OAKLAND ATHLETICS (2-4) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (2-4)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games after winning the opener and are now 2-4 for the season...the last time the A's were under .500 after six games was in 2012 when they were also 2-4...lost three of four from Los Angeles (AL) to start the season, marking the eighth consecutive year the A's lost or split the first series of the season...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...has a 4119-3850 (.517) record over the previous 50 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8834-9322 (.487) in their previous 117 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on the first homestand of the season, an eight-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (1-1)...leave following the game tomorrow for the first road trip of the season, an eight-game jaunt to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

PITCHING: The A's have issued 10 walks (in 56.0 innings), which is second fewest in the majors to Seattle (9 in 36.0 innings)...however, have allowed 61 hits, which is second most in the majors to Miami (62)...had their Major League leading seventh wild pitch of the season last night...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: Kendall Graveman was charged with the loss last night and A's starting pitchers are now 0-4 for the season...the only other time in Oakland history A's starters lost at least each of their first four decisions was in 1979 when they started 0-7...the A's are one of three American League teams without a win from their starters (BAL, TB)...have a 5.57 ERA, which is third highest in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed four errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...last year, the A's made a Major League leading 121 errors...the offense is tied for second in the AL in most walks (22) and most strikeouts (56).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...after this eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas, the A's have an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning April 16...are scheduled to play 11 games over the first 11 days of the season...then have two off days over the next four days (April 9 and 12) and will play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 14-16-2 (.469) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marks the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring...this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...tied with Houston for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (16) and also tied for the fewest hit by pitches (8)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...10 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster and 10 other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year...two were signed as a free agent (Lucroy, Petit), and three were acquired in a trade (Buchter, Pagán, Piscotty)...the A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster...Santiago Casilla had the most service time with 10 years and 148 days...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years...Matt Olson, who turned 24 on Opening Day was the youngest player...Santiago Casilla was the oldest at 37 years, 255 days and is the oldest player on an A's Opening Day roster since Bartolo Colón in 2011 (38 years, 309 days).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015...only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): Thursday against Texas, Saturday and Sunday at Los Angeles (AL) and next Tuesday at Los Angeles (NL)...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A'S vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at one game each...the loss last night snapped the A's nine-game Coliseum winning streak against the Rangers, which is their longest home winning streak against Texas (previous: 8, June 17, 2003-April 6, 2004)...it is their longest Coliseum winning streak against any team since a nine-game streak against Minnesota from Aug. 21, 2012-Aug. 9, 2014...won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 50-47 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 353-362 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 187-171 in Oakland and 166-191 in Texas...are 99-103 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 450-444 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chris Davis is a .301 (41-for-136) career hitter with 18 home runs and 38 RBI in 39 career games against Texas...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...**Chris Hatcher** is the first A's pitcher to be credited with the win in each of the A's first two victories of the season since Bobby Shantz in 1952 when the Philadelphia A's started the year 2-9...**Jonathan Lucroy** tossed out three attempted base stealers last night to become the first A's catcher with three caught stealings in a game since Stephen Vogt also had three on July 30, 2015 against Cleveland...has tossed out 180 base stealers dating back to 2010, which is the most by any catcher over that span.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1974** Reggie Jackson has four hits and a homer as the two-time defending World Champion Oakland A's open their season with a 7-2 victory at Texas...the A's would go on to win their third consecutive World Championship...in **2006** Marco Scutaro has a walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning to lead the A's to a 4-3 win over the Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-1, 1.17 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster and is beginning his third season in the majors.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to the second batter of the game, Mike Trout, but that was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings...retired 12 straight at that point and set down 21 of the final 23 hitters...left trailing 1-0 as the A's scored their only run in the bottom of the ninth.

MANAEA vs. TEXAS: Is 3-2 with a 3.98 ERA (40.2 ip, 41 h, 20 r, 18 er, 8 bb, 41 so, 4 hr) in seven career starts...is 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA (5 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 4.74 ERA (13 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in Texas...was 2-1 with a 3.71 ERA (17.0 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 19 so, 1 hr) in three starts last year...the loss came in an 8-1 decision at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score...picked up the win in the A's 8-3 victory on Aug. 26 in Oakland...allowed a two-run double to Beltre in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...left after five innings with a 6-2 lead...won again on Sept. 28 at Texas in a 4-1 decision...the A's scored a run in the fifth and he allowed an unearned run in the bottom of the fifth when Calhoun reached on a Semien error and later scored on a Robinson single...Oakland scored twice in the sixth to take the lead for good.

2017 RECAP: Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...this marked just the third time in Oakland history (Wengert, 161.1 ip in 1996 and 134.0 ip in 1997) and fourth time in Athletics history (Garver, 145 ip in 1957) the A's did not have a pitcher with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...it was just the fifth time in Oakland history the A's did not have a pitcher with at least 30 starts in a non-strike season (Karsay, 24 in 1997; Wengert, 25 in 1996; Young, 27 in 1986; Langford, 29 in 1979)...struck out 264 batters over his first two seasons, which are third most in Oakland history by a pitcher in his first two seasons in the majors (Hudson, 301; Zito, 283)...his 19 wins tied for sixth most.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491)

against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 18 home runs and issued 49 of his 55 walks to righties...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties...now has a .204 (48-for-235) career batting average and .558 OPS against lefties compared to .269 (258-for-959) with a .776 OPS against righties ...12 of the 18 home runs he allowed were solo shots...allowed a .160 batting average with two strikes...held the three hitter in the batting order to a .216 batting average but the two hitter batted .377...now has a .210 (29-for-138) career average against the three hitter.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 6-3 with a 4.19 ERA in 13 starts in Oakland and allowed just five home runs in 68.2 innings (0.66 per nine innings)...was 6-7 with a 4.50 ERA in 16 starts on the road and yielded 13 home runs in 90.0 innings (1.30 per nine innings)...is now 11-7 with a 3.44 ERA (61 er in 159.2 ip) in 28 career games at home, 8-13 with a 4.70 ERA (79 er in 151.1 ip) in 27 starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 6-1 with a 3.57 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day compared to 6-9 with a 4.89 ERA and .292 opponents average in 18 starts at night...tied for sixth in the American League in day wins...is now 8-3 with a 3.53 ERA (41 er in 104.2 ip) in 18 career day games, 11-17 with a 4.32 ERA (99 er in 206.1 ip) in 37 starts at night.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the All-Star Break, 5-5 with a 5.23 ERA and .317 opponents average in 13 starts after the break...allowed eight home runs in 93.1 innings before the break, 10 in 65.1 innings after the break

INNING BY INNING: Yielded 43 of his 88 runs over the first two innings of his starts...had a 5.91 ERA over the first two innings of a game, a 3.08 ERA over innings three through five and a 7.13 ERA in the sixth inning...did not allow a run after the sixth inning (8.2 ip)

THIS AND THAT: Went 5-7 against AL West competition, 7-3 against all other teams...tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (4), tied for fifth in triples (5) and tied for seventh in unearned runs (11) and hit batters (10)...received no runs of support in four of his 10 losses.

MORE 2017: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings in his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codioli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 decision...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville and was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an AL pitcher...had a career-high tying three-game losing streak from Aug. 1 to 18 (11.37 ERA, .415 opponents batting)...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings in a 12-5 loss to Baltimore on Aug. 12 in Oakland...went 1-3 with a 9.17 ERA and .391 opponents batting average in five starts in August...tied for fifth in the AL in losses in August...then went 3-2 with a 3.54 ERA in five starts in September and is 4-2 with a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) in eight career starts in the month...tossed a career-high 116 pitches for his 10th win of the season Sept. 6 against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed seven runs on a career-high tying 11 hits in 3.2 innings in an 11-1 loss at Boston Sept. 12...was scratched from his scheduled start Sept. 23 against the Rangers with a left upper back strain...returned to make his final start Sept. 28 at Texas and allowed one unearned run in 6.2 innings for the win.

RHP Daniel Mengden (0-1, 7.94 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was the losing pitcher in his first start last Saturday, an 8-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) here in Oakland (5.2 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is now 0-9 with a 6.57 ERA in 12 career starts in the Coliseum and his nine-game career-opening home losing streak is second longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1908...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hasty from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...is 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against the Rangers...the win came in his only start last year on Oct. 1 in a 5-2 A's win at Texas (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 8 so)...went 0-0 with a 6.12 ERA in seven games, including five starts, during the spring...ranked fourth among Cactus League pitchers with 25.0 innings pitched...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland last year.

- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the AL, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)...had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.
