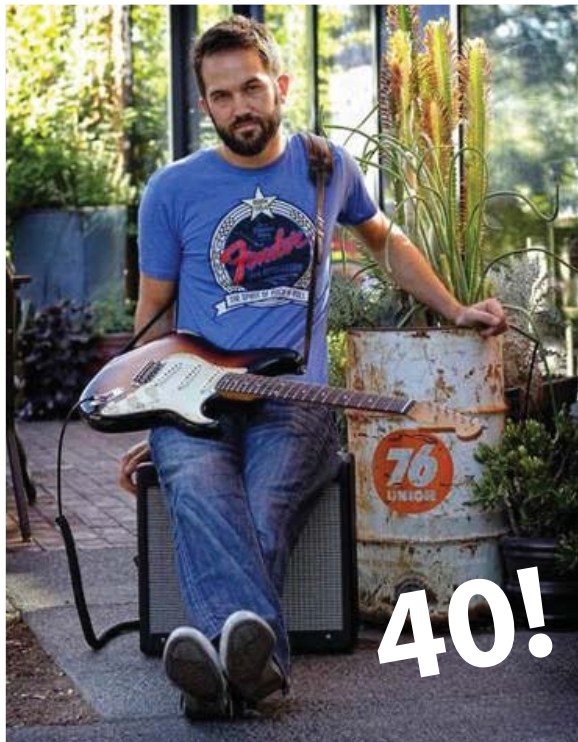

- ♦ 40 years ago, "Grease" debuted in the theaters, "Shadow Dancing" by Andy Gibb was the No. 1 song and Bjorn Borg won the 77th French Open over Guillermo Vilas (6-1, 6-1, 6-3).

HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs have won 3 straight games and are 7-2 in their last 9 and 9-3 in their last 12.
- ♦ Arizona has won 5 of its last 6 home games.
- ♦ The D-backs are 22-0 when scoring 5+ runs.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has 5-straight multi-hit efforts, batting .682 (15-for-22) with 6 doubles, 4 home runs, 11 RBI, 9 runs scored and a 2.311 OPS.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** is batting .359 (14-for-39)/1.262 OPS with 7 doubles, 2 triples, 3 homers and 11 RBI in his last 12 games.
- ♦ **Jon Jay** is hitting .392 (20-for-51) with 1 double, 5 RBI and 5 walks in his last 16 games vs. Pittsburgh.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs earned a 3-game sweep @ Rockies, winning the series finale, 8-3.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** went 3-for-5 and was a triple shy of the cycle with a double, home run (5) and 2 RBI.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** was 2-for-4 with a double, triple and 2 RBI... **Chris Owings** went 2-for-4 with 2 doubles and a RBI.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** (6-5) picked up the win after striking out 8 in 5.2 innings (2 ER).

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ Prior to tonight's game, the D-backs recalled RHP **Braden Shipley** from Triple-A Reno and optioned INF **Christian Walker** to Reno.
- ♦ Shipley was 3-4 with 1 save and a 6.48 ERA (30 ER in 41.2 IP) in 11 games (6 starts) with the Aces...he has worked exclusively out of the bullpen since May 22.

GOLDSCHMIDT NAMED NL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- ♦ Today, **Paul Goldschmidt** was named NL Player of the Week for June 4-10, hitting .640/.690/1.440 with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and a 2.130 OPS.
- ♦ The weekly honor was Goldschmidt's second of his career (also: April 27-May 3, 2015), and third by the D-backs this season (also: Patrick Corbin and A.J. Pollock).

- ♦ Arizona has produced 4 consecutive 10-hit games for the first time since a 5-game stretch from Aug. 27-Sept. 1, 2017.

D-BACKS OFFENSE SINCE MAY 28

- ♦ Since May 28, the D-backs are batting .273/.352/.528 with 26 doubles, 5 triples, 23 home runs and 81 runs scored (6.8/G), raising their average from a season-low .211 to .223.
- ♦ The D-backs rank among Major League leaders in several offensive categories during that span:

GOLDSCHMIDT IS HAPPENING

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has 5-straight multi-hit efforts, batting .682 (15-for-22) with 6 doubles, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and a 2.311 OPS.
- ♦ Since May 23, Goldschmidt is hitting .417/.493/.950 with 7 doubles, 7 homers, 18 RBI and a 1.443 OPS in 15 games...he ranks among MLB leaders during that span in slugging pct. (1st), OPS (1st), home runs (T-1st), average (2nd) and RBI (T-2nd).
- ♦ Goldschmidt in his first 48 games, compared to his last 15:

- ♦ Additional Goldschmidt notes:

- Has tied a Major League record with 2+ extra-base hits and 2+ RBI in 4 straight games (also: Frank Howard from May 12-16, 1968, Frank Robinson from Sept. 19-22, 1966, Vic Wertz from July 28-Aug. 1, 1950 and Chet Laabs from July 15-17, 1942).
- Since 1920, joins Lou Gehrig (June 16-19, 1936) as the only 2 players with 11+ extra-base hits and 15+ hits in a 5-game span (June 5-10) [source: STATS LLC].
- Boasts 4 straight games with 2+ RBI, tied for second-longest streak in franchise history (seventh time; last: Wellington Castillo in 2016)...is 1 game shy of his club record (April 21-26, 2017).
- Tied a career high with 5 multi-hit games in a row (third time)...last D-back with 6 straight was Yasmany Tomás from May 16-21, 2015.
- Set a club record with 4 consecutive 3+ hit efforts from June 5-9.

OUR OWN MARTE-PARTAY

- ♦ 11 of **Ketel Marte's** last 12 hits have gone for extra bases (2 triples, 3 home runs and 6 doubles).
- ♦ Yesterday, Marte tied the club record with 10 extra-base hits in a row, joining Chris Iannetta (May 12-June 8, 2017), Paul Goldschmidt (May 7-21, 2014), Luis Gonzalez (April 7-20, 2006) and Steve Finley (September 4-9, 1999) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

THE FEDERALIST AND THE PIRATES

- ♦ **Jon Jay** is a career .325 hitter (100-for-308) vs. Pirates, the fourth-best average against Pittsburgh among active players (min. 250 PA):
 - **BEST AVG VS. PIRATES AMONG ACTIVE PLAYERS** (min. 250 PA): .364 – Kris Bryant; .360 – Albert Pujols; .342 – J.J. Hardy; **.325 – Jon Jay**.

YOSHI'S SCORELESS STREAK

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 13.2 inning scoreless streak (16 G) since May 6 is the fourth-best active streak in the NL behind Jared Hughes (18.1), Josh Hader (16.1) and Jon Lester (15.0).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CLAY BUCHHOLZ (1-1, 1.88)

- ♦ Has allowed 2 or fewer runs in all 4 starts...was the first pitcher in D-backs history to give up no more than 1 run in his first 3 starts with the club.
- ♦ Will be making his second career start vs. Pirates...lost on Sept. 17, 2014 @ PNC Park (4 ER in 4.0 IP).
- ♦ Signed with Arizona as a Minor League free agent on May 4.

- ♦ **Named NL Player of the Week for April 16-22 after going 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA, 2 walks, 19 strikeouts and a 0.33 WHIP in 2 starts.**
- ♦ Selected to the 2013 NL All-Star Team and was a finalist for the 2013 Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- ♦ Acquired on July 25, 2010 with LHP Joe Saunders, LHP Tyler Skaggs and RHP Rafael Rodriguez from Los Angeles Angels for RHP Dan Haren...selected by Angels in second round of 2009 First-Year Player Draft.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ♦ Is 4-2 in 7 home starts...is looking for his first win @ Chase Field since April 22 vs. Padres (0-2 with a 5.50 ERA since).
- ♦ Has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 3 of his last 4 starts.
- ♦ Threw a 1-hit shutout on April 17 vs. Giants... began the game with 7.2 hitless innings before surrendering a check-swing, infield single to Brandon Belt.

LAST START

- ♦ Earned the win on June 5 @ Giants, giving up 1 run on 4 hits over 6.1 innings...walked 2 and struck out 7.
- ♦ Did not surrender a homer for the first time since May 14.

VS. PIRATES

- ♦ Is 1-2 with a 5.32 ERA (14 ER in 23.2 IP) in 4 career starts.
- ♦ Earned the win in his last outing on May 12, 2017 @ Chase Field (4 ER in 6.0 IP).
- ♦ Has gone 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (8 ER in 12.0 IP) in 2 starts @ Chase Field.

- ♦ Played basketball and baseball at Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, N.Y. before transferring to Chiopla Junior College (Fla.).
- ♦ Traveled to Australia in Nov. 2013 as part of a Major League Baseball goodwill tour.

PERFECT ON 5 DAYS OF REST

- ♦ Is 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA (9 ER in 37.2 IP) in 6 starts with 5 days of rest this season.

- ♦ Owns a combined 2.08 ERA (15 ER in 65.0 IP) in innings No. 1-5 (7.84 in sixth inning; 9 runs).
- ♦ Ranks fifth in the NL with a 23.4 swinging strike pct., behind Max Scherzer/WSH (27.0), Jacob deGrom/NYM (24.4), Luis Castillo/CIN (24.1) and Noah Syndergaard/NYM (23.7).

- ♦ Was announced as the D-backs' 2014 Opening Day starter vs. Dodgers in Sydney, Australia, before undergoing Tommy John Surgery...left his final Cactus League start on March 15 with elbow discomfort.
