AWARDS SEASON—The Tampa Bay Chapter of the BBWAA announced their annual Rays awards at the Clutch Hitters Luncheon, and these players will each be honored in a pregame ceremony tonight...LH **Blake Snell** won the **Don Zimmer** Award, given to the club's Most Valuable Player...INF **Joey Wendle** was named Outstanding Rookie and OF **Mallex Smith** won the **Paul C. Smith** Champion Award, given to the player who best exemplifies the spirit of true professionalism on and off the field.

- + The Rays also announced their Minor League awards, and will honor those players in a pregame ceremony...the minor league award winners will sign autographs for fans along the first base line tonight from 5:45-6:30...INF **Nate Lowe** was named Minor League Player of the Year, LH **Brock Burke** was named Minor League Pitcher of the Year and OF **Carl Chester** was honored with the Erik Walker Community Champion Award...see separate press release for a full list of awards, including affiliate MVPs.

RAY MATTER—The Rays are 3-5 in their last 8 games on the heels of a 5-game winning streak and 23-5 stretch from Aug 19-Sep 19...at 17 games over .500, they are two shy of matching their high-water mark of the season...they are 17-8 (.680) in September, tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Astros (18-5) and Brewers (16-7), and 39-24 (.619) since the All-Star break, 3rd in the majors behind the Athletics (41-21) and Red Sox (39-22).

- + The Rays are coming off a 1-3 series against the Yankees, their first home series loss since Aug 3-5 vs. CWS (0-3)...they are 8-1-2 in their last 11 series since Aug 20 and 11-2-2 in their last 15 since Aug 7.
- + Yesterday's 12-1 loss was the club's largest margin of defeat since May 13 at BAL (17-1) and largest at home since June 16, 2015 vs. WAS (16-4)...the 12 runs allowed were their most since July 27 at BAL (15) and most at home since Sep 15, 2017 vs. BOS (13)...the 4 HR allowed tied a season high (6th time) but were their most at home since Aug 23, 2017 vs. TOR (6)...the offense was held to 2 hits, tying their season low (3rd time, last Mon vs. NYY).

WHAT TO PLAY FOR—The Rays would need to go 2-1 or better in last 3 games for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays...they would join the Red Sox (7), Dodgers (6, 88-71 this season) and Yankees (6) as the only teams with six 90-win seasons since 2008, while the Cardinals (5, 87-72 this season) have a chance to join this group as well...since 2008, the Rays are 943-837 (.530), 6th in the majors behind the Yankees (.567), Dodgers (.556), Cardinals (.553), Red Sox (.549) and Angels (.531).

- + If the Rays reach 90 wins, it will be only the third time since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 that a team won 90 games and missed the postseason (2013 Rangers, 2012 Rays).
- + Monday's loss officially eliminated the Rays from postseason contention—they were the last AL team to be eliminated...including the remaining games of this season, since becoming the Rays in 2008 the club will have played only 54 games in which they were mathematically eliminated from postseason contention.
- + The Rays went 30-28 this season against the AL's five postseason teams, including 21-11 (.656) from June 22 on...they went 18-12 at home against the AL's five postseason clubs.

DOMESWEET DOME—The Rays are 49-29 (.628) at home this season, tied for the 3rd-best winning pct. in the majors behind the Red Sox (.622, .718) and Yankees (53-28, .654)...they are one win shy of reaching 50 home wins for only the fourth time in franchise history, after going 51-30 in 2013, 52-29 in 2009 and 57-24 in 2008...while the Rays are 4-5 in their last 9 games here following a club-record 12-game home winning streak, they are 37-13 in their last 50 games here following a 12-16 start this season.

- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion nine times, tied for 5th in the majors and tied for 2nd in the AL behind the Athletics (10)...this is their most since a club-record-tying 13 walk-off wins in 2013...their five walk-off home runs are tied for most in the AL and are 2nd-most for a single season in franchise history behind 2011 (7).

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—The Rays are 11-5 against the Blue Jays this season (5-1 at home, 6-4 on the road) and 196-172 (.533) all-time, their most wins against any opponent...they are 4-0-1 in series play this season, most recently a split last weekend in Toronto...the Rays have outscored them, 76-45, through 16 games this season—they have allowed 2 runs or fewer in 10 of 16 games, and allowed 1 run or fewer in six of 16 games...this is

the ninth time in the last 11 years the Rays have won the season series.

- + The Rays are hosting the Blue Jays for the first time since June 11-13 (3-0)...they played 10 games in Toronto from Aug 10-Sep 23...this series continues a stretch of facing the Blue Jays 13 times in the club's final 47 games of the season.

PITCHING POINTS—The Rays rank 5th in the majors and 3rd in the AL with a 3.74 ERA—only three times in franchise history have they finished a season with a lower ERA: 2011 (3.58), 2012 (3.19) and 2014 (3.56)...since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 3rd in the majors with a 3.48 ERA, behind the Dodgers (3.22) and Astros (3.43)—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + Despite trading four veteran pitchers in the week prior to MLB's non-waiver trade deadline, the Rays lead the majors with a .219 opp avg. and rank 4th with a 3.35 ERA since the start of August.
- + The Rays have a pitched to a AL-best 3.62 ERA in the 1st inning.
- + The Rays are 45-37 with traditional starters and 43-34 otherwise.
- + 24 different pitchers have recorded a win for the Rays, most in the majors and a single-season club record ahead of 2017 (20).
- + The Rays bullpen has surpassed 800 IP, and their 809.2 IP are a major league record by 152.2 IP, ahead of the 2012 Rockies (657 IP).
- + The Rays have lost 14 times this season when allowing 2 runs or fewer, most in the majors and a single-season club record...they have lost 23 times when yielding 3 runs or fewer, most in the majors and one shy of tying the single-season club record (24, 2014).

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 3rd in the AL with a .257 avg. and 2nd with a .338 OBP, while they were 12th in avg. and 10th in on-base pct. last season...they haven't finished a season in the top five in avg. since 2005 (.274, 3rd), nor in the top five in on-base pct. since 2013 (.329, 3rd).

- + The Rays have only four players with double-digit homers, tied with the Tigers for fewest in the majors and tied with 2001 for their fewest in a single season in franchise history...the Rays are the only team in the majors with only one player with 15 HR—C.J. **Cron** is 1 HR shy of becoming the ninth player in club history with 30 HR in a season...in comparison, the Blue Jays have 11 players with double-digit homers and seven players with at least 15 HR.
- + The Rays have totaled 147 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors and 81 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 27 games this season without the benefit of a home run, tied with the Pirates for most in the majors, and most in the AL.
- + The Rays are tied for 3rd in the majors with 121 SB, behind the Indians (132) Red Sox (122), and their most since 2012 (134).
- + **Tommy Pham's** 29-game on-base streak is the longest active in the majors and the longest by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (34) spanning 2012-13...it is the longest single-season on-base streak by a Ray since **Johnny Damon's** club-record 38-game stretch in 2011.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 27-30 (.474) in 1-run games...the 57 1-run games are tied with the Mariners for most in the majors and are a single-season club record...the 30 1-run losses are tied with the Giants for most in the majors and tied with 2015 for the club record...the Rays are 17-11 (.607) in 1-run games since June 19 compared to 10-19 (.345) before that.

SEVEN YEARS AGO—On Sep 28, 2011, the Rays came back from a 7-0 deficit in the 8th inning and went on to win, 8-7, on **Evan Longoria's** walk-off homer in the 12th, clinching the AL Wild Card...the win caps a 9.0-game comeback in the Wild Card standings that began on Sep 4—the largest deficit overcome by a team in September to make the playoffs.

- + The 7-run comeback remains tied for the Rays largest ever at Tropicana Field...with the Rays down to their final strike of the season, **Dan Johnson** delivers a pinch-hit homer to tie the game.
- + Minutes after the Red Sox lose in Baltimore, Longoria hit his walk-off homer...he became the second player in major league history to hit a walk-off homer in the last game of the regular season to send their team to the playoffs, joining **Bobby Thomson** with his "Shot Heard 'Round the World" for the New York Giants in 1951.

LAST START—On Sat at TOR, all 3 runs allowed came in the 4th inning, on a 2-run homer by **Rowdy Tellez** and RBI double by **Reese McGuire**...yielded 6 hits, matching his season high (2nd time, also Sep 11 vs. CLE), and threw a season-high 98 pitches, his most since May 7, 2017 (101, with PIT)...pitched a perfect 1st inning, but allowed at least one baserunner in every other frame, and his pitch count by inning was 13-13-15-30-10-17...was his third consecutive start of at least 6 IP, after going 0.2 IP on Sep 5 at TOR...his line: L, 6 IP, 6 H, 3 R/ER, 2 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 98 pit, 62 str.

SINCE THE TRADE—Is 1-5 with a 4.11 ERA (50.1-IP, 23-ER) and 55 SO in 10 starts with the Rays...is 0-2 with a 8.49 ERA (11.2-IP, 11-ER) in 3 starts against the Blue Jays and 1-3 with a 2.79 ERA (38.2-IP, 12-IP) against all other opponents...has a 2.86 BB/9 IP ratio with the Rays, down from a 5.46 BB/9 IP ratio in 34 apps with the Pirates...since Aug 1, his .193 opp. avg (35-for-181) ranks 4th in the AL (min. 40 IP).

- + Will be facing the Blue Jays for a second consecutive start, third time in 5 starts and fourth time in 11 starts since the trade to the Rays.
- + Has received a combined 11 runs of support in his 10 starts...min. 40 IP, his 1.97 R/9 IP of support is 3rd-lowest in the majors and 2nd-lowest in the AL since Aug 1...has received 3 runs or fewer of support in all 10 starts, 2 runs or fewer in 9 starts, 1 run or fewer in 6 starts and no run support in 4 starts.
- + Has allowed 1 run or fewer in five of his 10 starts with the Rays...has yielded 3 hits or fewer in 6 starts with the club and 2 hits or fewer in 5 starts.
- + His max velocity with the Rays is 100.2 mph, in his start on Aug 7 vs. BAL...his max velocity this season is 100.4 mph, in relief on May 24 at CIN (with PIT).
- + Has allowed 18 SB in 23 attempts between the Rays and Pirates this season, and 10 SB in 12 attempts since the trade...his 10 SB allowed since Aug 1 are tied for 5th-most in the majors and are 3rd-most in the AL.

STANDING TALL—Is the fifth pitcher in club history standing 6'8" or taller, according to Baseball Reference, following **Jeff Niemann** (6'9"), **Adam Russell** (6'8"), **Mark Hendrickson** (6'9") and **Billy Taylor** (6'8")...Rays pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** is also listed by Baseball Reference at 6'8" and spent parts of five years in the majors.

THE NEW GUY—Acquired from the Pirates on July 31 in the **Chris Archer** trade, with the Rays also receiving OF **Austin Meadows** and a player to be named (minor league RH **Shane Baz**)...at the time of the trade, his 72 SO ranked 3rd among NL relievers behind MIL **Josh Hader** (99) and COL **Adam Ottavino** (77), and his 19 relief apps of at least 2 IP were most in the majors.

MAKING THE LEAP—Was ranked by *Baseball America* as a Top 50 prospect in the minors for four consecutive seasons (2014-17), including No. 16 entering the 2015 season and No. 14 entering the 2016 season...is 45-21 with a 2.02 ERA (593.1-IP, 133-ER) and 785 SO over parts of six minor league seasons.

- + Despite spending the first two months of last season in the Pirates rotation, his 140 SO for Triple-A Indianapolis ranked 3rd in the Int'l. League.

ON THE CLOCK—Was selected by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2011 June Draft out of William S. Hart High School in Santa Clarita, Calif.—the same school that produced former Ray and 2011 All-Star **James Shields** and Indians All-Star **Trevor Bauer** (signed with UCLA).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (21-5, 1.90 ERA)

LAST START—On Sun at TOR, did not allow a run in 6.2 IP, his second consecutive scoreless start and ninth scoreless start of the season...was the second time in his career he went at least 6.2 IP and did not allow a run in a road game, following July 7 at NYM (7.1 IP)...recorded 11 SO, his most since Aug 21 vs. KC (11) and most on the road since June 3 at SEA (12), and his sixth start this season with double-digit strikeouts...got out of a 2-on, 2-out jam in the 5th inning, and his last 6 outs came via the strike-out...his line: W, 6.2 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 11 SO, 100 pit, 60 str.

THE WIN COLUMN—Leads the majors with a club-record 21 wins, ahead of CLE **Corey Kluber** (20)...is the majors' youngest 21-game winner since LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (21) in 2011 and the AL's youngest since OAK **Barry Zito** (23) in 2002...has won nine consecutive decisions, matching

Matt Moore (9) from Sep 29, 2012–May 19, 2013 for the longest streak in franchise history...has won a club-record nine straight starts (without a no-decision in between), going 9-0 with a 1.03 ERA (52.2-IP, 6-ER) and 74 SO over that span...according to Stats LLC, the only other pitchers in major league history to match or exceed those numbers over a 9-start span are MIN **Johan Santana** in 2004 and STL **Bob Gibson** in 1968.

- + Ranks 2nd in the majors and leads the AL with a 1.90 ERA.

vs. TORONTO—Is 4-2 with a 3.16 ERA (37-IP, 13-ER) in 7 starts in his career against the Blue Jays, and is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA (12.2-IP, 5-ER) in 2 starts at Tropicana Field...has faced them twice this season, both at Rogers Centre, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (11.2-IP, 3-H, 0-R/ER)...will be making his first start against them at home since April 6, 2017.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + On Sep 11 vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
