FISH BITES

Miami continues its final homestand of the season with game three of four against the Cincinnati Reds tonight at 7:10 p.m. RHP **José Ureña**, who is making his team-leading 30th start of the season and is looking to equal a career-best five-game win streak, is facing Cincinnati for just the third time in his career, going 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA; he last faced the Reds on July 21, 2017 at GABP, coming away victorious after allowing just one run on three hits and two walks, with four strikeouts, over 6.0 innings. The Reds are starting former Miami Marlin and Florida Gator RHP Anthony DeSclafani, who in two prior starts against the Marlins has gone 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA; he last faced off against Miami on August 16, 2016 at Marlins Park, earning the win after holding Miami to two runs on seven hits, while walking none and striking out six, over 6.0 innings. Miami opened the homestand with a two-game split against the Washington Nationals, after returning from a wet and wild 2-7 road trip that saw three postponements due to weather. Miami will close out its 2018 season slate next week, traveling to Washington for a three-game series Monday-Wednesday, followed by a three-game set at Citi Field against the Mets, Friday-Sunday. **Reminder:** tonight's game can be heard on 610AM WIOD.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

Eight hits and no runs were all the Marlins and Reds could muster through nine innings last night, with Miami coming away with a 1-0, walk-off win in 10 innings. In the deciding inning, **Brian Anderson** doubled to right with one out, and **Isaac Galloway** immediately followed with his own double to right to score Anderson and give Miami its ninth walk-off win of the season. Last night marked the fourth game this season that Marlins pitchers have shutout an opponent with three-or-fewer hits allowed. The last time Miami had as many as four such games in the same season was 2015, when they also recorded four. **Kyle Barraclough** earned his first win of the season, recording the final two outs in the 10th.

EXTRA MUSTARD

Last night's 1-0 win was the seventh 1-0 win in extra-innings in Club history, and first since May 23, 2015. In that game, Miami held Baltimore scoreless on nine hits over 13.0 innings, one of two 13.0-inning, 1-0 wins. The other was the second game of a September 26, 1998, doubleheader against Philadelphia.

SHUTOUT SHOUTOUT

The Marlins recorded their 11th shutout of the season last night, and second-consecutive 1-0 shutout. The 11 shutouts this season are tied for the 10th-most in a single season in Club history, and the most since recording 12 shutouts in both 2015 and '16. The Club record for shutouts in a single season is 17 in 2010.

VS. THE REDS

Miami is out in front of the 2018 series, 3-2, after last night's win; Miami took two of three from Cincinnati at Great American Ball Park, May 4-6. Miami is looking to extend its season-series win streak against Cincinnati to four, dating back to 2015. Prior to 2015, the Marlins hadn't won a season series since going 4-2 in 2005. In the nine seasons between season-series wins, Miami went 0-6-3. The Marlins the all-time series in South Florida (48-49; 13-10 at Marlins Park), and trail the overall series, 89-111.

WINDING DOWN AT HOME

Despite a 36-43 record at Marlins Park this season, the Marlins pitching staff has put together one of the finer seasons in recent memory at home. The staff will have accumulated the most innings pitched, finishing with a minimum 769.0, ahead of a 2007 staff that tossed 757.0. Marlins pitchers have allowed just 650 hits to date, which ranks as the fifth-fewest in franchise history. Their 7.79 hits allowed per 9.0 ranks as the second-lowest, behind a mark of 7.54 in 1996. The staff's .235 average against would go down as the second-lowest (.230 in '96), while their 3.63 ERA would end as the seventh-best.

IN RHYTHM

Over his last five starts, **José Ureña** has allowed a total of eight runs spanning 33.1 innings pitched for a 2.16 ERA. In three previous starts, which included a one-pitch outing against Atlanta on August 15, he had allowed 10 runs in 10.1 innings. Over his last three starts, Ureña has limited opponents to just three runs, equaling the best three-start stretch of his career in terms of runs allowed. From June 13-23, 2017, allowed three total runs to Oakland (1), Atlanta (2), and the Cubs (0). His current 1.47 ERA for the month is tied with Dereck Rodriguez for the fifth-lowest among National League starters (min. 3 GS), behind Luis Castillo (1.09), Ivan Nova (1.10), Jameson Taillon (1.42), and Jon Lester (1.45).

CHEN MUSIC

With another 7.0 scoreless innings last night, **Wei-Yin Chen** lowered his home ERA this season to 1.62 (78.0 ip/14 er), which now leads all National League starters (min. 70.0 ip). He will finish the season with the fourth-lowest single-season home ERA in club history, behind José Fernández (1.19 in 2013), Josh Johnson (1.57 in 2010) and Henderson Alvarez (1.60 in 2014).

PUTTING IT TOGETHER

Over their last 24 home games since July 28, the Marlins have posted a 2.99 ERA (223.0 ip/74 er) to mark the third-lowest ERA among National League staffs (fifth in MLB) at home in that span. They have limited opponents to a .211 average against, tops in the NL and second in the Majors behind Oakland (.209). Starters have allowed three-or-fewer runs 20 times, including 15 starts of two-or-less runs allowed, and posted a 2.83 ERA (133.2/42), while the bullpen has allowed 32 earned runs over 89.1 innings pitched for a 3.22 ERA.

HOME IMPROVEMENTS

Since June 8, Miami has gone 26-25 over its last 51 games at Marlins Park. That is a drastic improvement over a 10-18 record over the first 28 games at home. The Marlins have posted a 3.43 ERA (485.0 ip/185 er) over the stretch, which is the fifth-best among National League teams behind the Dodgers (3.07), Giants (3.18), Brewers (3.36), and Pirates (3.37).

CATCH & HIT

J.T. Realmuto hit his 21st home run of the year last Friday night, extending his single-season career high. His 18 home runs as a catcher rank as the second-most by a Marlins backstop in Club history, one behind Charles Johnson's 19 in 1997. His 62 RBI when behind the plate are the fourth-most in a single season in Marlins history, behind Ivan Rodriguez (82 in 2003) and Johnson (69 in 2001 and 63 in 1997).

ALL AROUND ANDY

Brian Anderson leads all Major League rookies in games (149), at-bats (564), runs (82), and average with RISP (.353); ranks second in hits (151), doubles (32), walks (59), multi-hit games (43), and on-base percentage (.352); ranks third in average (.268) and slugging (.392); ranks tied for fourth in triples (4); and ranks fifth in RBI (59). On the defensive side, he leads NL rookie outfielders (min. 50 GS) with a .994 fielding percentage, committing just one error in 176 total chances. He also owns eight outfield assists, tied with Harrison Bader for most among all ML rookie outfielders and just four off the Major League lead held by Billy Hamilton and Mitch Haniger. His eight total errors this season are third-fewest by a NL rookie (min. 90 GS), and he is the only rookie on that list to spend significant time at two different positions (57 GS at 3B; 89 GS in RF).

➤ José Ureña will make his 30th start of the season, extending a career-high, in game three of this four-game set against the Cincinnati Reds. Tonight will mark his 17th start of the season at Marlins Park, where has gone 2-9 with a 4.20 ERA (90.0 ip/42 er). The 17 starts at home are tied with 12 others for the eighth-most home starts in a single season in Club history; Jack Armstrong (1993), Kevin Brown (1996), and Scott Olsen (2007) share the top spot with 19 home starts.

➤ Suffering from the third-lowest run support average of any starter in the National League (min. 25 GS) at 3.60 (2.10 at home). Only nine starts this season has he left the game with more run support than runs allowed, and he has allowed three-or-fewer runs 17 times. His RSA of 3.60 is currently the eighth-lowest among Marlins starters with a min. of 25 starts all-time.

➤ Over his last five starts, has allowed a total of eight runs spanning 33.1 innings pitched for a 2.16 ERA. In three previous starts, which included a one-pitch outing against Atlanta on August 15, allowed 10 runs in 10.1 innings.

➤ Has allowed just three runs over his last three starts, equaling the best three-start stretch of his career in terms of runs allowed. From June 13-23, 2017, allowed three total runs to Oakland (1), Atlanta (2), and the Cubs (0).

➤ Is making just his third start and appearance against Cincinnati, going 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA. Tonight will mark his first start against the Reds at Marlins Park. He last faced the Redlegs on July 21, 2017 at GABP, when he allowed one run on three hits and two walks, while striking out four, over 6.0 innings. In other start, August 16, 2016, allowed five runs, seven hits, and three walks, with five strikeouts, over 6.0 frames.

➤ In last start, September 16 at Citizens Bank Park against Philadelphia, allowed just one run on three hits, with one walk and four strikeouts, over 5.0 innings. Marked third consecutive start with just four-or-fewer hits and one run allowed.

➤ On September 3 vs. Philadelphia, limited Phillies to one run on four hits, while walking none and striking out seven over 7.0 innings. Marked third career start of 7.0 innings pitched without walking a batter; Sept. 11, 2016 vs. the Dodgers and Sept. 20, 2017 vs. Mets.

➤ In August 19 start at Nationals Park, tossed first career complete game and first by a Marlins starter since Edinson Volquez no-hit the Arizona Diamondbacks on June 3, 2017 at Marlins Park. Needed 108 pitches to complete the game, allowing one run on two hits and two walks, while striking out four. Was eighth complete game by a Marlins starter against Washington (since 2005), and first since Ricky Nolasco on September 9, 2012 at Nationals Park.

➤ Trevor Richards will make his 24th start of the season for Miami in the finale of this four-game set against the Cincinnati Reds. On the season, has posted 3-9 record and 4.95 ERA (112.2 ip/62 er) with Miami. Has also made six starts at Triple-A New Orleans, going 3-2 with a 2.06 ERA (39.1/9).

➤ Has established professional single-season highs in appearances (29), starts (29) and innings pitched (152.0). He previously had 146.0 innings last season between Single-A Jupiter and Double-A Jacksonville.

➤ From June 23 to August 8, allowed 15 total runs over 48.0 innings pitched in nine starts for a 2.81 ERA. Has allowed 26 runs over his last six starts covering 26.2 innings.

➤ From July 8 to August 8, recorded six straight starts with four-or-fewer hits allowed. It tied the second-longest such streak in Marlins history, behind a stretch of eight consecutive games by Dan Straily from April 11-May 20, 2017.

➤ On August 22 vs. the Yankees, did not receive a decision despite allowing just two runs on three hits and three walks (one intentional), with nine strikeouts, over 5.1 innings. The nine strikeouts are the second-most he has struck out in a Major League game, behind a 10-strikeout performance against the Dodgers on April 25.
