OUR OWN BEDS

- The Colorado Rockies continue their six-game homestand with the first of four games against the Milwaukee Brewers ... split a two-game series against the Los Angeles Angels Tuesday and Wednesday, their first Interleague action of the season ... the Rockies 14 home games thus far are the fewest in the National League, tied with the Twins for the fewest in the Majors.
- Lost 8-0 to the Angels yesterday, snapping their season-high six-game winning streak ... it was the third time this season the Rockies have been shutout, the second time at Coors Field.
- The Rockies went 0-for-12 with eight strikeouts with runners in scoring position yesterday, the ninth time in franchise history they've gone hitless in at least 12 at-bats with RISP (last: May 28, 2014 at Philadelphia).
- Colorado beat the Angels 4-2 on Tuesday night, snapping their nine-game losing streak against Los Angeles ... it was their first win against the Angels at Coors Field since July 11, 1999.

TIME TO START A NEW ONE

- The Rockies club-record streak of nine consecutive quality starts was snapped on Wednesday after Tyler Anderson allowed four runs over five innings ... over that nine-game span, Rockies starters went 6-3 with a 1.92 ERA (61.0 IP, 13 ER) with an opponents' batting average of .190 (42-for-221).
- Rockies starters also had their 24 inning scoreless streak at home snapped on Wednesday ... it was the second-longest streak in franchise history behind a 2002 string.

PRESS START

- After allowing 13 runs to San Diego on April 23, including nine in the seventh inning, Colorado has posted a 2.53 ERA (114.0 IP, 32 ER) over their past 13 games while going 9-4 over that span ... over that span, starting pitchers have allowed 17 earned runs over 80.1 innings of work (1.90 ERA) with 11 quality starts.
- The 2.53 ERA since April 24 is the second-lowest in the Major Leagues over that span.
- Since April 24, the Rockies have held opponents to a .197 batting average (81-for-411), the lowest rate in the National League, the second-lowest in MLB (Houston, .192).
- Have allowed greater than three runs three times over the last 13 games.

THAT WAS FUN

- The Rockies were 6-3 on the road trip to Miami (1-2), Chicago-NL (2-1) and New York-NL (3-0) ... won the final two games in Chicago prior to a three-game sweep of the Mets, the Rockies' first sweep of 2018 ... Colorado hit .223 on the trip, including .280 in the final four games ... the

pitching staff posted a 2.31 ERA (78.0 IP, 20 ER) on the trip.

BATTLE OF THE BREWS

- Colorado plays the Brewers seven times this season, this four-game series at home and a three-game series at Miller Park August 3-5.
- The Rockies took the season series vs. the Brewers in 2017, taking four of seven games ... lost two of three at Coors Field but took three of four at Miller Park.
- Colorado has dropped each of the past two series at Coors Field vs. Milwaukee, having last beat them in a series at home in 2015 ... are 4-8 vs. the Brewers at Coors Field since 2014.
- Colorado has dropped each of the past two series at Coors Field vs. Milwaukee, having last beat them in a series at home in 2015 ... are 4-8 vs. the Brewers at Coors Field since 2014.
- Nolan Arenado's .384 (33-for-86) batting average against Milwaukee is fourth-highest among all active players (min. 95 plate appearances).
- Tonight's starting pitcher for Milwaukee, Jhoulys Chacín, spent the first six years of his career with Colorado after signing with the Rockies as a non-drafted international free agent in 2004 ... he ranks eighth in franchise history in starts (109) and wins (38) and seventh with 514 strikeouts.
- Rockies outfielder Gerardo Parra spent parts of two seasons with Milwaukee (2014-15), batting a combined .312 (139-for-446).
- Brewers Manager Craig Counsell was originally selected by the Rockies in the 11th round of the 1992 First-Year Player Draft, the first draft in Rockies history.
- Rockies bullpen coach Darren Holmes spent two seasons with the Brewers (1991-92) before being selected by the Rockies with the fifth pick in the 1992 Expansion Draft.

LEAVE A MINT ON THE PILLOW

- The Rockies' 15 road wins are the most in MLB ... their .652 win percentage (15-8) leads the National League and is fifth in MLB.
- Their 3.35 road ERA (199.0 IP, 74 ER) is fourth-best in the NL ... rank second in the NL with 191 road strikeouts.
- Over their 23 road games Colorado starters have posted a 3.06 ERA (129.1 IP, 44 ER) with 13 quality starts ... are 10-7.
- Batting .215 (163-for-759) in road games, ranking 14th in the NL and 28th in MLB.

#COORS?

- 33 of the Rockies' 46 home runs have come on the road, the most road homers in MLB.
- Charlie Blackmon leads MLB with 10 road home runs ... hit is first seven home runs on the road before homering at Coors Field on April 22 vs. Chicago-NL ... per Elias, he is the first Rockies player to have his first seven home runs come on the road since Ian Stewart in 2010.

USE WHAT I GOT TO GET WHAT I NEED

- The Rockies have five wins in which they have scored two or fewer runs ... their most wins in games in which they scored two or fewer was 10 in 2010 ... have won four or fewer such games in 19 of their previous 25 seasons ... went 2-36 in games in which they scored two or fewer runs in 2017.

BEAT THE STREAK

- Nolan Arenado has reached base in 19 consecutive games since April 12, the fourth-longest active streak in MLB and the second-longest streak of his career ... reached base in 30 consecutive games in 2014.
- Has batted .329 (23-for-70) with four doubles, seven home runs, 15 RBI, 12 walks and 18 strikeouts over the course of the streak.
- Arenado currently ranks sixth in the NL in batting average (.322), fifth in on-base percentage (.415) and third in slugging percentage (.609).

MARQUE IT

- 23-year-old right-hander is a member of his second career Opening Day roster ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
- Made his debut on Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
- Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 along with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee in exchange for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
- Pronounced HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z

CREW

- Will be making his third career start against the Brewers ... is 1-0 with a 4.63 ERA (11.2 IP, 6 ER), two walks and 13 strikeouts in two career starts.
- Made one start vs. Milwaukee in 2017, an 8-4 Rockies win at Coors Field on Aug. 18 ... pitched 5.2 innings and allowed four runs on seven hits with one walk and six strikeouts ... surrendered a career-high three home runs (Santana, Broxton, Arcia) ... it was his last win at Coors Field (a span of six starts).

KEEP IT ROLLING

- Earned his second win of the season his last time out, May 4 at New York-NL ... pitched six innings and allowed two runs on six hits with no walks and a season-high eight strikeouts ... allowed a two-run home run to Asdrubal Cabrera, the second batter of the game ... was his third quality start.

FRESH TOWELS

- His 1.96 road ERA (23.0 IP, 5 ER) is tied for seventh in the National League ... is 2-1 in four starts away from home with the Rockies 3-1.
- In 21 career starts on the road, has gone 7-6 with a 4.05 ERA (109.0 IP, 49 ER) ... made two road relief appearances in 2016 and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings pitched (6.23 ERA) ... combined, is 7-6 with a 4.13 ERA (113.1 IP, 52 ER).
- Went 5-4 with a 4.19 ERA (81.2 IP, 38 ER) in 16 road starts in 2017 ... averaged 10.25 hits per nine innings, 3.20 BB/9 and 7.82 SO/9.

COORS HEAVY

- In 19 career appearances, 18 starts, at Coors Field, is 7-5 with a 4.96 ERA (103.1 IP, 57 ER) ... 0-2 with a 10.64 ERA (11.0 IP, 13 ER) this year.
- Is 0-3 with a 7.06 ERA (29.1 IP, 23 ER) in his past six starts at home since Aug. 29, 2017.
- From May 10-Aug. 29, 2017, he went 6-0 (Rockies 9-0) with a 3.24 ERA (58.1 IP, 21 ER), 55 hits, 13 walks and 60 strikeouts over nine home starts.
- Went 6-3 with a 4.59 ERA (80.1 IP, 41 ER) in 13 starts at Coors Field in 2017 ... averaged 9.07 H/9, 2.24 BB/9 and 8.51 SO/9 ... eight of his 13 starts at Coors Field were quality starts.

GOOD TEAM WIN

- The Rockies have won 14 of his past 23 starts since July 7, 2017 (8-6, 4.48, 126.2 IP, 63 ER).

MEN OF STEEL

- First win this year April 16 at Pittsburgh ... season-high six innings, allowing two hits and two runs with two walks and a season-high six strikeouts in the 6-2 win.

DING DING

- Had his start cut short on April 11 vs. San Diego after he was ejected for fighting ... had pitched three scoreless innings and allowed one hit and one hit batter with a four strikeouts prior to the incident.

A DENVER OPENER

- Started the Rockies home opener on April 6 and walked a career-high six batters en route to a 8-3 loss vs. the Braves at Coors Field ... allowed four runs in the first inning and charged with three in the fifth, working 4.2 frames ... game was delayed one hour due to inclement weather and eventually began at 27 degrees, the second-coldest start temperature in club history.

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

- Named to the *Topp's* All-Star Rookie Team, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
- Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
- Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
- Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
- Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29 (9 SO, 9 SO, 10 SO).

The 28-year-old right-hander will make his eighth start of the season, his third at home ... earned his fourth win of the season in his last start, May 5 at New York-NL ... pitched seven scoreless innings with six hits, one walk and two strikeouts ... four wins tied for third in the NL ... in two starts at home this season, has no decisions and a 4.22 ERA (10.2 IP, 5 ER) ... is 13-7 (Rockies 24-11) with a 4.57 ERA (201.0 IP, 102 ER) in 35 career starts at Coors Field ... has made four career starts vs. Milwaukee, going 2-1 with a 2.88 ERA (25.0 IP, 8 ER) ... 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (20.0 IP, 5 ER) in three starts at home against the Brewers ... no decision in Rockies 6-3 loss to Milwaukee at Coors Field last August ... pitched seven innings and allowed three runs on eight hits with one walk and six strikeouts.

- His 11 home runs rank tied for second in the National League, tied for fifth in the Major Leagues ... ranks sixth in the NL with a .579 slugging percentage.
- Had his eight-game hitting streak snapped Tuesday, the longest streak on the Rockies thus far this season ... batted .310 (9-for-29) with seven runs, three home runs, five RBI, seven walks, five strikeouts and two stolen bases over the streak.
- Hit his 29th career leadoff home run May 1 at Chicago-NL, his first this season.
- His 10 road home runs lead MLB ... was the first Rockies player since Ian Stewart in 2010 to record his first seven home runs on the road ... lone Coors Field home run April 22 vs. Chicago-NL.
