MIAMI MARLINS (46-64) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (60-48)

Friday, August 3, 2018 – 7:05 EDT – Citizens Bank Park – Game 109 – Home 54

RHP Trevor Richards (3-5, 4.06) vs RHP Vince Velasquez (7-8, 4.02)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** In a thriller, the Phillies defeated the Marlins, 5-2, in walk-off fashion in South Philly ... Starter Nick Pivetta (ND) went 6.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 4 hits with 0 walks and 7 strikeouts ... Dormant for most of the night, minus another Rhys Hoskins dinger, the Phillies offense erupted in the 9th inning ... Hoskins walked, Santana reached on an infield single, Cabrera walked, Nick Williams grounded into a fielders choice which plated a run and Franco sent CBP into euphoria with a three-run walk-off home run ... It was the Phils first win this season when trailing after 8.0 innings.
- MAIK ON A MISSION:** Since he resumed a full-time role at third base on June 17, **Maikel Franco** has hit .331 with a .378 OBP and .617 SLG over 143 plate appearances and 38 games ... Franco, with 18 home runs on the season, has struck out a mere 48 times ... Among 51 players in the majors with 18 or more home runs this season, Franco's 48 strikeouts are the fewest ... For context, **Jose Ramirez** is next on the list with 51 strikeouts, followed by **Mookie Betts** with 54 ... Franco's first career walk-off home run came last night in Philadelphia's emphatic 5-2 win.
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** The Phillies have won nine of their last 11 games at home, 11 of their last 14 and are 35-18 (.660) at CBP this season ... They have the best home winning percentage in the National League and their win percentage at home is third-best in baseball, trailing only the Red Sox (.722) and Yankees (.704).
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** Since starting the season 1-4, the Phillies are 15 games over .500 at 59-44 and are tied with the Dodgers for the 2nd-best winning percentage in the NL in that span (.569), trailing only the Cubs (.583) ... At 60-48 with a .556 winning percentage this season, the Phils currently sport a half-game game lead over the Atlanta Braves (58-47, .552) in National League East ... The Phillies have not made it to the postseason since 2011, the end of their five-year run of National League East championships.
- WHAT A RELIEF:** Since July 1, the Phillies bullpen has amassed 98.1 innings and have posted a MLB-best 2.47 ERA (27 ER) in that stretch ... **Pat Neshek** (0.00 ERA, 9.2 IP), **Victor Arano** (1.42 ERA, 12.2 IP) and **Seranthony Dominguez** (1.74 ER, 10.1 IP) have all posted a sub-2.00 ERA in that span.
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 108 games, The Phils are 12 games above .500 at 60-48 and have scored 473 runs and allowed 447 (+26) ... Last season, through 108 games, they were 30 games under .500 at 39-69 and had scored 434 and allowed 524 (-90) ... **The Phillies didn't notch their 60th win last season until September 19** ... This season, in nine games (8.3 % of their games played thus far) in which they have allowed 10 or more runs, the Phillies have been outscored 111-30 (-81) ... **However, in their 99 other games this year (91.7% of their season), Philadelphia has a +107 run differential, outscoring the opposition 443-336.**
- BELIEVE IT:** On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, **Rhys Hoskins** fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9 and in 216 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .297/.389/.627 with 34 runs, 13 2B, 16 HR, 43 RBI and 27 walks ... The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (19 HR, 33 BB) ... Finally, Hoskins crushed his 40th career home run last night in his 149th career game, becoming the 2nd-fastest Phillies player to 40 career home runs (fastest: HOF Chuck Klein, 148 G).
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 104 consecutive games (since 4/4); it is the second-longest extra-base hit streak in franchise history (see chart to the right), shy of only a 129-game streak from 1929-30 ... It is the longest extra-base hit streak in the majors this season (next: DET, 67 G, 4/10-6/22).
- SERIESLY:** Over their last 15 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 10-3-2 ... Philadelphia's three series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27), the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) and the Reds this past weekend in Cincinnati (1-3) ... Philadelphia's 10 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres and Dodgers.
- ALUMNI WEEKEND INFO:** The Phillies will honor the 2008 World Series Champions as part of Toyota Phillies Alumni Weekend, August 3-5 ... Festivities take place during the Phillies-Marlins series and feature 2008 World Champion photo opportunities, special first pitches and pregame tributes throughout the weekend ... Highlights include the retirement of Shane Victorino (Aug. 3), the induction ceremony of Roy Halladay and Pat Gillick into the Toyota Phillies Wall of Fame (Aug. 4), 2008 Phillies World Series Champions Luncheon (Aug. 4), a celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the 2008 World Champion Phillies (Aug. 5) and a 2008 World Champions' Home Run Derby at The Yard (Aug 4-5).
- FLAGS FLY FOREVER:** This weekend, the 2008 World Championship team will be celebrated as the Phillies honor the 10-year anniversary of that special group ... The following members of that team are scheduled to return: Mick Billmeyer, Coach (2004-13), RHP Joe Blanton (2008-12), INF Eric Bruntlett (2008-09), OF Pat Burrell (2000-08), RHP Clay Condrey (2006-09), Coach Roly deAramas (2008), INF Greg Dobbs (2007-10), Coach Rich Dubee (2005-13), RHP Chad Durbin (2008-10), LHP Scott Eyre (2008-09), INF Pedro Feliz (2008-09), GM Pat Gillick (2006-08), 1B Ryan Howard (2004-16), OF Geoff Jenkins (2008), RHP Kyle Kendrick (2007-14), RHP Brad Lidge (2008-11), Manager Charlie Manuel (2005-13), LHP Jamie Moyer (2006-10), RHP Brett Myers (2002-09), SS Jimmy Rollins (2000-14), LHP J.C. LAST START: 7/28 at CIN: ND, 5.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 5 BB, 4 SO ... Velasquez vs Harvey ... Philadelphia had opportunities to score early, as well as the 9th inning when they loaded the bases with 1 out ... Ultimately it was not to be as the Phils went 0-for-4 with RISP.

TONIGHT'S START:

- What a Month:** Velasquez posted a 0.95 ERA (2 ER, 19.0 IP) in July, the lowest ERA among any NL pitcher with at least 15.0 IP, and 4th-lowest in MLB ... He held opponents to a .172 batting average
- On Fire:** In his last 6 games (5 starts), has posted a 1.67 ERA (5 ER, 27.0 IP), allowed only 17 hits (only 1 HR) and held opponents to a .183/.290/.258 slash line ... He had a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from 7/11-28, matching the longest of his career (other: 4/9-14/16)
- Providing Relief:** On 7/24 vs LAD, 2 days after his previous start, was called upon to pitch the 16th inning, firing a scoreless inning and earning the win, his second in two days ... It was his first game in relief since 10/2/15 at ARI, when he was with HOU, and his first career win in relief
- The Homie:** Counting today, 8 of his last 10 appearances will have been at CBP ... Despite having a 5.31 ERA at home this season, has a 2.79 mark (9 ER, 29.0 IP) in his last 6 games (5 starts) at CBP, striking out 32 batters and allowing 14 hits
- On the Brink:** Carried a no-hitter through 5.0 innings on 7/22 vs SD, the 3rd time he has done so this season (others: 5/28 at LAD and 6/14 vs COL) and 5th time a PHI pitcher has done so ... Per Elias, the last Phillie with 3 such starts in a season was Steve Carlton in 979 (4) ... Over the past five seasons combined (2013-17), Phillies starters had 3 such starts total.
- Put Him Away:** When ahead in the count 0-2, Velasquez has held opponents to a .082 AVG (4-49) with 30 SO ... It is the 6th-lowest AVG among all pitchers, min. 45 batters faced in 0-2 counts
- vs NL East:** 2-4, 4.25 ERA (17 ER, 36.0 IP) in 8 starts

- 2018:** 5-5, 5.31 ERA (34 ER, 57.2 IP) in 11 starts
- Career:** 11-13, 4.61 ERA (100 ER, 195.1 IP) in 41 games (35 starts)

2018 SEASON:

- Was on the 10-day DL, 7/1-10, with a right forearm contusion
- Twice this season has carried a no-hitter through at least 5.0 innings (5/28 at LAD and 6/14 vs COL)
- Went 3-1 with a 2.30 ERA (7 ER, 27.1 IP) with 36 strikeouts in 5 May starts ... It was the lowest ERA of any month of his career (min. 5 starts)
- Tied a career-high three-game win streak, 5/5-17
- On 5/10 vs SF Became the first Phillies pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts and multiple hits at the plate since 9/16/13 (Cliff Lee, 14 SO, 3 H), per *Elias* ... His 12 strikeouts were his 2nd-most ever in a start
- On 5/5 at WSH made the first start of his career of at least 5.0 IP and 1 or 0 hits
- Made a career-best 7 straight starts (8/10/17-4/29/18) issuing 2 or fewer walks
- Had 282 SO through his first 50 career starts, which when achieved was the 7th-most by any ML starter through his first 50 career starts since 2015
- Did not allow a home run in his first 16.2 IP this season
- Made his 3rd consecutive Opening Day roster

2017 SEASON:

- Was on the 10-day DL, 5/31-7/17, with a right flexor strain; included rehab assignments to Lehigh Valley (AAA), Reading (AA) and Clearwater (A)
- Had a 2.96 ERA (9 ER, 27.1 IP) in 6 starts from 5/25-8/4
- Stranded 74.4% of the runners he allowed on base
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/11 with a right middle finger injury ... Had surgery on right middle finger on 9/6 and missed the remainder of season
