) in 2013.

MORE THAN GLOVE: **Andrelton Simmons** has hit safely in 16 of his last 17 games, reaching base safely in 21 straight... Reached base safely in 38-of-last-84 PA (.452 OBP) and is hitting .394 (28/71) with two home runs, seven doubles, two triples and 15 RBI... **Leads MLB in PA per SO with 17.5 (158/9) and ranks fourth in A.L. batting .338**

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Shohei Ohtani** has a hit in 15 of 17 of his starts at DH and is batting .471 (8 for 17) in his last six contests... **His five home runs are tied for A.L. lead among rookies (Tyler Austin)**... Has registered a quality start in four of six outings on the mound... Named A.L. Rookie of Month for April... Became just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971... Tied club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)... As a DH, batted .359 (14/39) with four HRs, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS... In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Matched **Stan Musial** and **Alex Rodriguez** as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** & **Alex Rodriguez**).

PUJOLS POINTS: **Albert Pujols** ranks ninth all-time with 1,939 career RBI... Next up on the list is **Ty Cobb** with 1,944 RBI (source *Baseball Reference*)... **Pujols** sits at 628 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within four of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632).

WALK IN THE PARK: **Mike Trout** logged his second career four-walk game Saturday (also May 1 vs. BAL)... Just third Angel to record multiple four-walk games in a season (**Fred Lynn** in 1984 and **Chris Iannetta** in 2013)... **Trout has 22 walks across his last 20 games**... With his 600th walk May 8, became 5th player with 600 walks/200 HRs prior to age-27 season, joining **Mickey Mantle**, **Eddie Mathews**, **Mel Ott** & **Jimmie Foxx**.

FISH FACTS: **Mike Trout** scored his 700th career run April 8th to become one of nine players with 200 HRs & 700 runs prior to age-27 season (**Albert Pujols**, **Alex Rodriguez**, **Frank Robinson**, **Hank Aaron**, **Mickey Mantle**, **Eddie Mathews**, **Mel Ott** & **Jimmie Foxx**)... **Trout** has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old season – others are **Rogers Hornsby** (4) and **Ty Cobb** (4).

THIS N' THAT: On Sunday, **Pujols** logged career hit #3,007 tying **Al Kaline** for 30th all-time (**Wade Boggs** is 29th with 3,010)... **Halos' average home attendance (38,654) leads A.L.**... Club boasts seven sellouts thru 23 home games... **LAA has just 15 errors thru 41 games (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .990 fielding pct**... Bench Coach **Josh Paul** celebrates his 43rd birthday May 19th... **Garrett Richards**, his 30th, on May 27th.

PITCHING POINTS: **Angel pitchers have surrendered just seven HRs this month, second-fewest in MLB to Houston (5)**... LAA pitchers have 20 games this season with 10+ Ks (franchise record through first 40 games of season)... **Halo hurlers have issued 156 free passes, second-most in A.L.**... **Angels' bullpen has tossed 165 IP to rank 2nd in MLB (average 4.1 IP per game).**

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA

3-1, 2.45 ERA

Began last home start with 5.1 no-hit innings on May 3 vs. Baltimore

- Making fifth start of the season for Angels and third at home.
- Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on May 3 for third stint of season with Angels.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Wednesday at Colorado after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and allowing five hits and one walk with a career-high seven strikeouts.
- **QUALITY START:** Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings of start on May 3 vs. Baltimore before allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- **ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Is tied for second among A.L. rookies (with **Shohei Ohtani**) in wins (3) and ranks fourth (min. 15 IP) in ERA and fifth in batting average against (.209).
- **STREAKING:** With a winning decision tonight, would become first Angels pitcher to win three consecutive starts since **Matt Shoemaker** from May 12-23, 2017.
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- **VS. HOUSTON:** Today marks first career appearance vs. Astros.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In two starts at Angel Stadium, is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (8 IP – 4 ER)...Pitched career-high six innings in last home start on May 3 vs. Baltimore and carried no-hitter through 5.1 frames.
- **YOUTH WINS:** Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season.
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 185 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In three starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 2.92 ERA (12.1 IP – 4 ER) and 12 strikeouts.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and is the top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** is ranked #1)...He is also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Appeared in five games (one start) for Angels this Spring and went 1-2 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1 IP – 5 ER) and 12 strikeouts...Lone start of the Spring came on March 22 at Camelback Ranch against the Dodgers (L; 3 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 H, 2 BB, 4 SO).
- **2017 RECAP:** Opened 2017 season with Adv.-A Inland Empire and pitched to a 2.48 ERA (65.1 IP - 18 ER) with 57 strikeouts in 11 starts before being promoted to Double-A Mobile on June 1...Promoted to Triple-A Salt Lake on Aug. 22 and did not allow an earned run in two of his three starts for the Bees.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.

RHP GARRETT RICHARDS (4-1, 4.08 ERA)

Making ninth start of the season and fifth at home...First start of the year vs. Astros...Did not factor in decision in last start on Thursday vs. Minnesota after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing three earned runs on five hits with no walks and four strikeouts; carried a shutout into the sixth inning before allowing 3-run HR to Brian Dozier...In 14 career games (11 starts) against the Astros, is 5-4 with a 3.28 ERA (71.1 IP – 26 ER)...Made two starts vs. Houston last year, and went 0-1 with a 0.82 ERA (11 IP – 1 ER)...Has not allowed a run in last nine innings pitched vs. Houston.

#38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP)

AGE: 25

- Earned first career save last night after working a scoreless ninth inning.
- Charged with first career loss Friday vs. MIN after allowing 3 ER in 1.1 IP.
- Matched season-high with 1.2 scoreless innings Wednesday at Colorado.
- Opened career with 6.1 shutout frames across first six outings for Angels.
- Made Major League debut April 23 in hometown of Houston...Recorded first career strikeout vs. **Carlos Correa** with two on and two out in the 8th inning.
- In six total minor league games between Double-A Mobile and Triple-A Salt Lake, has worked 8.2 scoreless innings with 14 strikeouts.
- Opened the year with Mobile and pitched in three games before being promoted to Salt Lake on April 14.
- Originally drafted by Angels in 14th round of 2014 First-Year Player Draft.
- Native of Houston, TX...Attended St. Piux X HS (Houston, TX) and University of Texas San Antonio.
- **Last Outing:** 5/14 vs. HOU (1 IP, 2 H, 1 BB) **Holds:** 5 **Saves/Opps:** 1/2

#32 CAM BEDROSIAN (RHP)**AGE: 26**

- Has pitched in three games on the homestand...Allowed an inherited runner to score on Sunday vs. Twins for first time since March 31.
- Has not been charged with a run in 11 of last 12 appearances, including 2.1 shutout frames across three games on the current homestand.
- Pitched one scoreless inning across two outings on last road trip.

- Pitched 1.2 scoreless innings May 5 at Seattle, matching longest outing of the year

- Led Angels staff and ranked sixth in A.L. in appearances (71) last season.
