LEADING OFF: Angels play the fourth contest of a seven-game home stand (2-1) vs. Texas (2-1) & Seattle (Sept. 13-16)...LAA has won six of seven, are 7-4 this month, 10-5 last 15 games and 24-25 since the break...Halos looking to move a game over .500 for first time since August 18 (63-62)...Club has won last three series (season-high is five straight series to open 2018 season)...Angels have spent last 77 days in fourth place...15 remaining games are with divisional foes: Six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), three vs. Seattle (all at home), three vs. Texas (all at home) & three at Houston...Angels are 21-20-7 thru 48 series...On Monday, Angels set out on final road trip to Oakland (Sept. 18-20) and Houston (Sept. 21-23).

FROM THE START: Since August 28th, Angels' starting pitchers have fashioned a 2.39 ERA (67.2 – 18 ER), best ERA in MLB in span (14 G - .220 BAA).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: In Angels' 8-1 win, Felix Peña tossed six scoreless frames (6 IP, 6 H, 1 BB, 3 SO) to earn victory, his sixth straight outing with 6+ IP...Francisco Arcia logged his first career multi-homer game (4 RBI)...Arcia has 17 RBI in 10 home games while batting .448 (13/29) with three doubles & five HRs at Big A...Shohei Ohtani recorded his 40th extra-base hit, just 10th Angel rookie to do, first since Mike Trout in 2012...Seventh Japanese-born rookie with 40 XBH, first since Nori Aoki in 2012...Jose Fernandez homered for a second straight night, HR on Tuesday was first of MLB career.

CLOSING IN: Trout's 63.1 career WAR is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (Ty Cobb, 63.4).

KNOW THIS: Mike Trout is two stolen bases shy of second career 30 HR/25 SB campaign (also, 2012)...Would be only player in franchise history with multiple such seasons (Bobby Bonds in 1977)...Leads MLB with 112 walks, four shy of his club record (116 BB) set in 2016.

SHO OFF: Shohei Ohtani has recorded a hit in nine of last 10 games, batting .429 (15/35) with 12 runs, three doubles, a triple, four home runs, three SBs & 11 RBI in span...With 19 HRs, Ohtani has passed Seattle's Kenji Johjima (18 HR in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani has 19 HRs in 88 non-pitching games...With next HR, will be second-fastest Halo rookie to reach 20 HR (Wally Joyner hit 20 by his 82nd game in 1986) and eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs...Ohtani is lone MLB player in 2018 with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base (ESPN STATS).

OHTANI NAMED A.L. PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ohtani was named American League Player of the Week for the period ending Sept. 9 – his second such honor this season...In five games, the rookie batted .474 (9/19) with eight runs, a double, a triple, four home runs, 10 RBI and two stolen bases (1.828 OPS)...He is the first Halo to win Player of the Week honors twice in one season since Tim Salmon in 2000.

DID YOU KNOW? David Fletcher's 75 hits since joining the club on June 13 are third-most among A.L. rookies...Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Shohei Ohtani).

HEAN MACHINE: Andrew Heaney has set new career highs in wins (9), starts (27), strikeouts (161) and innings pitched (165.0)...He is the first Halo to reach 160+ Ks since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176 & Hector Santiago; 162) and has four 10+ strikeout games this season...In his last outing Sunday at CWS, he logged a career-high 12 strikeouts joining Frank Tanana as only left-handers in team history to record 12+ Ks with zero walks in a game.

FISH FACTS: Mike Trout's streak of reaching base safely snapped at 13 straight games last night, one shy of matching season high...Trout has tied team record reaching base 4 times on 16 occasions this season to equal mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...Trout has joined Willie Mays as the only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...Vying to be fifth player all-time (first in A.L.) with 120 walks, 30 HRs and 25 stolen bases: Barry Bonds (6 seasons), Jeff Bagwell (2 seasons), Chipper Jones (1999) and Bobby Abreu (2004).

PUIJOLS SURGERIES: Albert Pujols underwent another surgery yesterday, a procedure to remove a bone spur from his right elbow... He had an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee on August 30th... Pujols ranks 23rd all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22nd with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)... One of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Aaron & ARod).

HI, MY NAME IS... 59 players (35 pitchers-16 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...15 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

GOLD STANDARD: Three-time Gold Glover Andreton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 214 putouts and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 17.9 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 913 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.1 – best by any shortstop in MLB history...Simmons' 106 double plays lead MLB shortstops.

GLOVE STORY: According to FanGraphs, David Fletcher ranks second in overall Defensive Runs Above Average since the break (7.6) behind teammate A. Simmons (8.1)...Halos have not committed an error in last 10 games...With 67 errors this season, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club rank fourth in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 156 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 40.0 caught stealing pct. (28 of 70), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 rank third in A.L. in span.

BULLPEN BITS: 3.61 bullpen ERA ranks fifth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 21.6 % to score (50 of 232)...Bullpen has logged 556.2 IP, second in A.L. to TB... Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 200 games pitched lead A.L. (166.0 IP)... Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez leads A.L. with 136 games pitched - Blake Parker ranks tied for fourth in span (134 games).

THIS N' THAT: 35 players on Angels' current active roster...Club is 19-27 when a lefty starts (54-46 vs. RHS)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+47)...Halos' 190 HRs hit rank fifth in A.L...Andreton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 16.09 (547 PA/34 K) – also leads MLB batting .298 (51/171) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1,643 wins) ranks 18th on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season.

HOT HALOS: Felix Pena has allowed three-or-fewer runs in seven of his last eight outings, a 2.76 ERA (49 IP – 15 ER) in span...Only issued one walk across last 21 innings...Monday night (4 IP, 3 K) marked the fourth scoreless relief outing of 3 IP-or-more for Taylor Cole...Shohei Ohtani is batting .371 (33/90) with 24 runs, six doubles, a triple, 10 home runs, 29 RBI and seven stolen bases over his last 31 games (raised average from .257 to .295 in span)...Andreton Simmons has four multi-hit efforts last six games and 11 RBI his last 13 contests... Jose Fernandez owns a six-game hit-streak batting .318 (7/22; 3 R, 2 HR, 4 RBI)...Has hit safely in 18 of 24 games with LAA this season (hits in 15 of 18 starts)...20 of last 23 outings for Justin Anderson are scoreless...David Fletcher has hits 21 of last 26 games (10 multi-hit efforts) batting .318 (34/107) with 17 runs, six doubles, a triple and 11 RBI in span...Jose Alvarez has not been scored upon in 20 of last 22 outings (0.95 ERA; 19 IP – 2 ER)...Jaime Barria has allowed one earned run or less in five of last seven starts...He leads MLB rookie starters with 10 wins (min. 15 GS)...Mike Trout hitting .354 (29/81) with 20 runs, seven HR, 14 RBI and 19 BB his last 24 games.

Vs. SEATTLE: Mariners lead 2018 season series 8-7 (Angels have won four of last six)...Angels are 10-5 in last 15 home games vs. Seattle...LAA is 105-81 vs. M's since 2009...Trout has hit safely in 14 of 15 meetings against Seattle this season, batting .446 (25/56) with 15 runs, six doubles, one triple, six HRs & 10 RBI (13 BB/7 IBB).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

September 13

(2008) Francisco Rodriguez records his 58th save to set the Major League single-season save record passing the mark of 57 by Bobby Thigpen with Chicago White Sox in 1990; (1962) C/INF Ed Kirkpatrick makes his Major League debut with the Angels at 17 years, 11 months and 5 days old – the youngest player to ever appear for the club; (2011) Jordan Walden picks up save #30, becoming just the fifth rookie closer since 2000 with at least 30 saves (Feliz, Kimbrel, Sasaki, Papelbon).

September 14

(1978) Angels set a club record, scoring 13 runs in ninth inning at Texa (16-1 win)...The record was subsequently tied (May 12, 1997 vs. Chicago, 7th inning)...13 runs also set MLB record for runs in the 9th inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP ODRISAMER DESPAIGNE

2-2, 6.40 ERA

First appearance vs. Mariners since July 1, 2016

- **STARTING OFF:** Making 16th Major League appearance (fifth start) of the season...Fifth game (fourth starts) for Angels...Acquired from Miami on Aug. 14 in exchange for cash considerations...Name is pronounced: oh-DREE-sah-mer deh-SPAWN-yay.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Last outing came in relief on Sept. 2 at Houston...Did not retire a batter (4 BF) and was charged with one earned run after allowing two hits and two walks...Second appearance of career without retired a batter (also, Sept. 3, 2015 for Padres vs. Dodgers – 3 BF).
- **LAST START:** Did not factor in decision for Angels in last start on Aug. 27 vs. Colorado after tossing four innings and allowing two earned runs on six hits with four walks and two strikeouts.
- **WIN STREAK SNAPPED:** Loss in Angels debut on Aug. 17 at Texas snapped streak four straight winning decisions in Majors, which was the longest such streak of his career...The streak spanned from Sept. 25, 2017 – April 8, 2018.
- **STARTER #14:** With first start on Aug. 17, became 14th different starting pitcher for Angels this season...Angels have now used 16 different starters, which is tied with Tampa Bay and Minnesota for most in the Majors this season...Third time Angels have had at least 16 different starters in a season; Angels record for most starters in a season is 17 (1967).
- **CUBAN HALOS:** Became the first Cuban-born pitcher to start a game for the Angels since **Luis Tiant** on Sept. 4, 1982 at Milwaukee...He will be the sixth Cuban starting pitcher in Angels history, joining **Marcelino Lopez** (67 GS), **Tiant** (5 GS), **Minnie Rojas** (2 GS), **Ramon Lopez** (1 GS) and **Mike Cuellar** (1 GS).
- **AS A STARTER:** In 46 career games as a starter, is 11-21 with a 4.56 ERA (258.2 IP – 131 ER) and 161 strikeouts...In four starts this season, is 0-2 with a 7.41 ERA (17 IP – 14 ER) and 15 strikeouts.
- **WITH THE MARLINS:** Appeared in 11 games (one start) for Miami this season, going 2-0 with a 5.31 ERA (20.1 IP – 12 ER) and 18 strikeouts...Opened the season in Marlins starting rotation, but made his first appearance of the year in relief in the 17th inning on March 30 vs. Cubs and was the winning pitcher...Made his lone start of the year the following day (March 31) before being moved to the bullpen...Became first pitcher in Marlins history to start a game after also pitching in a game the previous day.
- **BABY CAKE TIME:** Was optioned by Miami to Triple-A New Orleans on June 7...In 13 games (four starts) for Triple-A New Orleans, went 2-3 with a 4.36 ERA (43.1 IP – 21 ER) and 40 strikeouts...Was named the Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for June 25-July 1 after working 10.1 shutout innings across two appearances.
- **ON THE DL:** Missed one month (April 20-May 21) this season on the Marlins disabled list with a right forearm strain...Made one rehab appearance with Adv.-A Jupiter on May 16 vs. Fort Myers.
- **VS. SEATTLE:** Tonight marks second career appearance (first start) vs. Mariners...Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (1 IP – 0 ER)...Only previous outing came in relief for Orioles on July 1, 2016 at Safeco Field; Worked one scoreless inning allowing one hit (single by **Seth Smith**) with one strikeout (**Leonys Martin**).
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Tonight marks third career game at Angel Stadium and second as a member of the Angels...In his two starts, is 0-0 with a 1.80 ERA (10 IP – 2 ER)...Pitched four innings and allowed two earned runs in first start as an Angel on Aug. 27 vs. COL...Did not factor in decision in only previous start at the ballpark on May 26, 2015 for Padres but pitched six scoreless innings allowing five hits and no walks with five strikeouts.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of La Habana, Cuba...Made his Major League debut with the Padres on June 23, 2014 after making just seven minor league appearances between Double-A San Antonio and Triple-A El Paso...Played professionally for Havana Industriales of Cuba's Serie Nacional for eight seasons before signing with San Diego as an international free agent on May 2, 2014...Traded by Padres to Baltimore on Feb. 4, 2016 for RHP **Jean Cosme**...Selected off waivers from Orioles by Marlins on Sept. 15, 2016...Acquired by Angels on Aug. 14 from Marlins for cash considerations.
